Brandon League is leads the AL with 22 saves...has not allowed an earned run in last 19 appearances (18.2 IP) & is 13-for-13 in save opportunities... **streak of 19 straight appearances without allowing an ER is T8th-longest in club history.**

BACK-TO-BACK CG's

Jason Vargas & Doug Fister threw back-to-back complete games, July 1-2... first time since June 29 (C. Lee) & June 30 (F. Hernandez) of last season that the Mariners have notched consecutive CG.

HE'S TOUGH LATE

9 of **Dustin Ackley's** 13 hits this season have come in the 7th inning or later... Ackley is batting .600 (9x15) with 6 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 home run and 3 RBI after after the 6th inning...he is also batting .500 (7x14) vs. relievers, compared to .207 (6x29) vs. starters.

GUTI IN THE FIELD

Franklin Gutierrez leads the team and T10th in the AL with 5 outfield assists despite playing in only 39 G (34 GS) in center field... **has not made an error in 231 consecutive games (225 GS) dating back to 8/21/09, a string of 647 consecutive errorless chances.**

DAY TRIPPER

David Pauley is 1-0, 0.00 in 12 DAY games this season...he has not allowed a run in 20.2 innings under the sun...is only qualifying AL pitcher with a zero ERA in day games this season.

RHP **Blake Beavan** made his Major League debut yest., becoming the 7th Mariner to make his MLB debut this season (Pineda, Wilhelmson, Lueke, Peguero, M. Wilson, Ackley)...the club record for most MLB debuts in a season is 15 set in 2004.

ON THE AIR

Mariners are using rotation of announcers this season, all former partners of HOF announcer Dave Niehaus...**Rick Rizzs, Dave Sims** and **Mike Blowers** will work nearly all the games, while **Ron Fairly, Ken Levine, Ken Wilson, Dave Valle, Dave Henderson, Jay Buhner** and **Dan Henderson** will mix in...Rizzs and Ken Wilson will be in the radio booth today, with Sims and Blowers calling the action on TV.

THIS DATE IN 2001

On this date in 2001, Mike Cameron recorded 3 hits including his 19th double of the season in Mariners 3-6 loss at Texas...the **Mariners will celebrate the 2001 team on July 16**; see full release in back of the press box.



TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners begin a pivotal 2-team, 7-game roadtrip vs. AL West opponents the Oakland Athletics (3 games) and Los Angeles Angels (4 games)...went 4-5 on just completed 9-game homestand vs. Florida (2-1), Atlanta (0-3) & San Deigo (2-1)...currently in 3rd place in the AL West, 2.5 games behind division leaders Los Angeles & Texas...today's game will be televised in the Northwest on **ROOT SPORTS** in HD & broadcast on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...won yesterday...are 7-9 in last 16 and 10-13 in last 23...have still won 25 of last 45... **33-29 over last 61 games**, including season-high 6G winning streak (May 18-23) & 5G win streak (April 26-30)...are 25-23 in games played at Safeco Field, 16-20 on the road...are 31-29 in night games, 10-14 during the day (**won 8 of last 13 day games**)...9-9 during Interleague play.

- **Close Games** -- 45 of 84 games have been decided by 2 or fewer runs (15-16 in 1-run, 6-8 in 2-run).
- The Mariners have used 75 different batting lineups in 83 games (62 different defensive lineups).
- **Comeback Wins** -- recorded 19 comeback wins this season, T2nd in the AL (TOR - 21, LAA - 19).
- **Shutouts** -- 2nd in AL w/9 ShO (DET-10)...held opponents to 2 or less runs MLB high 36 times.
- **Jamey Wright** -- is 1 appearance short of 500 in his career...246 starts, 253 relief outings.
- **Dustin Ackley** -- batting .302 (13x43) with 5 walks in 13 games...is 7-for-9 (.778) vs. LHP.

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...today is the eighth (4-3) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2011...went 2-3 in first trip to Oakland, April 1-3 and 2-2 at Safeco, April 21-24...the Mariners went 6-13 against the A's last season, including 2-7 at Oakland Coliseum...Seattle is 47-36 vs. Oakland since 2007...Mariners trail the all-time series 211-286, including a 90-159 mark in Oakland (dropped 8 of last 11 and 10 of last 14 in OAK).

