### A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail in the season series, 4-5...have lost the first three games of this series and have not been swept by the Rangers in a four-game series since June 19-22, 1986 at Texas...are 1-4 in Texas and 3-1 in Oakland...have lost the season series four times over the previous five seasons and are 49-55 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 290-299 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-139 in Oakland and 135-160 in Texas...including 68-72 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 387-381 against the Rangers/Senators.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Bailey** was charged with the ninth blown save of his career last night...four of those have come at Rangers Ballpark.

**Joey Devine** has not allowed a home run this season and now has an 83-game, 81.0-inning, 328-batter homerless streak...last allowed a home run April 7, 2006 at San Francisco (Alou).

**Hideki Matsui** has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

**Ryan Sweeney** has a 164-game errorless streak, which is second longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...is one short of the record of 165 set by Jermaine Dye from Sept. 25, 2002-Aug. 6, 2004.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1901** Harry Davis becomes the first player in American League history to hit for the cycle...in **1932** Jimmie Foxx ties the AL record for most total bases in a game with 16...he hits three home runs and adds a double and two singles in the A's 18-17, 18 inning win at Cleveland...Eddie Rommell pitches 17 innings of relief and allows 29 hits...in **1990** five Oakland A's play in the All-Star Game at Wrigley Field...in **2004** Erubiel Durazo has a pinch hit grand slam and drives in five runs as the A's win at Cleveland, 16-7.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three straight games, five of the last six and 12 of the last 17...are now a season-low 13 games under .500 at 39-52...this marks the first time the A's have been 13 games under .500 since September 14, 2009 (65-78)...have not been 14 under since September 13, 2009 (64-78)...are a season high 11 games back of Texas in the American League West, which is the A's largest deficit since September 30 of last year when they were also 11 back...the last time the A's trailed by more than 11 games was when they finished the 2009 season 22 games out...the A's .429 winning percentage is third lowest in the AL...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 17-32 (.347) since then, which is tied with Kansas for the second worst mark in the majors (Houston, 15-34)...have spent each of the last 41 days and 48 of the last 49 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 52 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

**AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's will go into the All-Star Break with a losing record for the third consecutive season as they are 39-52 (.429) with one game remaining...a loss today would give the A's their fourth worst record in Oakland history before the break and it would be the worst since going 37-52 (.416) in 1997...a loss would also put the A's 12 games behind Texas, matching their largest deficit in the West at the Break over the last 10 years (also 2009)...the pitching staff has a 3.15 ERA, which would be their lowest at the break since 1990 when they had a 3.09 ERA...has 625 strikeouts which is the second best pre-break total in Oakland history and 10 short of the record of 635 set in 2008...has yielded 61 home runs and have not surrendered fewer than 65 before the break since 1989 (54)...are batting .233 with a .338 slugging percentage and .300 on-base percentage...have not hit over .243 before the break since 1982 (.231), have not slugged under .355 since 1979 (.337) and have had an on-base percentage under .302 just once (.300 in 1979)...have 50 home runs and have hit fewer than 53 just once (42 in 1968)...are averaging 3.46 runs per game (315 r in 91 g), which is currently the third lowest pre-break total in Oakland history (3.32 in 1978, 3.34 in 1968).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-3 on this four-game road trip to Texas...went 2-4 on the last trip through New York (1-2) and Philadelphia (1-2) and have lost 22 of the last 27 games on the road...that is the A's worst 27-game stretch on the road since June 10-August 2, 1986 when they also went 5-22...are 16-31 (.340) on the road for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...went 4-5 on the last homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 23-21 (.523) at home...open post-break play with a four-game homestand against Los Angeles...are batting .245 (353 for 1443) with 163 runs scored in 44 home games (3.70 per game) and .223 (357 for 1600) with 152 runs scored in 47 games on the road (3.23 per game)...have the second lowest road batting average in the majors (Washington, .219).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .206 (114 for 553) with 43 runs scored over the last 17 games (2.53 runs per game)...have just 39 walks and four hit batters over that stretch for a .262 on-base percentage (4 sf)...have been held to two runs or fewer in 11 of those 17 games and have scored just 315 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.233), slugging percentage (.338) and on-base percentage (.300)...have been shutout 10 times, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 21 runs in the first three games of this series after allowing 24 runs in nine games on the last homestand...have a 2.39 ERA (55 er in 207.0 ip) and .214 (163 for 763) opponents batting average over the last 23 games...have a 3.15 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...lead the majors in pickoffs (16)...A's starting pitchers are 10-8 with a 2.48 ERA (40 er in 145.1 ip), .214 (115 for 537) opponents batting average, 42 walks, 116 strikeouts and 13 home runs over the last 23 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.20 ERA (200 er in 562.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.15) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.96).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit just 50 home runs, which is the **fewest in the American League** and third fewest in the majors...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 62 games, which is the longest streak by an A's team since April 24-July 15, 1994 when they had a 72-game streak...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed 13 home runs in the last 11 games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 61 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 71 errors, which ranks second in the American League to Texas (82)...the errors have led to 51 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (93).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's fell to 12-20 (.375) in one-run games with the loss last night...that is the worst record in the majors (Cubs 11-17, .393)...are 5-10 (.333) in extra inning games, which is the worst record in the American League...the 15 extra inning games are tied with the Angels for the most in the AL...are now 12-27 (.308) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last year.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 1-5 in this stretch of 11 consecutive games against all three American League West opponents (1-2 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...after this four-game series with the Rangers the A's host Los Angeles in a four-game series after the All-Star Break...are 13-15 (.464) against the West for the season but are 26-37 (.413) against everyone else.

