A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail in the season series, 4-3...lost two of three in Oakland to start the season and split a four-game series in Seattle in April...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 36-47 (.434) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 286-211 (.575) against Seattle, which is the **best mark by an AL team** against the Mariners (Boston, .575)...are 159-90 in Oakland and 127-121 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have a 23-18 record on the Fourth of July since moving to Oakland in 1968...are home on the 4th for the first time since 2007 when they lost to Toronto, 10-3...are 11-6 on the 4th in Oakland...this is the second time the A's have faced the Mariners on July 4...the other time was in 1978 when Oakland won 9-4 at Seattle.

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1905** Rube Waddell defeats Boston's Cy Young in a 20-inning marathon in the afternoon game of a doubleheader, 4-2...A's catcher Ossee Schreckengost works all 29 innings of the doubleheader to set a major league record...in **1974** California's Winston Llenas hits a pinch hit home run off Vida Blue in the sixth inning to end Oakland's club record streak of 136 2/3 innings without allowing a home run...in **1988** Mark McGwire homers in the 16th inning for the second consecutive day as the A's defeat the Cleveland Indians 4-2...McGwire has a solo shot in the 16th inning the day before at Toronto as the A's have a two-day span where they play 32 innings and 9 hours and 54 minutes of baseball in two cities.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from Arizona but have lost seven of the last 11 games since winning a season high six in a row...are 38-47 (.447) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 16-27 (.372) since then, which is the second worst mark in the AL (Kansas City, 14-29)...are now six games behind Texas and Los Angeles...have spent each of the last 35 days and 42 of the last 43 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 46 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 1.98 ERA (34 er in 154.1 ip) and .202 (114 for 563) opponents batting average over the last 17 games...now has a 3.12 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...the last time the A's had an ERA under 3.18 was in 1989 (3.09)...lead the majors in pickoffs (16)...A's starting pitchers are 9-5 with a 1.97 ERA (24 er in 109.2 ip), .200 (80 for 400) opponents batting average, 33 walks, 90 strikeouts and six home runs over the last 17 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.14 ERA (184 er in 527.0 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.11) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.05).

OFFENSE: The A's have reached double figures in hits in each of the last four games and are 41 for 136 (.301) with 18 runs scored over that span after hitting .181 with nine runs scored over the previous seven games...are batting .238 with a .343 slugging percentage overall, both of which are second lowest in the American League ahead of Seattle (.226/.336)...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.304)...the Oakland record for lowest marks in those categories is a .236 batting average in 1982, a .343 slugging percentage in 1968 and a .302 on-base percentage in 1979...have the second fewest runs scored (299) ahead of the Mariners (286)...are on pace to score 569 runs and have not scored fewer than 573 runs in a non-strike season since 1978 (532)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit two home runs in an inning for the first time this year yesterday when Jackson and Sizemore went deep in the sixth inning...have two two-homer games over the last four games after going an Oakland record 32 consecutive games with one home run or fewer...have gone 56 games since their last three-homer game (May 2 vs. Texas)...have 45 home runs for the season, which is **tied with San Diego for the fewest in the majors**...are on pace to hit 86 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has allowed five home runs in the last five games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 53 home runs for the season, which is tied with Seattle for the fewest in the American League...are on pace to allow 101 home runs and have not allowed fewer than 103 home runs in a non-strike season since 1976 (96).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 66 errors, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 72) and third most in the majors (Chicago, 69)...the errors have led to 45 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Texas, 48)...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (88).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this nine-game homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand which was their best homestand since 2006...are 22-19 (.537) at home for the season but are 16-28 (.364) on the road, which is the second worst record in the American League...leave following the game Wednesday for a four-game road trip to Texas, which takes the A's into the All-Star Break...went 2-4 on the last road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2) and have lost 19 of the last 24 on the road...are batting .251 (339 for 1352) with 158 runs scored in 41 home games (3.85 per game) and .226 (340 for 1506) with 141 runs scored in 44 games on the road (3.20 per game)...have a 2.87 ERA (120 er in 376.0 ip) at home, which is the lowest mark in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 12-18 (.400) in one-run games, which is tied with Houston for the worst record in the majors...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the worst mark in the American League...the 14 extra inning games are second most in the AL...are now 12-26 (.316) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-18 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-15 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last year.

