**UP TO SPEED:** Angels have won four straight games and eight of last nine contests...Halos open the second half with this four-game series in Oakland before returning home for three games with Texas (7/19-21)...Saturday's double header is the first scheduled DH for the Halos since Sept. 9, 1978 vs. KC and the first scheduled DH in the Majors since 2003...**20 of the Angels' first 29 games in the second half will be on the road...**Angels reached the All-Star break winning 11 of 13 and 14 of 17...**The club enters play tonight a season-high eight games over .500...**Halos have won eight consecutive series, a feat last accomplished during 100-win campaign in 2008...**Angels are 20-7 in last 27 games and have cut 5.0 games off Rangers' lead in West, entering today one game back...** Halos are 18-10-2 through 30 series played...Angels tied a club record with 11 wins on the last homestand (11-2)...Halos are 8-2 this month – club went 9-17 in July last season.

**NOW YOU KNOW:** The top two team ERAs in baseball over the last month (since 6/13) are the **Angels** (2.49; 223.2 IP - 62 ER) and the **A's** (2.57; 224 IP - 64 ER)...Halos have a 2.09 team ERA over their last 16 games (142.1 IP - 33 ER).

**FAST FACTS:** Angels have connected for 23 home runs in their last 17 games, including eight long balls over the last three contests...Halos logged 50 wins before the All-Star Break for the third time in six seasons (also 2007 & 2008)...**Angels' 19-6 record since June 13<sup>th</sup> is tops in MLB...** Dan Haren, Jered Weaver and Ervin Santana are the first trio in club history to each post 100 Ks before the All-Star Break...Marks just the fifth time since World War II that a team has had three pitchers with 100+ strikeouts before the break (STATS LLC).

**WEAVER TOMORROW (GAME 1):** Jered Weaver, the MLB ERA leader (1.86), will start the first game of the double header tomorrow...He is one win shy from passing Jarrod Washburn (75 wins) for 10<sup>th</sup> most on Angels all-time list and one strikeout shy from 900 for his career...He was the A.L.'s starting pitcher for the All-Star Game working one scoreless inning (1 BB, 1 SO)...**Weaver is 5-0 with a 1.48 ERA over his last seven outings...**His 2.25 ERA since last year's all-star break is tops in baseball (min. 150 IP).

**@ OAKLAND:** Halos are 10-3 in last 13 home games vs. A's but just 4-8 in last 12 in Oakland...Club is 4-5 vs. A's in 2011...Halos have not lost a season series to Oakland since 2003...In the Angels' last 15 victories, they have outscored A's 81-31...In their last 12 losses, they have been outscored 97-23.

**STINGY:** Angels have logged a 2.49 ERA over their last 25 contests (223.2 IP - 62 ER)...Angel starting pitchers have held opponents to three earned runs or less in 22 of these 25 contests.

**THE COWBOY:** The Angels will hold a pre-game ceremony prior to Tuesday's game (7/19) vs. Texas to induct original owner **Gene Autry** into the club's Hall of Fame...Autry will be the ninth member inducted into the Angels' Hall of Fame (Ryan, Grich, Carew, Downing, Finley, Baylor, Fregosi, Reese).

**TRUMBO JACKS:** Mark Trumbo's 17 home runs lead all MLB rookies and are most by an Angel rookie before the All-Star break since **Tim Salmon** had 17 in 1993...Trumbo is on pace for 30 homers.

**HELP WANTED:** Jered Weaver and Dan Haren are in the top 5 in several A.L. pitching categories despite ranking 89<sup>th</sup> (Weaver) and 108<sup>th</sup> (Haren) respectively out of 110 qualifiers in run support rankings...Angels are scoring 2.68 runs per game for Haren and 3.46 for Weaver.

