A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail in the season series, 5-3...have lost three of four in Oakland and split a four-game series in Seattle in April...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 36-48 (.429) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 286-212 (.574) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .575)...are 159-91 in Oakland and 127-121 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 160-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...the record is 165 by Jermaine Dye from Sept. 25, 2002-Aug. 6, 2004.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1989 Mark McGwire connects off Charlie Leibrandt for his 100th career homer, a three-run shot in the third inning...he drives in five runs in the A's 12-9, 11-inning loss to Kansas City...in **1993** Rickey Henderson becomes the second player in ML history to lead off both games of a doubleheader with a homer...Boston's Harry Hopper was the first on May 30, 1913 vs. Washington...prior to the game, Rollie Fingers has number 34 retired...in 1 his 34 retired Henderson 1994 Rickey becomes Oakland's all-time leader in games played when he plays in his 1411th game as an Athletic...the A's win at New York 8-7...in **1996** the A's set an Oakland record and 13 runs in the first inning of a 16-8 win over California...Matt Stairs tied a Major League record by driving in six runs in the inning on a two-run single and a grand slam

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost eight of the last 12 games since winning a season high six in a row...are 38-48 (.442) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 16-28 (.364) since then, which is the second worst mark in the AL (Kansas City, 14-30)...are now seven games behind Texas and Los Angeles, which is one short of the season high of eight (last: June 14)...have spent each of the last 36 days and 43 of the last 44 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 47 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 1.98 ERA (36 er in 163.1 ip) and .202 (120 for 594) opponents batting average over the last 18 games...now has a 3.11 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...the last time the A's had an ERA under 3.18 was in 1989 (3.09)...lead the majors in pickoffs (16)...A's starting pitchers are 9-6 with a 2.01 ERA (26 er in 116.1 ip), .199 (84 for 422) opponents batting average, 35 walks, 95 strikeouts and seven home runs over the last 18 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.14 ERA (186 er in 533.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.10) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.01).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .217 (86 for 397) with 28 runs scored over the last 12 games (2.3 runs per game)...are hitting .236 with a .341 slugging percentage overall, both of which are second lowest in the American League ahead of Seattle (.226/.336)...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.303)...the Oakland record for lowest marks in those categories is a .236 batting average in 1982, a .343 slugging percentage in 1968 and a .302 on-base percentage in 1979...have the second fewest runs scored (300) ahead of the Mariners (288)...are on pace to score 565 runs and have not scored fewer than 573 runs in a non-strike season since 1978 (532)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 45 home runs, which is the **fewest in the majors**...are on pace to hit 85 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 57 games...the last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed six home runs in the last six games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 54 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the AL to Seattle (53)...are on pace to allow 102 home runs and have not allowed fewer than 103 home runs in a non-strike season since 1976 (96).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 12-19 (.387) in one-run games with the loss yesterday, which is for the worst record in the majors...are tied for third in the American League in one-run decisions (31)...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games, which is the worst mark in the AL...the 14 extra inning games are second most in the AL...are now 12-26 (.316) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-19 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-15 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone four consecutive games without an error but have 66 for the season...rank second in the American League and third in the majors in errors...the errors have led to 45 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Texas, 47)...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (90).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on this nine-game homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Seattle (0-1)...went 5-1 on the last homestand which was their best homestand since 2006...are 22-20 (.524) at home for the season but are 16-28 (.364) on the road, which is the second worst record in the American League...leave following the game tomorrow for a four-game road trip to Texas, which takes the A's into the All-Star Break...went 2-4 on the last road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2) and have lost 19 of the last 24 on the road...are batting .248 (342 for 1381) with 159 runs scored in 42 home games (3.79 per game) and .226 (340 for 1506) with 141 runs scored in 44 games on the road (3.20 per game)...have a 2.85 ERA (122 er in 385.0 ip) at home, which is the lowest mark in the AL.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 0-1 in this stretch of 11 consecutive games against all three American League West opponents...after this three-game series with the Mariners the A's have a four-game series with Texas before hosting Los Angeles in a four-game series after the All-Star Break...are 12-11 (.522) against the West for the season but are 26-37 (.413) against everyone else.

