A's vs. TIGERS

The season series is even at two games each as the two clubs split a four-game series in Oakland in April...this two-game series marks the A's only appearance in Detroit but the Tigers return to the Coliseum in September for another four-game series...the A's have won two season series over the last five years, lost two and split one...are 25-22 against Detroit since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 233-225 against the Tigers...that includes 130-99 in Oakland, 101-124 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 25-18 at Comerica Park...all-time, the A's are 901-978 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded the 60th save of his career last Friday night and needs one more to tie Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland history.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has an 84-game, 81.0-inning, 328-batter homerless streak...last allowed a home run April 7, 2006 at San Francisco (Alou).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Jemile Weeks has four straight multiple hit games (9 for 16, .563) and a career-high tying six-game hitting streak (11 for 25, .440)...his 44 hits are second most in Oakland history by a player in the first 35 games of his career.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1992** Carney Lansford ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 6-2 win against Detroit...he adds a single to finish the day a perfect 4 for 4...in **1999** Buddy Groom ties an Oakland record by pitching in his sixth consecutive game...he retires the only batter he faces in the A's 10-5 win over Colorado...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses a one-hitter in the A's 10-0 win over Texas...it is his first of two one-hitters in 2002.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Won three of four from Los Angeles to start the second half of the season after losing four straight and 13 of 18 going into the All-Star Break...remain a season-high 13 games behind Texas in the American League West for the third consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since they finished the 2009 season 22 games out...the A's .438 winning percentage is third lowest in the AL...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 20-34 (.370) since then...have spent each of the last 47 days and 54 of the last 55 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 58 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has a 2.32 ERA (65 er in 252.0 ip) and .208 (192 for 925) opponents batting average over the last 28 games...now has a 3.09 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the majors**...are tied for the ML lead in pickoffs (16)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.349) and rank fourth in opponents batting (.239) and on-base percentage (.309)...struck out 41 batters in the four-game series against Los Angeles over the weekend and now have 670 strikeouts for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-10 with a 2.46 ERA (49 er in 179.1 ip), .209 (138 for 660) opponents batting average, 54 walks and 148 strikeouts over the last 28 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks and 37 strikeouts over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.15 ERA (209 er in 596.2 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.01).

OFFENSE: The A's scored seven runs before the first out was recorded Sunday against Los Angeles, the first time that has happened in Oakland history...finished the first inning with eight runs, which are the A's most runs in an inning this year...it marked the sixth time in Oakland history the A's scored eight or more runs in the first inning, the first time since September 3, 2006 when they scored nine against Baltimore...have scored just 335 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...the A's hit .303 (40 for 132) in the four-game series against Los Angeles after batting .205 over the final 18 games before the All-Star Break...are now batting .236 for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...also have the second lowest on-base percentage (.303) and slugging percentage (.340)...have been shutout twice in the last eight games and 11 times this year, which is the most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 52 home runs, which is the **fewest in the American League** and second fewest in the majors (San Diego, 50)...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 67 games...since 1979, the only longer streak by an A's team was a 72-game streak from April 24-July 15, 1994...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed 17 home runs in the last 16 games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...has surrendered 65 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last three games (four total) and now have 76 for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Chicago, 84)...the errors have led to 54 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...rank third in the AL in double plays (97).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 3-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles...are now 26-22 (.542) at home compared to 16-32 (.333) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...begin a five-game road trip to Detroit (two games) and New York (three games) tonight...went 0-4 on the last road trip to Texas and have a five-game road losing streak...have now lost 23 of the last 28 games on the road, which is the A's worst 28-game stretch on the road since May 26-August 2, 1986 when they also went 5-23...are batting .250 (393 for 1575) with 183 runs scored in 48 home games (3.81 per game) and .222 (363 for 1632) with 152 runs scored in 48 games on the road (3.17 per game)...have the second lowest road batting average in the majors (Washington, .222).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied with Los Angeles for the worst record in the American League...the 16 extra inning games are tied with the Angels for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 10-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...are 13-20 (.394) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the AL and tied for second worst in the majors (Houston, 10-16)...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (8) and four more than they had all last year.

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season...went 39-53 (.424), which was the fourth worst record at the break in Oakland history...it was the worst since going 37-52 (.416) in 1997...the A's 12-game deficit in the AL West matches their largest at the break over the last 10 years (2009)...the pitching staff posted a 3.13 ERA, which was their lowest at the break since 1990 (3.09)...had 629 strikeouts, which was the second best total in Oakland history (635 in 2008)...the offense batted .233 with a .337 slugging percentage and .299 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is the lowest in Oakland history at the break, the batting average is third lowest (.231 in 1982, .233 in 1979) and the slugging percentage is third lowest (.329 in 1968, .337 in 1979)...hit 50 home runs, which is second fewest in Oakland history (42 in 1968)...averaged 3.42 runs, which was third lowest (3.32 in 1978, 3.34 in 1968).

