9 of **Dustin Ackley's** 13 hits this season have come in the 7th inning or later... Ackley is batting .529 (9x17) with 6 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 home run and 3 RBI after after the 6th inning...he is also batting .467 (7x15) vs. relievers, compared to .188 (6x32) vs. starters.

GUTI IN THE FIELD

Franklin Gutierrez leads the team and T10th in the AL with 5 outfield assists despite playing in only 39 G (34 GS) in center field...<u>has not made an error</u> in 232 consecutive games (225 GS) dating back to 8/21/09, a string of 649 consecutive errorless chances.

ALL STARS AMONG US

Mariners pitchers Felix Hernandez (2nd ASG) and Brandon League (1st ASG) have been elected to play for the AL in the 82nd All-Star Game July 12 in Phoenix...this marks the first time since 2003 that the Mariners will have multiple pitchers represented in the Midsummer Classic (Moyer, Hasegawa).

ON THE AIR

Mariners are using rotation of announcers this season, all former partners of HOF announcer Dave Niehaus...Rick Rizzs, Dave Sims and Mike Blowers will work nearly all the games, while Ron Fairly, Ken Levine, Ken Wilson, Dave Valle, Dave Henderson, Jay Buhner and Dan Wilson will mix in... Rizzs and Ken Wilson will be in the radio booth tonight, with Sims and Blowers calling the action on TV.

THIS DATE IN 2001

On this date in 2001, **John Olerud** had a RBI single in the 1st and **Edgar** Martinez hit a solo home run in the 8th, but it wasn't enough as Texas defeated the Mariners 14-2....the Mariners will celebrate the 2001 team on July 16; see full release in back of the press box.



TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a pivotal 2-team, 7-game roadtrip vs. AL West opponents the Oakland Athletics (1-0) and Los Angeles Angels (4 games)...went 4-5 on just completed 9-game homestand vs. Florida (2-1), Atlanta (0-3) & San Deigo (2-1)...currently in 3rd place in the AL West, 2.5 games behind division leaders Los Angeles & Texas...tonight's game will be televised in the Northwest on ROOT SPORTS in HD & broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio

ODDS AND ENDS...won 2 in a row...are 8-9 in last 17 and 11-13 in last 24...have still won 26 of last 46... 34-28 over last 62 games, including season-high 6G winning streak (May 18-23) & 5G win streak (April 26-30)...are 25-23 in games played at Safeco Field, 17-20 on the road...are 31-29 in night games, 11-14 during the day (won 9 of last 14 day games)...went 9-9 during Interleague play.

- Close Games -- 46 of 85 games have been decided by 2 or fewer runs (16-16 in 1-run, 6-8 in 2-run). The Mariners have used 75 different batting lineups in 83 games (62 different defensive lineups).
- Comeback Wins -- recorded 20 comeback wins this season, 2nd in the AL (TOR 21).
- Shutouts -- 2nd in AL w/9 ShO (DET-10)...held opponents to 2 or less runs MLB high 38 times.
- Jamey Wright -- is 1 appearance short of 500 in his career...246 starts, 253 relief outings. Dustin Ackley -- batting .277 (13x47) with 5 walks in 14 games...is 7-for-10 (.700) vs. LHP.
- Ichiro currently ranks 2nd in the American League with 35 multi-hit games and 9th with 96 hits.
- The pitching staff currently has a 3.24 ERA during day games, 3rd in the American League.

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...tonight is the ninth (5-3) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2011...went 2-3 in first trip to Oakland, April 1-3 and 2-2 at Safeco, April 21-24...the Mariners went 6-13 against the A's last season, including 2-7 at Oakland Coliseum...Seattle is 48-36 vs. Oakland since 2007...Mariners trail the all-time series 212-286, including a 91-159 mark in Oakland (dropped 8 of last 12 and 10 of last 15 in OAK).

ANOTHER HIT FOR ICHIRO...Ichiro has recorded 268 career hits vs. the Athletics, ranking 3rd all-time (since 1968)...he trails only Rod Carew (282) and George Brett (271)...Ichiro is a career .333 (286x806) hitter vs. the Athletics...has recorded 4 consecutive multi-hit games vs. OAK, batting .529 (9x17) with 1 run scored, 1 double and 2 stolen bases.

