A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail in the season series, 6-3...have lost four of five in Oakland and split a four-game series in Seattle in April...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 36-49 (.424) against Seattle since 2007...that is the lowest winning percentage by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 286-213 (.573) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .575)...are 159-92 in Oakland and 127-121 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has a 81-game, 79.0-inning, 320-batter homerless streak.

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Kurt Suzuki has caught 535 games, which is two away from Mike Heath for third place in Oakland history.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 161-game errorless streak, which is fourth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...the record is 165 by Jermaine Dye from Sept. 25, 2002-Aug. 6, 2004.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1990 the A's hit seven home runs in the second game of a doubleheader to defeat the Cleveland Indians 12-1...Mark McGwire and Rickey Henderson hit two each and Carney Lansford, Jose Canseco and Jamie Quirk chip in one each...in 2001 Mark Mulder takes a perfect game into the eighth inning and finishes with a complete game one-hitter in the A's 3-0 win at Arizona...in 2009 Brett Anderson tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park in a 6-0 A's win and Nomar Garciaparra drives in the go-ahead run in his return to Boston.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost nine of the last 13 games since winning a season high six in a row...are 11 games under .500 at 38-49, which is one short of the season low (28-40 on June 14)...are eight games behind Texas and Los Angeles in the American League West, which matches the A's largest deficit of the season (last: June 14)...the A's .437 winning percentage is third lowest in the AL...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 16-29 (.356) since then, which is the second worst mark in the AL (Kansas City, 15-30)...have spent each of the last 37 days and 44 of the last 45 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 48 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 1.97 ERA (38 er in 173.1 ip) and .203 (128 for 630) opponents batting average over the last 19 games...now has a 3.09 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...the last time the A's had an ERA under 3.18 was in 1989 (3.09)...lead the majors in pickoffs (16)...A's starting pitchers are 9-6 with a 1.97 ERA (27 er in 123.1 ip), .200 (89 for 446) opponents batting average, 36 walks, 100 strikeouts and eight home runs over the last 19 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.11 ERA (187 er in 540.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.07) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.00).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .214 (92 for 429) with 30 runs scored over the last 13 games (2.31 runs per game)...are hitting .236 with a .341 slugging percentage and .302 on-base percentage overall, all of which are second lowest in the American League ahead of Seattle (.226/.337/.293)...the Oakland record for lowest marks in those categories is a .236 batting average in 1982, a .343 slugging percentage in 1968 and a .302 on-base percentage in 1979...have the second fewest runs scored (302) ahead of the Mariners (292)...are on pace to score 562 runs and have not scored fewer than 573 runs in a non-strike season since 1978 (532)...have been shutout nine times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 46 home runs, which is tied with San Diego for the fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 86 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 58 games...the last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed seven home runs in the last seven games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 55 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the AL to Seattle (54)...are on pace to allow 102 home runs and have not allowed fewer than 103 home runs in a non-strike season since 1976 (96).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 5-10 (.333) in extra inning games with the loss last night...that is the worst record in the American League...the 15 extra inning games are tied with the Angels for second most in the majors (Atlanta, 16)...are now 12-27 (.308) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-19 (.387) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Cubs, 10-16)...are 9-20 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-16 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 68 errors, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...the errors have led to 47 unearned runs, which is tied with Texas for the most in the majors...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (91).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-5 on this nine-game homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Seattle (0-2)...went 5-1 on the last homestand which was their best homestand since 2006...are 22-21 (.512) at home for the season but are 16-28 (.364) on the road, which is the third worst record in the American League...leave following the game today for a four-game road trip to Texas, which takes the A's into the All-Star Break...went 2-4 on the last road trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2) and have lost 19 of the last 24 on the road...are batting .246 (348 for 1413) with 161 runs scored in 43 home games (3.74 per game) and .226 (340 for 1506) with 141 runs scored in 44 games on the road (3.20 per game)...have a 2.83 ERA (124 er in 395.0 ip) at home, which is the lowest mark in the AL.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 0-2 in this stretch of 11 consecutive games against all three American League West opponents...after this three-game series with the Mariners the A's have a four-game series at Texas before hosting Los Angeles in a four-game series after the All-Star Break...are 12-12 (.500) against the West for the season but are 26-37 (.413) against everyone else.

ALL-STAR: Gio Gonzalez was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team Sunday...it is his first All-Star selection...Gonzalez was also named AL Co-Player of the Week yesterday along with Toronto's Jose Bautista after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a ML leading 16 strikeouts last week.

IN JUNE: The A's went 9-17 (.346) in the month of June, which was the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it was the fourth lowest winning percentage in June in Oakland history and the worst since 1986 (7-22, .241)...had a .312 slugging percentage, which was the lowest mark in the majors and the second lowest in Oakland history in a month of 20 or more games (.299 in April, 1979)...tied for the fewest home runs in the majors (12)...had the second lowest batting average (.222) and on-base percentage (.292) in the AL and the second fewest runs scored (85).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Anderson, Balfour, Braden, Ross, Willingham) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and eighth start of the season...the A's are 3-4 (.429) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings four times, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer four times.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA (8 er in 32.0 ip) in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in

Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July. 1968.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in four of his last five starts and is 0-3 with a 2.17 ERA (7 er in 29.0 ip) over that span...has run support of 2.93 (13 rs in 40.0 ip) in his seven starts for the season.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 2.43 ERA (8 er in 29.2 ip) and .200 (22 for 110) opponents batting average over his last six games, including five starts...the losing streak is the longest of his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .233 (20 for 86) with the bases empty and .162 (12 for 74) with runners on base...including .160 (4 for 25) with runners in scoring position...has held the opposition to a .157 (11 for 70) batting average the first time through the lineup and .233 (21 for 90) after that...has allowed a .189 (7 for 37) average to batters leading off an inning but has issued seven walks (.318 on-base percentage).