ALL-STAR: Gio Gonzalez was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team Sunday...it is his first All-Star selection...Gonzalez was also named AL Co-Player of the Week along with Toronto's Jose Bautista after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a ML leading 16 strikeouts last week.

IN JUNE: The A's went 9-17 (.346) in the month of June, which was the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it was the fourth lowest winning percentage in June in Oakland history and the worst since 1986 (7-22, .241)...had a .312 slugging percentage, which was the lowest mark in the majors and the second lowest in Oakland history in a month of 20 or more games (.299 in April, 1979)...tied for the fewest home runs in the majors (12)...had the second lowest batting average (.222) and on-base percentage (.292) in the AL and the second fewest runs scored (85).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Anderson, Balfour, Braden, Ross, Willingham) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season...the A's are 8-10 (.444) in his starting assignments this year and are 44-36 (.550) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in nine of his 18 starts, allowed one run or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

LAST 10 STARTS: Is 2-6 with a 4.65 ERA (31 er in 60.0 ip) and a .277 (62 for 224) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...his current stretch includes a career-high five-game losing streak from May 15 to June 14 (5.67 ERA, .302 opponents average).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for eighth in the American League in wins (8)...ranks second in most stolen bases allowed (17) and wild pitches (11) and fourth in walks

(48)...the 11 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when three pitchers had at least 11 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14, Haynes 11).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-1 with a 1.76 ERA (6 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts against American League West competition this year and 5-5 with a 3.86 ERA (35 er in 81.2 ip) in 13 starts against everyone else...now has a 14-7 record and a 2.27 ERA (41 er in 162.1 ip) in 26 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 22-20 with a 4.34 ERA (157 er in 325.1 ip) in 54 starts against everyone else.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-4 with a 2.83 ERA (18 er in 57.1 ip) in nine starts at home and 4-2 with a 3.76 ERA (23 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on the road...is now 22-14 with a 3.17 ERA (94 er in 267.0 ip) in 42 career starts in Oakland and 14-13 with a 4.24 ERA (104 er in 220.2 ip) in 38 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .146 (7 for 48) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is second lowest in the American League (Harrison, TEX .132)...opponents are hitting .217 (20 for 92) with runners in scoring position...that includes .114 over his first eight starts and .281 (16 for 57) over his last nine starts...has allowed nine home runs and six have been solo shots.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 4-5 with a 4.38 ERA (35 er in 72.0 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest and 4-1 with a 1.34 ERA (6 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

WINS: Is 26-13 with a 2.96 ERA (100 er in 304.0 ip) and .228 (251 for 1102) opponents batting average in 47 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are fifth most in the majors over that span...is 36-27 (.571) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day *April 1* in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...improved to 6-0 in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas *May 9* but was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago *May 15* in Oakland...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave

Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss ended a career-high seven-game winning streak as he also won his final start of 2010...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-0 loss to New York **May 30** in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...had a no decision in the 9-8, 14-inning loss at Boston **June 4**...the scored was tied at 2-2 when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the sixth...the A's scored four times in the ninth to send the game into extra innings...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 9-4 loss at Chicago **June 9**...allowed a season-high six runs in a season-low 2.2 innings...lost his career-high fifth consecutive decision in the A's 7-4 loss to Kansas City **June 14** in Oakland...walked seven batters in 4.1 innings and did not record a strikeout... the only other pitcher in Oakland history to walk seven or more batters in a game without striking out a batter is Mike Norris with eight on April 16, 1979 against Seattle...snapped his losing streak at a career-high five games in the A's 2-1 win over San Francisco **June 19** in Oakland...tossed a career-high seven batters in the A's 4-1 win at Philadelphia **June 25**...retired 12 straight and 17 of 18 at one point.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to Florida on Thursday in Oakland...allowed just one unearned run over the first four innings as Ramirez scored on a DeJesus error in the second...then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on RBI singles by Ramirez and Morrison and a two-run double by Buck...was relieved by Magnuson after the Buck double, lasting just 4.2 innings...it was his fifth outing of the season under 5.0 innings.

