A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series, 6-4...are 3-0 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...have won seven of the last eight games in Oakland...have lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons and six of the last seven...are 66-77 (.462) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 371-300 against the Angels...that includes 193-140 in Oakland and 178-160 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 420-377 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's were 5 for 5 with RISP last night, the first time in Oakland history they were perfect with at least five at bats.

Andrew Bailey recorded the 60th save of his career last night and needs one more to tie Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland history.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has an 84-game, 81.0-inning, 328-batter homerless streak...last allowed a home run April 7, 2006 at San Francisco (Alou).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Ryan Sweeney extended his errorless streak to 165 games last night, which ties the Oakland record for consecutive errorless games by an outfielder...shares the mark with Jermaine Dye.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1971 Vida Blue tosses a one-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 4-0...Blue improves to 18-3 with the victory and would go on to win both the MVP and the Cy Young Award...in 1991 the A's score three times in the bottom of the 13th inning after Cleveland scores twice in the top of the 13th for a 7-6 win...Mike Gallego has a two-run triple to tie the game and scores the winning run when Terry Steinbach walks with the bases loaded.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their four-game losing streak last night but have lost six of their last eight games and 13 of the last 19...remain a season-high 12½ games behind Texas in the American League West, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since they finished the 2009 season 22 games out...the A's .430 winning percentage is third lowest in the AL...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 18-33 (.353) since then, which is the third worst mark in the AL...the A's are 2-6 in this stretch of 11 consecutive games against all three AL West opponents (1-2 vs. Seattle, 0-4 vs. Texas, 1-0 vs. Los Angeles)...have spent each of the last 44 days and 51 of the last 52 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 55 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

DOUBLEHEADERS: Today's doubleheader is the first in Oakland since August 22, 1998 against Detroit...that was the result of a rainout...the A's have not played a scheduled doubleheader in Oakland since August 10, 1997 against Milwaukee...in that four-game series, the two clubs played on Thursday, had Friday off for a Raiders exhibition game, played a single game Saturday and two on Sunday...the last scheduled doubleheader prior to that was July 8, 1995 against Toronto...the last scheduled doubleheader in the majors was August 2, 2003 (San Diego at Philadelphia)...the A's have been swept in each of their last four doubleheaders, including the most recent, May 29, 2009 at Texas...have not split a doubleheader since May 26, 2001 at Minnesota and have not swept a doubleheader since the last home twinbill in 1998 against Detroit...the A's and Angels have not played two since July 30, 1983 at California, a sweep by the A's...the A's and Angels have played 14 doubleheaders and Oakland is 5-1-8, including 4-0-6 in Oakland.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.41 ERA (60 er in 224.0 ip) and .214 (176 for 824) opponents batting average over the last 25 games but are just 12-13 over that span...have a 3.14 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...are tied for the ML lead in pickoffs (16)...A's starting pitchers are 11-9 with a 2.50 ERA (44 er in 158.1 ip), .215 (126 for 585) opponents batting average, 45 walks, 123 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the last 25 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks, 37 strikeouts and 14 home runs over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.19 ERA (204 er in 575.2 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the AL** and third lowest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .214 (132 for 616) with 48 runs scored over the last 19 games (2.53 runs per game)...have just 40 walks and four hit batters over that stretch for a .265 on-base percentage (4 sf)...have been held to two runs or fewer in 12 of those 19 games and have scored just 320 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...have been shutout twice in the last five games and 11 times this year, which is the most in the AL...also have the second lowest batting average (.234), slugging percentage (.339) and on-base percentage (.300) in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 51 home runs, which is the **fewest in the American League** and third fewest in the majors...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 64 games, which is the longest streak by an A's team since April 24-July 15, 1994 when they had a 72-game streak...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed 14 home runs in the last 13 games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...have surrendered 62 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 71 errors, which ranks second in the American League...the errors have led to 51 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (95).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this four-game homestand against Los Angeles...went 4-5 on the last homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are now 24-21 (.533) at home compared to 16-32 (.333) on the road...are tied for the second worst road record in the American League...went 0-4 on the last road trip to Texas and have now lost 23 of the last 28 games on the road...that is the A's worst 28-game stretch on the road since May 26-August 2, 1986 when they also went 5-23...are batting .248 (365 for 1474) with 168 runs scored in 45 home games (3.73 per game) and .222 (363 for 1632) with 152 runs scored in 48 games on the road (3.17 per game)...have a 2.77 ERA (127 er in 413.0 ip) at home, which is second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.71).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 12-20 (.375) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors (Houston 10-16, .385)...are 5-10 (.333) in extra inning games, which is the worst record in the American League...the 15 extra inning games are tied with the Angels for the most in the AL...are now 12-27 (.308) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 9-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 7-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (8) and four more than they had all last year.