CRAZY EIGHT...Michael Pineda earned his 8th win of the season in Mariners 2-1 victory over the Athletics yesterday...his 8 wins before the All-Star break currently ranks 3rd by a Mariners rookie pitcher...only Dave Fleming (11) and Freddy Garcia (9) have recorded more wins during their rookie campaign prior to the All-Star break...Pineda is scheduled to make one more start before the break.

WHAT A DEBUT...Blake Beavan earned the win Sunday in his first Major League start, allowing only one run on three hits in 7.0 innings...Beavan is the ninth Mariners in his ML debut as a starter and first since **Travis Blackley** on July 1, 2004...the other seven Mariners to start and win in their ML debut: **Bob** Stoddard (9/4/81), Matt Young (4/6/83), Mark Langston (4/7/84), Pat Rice (5/18/91), Bob Wolcott (8/18/95), Freddy Garcia (4/7/99) and Joel Pineiro (8/8/2000-G1).

BULLPEN STREAKING...the Mariners bullpen has not allowed a run in last 16.0 innings since June 24...during this stretch they have limited opponents to a .158 average (9x57), while walking 3 and striking out 13...this season the Mariners relievers rank fourth in the AL with a 3.25 ERA.

LEAGUE LEADERS...**Brandon League** is leads the AL with 23 saves...he has not allowed an earned run in last 20 appearances (19.2 IP) & is 14-for-14 in save opportunities...streak of 20 straight appearances without allowing an ER is T6th-longest in club history...League's 23 saves are already 14th-best in club single-season history, and 3rd-best pre-All-Star break.

ALWAYS COMING THROUGH...Justin Smoak has recorded the game-winning RBI in the last two consecutive games...he currently ranks T7th in the American League with 9 game-winning RBI this

IT MUST BE THE SUNSHINE...Mariners pitching staff have allowed only 3 runs in last 34.0 innings (0.75 ERA)...during this stretch they have limited opponents to a .153 average (19x24), while walking 7 and striking out 31...the current 4-game stretch of allowing 1 earned run or less is T5th all-time in franchise history...it is the third time this season the team has had a stretch of at least 4 games allowing 1 ER or less (5, 2x: May 18-22 and June 19-29).

NOT JUST GOOD, RECORD SETTING GOOD... Mariners starters lead the American League (2nd in MLB) with a 3.10 ERA (195 ER, 566.2 IP); the club record is 3.67, set in 1990...the team has only had a starters ERA of under 4.00 in six seasons prior to 2011, including last season when it finished with a 3.83 mark, 3rd-best mark ever (3.77 in 2001 ranks 2nd).

STRONG START(ERS)... Mariners starters have tossed at least 7.0 innings in 47 games this year, 2nd most in Majors (PHI, 48)...tossed at least 7.0 in 16 of last 20 games...on pace for 89 starts of 7.0+ IP which would be the best in club history (84, 1993)...had 69 starts of 7.0+ IP in 2010.

RIGHT ON... Mariners face a right-handed starter in each of next 6 games leading up to the All-Star break...Seattle is 34-29 (.540) vs. right-handed starters, compared to 8-14 (.363) vs. lefty starters... Seattle has won 3 of last 4 games by RH starters.

<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u>...that with his first strikeout vs. the Athletics yesterday, **Michael Pineda** became the first Mariners rookie with 100 strikeouts before the All-Star break...**Mark Langston** held the previous franchise record when he struck out 84 batters during his rookie campaign with the Mariners in 1984...Pineda is the 4th rookie to accomplish the feat in the past 10 seasons: Daisuke Matsuzaka in 2007 (123), Francisco Liriano in 2006 (102) and Kazuhisa Ishii in 2002 (100).

- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005...youngest MLB pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84...Rijo was 19 years, 54 days old on July 6,1984 (NYY at MIN) in relief appearance.
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest play er to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher.
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted free agent July 4, '02.

