A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series, 5-4...are 2-0 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...have won six of the last seven games in Oakland...have lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons and six of the last seven...are 65-77 (.458) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 370-300 against the Angels...that includes 192-140 in Oakland and 178-160 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 419-377 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has 59 career saves and needs two more to tie Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland

Joev Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has an 83-game, 81.0-inning, 328batter homerless streak...last allowed a home run April 7, 2006 at San Francisco (Alou).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500...no one has combined for 500.

Scott Sizemore is batting .287 with four home runs and 14 RBI since joining the A's June 6...the home runs are the most on the club over that span and the RBI are tied for the most.

Ryan Sweeney has not committed an error in 46 games in the outfield this year and now has a 164-game errorless streak...that is one short of the Oakland record for an outfielder set by Jermaine Dye from Sept. 25, 2002-Aug. 6,

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1969 Blue Moon Odom homers, drives in four runs and tosses a complete game to improve his record to 13-3 in the A's 6-2 win at Seattle...in 2002 Ted Lilly combines with the A's bullpen on a four-hit shutout in his Oakland debut at Tampa Bay, the A's third shutout in their last four games.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four straight, six of the last seven and 13 of the last 18 games to fall a season-low 14 games under .500 at 39-53...this is the first time the A's have been 14 games under .500 since September 13, 2009 (64-78)...have not been 15 under since September 9, 2009 (62-77)...are a season-high 12½ games behind Texas in the American League West, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since they finished the 2009 season 22 games out...the A's .424 winning percentage is third lowest in the AL...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 17-33 (.340) since then, which is the second worst mark in the AL (Kansas City, 17-34)...the A's are 1-6 in this stretch of 11 consecutive games against all three AL West opponents (1-2 vs. Seattle, 0-4 vs. Texas)...have spent each of the last 43 days and 50 of the last 51 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 54 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season...went 39-53 (.424), which was the fourth worst record at the break in Oakland history...it was the worst since going 37-52 (.416) in 1997...the A's 12-game deficit in the AL West matches their largest at the break over the last 10 years (2009)...the pitching staff posted a 3.14 ERA, which was their lowest at the break since 1990 (3.09)...had 629 strikeouts, which was the second best total in Oakland history (635 in 2008)...yielded 62 home runs, which are the fewest since 1989 (54)...the offense batted .233 with a .337 slugging percentage and .299 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is the lowest in Oakland history at the break, the batting average is third lowest (.231 in 1982, .233 in 1979) and the slugging percentage is third lowest (.329 in 1968, .337 in 1979)...hit 50 home runs, which is second fewest in Oakland history (42 in 1968)...averaged 3.42 runs, which was third lowest (3.32 in 1978, 3.34 in 1968).

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the second time in the last four games last Sunday and the 11th time this year, which is the most in the American League...are batting .205 (120 for 585) with 43 runs scored over the last 18 games (2.39 runs per game)...have just 40 walks and four hit batters over that stretch for a .259 on-base percentage (4 sf)...have been held to two runs or fewer in 12 of those 18 games and have scored just 315 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...also have the second lowest batting average (.233), slugging percentage (.337) and on-base percentage (.299) in the AL

PITCHING: The A's allowed 23 runs in the four game series at Texas after allowing 24 runs in nine games on the last homestand...have a 2.39 ERA (57 er in 215.0 ip) and .213 (168 for 790) opponents batting average over the last 24 games...have a 3.14 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...are tied for the ML lead in pickoffs (16)...A's starting pitchers are 10-9 with a 2.47 ERA (42 er in 153.0 ip), .213 (120 for 563) opponents batting average, 44 walks, 119 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the last 24 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.19 ERA (202 er in 570.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Seattle, 3.19) and third lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.93).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 50 home runs, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 63 games, which is the longest streak by an A's team since April 24-July 15, 1994 when they had a 72-game streak...the A's last threehomer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed 14 home runs in the last 12 games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 62 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 71 errors, which ranks second in the AL...the errors have led to 51 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (94).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 0-4 on the last road trip to Texas and have now lost 23 of the last 28 games on the road...that is the A's worst 28-game stretch on the road since May 26-August 2, 1986 when they also went 5-23...begin a brief four-game homestand tonight against Los Angeles...went 4-5 on the last homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Seattle (1-2)...are 23-21 (.523) at home and 16-32 (.333) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...are batting .245 (353 for 1443) with 163 runs scored in 44 home games (3.70 per game) and .222 (363 for 1632) with 152 runs scored in 48 games on the road (3.17 per game)...have a 2.76 ERA (124 er in 404.0 ip) at home, which is second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.71).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 12-20 (.375) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors (Cincinnati 13-21, .382)...are 5-10 (.333) in extra inning games, which is the worst record in the American League...the 15 extra inning games are tied with the Angels for the most in the AL...are now 12-27 (.308) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (7) and four more than they had all last year.