4TH OF JULY...Seattle is 15-17 all-time on the 4th of July, playing 23 of 32 games on the road...has won 4 straight, and 5 of 6, 4th of July games, including an 8-1 win last season at Detroit...lost 4-9 on July 4, 1978 vs. the Athletics in only previous meeting between the two teams on this National Holiday...will wear special Red, White and Blue hats for Independence Day.

WHAT A DEBUT...**Blake Beavan** earned the win yesterday in his first Major League start, allowing only one run on three hits in 7.0 innings...Beavan is the ninth Mariner starter to record a win in his ML debut and first since **Travis Blackley** on July 1, 2004...the other seven Mariners to start and win in their ML debut: **Bob Stoddard** (9/4/81), **Matt Young** (4/6/83), **Mark Langston** (4/7/84), **Pat Rice** (5/18/91), **Bob Wolcott** (8/18/95), **Freddy Garcia** (4/7/99) and **Joel Pineiro** (8/8/2000-G1).

ALL-STARS AMONG US...Mariners pitchers **Felix Hernandez** (2nd ASG) and **Brandon League** (1st ASG) have been elected to play for the American League in the 82nd All-Star Game July 12 in Phoenix...this marks the first time since 2003 that the Mariners will have multiple pitchers represented in the Midsummer Classic (Moyer, Hasegawa).

BULLPEN STREAKING...the Mariners bullpen has not allowed a run in last 13.0 innings since June 24...during this stretch they have limited opponents to a .170 average (8x47), while walking 2 and striking out 10...this season the Mariners relievers rank fourth in the AL with a 3.30 ERA.

5 IS NOT ENOUGH...with his start yesterday, **Blake Beavan** became just the 6th Mariner starting pitcher this season...Seattle was the final team in the Majors to make all of its starts by 5 pitchers... Chicago (AL), Detroit, Milwaukee, Minnesota, Pittsburgh, San Francisco and Texas have all divided their starts among 6 pitchers.

SINGLES = WIN...all 6 of the Mariners hits yesterday we singles...it marks just the sixth time this season the Mariners have not recorded an extra-base hit in a game, but only the second time the team has recorded all singles and won (last: April 22 vs. OAK).

HE JUST GETS ON BASE...**Dustin Ackley** has reached base safely, via hit or walk, in first 13 games of his MLB career...**13-game streak** is 2nd longest streak by Mariner to begin a career **behind Alvin Davis' 47-game streak in 1984.**

IT MUST BE THE SUNSHINE...Mariners starters have allowed only two runs in last 25.0 innings (0.72 ERA)...during this stretch starters have limited opponents to a .170 average (15x88), while walking 3 and striking out 18.

NOT JUST GOOD, RECORD SETTING GOOD...Mariners starters lead the American League (2nd in MLB) with a 3.11 ERA (194 ER, 560.2 IP); the club record is 3.67, set in 1990...the team has only had a starters ERA of under 4.00 in six seasons prior to 2011, including last season when it finished with a 3.83 mark, 3rd-best mark ever (3.77 in 2001 ranks 2nd).

STRONG START(ERS)...Mariners starters have tossed at least 7.0 innings in 46 games this year, 2nd most in Majors (PHI, 47)...tossed at least 7.0 in 15 of last 19 games...on pace for 89 starts of 7.0+ IP which would be the best in club history (84, 1993)...had 69 starts of 7.0+ IP in 2010.

GOING NATIONAL...the Mariners finished 9-9 vs. the NL this season: San Diego (3-0 road, 2-1 home), Philadelphia (2-1), Atlanta (0-3), @Washington (0-3), @Florida (2-1)...marks the 12 consecutive seasons posting at least a .500 record in Interleague play (since 2000), going 124-92 (.574) during that stretch...their 12 straight seasons is the 2nd-longest streak in the Majors: 1. NYY - 14; 2. SEA - 12; 3. BOS - 9; 4. LAA/TEX - 5...**Mariners are 145-121 all-time in Interleague play, the 6th-best winning percentage in Interleague Play (.545).**

AS YOU KNOW...**Blake Beavan** allowed one run on three hits in seven innings to earn a victory in his Major League debut as the Mariners topped the Padres, 3-1 on Sunday...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that Beavan is only the second starting pitcher in Mariners history to win his first game in the Majors while allowing no more than one run...the first was **Pat Rice**, whose only big-league victory came in his debut, when he threw 5.2 scoreless innings at Yankee Stadium in a 4-1 Mariners triumph on May 18, 1991.

