UP TO SPEED: Angels have won four of last five and eight of last 10 contests...Halos opened the second half yesterday with the first of a four-game series in Oakland (0-1)...Following this series, the club returns home for three games with Texas (7/19-21)...Today's double header is the first scheduled DH for the Halos since Sept. 9, 1978 vs. KC and the first scheduled DH in the Majors since 2003...**20 of the Angels' first 29 games in the second half will be on the road...**Angels reached the All-Star break winning 11 of 13 and 14 of 17...Halos have won eight consecutive series, a feat last accomplished during 100-win campaign in 2008...**Angels are 20-8 in last 28 contests...**Halos are 18-10-2 through 30 series played...Angels tied a club record with 11 wins on the last home stand (11-2)...Halos are 8-3 this month – club went 9-17 in July last season.

NOW YOU KNOW: The top two team ERAs in baseball over the last month (since 6/13) are the **Angels** (2.60; 231.2 IP - 67 ER) and the **A's** (2.59; 233 IP – 67 ER)...Halos have a 2.27 team ERA over their last 17 games (150.1 IP – 38 ER).

FAST FACTS: Halos lead the A.L. with 23 come-from-behind victories...Angels have connected for 23 home runs in their last 18 games...Halos logged 50 wins before the All-Star Break for the third time in six seasons (also 2007 & 2008)...**Dan Haren, Jered Weaver and Ervin Santana** are the first trio in club history to each post 100 Ks before the All-Star Break...Marks just the fifth time since World War II that a team has had three pitchers with 100+ strikeouts before the break (*STATS LLC*)...Five shutouts by Angels starters are tied for most in A.L.

WEAVER (GAME 1): Jered Weaver, the MLB ERA leader (1.86), will start the first game of the double header today...He is one win shy from passing Jarrod Washburn (75 wins) for 10th most on Angels all-time list and one **strikeout shy from 900 for his career**...He was the A.L.'s starting pitcher for the All-Star Game working one scoreless inning (1 BB, 1 SO)...**Weaver is 5-0 with a 1.48 ERA over his last seven outings**...His 2.25 ERA since last year's All-Star break is tops in baseball (min. 150 IP).

@ OAKLAND: Halos are 10-3 in last 13 home games vs. A's but just 4-9 in last 13 in Oakland...Club is 4-6 vs. A's in 2011...Halos have not lost a season series to Oakland since 2003...In the Angels' last 15 victories, they have outscored A's 81-31...In their last 12 losses, they have been outscored 102-26.

STINGY: Angels have logged a 2.60 ERA over their last 25 contests (231.2 IP – 67 ER)...Angel starting pitchers have held opponents to three earned runs or less in 22 of these 26 contests.

THE COWBOY: The Angels will hold a pre-game ceremony prior to Tuesday's game (7/19) vs. Texas to induct original owner **Gene Autry** into the club's Hall of Fame...Autry will be the ninth member inducted into the Angels' Hall of Fame (Ryan, Grich, Carew, Downing, Finley, Baylor, Fregosi, Reese)...Nolan Ryan is scheduled to throw out the ceremonial first pitch.

TRUMBO JACKS: Mark Trumbo's 17 home runs lead all MLB rookies and are most by an Angel rookie before the All-Star break since **Tim Salmon** had 17 in 1993...Trumbo is on pace for 30 homers.

FISH TALE: 19-year old **Mike Trout** made his MLB debut July 8th after the Angels selected the contract of the outfielder from double-A Arkansas...**At 19 years, 335 days, Trout** became the youngest player to make his big-league debut for the Angels since May 30, 1971, when Andy Hassler debuted at age 19 years, 224 days...Trout is currently the youngest player in the big leagues.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: Angels' current 25-man roster features **eight players ages 25-or-younger (Amarista, Bell, Cassevah, Conger, Kohn, Trout, Trumbo & Walden)**...**11 players on the current 25-man roster have less than two years of MLB service time.**

THIS N' THAT: Angels are 41-8 (.837) when scoring four-plus runs, second best in the A.L...Angel Stadium averages 39,002 fans per game to rank third in the A.L...Club has played 15 extra-inning affairs (6-9) – club record is 25 extra inning games in 1976...Angels have used **74 different lineups in 93 games**...Halos have been shut out 10 times this season (shutout a total of nine times in 2010)...Club is 17-13 in day games this season...Halo pinch-hitters are 3-for-40 on season...Nine of Angels' 21 road losses have come in walk-off fashion...Halos' have 17 one-run losses...Club has had eight rain delays this season.

Is 13-3 with a 1.97 ERA in career vs. Oakland

- Angels have won each of Santana's last three starts, but he has registered just one victory...Has posted a 2.38 ERA (22.2 IP – 6 ER) in his last three starts...In his last seven starts, offense has scored just 11 total runs of support while he was in the game (1.6 runs per game).
- Has allowed two earned runs-or-less in eight of last 14 starts (4-5 in those starts)...11 of 19 starts have been quality starts.
- Winless in last five road starts with last victory coming April 29 at Tampa Bay...Owns a 2.44 ERA (51.2 IP – 14 ER) in last seven starts at the Big A.
- Tossed sixth career shutout, May 20 vs. Atlanta, snapping three start winless streak...Third Halos starter to toss a shutout this season.
- Has tossed six innings or more in 16 of 19 starts this season...Halos are 9-10 in his 19 starts.
- Bounced back from tough 2009 season (8-8, 5.03) to finish 17-10 with four complete games, one shutout and a 3.92 ERA (222.2 IP – 97 ER) in 33 starts in 2010...Won nine of final 12 decisions in 2010, finishing season with a career-high 17 wins.
- Has thrown seven innings-or-more 10 times this season, posting a 2-4 record in those starts...Tossed seven innings-or-more 16 times in 2010 (11-2 in those starts).
- Owns a 3.79 career ERA at home compared to a 4.98 mark (555 IP – 307 ER) on the road.
- Ranks eighth on Angels' all-time win list with 80 career victories; Clyde Wright (87) is next on the list...Ranks seventh on Angels' all-time list with 962 strikeouts...Ranks 10th with 1,194 innings pitched, Kirk McCaskill (1,221) is next on the list.
- Is 80-63 with 10 complete games, six shutouts, and a 4.36 ERA (1194 IP – 576 ER) in 192 career games, 189 starts.

VS. ATHLETICS: Is making 23rd career appearance, 21st start vs. Oakland, second start of 2011...Defeated Oakland, 4-1, May 25th at Angel Stadium...Was 2-1 with a 4.70 ERA (23 IP – 12 ER) in 2010...Owns a 6-1 career record at the Oakland Coliseum, registering a 2.00 ERA (63 IP – 14 ER) in 11 career appearances (nine starts)...Is 13-3 lifetime with a 1.97 ERA (137.1 IP – 30 ER)...His 13 wins and 1.97 ERA are his best marks vs. any opponent (min. two starts).