SCORING CHANGE: There has been a scoring change in the A's vs. Texas game on July 9...in the second inning, Mitch Moreland was originally credited with a base hit...that has been changed to an error on Jemile Weeks, making the run unearned...the change is not reflected in today's statistics although the A's notes have been updated.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento today and is scheduled to make his 11th appearance and ninth start of the season...the A's are 4-4 (.500) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings five times, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

BRIEFLY: Began the season at Sacramento and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has a 2.16 ERA, which is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched...using the same minimum, he has the second lowest opponents batting average (.186), third lowest slugging percentage (.284) and fifth lowest on-base percentage (.261).

LAST FOUR STARTS: Has allowed just one earned run over his last four starts and is 1-1 with a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 24.2 ip) and .126 (11 for 87) opponents batting average over that span.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high four games in his last start...posted a 2.43 ERA and .200 opponents during the losing streak, which spanned six games, including five starts.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in four of his last six starts and has three runs of support or fewer in six of his eight starts...has run support of 2.87 (15 rs in 47.0 ip) as a starter for the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .186 (34 for 183) batting average, including .160 (4 for 25) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .182 (8 for 44) average to batters leading off an inning but has issued seven walks (.294 on-base percentage).

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed just one earned run over the first three innings of a game for a 0.37 ERA (1 er in 24.1 ip) and .129 (11 for 85) opponents batting average...has a 3.86 ERA (11 er in 25.2 ip) and .235 (23 for 98) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-3 with a 2.11 ERA (11 er in 47.0 ip) in eight starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...made his two relief appearances on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3rd and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4th.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA (8 er in 32.0 ip) in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July, 1968.

2011 START-BY-START: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles **May 24**...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...just three runners advanced into scoring position...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore **May 29** in Oakland...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore **June 7**...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-4 loss at Chicago **June 12**...surrendered career highs in hits (6), runs (5) and walks (4)...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco **June 18** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the fifth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Philadelphia **June 24**...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...Worley, Herndon, Perez and Stutes combined to shutout the A's on two hits...extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida **June 29** in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings...Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle July 6 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...retired the first four batters, allowed a single to Ackley and then retired 12 straight...also issued a one-out walk to Figgins in the sixth and a leadoff single to Kennedy in the seventh

MOSCOSO vs. DETROIT: Is 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA (4.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 1 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both in relief...his outings came in consecutive appearances in 2009...tossed a scoreless ninth inning in the Rangers 7-3 win July 28 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 so)...then pitched 3.1 innings of relief in a 13-5 loss the next day (4 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...allowed a solo home run to Thames in the fourth inning.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in Sacramento's 3-2 loss to Fresno last Thursday at Sacramento...allowed a RBI single to Brandon Belt in the first but Sacramento scored twice in the third...then surrendered lead off home runs to Edgar Gonzalez in the fourth and Belt in the sixth for the loss.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (2-5, 3.64 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season, his fourth since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...is 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA in three starts since his return...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 win over Los Angeles last Friday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...the win snapped his losing streak at a career high five games...based on a minimum of 70 innings pitched, he ranks third in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.43) and fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.33)...is 1-3 with a 3.99 ERA in 13 career appearances against Detroit, including six starts...had a no decision in his only start this year, an 8-4 A's loss in 10 innings April 15 in Oakland (6.2 ip, 6 h, 1 bb, 7 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

The A's bullpen has a 1.73 ERA (13 er in 67.2 ip) over the past 26 games dating back to June 17...is 2-4 with nine saves, one blown save, a .194 (47 for 242) opponents batting average and two home runs allowed over that span...now has a 2.95 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...has the lowest opponents batting average (.228) and slugging percentage (.331) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.306)...is tied for the fewest wins (9) and has the most losses (18)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (65)...has allowed the third fewest home runs (16).

- Recorded the 60th save of his career last Friday against Los Angeles and is now one away from tying Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland history.
- Has allowed four runs in his last five appearances (3 er in 4.2 ip, 5.79 ERA) after allowing just one run over his first 12 outings (0.73 ERA)
- Has held opponents to a .153 batting average, including .120 (3 for 25) against right-handers and .176 (6 for 34) against lefties.
- Has not faced the Tigers this year...has a win and has converted both of his save opportunities in five career appearances against Detroit (5.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 1.69 ERA).
- Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list July 7...has appeared in four games since his return and retired all 12 batters he has faced (4.0 ip, 5 so).
- Ranks third among American League relievers in first batter strikeouts (15) and is tied for sixth in wins (4).
- Has held opponents to a .180 (23 for 128) batting average, including .145 (9 for 62) against left-handers and .136 (3 for 22) with runners in scoring position.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season, his fourth since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 3-9 (.250) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 30-38 (.441) in his 68 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 10 of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer all 12 times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up his first win since April 10 in his last start, snapping his losing streak at a career-high five games...his previous high was four from June 25 to September 10, 2006...posted a 4.14 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned eight starts.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is **tied for the most** among American League pitchers (**Verlander, DET and Harrison, TEX**)...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley.