ABOUT PINEDA...

- Will be making 17th Major League start today vs. the A's.
- Owns a career minor league record of 31-14 with a 2.49 ERA (112 ER, 404.1 IP) in 86 G/71 GS.
- Signed as a non-drafted free agent Dec. 5, 2005; signed by Mariners scouts Patrick Guerrero and Franklin Taveras.
- Made professional debut in 2006 in the Dominican Summer League (2-1, 0.44, 8 G, 3 GS).
- Was a finalist for the 2010 *USA Today* Minor League Player of the Year, winning the fan vote portion of the award.
- Ranked by MLB.com (#13) and *Baseball America* (#16) as one of the top prospects in baseball heading into 2011.
- Named by *Baseball America* as the No. 3 prospect in the Southern League and Pacific Coast League.
- the 7th-youngest player on a 2011 Opening Day roster at 22 years, 72 days (as of March 31)...was the 3rd-youngest AL player behind Royals LHP Tim Collins (21.222) and White Sox LHP Chris Sale (22.001).
- **Pineda is 6-7, 260**...he is listed in the Mariners 2011 Media Guide at 6-5, 245.

LAST TIME OUT...L#5 in last start June 28 vs. Atlanta (6.1,4,5,4,5,5,HR)...left the game with the Mariners leading 3-2 and the bases loaded (Aaron Laffey allowed all 3 runs to score)...tied career-high with 5 walks (also: 5/27 vs. NYY).

JUNE RECAP...tied Felix Hernandez for team lead with 6 starts in June...went 1-3 with a 3.03 ERA (13 ER, 38.2 IP)...pitched at least 6.0 innings in 5 of 6 starts during the month...struck out 33 and walked 13.

HOME VS. ROAD...is 4-2, 2.44 ERA (14 ER, 51.2 IP) in 8 starts at home...has allowed 1 or fewer earned runs in 5 of his 8 outings at Safeco Field...compares to a 3-3, 2.86 ERA (16 ER, 50.1 IP) in 8 starts on the road.

BREAKING UP A NO-HITTER...Pineda recorded his first career hit June 23 at WAS, a single with 1 out in the 6th inning which broke up Jason Marquis' no-hit bid...the last time a player got his first career hit to break up a no-hit bid of 5+ innings was August 3, 1986, when Luis Rivera's first career hit ended a 6 1/3 inning no-hit bid by Bob Ojeda.

THE WEST...is 1-2 with a 3.32 ERA (7 ER, 19.0 IP) in 3 starts vs. AL West opponents...only division to have a sub .500 record against in his young career: AL East (1-0, 2.84), AL Central (3-2, 2.87), NL East (1-1, 2.33), NL West (1-0, 0.00).

SET THE ALARM EARLY...is 2-0, 1.38 ERA (4 ER, 26.0 IP) in 4 day game starts this season...opponents are batting .189 (17x90) with 9 walks and 30 K's...currently ranks 5th among AL pitchers with a 1.38 ERA during the day.

PUNCHOUTS...enters today's start ranked T10th in the AL (tops among Major League rookies) with 99 strikeouts...has recorded at least 5 strikeouts in 13 of 16 starts, including 10 consecutive April 12-June 1...became just the 2nd Mariners rookie to record at least 5 strikeouts in 10 straight starts: Mark Langston, 13 straight during AL Rookie Pitcher of the Year season in 1984.

BACK-TO-BACK 7.0 Sho...recorded back-to-back starts with 7.0 shutout innings, and tossed career-high streak of 14.0 consecutive scoreless innings May 16-21...is the 3rd Mariners rookie pitcher with back-to-back starts of at least 7.0 or more IP and 0 runs allowed: Mark Langston (June 26-July 1, 1984) & Bob Stoddard (Sept. 12-17, 1982).

LOTS OF K'S, LITTLE WALKS...ranks 12th in the AL with a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.09 (99 strikeouts, 32 walks)...the Mariners single-season rookie record is 2.34 set by Erik Hanson in 1989 and the AL rookie record is 4.50 set by Francisco Liriano (MIN) in 2006 (min. 15 GS)...Mariners single-season record (non-rookie) is 4.52 by Randy Johnson in 1995 (294 strikeouts, 65 walks).