- Selected to 2009 All-Star game (1st in career).
- In 2010 won the AL Cy Young Award, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joins Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners to win the Cy Young ... named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year.
- Tossed at least 6.0 IP in 152 of 190 GS (80%), including 118 of last 135 starts (87%)...16 of 18 (89%) in 2011.
- 9-9, 3.08 ERA (59 ER, 172.1 IP) in 25 career starts in June.

LAST TIME OUT...L#7 in last start June 29 vs. ATL...made 127 pitches, 2nd most this season (128, 5/28 vs. NYY)...5 earned runs and 10 hits are the 2nd highest total he's allowed this season...left with 2 runners on in the 8th & Chris Ray stranded them...allowed 3 runs in the 5th, 1 on wild pitch, 2 on F. Freeman 2-RBI single to center.

STRING OF 7'S...Felix has thrown at least 7.0 innings in 8 of his last 9 starts (since 5/17)...over the 9-start stretch is 4-4 with a 3.34 ERA (25 ER, 67.1 IP)...tonight will be his AL leading 19th start of the season, and heads into the start ranked 4th in the AL with 129.0 innings pitched.

A BAKER'S DOZEN...tied his career-high with 13 strikeouts (also: 8/10/10 vs. OAK) on May 22 at San Diego...marked the 11th time in career to strike out 10 or more batters in a start...now has 13 career double-digit strikeout games including 4 this season...one of 4 AL pitchers with at least 4 double-digit K games this season (C.J. Wilson - 5, David Price - 4, James Shields - 4).

THE FINISHER ... recorded 15th career complete game May 6 vs. White Sox (9.0,5,2,2,2,6,HR), his 2nd of 2011...ranked 3rd in the American League with 6 complete games in 2010 (Cliff Lee & Carl Pavano, 7).

79 AND COUNTING...recorded his 79th win in his last start June 24 vs. Florida... passed Freddy Garcia (76) on June 2 for most career wins in club history as right-hander...now 2nd all-time in Mariners wins, ahead of Garcia and trailing Randy Johnson (130).

YOUNG AND GOOD ... Felix Hernandez does not turn 26 until April, 2012... among active pitchers, he already has the most wins prior to turning 26:

1. Felix Hernandez (79); 2. CC Sabathia (76); 3. Mark Buehrle (69); 4. Carlos Zambrano (69); 5. Jake Peavy (64).

ACTIVE ERA LEADERS...among active pitchers with at least 1,000 career innings pitched, ranks 4th (3rd among starters) with 3.21 ERA: 1. M. Rivera (2.22); 2. J. Santana (3.10); 3. R. Oswalt (3.20); 4. F. Hernandez (3.21); 5. B. Webb (3.27).

QUARTER CENTURY...dating back to 1900, Felix is one of just 9 pitchers to record at least 172 starts prior to turning 25, he turned 25 on April 6...he joined Bert Blyleven, Christy Mathewson, Walter Johnson, Larry Dierker, Catfish Hunter, Dwight Gooden, Bob Feller and Hal Newhouser

PITCHING ON A FINE LINE...it is no secret that Hernandez has been the victim of low run support over the last few years...the 2010 AL Cy Young winner has received 1 or fewer runs of support in 20 of his last 52 starts dating back to the start of the 2010 season...despite having the 5th-lowest run support average by any AL starter over span (3.40), has gone 21-19 with a 2.64 ERA.

BACK-TO-BACK(-TO-BACK)...since the start of the 2009 season, has combined to go 40-24, 2.58 ERA (177 ER, 617.1 IP) and 573 strikeouts...leads Majors with 71 quality starts since the start of '09...became the first pitcher since Roger Clemens (2.43 in 2004-05) to post a sub 2.50 ERA over a 2-season stretch (2009-10) (min. 400.0 IP).

2011 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...

- Has allowed 2 ER or less in 11 of 18 starts this season...averaging just over 7.0 innings per start (129.0 IP/18 GS = 7.17 IP/GS).
- Among AL Pitching Leaders: 3rd in strikeouts (124), 4th in IP (129.0), 5th in K/9.0 IP (8.65), T9th in quality starts (12), 16th in opponents average (.233).