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season...went 39-53 (.424), which was the fourth worst record at the break in Oakland history...it was the worst since going 37-52 (.416) in 1997...the A's 12-game deficit in the AL West matched their largest at the break over the last 10 years (2009)...the pitching staff posted a 3.14 ERA, which was their lowest at the break since 1990 (3.09)...had 629 strikeouts, which was the second best total in Oakland history (635 in 2008)...the offense batted .233 with a .337 slugging percentage and .299 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is the lowest in Oakland history at the break, the batting average is third lowest (.231 in 1982, .233 in 1979) and the slugging percentage is third lowest (.329 in 1968, .337 in 1979)...hit 50 home runs, which is second fewest in Oakland history (42 in 1968)...averaged 3.42 runs, which was third lowest (3.32 in 1978, 3.34 in 1968).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season...the A's are 8-12 (.400) in his starting assignments this year and are 44-38 (.537) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 11 of his 20 starts, allowed one run or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

RECENTLY: Has allowed two runs or fewer in four of his last five starts and is 2-2 with a 2.31 ERA (9 er in 35.0 ip) and .216 (27 for 125) opponents batting average over that span...however, is 2-7 with a 4.10 ERA (34 er in 74.2 ip) and a .263 (72 for 274) opponents batting average over his last 12 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in each of his last three starts...since 1998, the only A's starting pitcher with three consecutive starts with no run support is Greg Smith (April 29-May 9, 2008)...has received three runs of support or fewer in each of his last 12 starts and his run support average over that stretch is 1.69 (14 rs in 74.2 ip)...received run support of 5.68 over his first eight starts...his season RSA of 3.33 (47 rs in 127.0 ip) is fifth lowest in the American League.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in most stolen bases allowed (19)...also ranks second in the AL in wild pitches (11) and tied for fifth in walks (51)...the 11 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when three pitchers had at least 11 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14, Haynes 11).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-4 with a 2.66 ERA (19 er in 64.1 ip) in 10 starts at home and 4-3 with a 3.59 ERA (25 er in 62.2 ip) in 10 starts on the road...ranks 10th in the American League in home ERA...is now 22-14 with a 3.12 ERA (95 er in 274.0 ip) in 43 career starts in Oakland and 14-14 with a 4.18 ERA (106 er in 228.1 ip) in 39 starts on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-2 with a 1.79 ERA (9 er in 45.1 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition this year and 5-5 with a 3.86 ERA (35 er in 81.2 ip) in 13 starts against everyone else...now has a 14-8 record and a 2.24 ERA (44 er in 177.0 ip) in 28 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 22-20 with a 4.34 ERA (157 er in 325.1 ip) in 54 starts against everyone else.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .135 (7 for 52) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Cueto, CIN .108)...opponents are hitting .202 (20 for 99) with runners in scoring position, which is eighth lowest in the AL...that includes .114 over his first eight starts and .250 (16 for 64) over his last 12 starts...has allowed 11 home runs and seven have been solo shots.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 4-1 with a 1.34 ERA (6 er in 40.1 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more and 4-6 with a 3.95 ERA (38 er in 86.2 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest.

WINS: Is 26-14 with a 2.91 ERA (103 er in 318.2 ip) and .227 (261 for 1152) opponents batting average in 49 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are fifth most in the majors over that span...is 36-28 (.563) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day **April 1** in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings...improved to 6-0 in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9** but was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss ended a career-high seven-game winning streak as he also won his final start of 2010...lost his career-high fifth consecutive decision in the A's 7-4 loss to Kansas City **June 14** in Oakland...walked seven batters in 4.1 innings and did not record a strikeout...the only other pitcher in Oakland history to walk seven or more batters in a game without striking out a batter is Mike Norris with eight on April 16, 1979 against Seattle.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Texas last Sunday...tossed 7.2 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched plateau...blanked the Rangers on four hits over the first five innings...had retired nine consecutive batters before walking Hamilton with two outs in the sixth inning...Beltre followed with a home run for the only two runs of the game...Harrison and Lowe combined to shutout the A's on six hits and a walk.