ROOKIE RANKINGS...amongst American League rookie starters, ranks 1st ERA (2.65), strikeouts (99) and opp. avg (.198) and 3rd in innings pitched (102.0) and in wins (7).

AMERICAN LEAGUE RANKINGS...amongst American League starters, ranks 4th in K/9.0 IP (8.74) and 4th in opponent batting (.198), 6th in ERA (2.65), T7th in quality starts (12), T12th in strikeouts (99), 12th in K/BB ratio (3.09) and T21st in wins (7).

APRIL ROOKIE PITCHER OF THE MONTH...Pineda was named American League Rookie of the Month for April...he is the third Mariners player to receive the Rookie of the Month award, joining Ichiro Suzuki (4x; April, May, Aug. and Sept., 2001) and Rafael Soriano (Aug., 2003)...was 4-1 with a 2.01 (7 ER, 31.1 IP) in 5 starts in April...limited opponents to a .198 average (22x111), while walking 12 and striking out 30...first Mariners rookie pitcher to record 4 wins in the month of April...only the second Mariners rookie starter to win 4 games in a month; he joins Freddy Garcia (August, 1999).

ROOKIES IN APRIL...Pineda is only the 5th rookie pitcher in modern Major-League history (i.e., since 1900) to win 4 consecutive starts in one season before the end of April...the other rookies to do that were Monte Weaver (1932 Senators), Jerry Koosman (1968 Mets), Fernando Valenzuela (1981 Dodgers, 5 in a row) and Kaz Ishii (2002 Dodgers, 5).

NEVER FORGET YOUR FIRST...recorded first career win in Mariners 3-2 victory over Toronto on April 12 in Safeco Field debut...allowed 2 runs (1 ER) on 5 hits in 7.1 innings...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings before allowing 2 runs in the 8th...became the first Mariner since Joel Pineiro in 2000 to record a quality start in his Major League debut...he was the second rookie this season to toss a QS in his MLB debut (Zach Britton, BAL vs. TB).

NOT SINCE FREDDY...Pineda became the first Mariners rookie pitcher to crack the Opening Day starting rotation since Freddy Garcia in 1999.

AND NOT SINCE FELIX...Pineda also became the first Mariners pitcher to make his ML debut in a start since **Felix Hernandez** on Aug. 4, 2005.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS...

- Limiting opponents to .198 (73x369) batting average, including a .182 (33x181) vs. right-handers...23 of his 73 hits allowed have been for extra-bases (13 2B, 2 3B, 8 HR)...limiting opposing batters to a .135 average (28x207) when he gets 2 strikes on a batter.
- According to FanGraphs.com, tied for MLB lead among starters with an average fastball velocity of 95.1 mph (J. Verlander is also at 95.1 mph).
- Leadoff hitters are 5-for-43 (.116), and cleanup hitters are just 9-for-42 (.214).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP FELIX HERNANDEZ (8-7, 3.35)

25-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season tomorrow vs. the A's...**elected to the AL All-Star team for the 2nd time in his career**...L#7 in last start June 29 vs. Atlanta (7.2,10,5,5,3,6)...is 2-2, 3.52 (12 ER, 30.2 IP) over his last 4 starts...has not won consecutive starts since April 21 (vs. OAK) & April 26 (at DET)...among AL starters ranks 3rd in strikeouts (124), 4th in innings pitched (129.0) and tied for the league lead with 18 starts...struck out 13 batters, tying career-high on May 22 at San Diego...has recorded a quality start in 37 of last 45 starts (12 of 18 this season)...earned a CG victory in season debut on Opening Day April 1 at OAK (9.0,5,2,2,0,5,HR)...was first OD CG since Ben Sheets in 2007 and 9.0 IP CG by an AL pitcher since Bartolo Colon in 2002...first AL OD performance since Rick Rhoden to record a CG win (9.0 IP) with zero walks (4/5/88 NYY vs. MIN)...**2010** -- won the AL Cy Young award going 13-12, 2.27 with 232 strikeouts in 34 starts...led the AL in innings, ERA, quality starts (30), opponent batting average (.212), T1st in starts (34) and 2nd in strikeouts...**Career** -- is 79-60 with a 3.21 ERA in 190 career starts...79 career wins currently ranks 3rd on the Mariners all-time wins list, tops among RHP...**vs. OAK** -- is 11-4, 2.61 in 19 stats vs. OAK, including 2-0, 1.08 in 2 starts this season.