DOUBLEHEADERS: The A's and Angels will play a doubleheader tomorrow, the first twinbill in Oakland since August 22, 1998 against Detroit...that was the result of a rainout...the A's have not played a scheduled doubleheader in Oakland since August 10, 1997 against Milwaukee...it that four-game series, the two clubs played on Thursday, had Friday off for a Raiders exhibition game, played a single game Saturday and two on Sunday...the last scheduled doubleheader prior to that was July 8, 1995 against Toronto...the last scheduled doubleheader in the majors was August 2, 2003 (San Diego at Philadelphia).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season, his third since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 2-9 (.182) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 29-38 (.433) in his 67 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 10 of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer all 11 times.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 4.14 ERA (54.1 ip, 58 h, 30 r, 25 er, 10 bb, 32 so) over his last eight starts...the losing streak is a career-high, topping his previous high of four from June 25 to September 10, 2006.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so)...was reinstated from the DL July 3 and is 0-1 with a 4.97 ERA (7 er in 12.2 ip) in two starts since his return.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .200 (18 for 90) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .320 (63 for 197) after that...opponents are batting .362 (17 for 47) with runners in scoring position.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just three home runs in 76.1 innings, which is tied for the fewest among Major League pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched (Morton, PIT)...all three have been solo shots and two have been hit by left-handed hitters.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or less in eight of his 11 starts...his season run support is 3.89 (33 rs in 76.1 ip)...has 10 runs of support in his five losses (35.1 ip, 2.55 RSA).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitchers (Verlander, DET and Harrison, TEX)...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

2011 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto April 5...gave up only one run over the first five innings when Hill drove in Escobar on a force out...however, then allowed four runs, three earned, in the sixth inning...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle)...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota *April 10*...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss *April 15* against Detroit in Oakland...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle *April* 21...the complete game was his second of his career, his first since May 24, 2009 with Texas at Houston...allowed the game's only run in the fourth inning when Kennedy hit a home run with one out...allowed only four hits, with the home run being the only hit that went for extra bases, while walking one and striking out six...he threw 64 of 99 pitches for strikes...was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles April 26...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...surrendered two runs in the second inning, three in the third and two more in the fifth...was then replaced by Ziegler with one out in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Texas *May 2* in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...had a 1-0 lead when Young hit a two-run double in the third inning...the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth but sacrifice flies by Young and Beltre in the fifth gave Texas a 4-2 lead...left after six innings trailing 4-3 but Willingham homered in the eight and Matsui in the 10th for the win...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City May 7...both of his complete games have been losses...allowed seven hits and walked two...retired each of the first 14 batters before Hosmer singled with two outs in the fifth...then allowed three runs in the sixth inning on RBI singles by Cabrera and Gordon and a Butler sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with three in the eighth but he allowed an Aviles sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth for the loss...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago May 13...allowed all four of the runs in the second inning...the first run scored on a fielders choice but Vizquel followed with a RBI double and Beckham scored on a sacrifice fly before his own error on a pickoff attempt allowed Vizquel to score...shutout the Rangers on two hits over his final five innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10inning loss to Minnesota *May 18*...allowed a RBI single to Morneau in the first inning but the A's came back with two runs in the second...then allowed two runs in the third on a two-run single by Plouffe...then retired 13 of the final 17 hitters he faced...the A's scored once in the sixth inning to tie the game and he was relieved by Balfour to start the eighth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Seattle July 4 in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters before Suzuki singled to lead off the fourth...faced the minimum over the first five innings thanks to two double plays...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Bard in the sixth and a RBI double to Smoak in the seventh...the A's were limited to a run on three hits by Pineda and the Mariners bullpen.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Texas last Saturday...the A's scored four times in the second inning but he allowed a run in the bottom of the second on a Torrealba RBI double...the A's added another run in the fifth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the inning to tie the game...Kinsler had a RBI double, Andrus a sacrifice fly, Hamilton a RBI ground out and Beltre a solo home run...the A's scored a run in the seventh to take a 6-5 lead but Bailey allowed a two-run home run to Hamilton in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save and loss.

McCARTHY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-2 with a 5.00 ERA (36.0 ip, 47 h, 24 r, 20 er, 9 bb, 21 so, 2 hr) in eight career appearances, four starts...is 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in three relief appearances in his home ballparks and 0-2 with a 6.00 ERA (16 er in 24.0 ip) in five games, four starts, in Los Angeles...is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (14 er in 23.1 ip) in his four starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-3 A's loss at Los Angeles April 26...allowed a two-run double to Amarista in the second inning but the A's came back with three runs in the third...then allowed three runs in the bottom of the third on a wild pitch, a Wells RBI single and a Conger RBI single.

TOMORROW'S GAME 1 PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (8-7, 3.12 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season...has allowed two runs or fewer in four of his last five starts and is 2-2 with a 2.31 ERA and .216 opponents batting average over that span...however, is 2-7 with a 4.10 ERA and a .263 opponents batting average over his last 12 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...has received no run support in each of his last three starts and his season run support of 3.33 is fifth lowest in the American League...is 3-2 with a 1.79 ERA in seven starts against AL West competition and 5-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 2-0 loss at Texas last Sunday (7.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 4-2 with a 2.13 ERA in eight career starts against Los Angeles...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's loss at Los Angeles May 25 (6.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 4 so).

TOMORROW'S GAME 2 PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Rich Harden (1-1, 5.73 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1...was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and went 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts...has 869 strikeouts in 856.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.13 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-0 A's loss at Texas July 7 (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 6-3 with a 3.76 ERA (91.0 ip, 78 h, 41 r, 38 er, 36 bb, 73 so, 6 hr) in 15 career appearances, 14 starts, against Los Angeles.

The A's bullpen has a 1.89 ERA (12 er in 57.0 ip) over the past 22 games dating back to June 17...is 1-4 with eight saves, one blown save, a .201 (41 for 204) opponents batting average and two home runs allowed over that span...now has a 3.04 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.336) in the AL, is tied for the lowest batting average (.231) and has the third lowest on-base percentage (.306)...is tied for the fewest wins (8) and has the most losses (18)...has allowed the third fewest home runs (16)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (62)

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