NIGHT AND DAY: Has a 0.87 ERA (3 er in 31.0 ip) and .170 (19 for 112) opponents batting average in six night games compared to a 6.75 ERA (9 er in 12.0 ip) and .271 (13 for 48) opponents average in three day games.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-3 with a 2.48 ERA (11 er in 40.0 ip) in seven starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 24 and won each of his first two starts...had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2 and pitched in relief on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3rd and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4th...is 0-3 with a 2.17 ERA (7 er in 29.0 ip) in five starts since

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed just one earned run over the first three innings of a game for a 0.42 ERA (1 er in 21.1 ip) and .133 (10 for 75) opponents batting average...has a 4.57 ERA (11 er in 21.2 ip) and .259 (22 for 85) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

2011 START-BY-START: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...just three runners advanced into scoring position...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore May 29 in Oakland...allowed four runs on five hits in 5.0 innings...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Pie, a bases loaded walk to Reimold and RBI ground outs by Markakis and Guerrero...the A's came back with four runs in the bottom of the fifth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore *June* 7...allowed a lead-off home runs to Hardy in the bottom of the first and Scott in the bottom of the fifth...those were the only two runs he would allow in 5.0 innings...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-4 loss at Chicago *June 12*...surrendered career highs in hits (6), runs (5) and walks (4)...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the White Sox on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a three-run home run to Dunn in the fourth...the A's tied the game with single runs in the sixth and seventh and he put runners on first and second with a pair of walks in the seventh...was relieved by Balfour who allowed both of the inherited runners to score...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco June 18 in Oakland...blanked the Giants on two hits over the first four innings and the scored was tied at 0-0 entering the fifth...allowed a single and a walk to start the inning and his own error allowed one of those runs to score...also yielded a sacrifice fly to Huff and was relieved by Ziegler with two outs and the A's trailing 2-0...Oakland then scored four times in the bottom of the fifth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Philadelphia June 24...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...yielded just two hits and walked three and left the game with the scored tied a 0-0...Devine pitched a scoreless eighth before Fuentes allowed the only run of the game in the bottom of the ninth...Worley, Herndon, Perez and Stutes combined to shutout the A's on two hits.

LAST START: He extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida a week ago today in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings after fanning just seven batters over his previous four starts...allowed two unearned run in the first inning as a Pennington fielding error preceded a two-out two-run home run by Ramirez...also surrendered a solo home run to Morrison in the fourth...Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks.

MOSCOSO vs. SEATTLE: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-2 with a 4.02 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in eight games, seven starts...struck out 43 in 40.1 innings, an average of 9.59 per nine innings...issued just 13 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just one home run in 40.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-4 (.429) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in three of his seven starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight outings and five runs or more in his other three.

RHP Rich Harden (1-0, 3.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 after being placed on the DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was the winning pitcher in last start, a 5-4 A's win over Arizona last Friday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so)...it was his first win as an Athletic since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia...is 5-2 with a 4.21 ERA in 12 career appearances, 11 starts, against Texas...last faced the Rangers May 11, 2008 and had a no decision in the A's 12-6 win (3.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 5 so)...went 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts on a rehab assignment with Sacramento.

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 11 of the past 12 games and has a 1.55 ERA (5 er in 29.0 ip) over that span...now has a 3.04 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League...has the second lowest opponents batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.309) and slugging percentage (.336)...is tied for the fewest wins (8) and the most losses (17)...has allowed 15 home runs, which ranks third fewest...ranks second with 58 first batter strikeouts...has allowed 33 of 102 (32.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL

- Has recorded seven saves since being reinstated from the disabled list May 29, which is tied for eighth most in the American League over that span...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL.
- Has not allowed a run in nine of his past 10 appearances (1 er in 10.1 ip, 0.87 ERA) and in 11 of 13 outings overall (2 er in 13.1 ip, 1.35 ERA).
- Has held opponents to a .152 batting average, including .105 (2 for 19) against right-handers and a .185 (5 for 27) mark against lefties.
- Faced Seattle for the first time this season last night and was charged with the loss...is 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA and four saves in five opportunities in 16 career appearances against the Mariners (17.1 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 18 so, 1 hr).
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 28 retroactive to June 22 with a strained right oblique...it is his sixth career appearance on the DL.
- Was tied for second among American League relievers in wins (4) at the time of his injury.
- Has held opponents to a .198 (23 for 116) batting average, including .136 (3 for 22) with runners in scoring position.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

2010 RECAP: Was 5-5 with a 5.58 ERA in 20 games, 18 starts, with Texas in a season where he was bothered by injuries and control problems much of the season, which resulted in two stints on the disabled list...the ERA was the highest of his major league career...issued 62 walks in 92.0 innings, an average of 6.07 per nine innings...that was the highest ratio in the majors among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...it was also sixth highest in team history and the highest since 1987 (Bobby Witt, 8.81; Mitch Williams. 7.79)...walked five or more batters in six of his 18 starts, including a season high six April 18 at New York and May 14 at Toronto.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
