<u>UP TO SPEED:</u> Angels split double-header yesterday and look for split of series with victory today in fourth game of a four-game series in Oakland (1-2)...Following today's game, the club returns home for three games with Texas (7/19-21) before embarking on a 10-game road trip to Baltimore (7/22-24), Cleveland (7/25-27) and Detroit (7/28-31)...20 of the Angels' first 29 games in the second half will be on the road...Halos streak of eight consecutive series victories (a feat last accomplished during 100-win campaign in 2008) came to an end yesterday...Angels are 21-9 in last 30 contests...Halos are 18-10-2 through 30 series played...Angels tied a club record with 11 wins on the last home stand (11-2)...Halos are 9-4 this month – club went 9-17 in July last season.

<u>DOUBLE DIP RECAP:</u> Yesterday, Halos split first double header since July 21, 2009 at Kansas City...Was first *scheduled* double-header for the Halos since Sept. 9, 1978 vs. KC and the first scheduled DH in the Majors since 2003...**Jered Weaver** collected his league-leading 12th victory in game one while **Mark Trumbo** (18) and **Vernon Wells** (14) connected for home runs in the night cap...Club struggled offensively, striking out 22 times and going 2-for-14 with RISP on the day.

LEADING THE WAY: Jered Weaver has a 12-4 record with a 1.90 ERA through 20 starts this season, making him the first player to have 12-or-more wins with an ERA under 2.00 in his first 20 starts of a season since Pedro Martinez in 2000 (13-4, 1.46) – ELIAS...1.90 ERA is also the lowest mark in club history after 20 starts...With his sixth straight victory yesterday, Weaver moves into a tie for second most in MLB and notches 76th career victory, passing Jarrod Washburn for 10th on Angels' all-time list...Marks second time this season he has strung together six straight victories (opened season 6-0).

<u>FAST FACTS:</u> Halos lead the A.L. with 23 come-from-behind victories...Angels have connected for 26 home runs in their last 20 games...Halos logged 50 wins before the All-Star Break for the third time in six seasons (also 2007 & 2008)...**Dan Haren, Jered Weaver** and **Ervin Santana** are the first trio in club history to each post 100 Ks before the All-Star Break...Marks just the fifth time since World War II that a team has had three pitchers with 100+ strikeouts before the break (STATS LLC)...Five shutouts by Angels starters are tied for most in A.L...Halos have a 2.28 team ERA over their last 19 games (169.1 IP <u>– 43 ER).</u>

WANNA GET AWAY? Angels are batting .264 on the road, compared to a .245 mark at Angel Stadium...Club is 9-6 in last 15 road affairs...Howie Kendrick ranks fourth in the A.L. batting .319 (51/160) on the road while teammate Maicer Izturis ranks 11th at .312 (48/154).

@ OAKLAND: Halos are 10-3 in last 13 home games vs. A's but just 5-10 in last 15 in Oakland... <u>UP NEXT VS. TEXAS:</u> Halos will host the Rangers for the first time this season after splitting first six games at Arlington...Angels dropped 2010 series 9-10 (3-7 in Arlington, 6-3 at home)...10 of the 19 meetings between the clubs were one-run affairs which tied the A.L. record since realignment...30 of the last 42 games have been decided by three runs or less... Halos are 67-52 vs. Texas since 2005.

STINGY: Angels have logged a 2.58 ERA over their last 28 contests (250.2 IP - 72 ER)...Angel starting pitchers have held opponents to three earned runs or less in 24 of these 28 contests.

THE COWBOY: The Angels will hold a pre-game ceremony prior to Tuesday's game (7/19) vs. Texas to induct original owner **Gene Autry** into the club's Hall of Fame...Autry will be the ninth member inducted into the Angels' Hall of Fame (Ryan, Grich, Carew, Downing, Finley, Baylor, Fregosi, Reese)...Nolan Ryan is scheduled to throw out the ceremonial first pitch.

TRUMBO JACKS: Mark Trumbo's 18 home runs lead all MLB rookies...Had 17 homers going into the

break, most by an Angel rookie before the All-Star break since Tim Salmon had 17 in 1993... Trumbo is on pace for 30 homers.

FISH TALE: 19-year old Mike Trout made his MLB debut July 8th after the Angels selected the contract of the outfielder from double-A Arkansas...At 19 years, 335 days, Trout became the youngest player to make his big-league debut for the Angels since May 30, 1971, when Andy Hassler debuted at age 19 years, 224 days...Trout is currently the youngest player in the big leagues.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: Angels' current 25-man roster features eight players ages 25-or-younger (Amarista, Bell, Cassevah, Conger, Kohn, Trout, Trumbo & Walden)...11 players on the current 25-man roster have less than two years of MLB service time.

THIS N' THAT: Angels are 42-8 (.840) when scoring four-plus runs, second best in the A.L...Angel Stadium averages 39,002 fans per game to rank third in the A.L...Club has played 16 extra-inning affairs (6-10) — club record is 25 extra inning games in 1976...Angels have used 76 different lineups in 95 games. Halos have been shut out 10 times this season (shutout a total of nine times in 2010)...Club is 18-14 in day games this season...Halo princh-hitters are 3-for-40 on season...10 of Angels' 22 road losses have come in walk-off fashion...Halos' have 18 one-run losses...Club has had eight rain delays this season.

- Angels are 6-0 in Pineiro's last six starts, but he has recorded just three of the victories...Has received 42 runs of support in his last six starts (7 per game). Has registered a 2.14 ERA (33.2 IP 8 ER) in his five victories this season compared to a 4.95 ERA (56.1 IP 31 ER) in his other starts.
- In the month of July, owns a 21-10 career record with a 3.88 ERA.
- Has posted a 2.61 ERA (117.1 IP 34 ER) in his last 17 starts at Angel Stadium, allowing two runs or less in nine of the 17 starts.
- Recorded 100th career victory, June 17th at New York Mets...Became just the fourth Puerto-Rican born pitcher to win 100 or more games in the Major Leagues, joining Javier Vazquez (155), Juan Pizarro (131) and Jaime Navarro (116) - courtesy of Elias.
- Owns a 3.32 ERA in six road starts this season compared to a 4.43 ERA in seven starts at Angel Stadium.
- Has thrown seven innings-or-more in 13 of last 25 starts dating back to last season, posting a perfect 8-0 record in those starts
- Has thrown six innings or more in 11 of 14 starts this season with six quality starts.

 Surpassed 1,000 career strikeout mark, May 5th at Boston...With June 17th victory, became 33rd active pitcher to notch 100 career victories.
- Went 10-7 with a 3.84 ERA in 2010...Missed significant time with a right oblique strain...Won seven of final eight decisions in 2010, posting a 2.77 ERA (84.1 IP - 26 ER) over the span to drop ERA from 5.23 to 3.84
- Is 102-89 with 15 complete games, six shutouts and a 4.32 ERA (1698.2 IP 815 ER) in 322 career appearances, 253 starts.