**FISH TALE:** 19-year old **Mike Trout** made his MLB debut July 8th after the Angels selected the contract of the outfielder from double-A Arkansas...**At 19 years, 335 days, Trout** became the youngest player to make his big-league debut for the Angels since May 30, 1971, when Andy Hassler debuted at age 19 years, 224 days...**Trout is currently the youngest player in the big leagues.**

**YOUTH MOVEMENT:** Angels' current 25-man roster features **eight players ages 25-or-younger** (Bell, Bourjos, Cassevah, Conger, Kohn, Trout, Trumbo & Walden)...**11 players on the current 25-man roster have less than two years of MLB service time.**

**THIS N' THAT:** Angels are 41-8 (.837) when scoring four-plus runs, second best in the A.L...Angel Stadium averages 39,002 fans per game to rank third in the A.L...Club has played 15 extra-inning affairs (6-9) – club record is 25 extra inning games in 1976...**Angels have used 73 different lineups in 92 games...**Halos have been shut out 10 times this season (shutout a total of nine times in 2010)...Halo pinch-hitters are 3-for-40 on season...**Nine of Angels' 20 road losses have come in walk-off fashion...**Halos' have 17 one-run losses...Club has had eight rain delays this season.

**(2003)** Garret Anderson (3/4, 2B, HR, 2 RBI) propels the American League to a 7-6 comeback win in the 74<sup>th</sup> All-Star Game at U.S. Cellular Field in Chicago...Anderson is the third Angel to capture game MVP honors, joining Fred Lynn (1983) and Leon Wagner (1962 – Game 2)...With Anderson as the game MVP, Mike Scioscia as the winning manager and Brendan Donnelly as the winning pitcher, the Angels completed just the second trifecta from one team at the Mid-Summer Classic.

**TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP DAN HAREN**

Has won four straight starts, posting a 1.45 ERA (31 IP – 5 ER) over the span

- Had club-high 17.1 inning scoreless streak snapped in last start...Has won four straight starts, posting a 1.45 ERA (31 IP – 5 ER) over the span.
- **Earned 100<sup>th</sup> career victory with fourth career shutout, July 5<sup>th</sup> vs. Detroit...**With second consecutive 1-0 victory, became 34<sup>th</sup> active pitcher with 100 or more wins, joining teammate Joel Pineiro who reached the mark on June 17<sup>th</sup>.
- Has left game tied or with lead in 14 of 19 starts, but Halos are just 11-8 in his outings.
- Reached 100-strikeout plateau on July 5th, joining teammates Jered Weaver and Ervin Santana as the first trio in club history to reach the mark before the All-Star Break...Marks just the fifth time since World War II that a team has had three pitchers with 100+ strikeouts before the break (*Stats, LLC*).
- Tossed seven innings-or-more in 12 of 19 starts this season with 16 quality starts.
- Among league leaders ranks tied for fourth in wins, sixth in ERA and innings pitched (134.1) and eighth in both strikeouts (115) and opponents BAA (.217).
- Tossed third career shutout and first career one-hit game, April 12 vs. Cleveland...Became 11<sup>th</sup> Angels pitcher (17<sup>th</sup> time) to toss a one-hitter and first since John Lackey in 2006...Victory marked third in one week span, making Haren the first pitcher in nearly 20 years to win three games in one week with two of them as the starting pitcher (Bob Walk, 1991). Credit *ELIAS*.
- Earned victory in relief, April 9 vs. Toronto, marking first relief appearance since 2004 World Series...Had made 203 starts since last relief appearance.
- Registered a 5-4 record with a 2.87 ERA (94 IP – 30 ER) in 14 starts with Halos in 2010...Compiled a 12-12 overall record with one complete game and a 3.91 ERA (235 IP – 102 ER) in 35 starts between Angels and Arizona...Acquired from Arizona, July 25 in exchange for Joe Saunders, Rafael Rodriguez, Patrick Corbin and Tyler Skaggs.
- Since 2005, his six consecutive seasons of 215-plus innings pitched is the longest active streak in the Majors, ranking first during that span with 153 quality starts.
- Owns an 101-79 career record with 13 complete games, four shutouts, and a 3.57 ERA (1596 IP – 633 ER) in 251 appearances, 240 starts.

**VS. OAKLAND:** Is making sixth career start and appearance vs. Oakland, third start of 2011...Is 0-1 vs. former team this season, registering a 3.21 ERA (14 IP – 5 ER)... Played for Oakland from 2005-07, posting a 43-34 record with a 3.64 ERA, making an All-Star appearance in 2007...2-1 lifetime vs. A's with a 3.44 ERA (34 IP – 13 ER).