**ALL-STAR:** Gio Gonzalez was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team a week ago today...it is his first All-Star selection...Gonzalez will be tweeting during the Home Run Derby Monday from his account @GioGonzalez47...Gonzalez was also named AL Co-Player of the Week Tuesday along with Toronto's Jose Bautista after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a ML leading 16 strikeouts last week.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 20<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 8-11 (.421) in his starting assignments this year and are 44-37 (.543) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 10 of his 19 starts, allowed one run or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

**LAST 11 STARTS:** Is 2-6 with a 4.30 ERA (32 er in 67.0 ip) and a .270 (67 for 248) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...has received three runs of support in each of his last 11 starts and his run support average over that stretch is 1.88 (14 rs in 67.0 ip)...received run support of 5.68 over his first eight starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in most stolen bases allowed (19)...also ranks second in the AL in wild pitches (11) and fifth in walks (49)...the 11 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when three pitchers had at least 11 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14, Haynes 11).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 3-1 with a 1.67 ERA (7 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts against American League West competition this year and 5-5 with a 3.86 ERA (35 er in 81.2 ip) in 13 starts against everyone else...now has a 14-7 record and a 2.23 ERA (42 er in 169.1 ip) in 27 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 22-20 with a 4.34 ERA (157 er in 325.1 ip) in 54 starts against everyone else.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .140 (7 for 50) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...opponents are hitting .208 (20 for 96) with runners in scoring position, which is ninth lowest in the AL...that includes .114 over his first eight starts and .262 (16 for 61) over his last nine starts...has allowed 10 home runs and seven have been solo shots.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 4-5 with a 4.10 ERA (36 er in 79.0 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest and 4-1 with a 1.34 ERA (6 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-4 with a 2.66 ERA (19 er in 64.1 ip) in 10 starts at home and 4-2 with a 3.76 ERA (23 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on the road...is now 22-14 with a 3.12 ERA (95 er in 274.0 ip) in 43 career starts in Oakland and 14-13 with a 4.24 ERA (104 er in 220.2 ip) in 38 starts on the road.

**WINS:** Is 26-13 with a 2.92 ERA (101 er in 311.0 ip) and .227 (256 for 1126) opponents batting average in 48 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are fifth most in the majors over that span...is 36-27 (.571) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24<sup>th</sup> birthday (42, Vida Blue).

**2011 HIGHLIGHTS:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...improved to 6-0 in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9** but was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss ended a career-high seven-game winning streak as he also won his final start of 2010...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-0 loss to New York **May 30** in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning after yielding just one first inning run over his first 11 starts...had a no decision in the 9-8, 14-inning loss at Boston **June 4**...the scored was tied at 2-2 when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the sixth...the A's scored four times in the ninth to send the game into extra innings...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 9-4 loss at Chicago **June 9**...allowed a season-high six runs in a season-low 2.2 innings...lost his career-high fifth consecutive decision in the A's 7-4 loss to Kansas City **June 14** in Oakland...walked seven batters in 4.1 innings and did not record a strikeout...the only other pitcher in Oakland history to walk seven or more batters in a game without striking out a batter is Mike Norris with eight on April 16, 1979 against Seattle...snapped his losing streak at a career-high five games in the A's 2-1 win over San Francisco **June 19** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 118 pitches and retired 16 of the final 17 hitters he faced...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win at Philadelphia **June 25**...retired 12 straight and 17 of 18 at one point...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to Florida **June 30** in Oakland...allowed just one unearned run over the first four innings as Ramirez scored on a DeJesus error in the second...then allowed four runs in the fifth inning and was relieved by Magnuson after lasting just 4.2 innings...it was his fifth outing of the season under 5.0 innings.

**LAST START:** Had a no decision in the A's 4-2, 10-inning loss to Seattle last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings to bring his career total to 494.2...allowed an unearned run in the second inning when Ackley singled, stole second, went to third on a Suzuki error and scored on a Peguero sacrifice fly...also allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the seventh and left trailing 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the eighth and ninth innings to get him off the hook.

**CAHILL vs. TEXAS:** Is 8-2 with a 2.18 ERA (70.1 ip, 61 h, 20 r, 17 er, 20 bb, 44 so, 7 hr) in 11 career starts...has no more than four wins against any other team...has allowed two runs or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...is 3-0 with a 0.98 ERA (3 er in 27.2 ip) in four starts in Texas and 5-2 with a 2.95 ERA (14 er in 42.2 ip) in seven starts in Oakland...is 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA (14.0 ip, 12 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 11 so) in two starts this year...the first win came in a 3-1 A's victory in Oakland April 29...tossed 7.0 shutout innings, scattering seven hits and four walks...left with a 7-0 lead...also picked up the win in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas May 9...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed one run, his third consecutive start of seven or more innings and one run or fewer...the Rangers scored their only run on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth.

**8-18, 3.04 ERA (254.2 ip, 217 h, 103 r, 86 er, 101 bb, 222 so, 16 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 23/32 (71.9%)**

The pen was charged with the blown save and loss last night, snapping a streak of 10 consecutive saves without a blown save...the pen is now 2-4 with 10 saves, one blown save, a 2.15 ERA (18 er in 75.1 ip), .215 (59 for 275) opponents batting average and two home runs allowed over the last 27 games dating back to June 10...now has a 3.04 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...has the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307) in the AL and the second lowest batting average (.231) and slugging percentage (.336)...has surrendered the third fewest home runs (16)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (61)...is tied for the fewest wins (8) and has the most losses (18).

**Save/Opportunities: 8-10**

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