ALL-STAR: Gio Gonzalez was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team yesterday...it is his first All-Star selection.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's went 8-10 in interleague play, their third consecutive season with a losing record against the National League...it was just the fifth time in 15 interleague seasons the A's finished with a losing interleague record...are 21-33 (.389) over the last three years, which is tied for the second worst mark in the majors, but are 144-122 (.541) all-time, which is the seventh best record...compiled a 2.09 ERA, which was second lowest in the majors behind Seattle (1.68) and the lowest in Oakland history...also set Oakland interleague records for strikeouts (140) and fewest home runs (8)...batted .223, which was third lowest in the majors...the offense set Oakland interleague records for most stolen bases (16), fewest runs (50), fewest hits (132), fewest triples (0) and lowest on-base percentage (.283)

IN JUNE: The A's went 9-17 (.346) in the month of June, which was the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it was the fourth lowest winning percentage in June in Oakland history and the worst since 1986 (7-22, .241)...it marks the third consecutive season the A's finished June with a losing record...had a .312 slugging percentage, which was the lowest mark in the majors and the second lowest in Oakland history in a month of 20 or more games (.299 in April, 1979)...tied for the fewest home runs in the majors (12)...had the second lowest batting average (.222) and on-base percentage (.292) in the AL and the second fewest runs scored (85)...the batting average and on-base percentage were second worst by an A's team since 1983 (.220 and .285 in August, 2008)...the pitching staff ranked fifth in the AL in ERA (3.38).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season, his first since being reinstated from the disabled list yesterday...the A's are 2-7 (.222) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 29-36 (.446) in his 65 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in eight of his nine starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer all nine times.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has matched the longest losing streak of his career as he is 0-4 despite a 3.89 ERA (41.2 ip, 45 h, 23 r, 18 er, 8 bb, 23 so) opponents batting average over his last six starts...also lost four straight from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run in 63.2 innings and it came April 21 at Seattle, a solo shot by Kennedy...the one home run is the fewest among all Major League pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .208 (15 for 72) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .317 (53 for 167) after that...opponents are batting .390 (16 for 41) with runners in scoring position.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is tied for the most among Major League pitchers (Garza, CHI-NL; Verlander, DET)...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

2011 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto **April 5**...gave up only one run over the first five innings when Hill drove in Escobar on a force out...however, then allowed four runs, three earned, in the sixth inning...Lind drove in Davis with a sacrifice fly, Hill singled home Escobar and Encarnacion scored Hill with a double...Snider then brought in Rivera, who had reached on a Kouzmanoff throwing error, on a groundout to tie the game at 5-5...then pitched two more scoreless innings before being relieved by Blevins to start the ninth after throwing 89 pitches...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle, a no decision in a 7-4 Rangers win (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 so)...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota **April 10**...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...he struck out five and did not walk a batter, the eighth start of his career in which he did not allow a walk...was replaced by Blevins with one out and runners on second and third in the eighth inning, with both runners going on to score...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss **April 15** against Detroit in Oakland...gave up six hits, walked one and recorded a season-high seven strikeouts...it was his most strikeouts in a game since also recording seven strikeouts May 13, 2009 with Texas against Seattle...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle **April 21**...the complete game was his second of his career, his first since May 24, 2009 with Texas at Houston...allowed the game's only run in the fourth inning when Kennedy hit a home run with one out...allowed only four hits, with the home run being the only hit that went for extra bases, while walking one and striking out six...he threw 64 of 99 pitches for strikes...was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles **April 26**...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...surrendered two runs in the second inning, three in the third and two more in the fifth...was then replaced by Ziegler with one out in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Texas **May 2** in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...had a 1-0 lead when Young hit a two-run double in the third inning...the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth but sacrifice flies by Young and Beltré in the fifth gave Texas a 4-2 lead...left after six innings trailing 4-3 but Willingham homered in the eighth and Matsui in the 10th for the win...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City **May 7**...both of his complete games have been losses...allowed seven hits and walked two...retired each of the first 14 batters before Hosmer singled with two outs in the fifth...then allowed three runs in the sixth inning on RBI singles by Cabrera and Gordon and a Butler sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with three in the eighth but he allowed an Aviles sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth for the loss...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 13**...allowed all four of the runs in the second inning...the first run scored on a fielders choice but Vizquel followed with a RBI double and Beckham scored on a sacrifice fly before his own error on a pickoff attempt allowed Vizquel to score...shutout the Rangers on two hits over his final five innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning loss to Minnesota May 18...allowed a RBI single to Morneau in the first inning but the A's came back with two runs in the second...then allowed two runs in the third on a two-run single by Plouffe...then retired 13 of the final 17 hitters he faced...the A's scored once in the sixth inning to tie the game and he was relieved by Balfour to start the eighth.

