A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series, 7-5...are 4-1 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...have won eight of the last 10 games in Oakland...have lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons and six of the last seven...are 67-78 (.462) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 372-301 against the Angels...that includes 194-141 in Oakland and 178-160 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 421-378 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded the 60th save of his career Friday night and needs one more to tie Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland history.

David DeJesus is a .344 career hitter against Los Angeles, which is the best mark by any player against the Angels (min. 200 PA).

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has an 84-game, 81.0-inning, 328batter homerless streak...last allowed a home run April 7, 2006 at San Francisco (Alou).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Ryan Sweeney extended his errorless streak to 167 games yesterday, breaking the Oakland record for consecutive errorless games by an outfielder...the previous mark was 165 by Jermaine Dve.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1934** Bob Johnson, Jimmie Foxx and Pinky Higgins hit consecutive home runs in the fourth inning but the A's lose to St. Louis, 7-4...in **1969** Sal Bando is a perfect 5 for 5 in an 8-2 A's win at Seattle against the Pilots...he would duplicate the feat later in the season on September 30, also against Seattle...in **1974** Sal Bando singles in the A's 2-0 win at Baltimore for the 1000th hit of his major league career.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Split the doubleheader yesterday and have won two of the first three games of this series...however, have lost seven of their last 10 games and 14 of the last 21...are a season-high 13 games behind Texas in the American League West, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since they finished the 2009 season 22 games out...the A's .432 winning percentage is third lowest in the AL...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 19-34 (.358) since then...the A's are 3-7 in this stretch of 11 consecutive games against all three AL West opponents (1-2 vs. Seattle, 0-4 vs. Texas, 2-1 vs. Los Angeles)...have spent each of the last 45 days and 52 of the last 53 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 56 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff had 21 strikeouts in the doubleheader yesterday, the most ever in a doubleheader by an Oakland team...now has 660 strikeouts for the season, which ranks third in the American League...has a 2.44 ERA (66 er in 243.0 ip) and .210 (187 for 892) opponents batting average over the last 27 games but are just 13-14 over that span...has a 3.13 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...are tied for the ML lead in pickoffs (16)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.350), the third lowest batting average (.240) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.310).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-10 with a 2.61 ERA (50 er in 172.1 ip), .213 (135 for 635) opponents batting average, 52 walks and 140 strikeouts over the last 27 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks and 37 strikeouts over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.21 ERA (210 er in 589.2 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the AL** and second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.00).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .222 (152 for 686) with 54 runs scored over the last 21 games (2.57 runs per game)...have just 49 walks and four hit batters over that stretch for a .276 on-base percentage (5 sf)...have been held to two runs or fewer in 13 of those 21 games and have scored just 326 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...have been shutout twice in the last seven games and 11 times this year, which is the most in the AL...also have the second lowest batting average (.236), slugging percentage (.340) and on-base percentage (.302) in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 51 home runs, which is the **fewest in the American League** and tied for second fewest in the majors...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 66 games...since 1979, the only longer streak by an A's team was a 72-game streak from April 24-July 15, 1994...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed 17 home runs in the last 15 games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...has surrendered 65 home runs for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles for the fewest in the AL and tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 73 errors, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 52 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (95).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this four-game homestand against Los Angeles...went 4-5 on the last homestand against Florida (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are now 25-22 (.532) at home compared to 16-32 (.333) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...begin a five-game road trip to Detroit (two games) and New York (three games) on Tuesday...went 0-4 on the last road trip to Texas and have a five-game road losing streak...have now lost 23 of the last 28 games on the road, which is the A's worst 28-game stretch on the road since May 26-August 2, 1986 when they also went 5-23...are batting .249 (385 for 1544) with 174 runs scored in 47 home games (3.70 per game) and .222 (363 for 1632) with 152 runs scored in 48 games on the road (3.17 per game)...have a 2.77 ERA (133 er in 432.0 ip) at home, which is second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 2.71).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games with the win in the second game of the doubleheader yesterday...that is tied with Los Angeles for the worst record in the American League...the 16 extra inning games are tied with the Angels for the most in the AL...are now 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 10-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...improved to 13-20 (.394) in one-run games, but that is still the worst record in the AL...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (8) and four more than they had all last year.

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season...went 39-53 (.424), which was the fourth worst record at the break in Oakland history...it was the worst since going 37-52 (.416) in 1997...the A's 12-game deficit in the AL West matches their largest at the break over the last 10 years (2009)...the pitching staff posted a 3.14 ERA, which was their lowest at the break since 1990 (3.09)...had 629 strikeouts, which was the second best total in Oakland history (635 in 2008)...yielded 62 home runs, which are the fewest since 1989 (54)...the offense batted .233 with a .337 slugging percentage and .299 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is the lowest in Oakland history at the break, the batting average is third lowest (.231 in 1982, .233 in 1979) and the slugging percentage is third lowest (.329 in 1968, ..., averaged 3.42 runs, which was third lowest (3.32 in 1978, 3.34 in 1968).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season...the A's are 9-9 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 39-36 (.520) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 14 of his 18 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 12 times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team and was the A's lone selection...entered the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with two outs and the bases empty and struck out the only batter he faced, Jay Bruce.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.47), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.326) and ninth in opponents batting average (.221)...is also tied for second in walks (52) and tied for 10th in hit batters (6) and wild pitches (6).

