#### A's vs. RANGERS

The A's season series is even at four games each...the A's have lost three of four in Texas and have won three of four in Oakland...have lost the season series four times over the previous five seasons and are 49-54 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 290-298 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-139 in Oakland and 135-159 in Texas...including 68-71 all-time record of 387-380 against the Rangers/Senators.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has an 82-game, 80.0-inning, 323-batter homerless streak...last allowed a home run April 7, 2006 at San Francisco (Alou).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500...no one has combined for 500.

**Scott Sizemore** is 10 for 28 (.357) with three home runs, six RBI and four multiple hit games over his last eight games.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error this year and now has a 163-game errorless streak, which is second longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...is two short of the record of 165 set by Jermaine Dye from Sept. 25, 2002-Aug. 6, 2004.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1971, after 19 scoreless innings, Angel Mangual delivers a RBI single in the bottom of the 20th inning as the A's defeat the Angels 1-0...Vida Blue strikes out a club record (extra innings) 17 batters in 11 innings of work, Rollie Fingers adds seven in seven innings of relief and the A's pitching staff finishes with a club record 26 strikeouts in the five hour and five minute game that finishes at 1:08 a.m.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost two straight games, four of the last five and 11 of the last 16...that drops the A's to a season low tying 12 games under .500 at 39-51 (were 28-40 on June 14)...have not been more than 12 games under .500 since September 14, 2009 when they were 13 under (65-78)...are a season high 10 games back of Texas in the American League West, which is the A's largest deficit since October 2 of last year when they were also 10 back...have not trailed by 11 game since September 30, 2010...the A's .433 winning percentage is the third lowest in the AL...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 17-31 (.362) since then, which is the second worst mark in the AL (Kansas City, 16-32)...have spent each of the last 40 days and 47 of the last 48 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 51 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's will go into the All-Star Break with a losing record for the third consecutive season as they are 39-51 (.433) with two games remaining...were 43-46 (.483) last year and 37-49 (.430) in 2009...the pitching staff has a 3.11 ERA, which would be their lowest at the break since 1990 when they had a 3.09 ERA...has 620 strikeouts which is the second best pre-break total in Oakland history and 15 short of the record of 635 set in 2008...has yielded 59 home runs and have not surrendered fewer than 65 before the break since 1989 (54)...are batting .234 with a .338 slugging percentage and .300 on-base percentage...have not hit under .243 before the break since 1982 (.231), have not slugged under .355 since 1979 (.337) and have had an on-base percentage under .302 just once (.300 in 1979)...have 48 home runs and have hit fewer than 53 just once (42 in 1968)...are averaging 3.43 runs per game (309 r in 90 g), which is currently the third lowest pre-break total in Oakland history (3.32 in 1978, 3.34 in 1968).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-2 on this four-game road trip to Texas...went 2-4 on the last trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2) and have lost 21 of the last 26 games on the road...are 16-30 (.348) on the road for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...went 4-5 on the last homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 23-21 (.523) at home...are batting .245 (353 for 1443) with 163 runs scored in 44 home games (3.70 per game) and .223 (350 for 1567) with 146 runs scored in 46 games on the road (3.17 per game)...have the second lowest road batting average in the majors (Washington, .219).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have been held to 10 runs on 24 hits over the last five games (152 ab, .158 batting average) and are batting .206 (107 for 520) with 37 runs scored over the last 16 games (2.31 runs per game)...have just 35 walks and four hit batters over that stretch for a .259 on-base percentage (4 sf)...have been held to two runs or fewer in 11 of those 16 games and have scored just 309 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.234), slugging percentage (.338) and on-base percentage (.300)...have been shutout 10 times, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 14 runs in the first two games of this series after allowing 24 runs in nine games on the last homestand...have a 2.18 ERA (48 er in 198.1 ip) and .207 (150 for 725) opponents batting average over the last 212 games...have a 3.11 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...lead the majors in pickoffs (16)...A's starting pitchers are 10-8 with a 2.26 ERA (35 er in 139.1 ip), .207 (106 for 511) opponents batting average, 42 walks, 112 strikeouts and 12 home runs over the last 22 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.15 ERA (195 er in 556.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.07) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.98).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 48 home runs, which is the fewest in the American League and second fewest in the majors...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 61 games...the last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed 11 home runs in the last 10 games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 59 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 70 errors, which ranks second in the American League to Texas (71)...the errors have led to 51 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs for the most in the majors...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (93).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-10 (.333) in extra inning games, which is the worst record in the American League...the 15 extra inning games are tied with the Angels for the most in the AL...are now 12-27 (.308) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-19 (.387) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors (Cubs 11-17, .393)...are 9-20 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-16 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last year.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 1-4 in this stretch of 11 consecutive games against all three American League West opponents (1-2 vs. Seattle, 0-2 vs. Texas)...after this four-game series with the Rangers the A's host Los Angeles in a four-game series after the All-Star Break...are 13-14 (.481) against the West for the season but are 26-37 (.413) against everyone else.

**ALL-STAR:** Gio Gonzalez was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team last Sunday...it is his first All-Star selection...Gonzalez was also named AL Co-Player of the Week Tuesday along with Toronto's Jose Bautista after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a ML leading 16 strikeouts last week.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11<sup>th</sup> start of the season, his second since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 2-8 (.200) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 29-37 (.439) in his 66 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in nine of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer all 10 times.

**FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-5 despite a 3.72 ERA (48.1 ip, 49 h, 25 r, 20 er, 10 bb, 28 so) over his last seven starts...the losing streak is a career-high,

topping his previous high of four from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of three runs or less in each of his last seven starts...his season run support is 3.45 (27 rs in 70.1 ip)...has 10 runs of support in his five losses (35.1 ip, 2.55 RSA).

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed just two home runs in 70.1 innings, which are the fewest among Major League pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched...both of the home runs have come against Seattle and have been solo shots by left-handed hitters (Kennedy, Bard).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .185 (15 for 81) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .317 (57 for 180) after that...opponents are batting .381 (16 for 42) with runners in scoring position.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Has committed four errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitchers (Verlander, DET)...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

2011 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto April 5...gave up only one run over the first five innings when Hill drove in Escobar on a force out...however, then allowed four runs, three earned, in the sixth inning...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle)...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota April 10...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss *April 15* against Detroit in Oakland...gave up six hits, walked one and recorded a season-high seven strikeouts...it was his most strikeouts in a game since also recording seven strikeouts May 13, 2009 with Texas against Seattle...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10<sup>th</sup> as Fuentes took the loss...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle *April 21*...the complete game was his second of his career, his first since May 24, 2009 with Texas at Houston...allowed the game's only run in the fourth inning when Kennedy hit a home run with one out...allowed only four hits, with the home run being the only hit that went for extra bases, while walking one and striking out six...he threw 64 of 99 pitches for strikes...was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles **April** 26...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...surrendered two runs in the second inning, three in the third and two more in the fifth...was then replaced by Ziegler with one out in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Texas May 2 in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...had a 1-0 lead when Young hit a two-run double in the third inning...the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth but sacrifice flies by Young and Beltre in the fifth gave Texas a 4-2 lead...left after six innings trailing 4-3 but Willingham homered in the eight and Matsui in the 10<sup>th</sup> for the win...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City May 7...both of his complete games have been losses...allowed seven hits and walked two...retired each of the first 14 batters before Hosmer singled with two outs in the fifth...then allowed three runs in the sixth inning on RBI singles by Cabrera and Gordon and a Butler sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with three in the eighth but he allowed an Aviles sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth for the loss...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago *May 13*...allowed all four of the runs in the second inning...the first run scored on a fielders choice but Vizquel followed with a RBI double and Beckham scored on a sacrifice fly before his own error on a pickoff attempt allowed Vizquel to score...shutout the Rangers on two hits over his final five innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning loss to Minnesota *May 18*...allowed a RBI single to Morneau in the first inning but the A's came back with two runs in the second...then allowed two runs in the third on a two-run single by Plouffe...then retired 13 of the final 17 hitters he faced...the A's scored once in the sixth inning to tie the game and he was relieved by Balfour to start the eighth.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Seattle last Monday in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters before Suzuki singled to lead off the fourth...faced the minimum over the first five innings thanks to two double plays...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Bard in the sixth and a RBI double to Smoak in the seventh...the A's were limited to a run on three hits by Pineda and the Mariners bullpen.

**McCarthy vs. Texas:** Is 1-2 with a 2.86 ERA (22.0 ip, 14 h, 11 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 14 so, 4 hr) in five career appearances, three starts...that includes 0-1 with a 1.23 ERA (1 er in 7.1 ip) in two games, one start, in his home ballparks and 1-1 with a 3.68 ERA (6 er in 14.2 ip) in three games, two starts in Texas...is 1-1 with a 2.89 ERA (6 er in 18.2 ip) in his three starting assignments...pitched for Texas from 2007-09 and is 8-6 with a 3.84 ERA (52 er in 122.0 ip) in 25 games, 24 starts, in Rangers Ballpark...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's win in 10 innings May 2 in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...had a 1-0 lead when Young hit a two-run double in the third inning...the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth but sacrifice flies by Young and Beltre in the fifth gave Texas a 4-2 lead...left after six innings trailing 4-3 but Willingham homered in the eight and Matsui in the 10<sup>th</sup> for the win.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (8-6, 3.17 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 20<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is 2-6 with a 4.30 ERA and a .270 opponents batting average over his last 11 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 3-1 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts against American League West competition and 5-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss in 10 innings to Seattle last Tuesday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb 5 so)...is 8-2 with a 2.18 ERA in 11 career starts against Texas...has no more than four wins against any other team...has allowed two runs or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...is 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA (14.0 ip, 12 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 11 so) in two starts this year.

The A's bullpen has converted each of its 10 save opportunities since June 10 and has a 1.98 ERA (16 er in 72.2 ip), .209 (55 for 263) opponents batting average and one home run allowed over that 26-game span...now has a 3.00 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the pen has the fourth best save percentage in the AL (74.2%) and is tied for fourth in saves (23)...has the lowest opponents batting average (.230) and on-base percentage (.306) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.333)...is tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (15)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (60)...is tied for the fewest wins (8) and the most losses (17)

- Has converted each of his last eight save opportunities after he was charged with the blown save in his first opportunity...is 59 for 67 (88.1%) in his career, which is the best percentage in Oakland history...needs two more saves to tie Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland history. Has not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 outings (1 er in 11.1 ip, 0.79 ERA).
- Has held opponents to a .143 batting average, including .100 (2 for 20) against right-handers and .172 (5 for 29) against lefties.
- Retired each of his first 12 first batters faced before allowing a single to Gutierrez in Tuesday's loss to Seattle...first batters are 1 for 14 (.071) for the season.
- Has not faced the Rangers this year...is 1-1 with three saves, three blown saves and a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) in 15 career appearances against Texas...has been charged with three of his eight career blown saves in Rangers Ballpark and has not converted a save here
- Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