McCARTHY vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-3 with a 5.45 ERA (36.1 ip, 40 h, 22 r, 22 er, 8 bb, 30 so, 9 hr) in eight career appearances, including six starts...is 1-0 with a 4.29 ERA (10 er in 21.0 ip) in four games in his home ballparks and 0-3 with a 7.04 ERA (12 er in 15.1 ip) in four games at Safeco Field...is 1-2 with a 5.51 ERA (20 er in 32.2 ip) in his six starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 1-0 A's loss at Seattle April 21...tossed a complete-game four-hitter but Hernandez, Wright and League combined to shutout the A's on five hits...allowed the only run of the game on a one-out home run by Kennedy in the fourth inning.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (8-6, 3.28 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season...is 2-6 with a 4.65 ERA and a .277 opponents batting average over his last 10 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...is tied for eighth in the American League in wins (8)...is tied for the lead in most stolen bases allowed (17), ranks second in wild pitches (11) and third in walks (48)...is 3-1 with a 1.76 ERA in five starts against AL West competition this year and 5-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...now has a 14-7 record and a 2.27 ERA in 26 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 22-20 with a 4.34 ERA in 54 starts against everyone else...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss to Florida last Thursday (4.2 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 2-3 with a 2.61 ERA in seven career starts against Seattle, including 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (10.2 ip, 11 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 10 so) in two starts this year.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

8-16, 3.07 ERA (237.2 ip, 203 h, 97 r, 81 er, 96 bb, 209 so, 15 hr) Save/Save Opportunities: 22/30 (73.3%)

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in nine of the past 10 games and has a 1.52 ERA (4 er in 23.2 ip) over that span...now has a 3.07 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...has the lowest opponents batting average (.231) and second lowest on-base percentage (.309) and slugging percentage (.338)...is tied for the fewest wins (8) and has the second most losses (16)...has allowed 15 home runs, which ranks third fewest...ranks third with 55 first batter strikeouts...has allowed 33 of 97 (34.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL.

- Has recorded seven saves since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29, which is tied for eighth most in the American League over that span...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has not allowed a run over his past nine appearances (9.1 ip) and in 11 of his 12 outings this season (1 er in 12.1 ip, 0.73 ERA).
- Has not allowed a run in his past nine outings (8.2 ip) against Seattle and is 1-0 with a 1.65 ERA and four saves in five opportunities in 15 career appearances (16.1 ip, 11 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 16 so, 1 hr).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 28 retroactive to June 22 with a strained right oblique...it is his sixth career appearance on the DL.

LAST 10 STARTS: Is 2-6 with a 4.65 ERA (31 er in 60.0 ip) and a .277 (62 for 224) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...his current stretch includes a career-high five-game losing streak from May 15 to June 14 (5.67 ERA, .302 opponents average).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to Florida on Thursday in Oakland...allowed just one unearned run over the first four innings as Ramirez scored on a DeJesus error in the second...then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on RBI singles by Ramirez and Morrison and a two-run double by Buck...was relieved by Magnuson after the Buck double, lasting just 4.2 innings...it was his fifth outing of the season under 5.0 innings.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