STRIKEOUTS: Ranks second in the American League in strikeouts per nine innings (8.84)...has 111 strikeouts overall, which tied for the fourth best pre-All-Star Break total in Oakland history...they were the most at the break since Jose Rijo also had 111 in 1986...the top three are Vida Blue (188 in 1971), Vida Blue (120 in 1975) and Catfish Hunter (119 in 1972).

THE LONG BALL: Allowed three home runs in 4.0 innings in his last start after allowing six home runs over his first 17 starts and 109.0 innings...six of the nine home runs have been solo shots.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Allowed seven runs in his last start to snap his three-game winning streak...had allowed just seven runs total over his previous five starts...is now 3-1 with a 1.97 ERA (7 er in 32.0 ip) and .186 (22 for 118) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has walked just 12 and struck out 39...went 0-3 with a 4.34 ERA, a .264 batting average, 12 walks and nine strikeouts over his previous three starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.08 ERA (15 er in 65.0 ip) and .189 (43 for 228) opponents batting average in 10 starts at home and 2-4 with a 3.00 ERA (16 er in 48.0 ip) and .259 (49 for 189) opponents average in eight starts on the road...ranks fourth in the American League in home ERA and opponents batting average and tied for fourth in wins...over the last two years, he is 14-5 with a 2.37 ERA (44 in 167.0 ip) and .195 (116 for 594) opponents average in 26 starts at home and 9-10 with a 3.62 ERA (59 er in 146.2 ip) and .257 (147 for 571) average in 25 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .167 (16 for 96) average with runners in scoring position, which is second lowest in the American League...opponents are batting .268 (42 for 157) with no outs and .192 (50 for 260) with one or two outs...has held the first three spots in the batting order to a .197 (31 for 157) average.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer 11 of his 19 starts...has just nine runs of support in his six losses this year (33.2 ip, 2.41 RSA) and 27 runs of support in his 26 career losses (127.2 ip, 1.90 RSA)...is 25-1 in 34 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-25 in 41 starts with support of two or fewer.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.13 ERA (25 er in 72.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 1.32 ERA (6 er in 41.0 ip) from the fifth inning on...has allowed eight of his nine home runs over the first four innings of a game.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-2 with a 3.03 ERA (10 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts against American League West competition...his career numbers are 13-5 with a 2.96 ERA (48 er in 146.0 ip) against divisional foes and 17-21 with a 4.41 ERA (147 er in 300.1 ip) against all other teams.

DAYS REST: Is 3-5 with a 3.17 ERA (23 er in 65.1 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest and 5-1 with a 1.51 ERA (8 er in 47.2 ip) in seven starts on five or more days rest.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-4 with a 2.14 ERA (16 er in 67.1 ip) and .206 (50 for 243) opponents batting average in 11 starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 2.96 ERA (15 er in 45.2 ip) and .241 (42 for 174) average in seven starts during the day...has the second lowest night ERA in the American League.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 3.27 ERA (4 er in 11.0 ip) over his first two starts of July...went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week ending July 3 after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a Major League leading 16 strikeouts in two starts...shared the honors with Toronto's Jose Bautista...it marked his first Player of the Week award.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-5 loss at Texas July 8...allowed five runs in the first inning, including a Napoli grand slam...a Rosales error earlier in the inning allowed a run to score and four of the five runs were unearned...surrendered a pair of solo home runs to Kinsler and Beltre in the second inning and left after pitching a season-low 4.0 innings.

GONZALEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 4-2 with a 3.20 ERA (39.1 ip, 34 h, 15 r, 14 er, 12 bb, 45 so, 2 hr) in seven career appearances, all starts...is 2-1 with a 4.43 ERA (10 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts at Anaheim and 2-1 with a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland...is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 12 so) in two starts this year...the loss came in a 5-0 A's loss on April 25 at Los Angeles...allowed a two-run single to Kendrick in the second, an RBI double to Abreu in the third and two more runs in the fourth on an error and a grounded into double play...Weaver shutout the A's on seven hits...then combined with Breslow and Magnuson on a two-hit shutout in the A's 14-0 win May 17 in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...retired each of the first 11 batters before walking Izturis with two outs in the fourth...surrendered his only hit when Kendrick singled to leadoff the fifth...neither base runner advanced past first base.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Guillermo Moscoso (3-4, 2.16 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th appearance and ninth start of the season...began the season at Sacramento and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break...has allowed just one earned run over his last four starts and is 1-1 with a 0.36 ERA over that span...took the loss in his last minor league start last Thursday against Fresno (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 9 so)...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in his last Major League start July 6 in Oakland, a 2-0 A's win over Seattle (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA in two career appearances against Detroit, both in relief in 2009.

- Recorded the 60th save of his career Friday and is now one away from tying Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland history. Has allowed four runs in his last five appearances (3 er in 4.2 ip, 5.79 ERA) after allowing just one run over his first 12 outings (0.73 ERA) Has held opponents to a .153 batting average, including .120 (3 for 25) against right-handers and .176 (6 for 34) against lefties.
- Retired each of his first 12 first batters faced before allowing a single to Gutierrez in Tuesday's loss to Seattle...first batters are now 1 for 17 (.059) for the season.
- Has recorded a save in two appearances against the Angels this year (2.0 ip, 3 so)...has converted all six of his save opportunities in 16 career outings against Los Angeles (18.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 21 so, 2 hr, 1.00 ERA).
- Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