CAHILL vs. SEATTLE: Is 2-3 with a 2.61 ERA (41.1 ip, 39 h, 13 r, 12 er, 16 bb, 26 so, 3 hr) in seven career starts...is 2-1 with a 3.04 ERA (8 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts in Seattle and 0-2 with a 2.04 ERA (4 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland...is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (10.2 ip, 11 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 10 so) in two starts this year...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day April 1 in Oakland...walked Suzuki to start the game but then retired each of the next eight batters...walked Cust with the bases loaded in the third inning to make the score 2-1 and was relieved by Blevins with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second...Blevins got the final out but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was the first time in his 63 career starts the A's bullpen blew a save...then picked up the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle April 23...allowed a run in the second on a Wilson RBI single but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...the A's scored once in the third, three times in the fourth and five times in the sixth for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Guillermo Moscoso (2-4, 2.51 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and eighth start of the season...went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the four-game losing streak is the longest of his career...has received no run support in four of his last five starts and is 0-3 with a 2.17 ERA (7 er in 29.0 ip) over that span...has run support of 2.93 in his seven starts for the season...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-0 A's loss to Florida last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 8 so)...has never faced Seattle in his career...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 24 after going 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts, with the River Cats.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

WITH THE A'S: Last Friday against Arizona, made his first start as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and compiled a 37-19 record and a 3.42 ERA (208 er in 547.2 ip) in 98 games, 90 starts...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

SINCE 2003: Has 864 strikeouts in 851.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.13 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 10.03)...has a .224 (698 for 3123) opponents batting average over that span, which is third best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221 and Jason Schmidt, .223).

LAST START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona last Friday in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...the A's scored a run in the fourth and four more in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler to start the seventh.

HARDEN vs. TEXAS: Is 5-2 with a 4.21 ERA (66.1 ip, 57 h, 34 r, 31 er, 30 bb, 65 so, 3 hr) in 12 career appearances, 11 starts...that includes 4-1 with a 2.45 ERA (12 er in 44.0 ip) in seven games, six starts, in Oakland and 1-1 with a 7.66 ERA (19 er in 22.1 ip) in five starts in Texas...is 5-2 with a 4.27 ERA (31 er in 65.1 ip) in his 11 starting assignments...pitched for Texas last year and is 3-3 with a 5.48 ERA (41 er in 67.1 ip) in 15 career appearances at Rangers Ballpark...last faced the Rangers May 11, 2008 and had a no decision in the A's 12-6 win...the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed a RBI double to Bradley in the first, a RBI single to Kinsler in the second, a two-run single by Saltalamacchia in the third and a Hamilton RBI triple in the fourth...left after 3.2 innings trailing 5-4.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and went 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts...struck out 12 batters in 7.2 innings...allowed a .115 (3 for 26) opponents batting average, including .083

2010 RECAP: Was 5-5 with a 5.58 ERA in 20 games, 18 starts, with Texas in a season where he was bothered by injuries and control problems much of the season, which resulted in two stints on the disabled list...the ERA was the highest of his major league career...issued 62 walks in 92.0 innings, an average of 6.07 per nine innings...that was the highest ratio in the majors among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...it was also sixth highest in team history and the highest since 1987 (Bobby Witt, 8.81; Mitch Williams, 7.79)...walked five or more batters in six of his 18 starts, including a season high six April 18 at New York and May 14 at Toronto.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for 10th in the American League in hit batters (9)...tied for fourth on the club in strikeouts (75), was fifth in starts and pitched the sixth most innings (92.0)...was also second on the team in hit batters and third in walks.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .238 (40-for-168) against right-handed hitters and .273 (51-for-187) against left-handers...yielded a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .220 the second time and .372 after that...his career numbers are .196 (238 for 1214), .222 (246 for 1109) and .268 (214 for 800).



THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA (4 er in 28.0 ip) and .153 (15 for 98) opponents batting average over his last four starts...has walked just nine and struck out 34...the three-game winning streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: Aug. 24-Sept. 8, 2010)...went 0-3 with a 4.34 ERA, a .264 batting average, 12 walks and nine strikeouts over his previous three starts.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