CAHILL vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 4-2 with a 2.13 ERA (50.2 ip, 43 h, 15 r, 12 er, 25 bb, 20 so, 4 hr) in eight career starts...is 3-0 with a 1.40 ERA (4 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-2 with a 2.88 ERA (8 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts at Los Angeles...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's loss at Los Angeles May 25...allowed a RBI single to Bourjos in the second inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth...allowed three runs in the bottom of the fifth on back-to-back home runs by Hunter and Callaspo and a RBI double by Willits...it was the second time in his career he allowed back-to-back home runs (Aug. 30, 2010 at New York)...went 3-1 with a 1.29 ERA (28.0 ip, 20 h, 5 r, 4 er, 9 bb, 13 so) in four starts last year.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...it is the 148th start of his career, his 92nd as an Athletic...the A's are 1-1 in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 92-55 (.626) in his starting assignments, including 59-32 (.648) with the A's.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

WITH THE A'S: His start July 1 against Arizona was his first as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 37-20 record and a 3.47 ERA (213 er in 552.2 ip) in 99 games, 91 starts...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

SINCE 2003: Has 866 strikeouts in 856.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.10 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 10.01)...has a .224 (706 for 3145) opponents batting average over that span, which is fourth best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221; Jason Schmidt, .223; Tim Lincecum, .224).

FIRST START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona July 1 in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...the A's scored a run in the fourth and four more in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler to start the seventh.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas July 7...allowed runs in four of his five innings...Kinsler scored on a ground out in the first and Hamilton had a RBI single in the third...Kinsler added a RBI single in the fourth followed by a Hamilton sacrifice fly and Young hit a leadoff home run in the fifth inning...Holland shutout the A's on four hits.

HARDEN vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 6-3 with a 3.76 ERA (91.0 ip, 78 h, 41 r, 38 er, 36 bb, 73 so, 6 hr) in 15 career appearances, 14 starts...is 2-2 with a 3.95 ERA (18 er in 41.0 ip) in seven games, six starts, in Oakland and 4-1 with a 3.60 ERA (20 er in 50.0 ip) in eight starts on the road...faced the Angels once last year while pitching for Texas and was the winning pitcher in the Rangers 2-1 win at Los Angeles July 31...blanked the Angels on three hits and two walks over the first six innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a one-out solo home run to Kendrick in the seventh.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and went 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts...struck out 12 batters in 7.2 innings...allowed a .115 (3 for 26) opponents batting average, including .083 (1 for 12) against left-handed hitters and .143 (2 for 14) against right-handers.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season...the A's are 9-9 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 39-36 (.520) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 14 of his 18 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 12 times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team and was the A's lone selection...entered the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with two outs and the bases empty and struck out Jay Bruce.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **fourth** in the American League in ERA (2.47), **eighth** in opponents slugging percentage (.326) and **10th** in opponents batting average (.221)...is also **tied for third** in walks (52), **tied for eighth** in hit batters (6) and **tied for ninth** in wild pitches (6).

STRIKEOUTS: Ranks **fifth** in the American League in strikeouts per nine innings (8.84)...has 111 strikeouts overall, which tied for the fourth best pre-All-Star Break total in Oakland history...they were the most at the break since Jose Rijo also had 111 in 1986...the top three are Vida Blue (188 in 1971), Vida Blue (120 in 1975) and Catfish Hunter (119 in 1972).

THE LONG BALL: Allowed three home runs in 4.0 innings in his last start after allowing six home runs over his first 17 starts and 109.0 innings...six of the nine home runs have been solo shots.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.13 ERA (25 er in 72.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 1.32 ERA (6 er in 41.0 ip) from the fifth inning on...has allowed eight of his nine home runs over the first four innings of a game.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-2 with a 3.03 ERA (10 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts against American League West competition...his career numbers are 13-5 with a 2.96 ERA (48 er in 146.0 ip) against divisional foes and 17-21 with a 4.41 ERA (147 er in 300.1 ip) against all other teams.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-5 loss at Texas July 8...allowed five runs in the first inning, including a Napoli grand slam...a Rosales error earlier in the inning allowed a run to score and four of the five runs were unearned...surrendered a pair of solo home runs to Kinsler and Beltre in the second inning and left after pitching a season-low 4.0 innings.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
