A's vs. TIGERS

The A's trail the season series 3-2...lost last night after splitting a four-game series in Oakland in April...this two-game series marks the A's only appearance in Detroit but the Tigers return to the Coliseum in September for another four-game series...the A's have won two season series over the last five years, lost two and split one...are 25-23 against Detroit since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 233-226 against the Tigers...that includes 130-99 in Oakland, 101-125 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 25-19 at Comerica Park...all-time, the A's are 901-979 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded the 60th save of his career last Friday night and is now one away from tying Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland history.

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has an 84-game, 81.0-inning, 328-batter homerless streak...last allowed a home run April 7, 2006 at San Francisco (Alou).

Hideki Matsui has 499 career home runs between Japan and the United States...25 Major Leaguers and eight players in the Japanese Leagues have hit 500.

Jemile Weeks has recorded 44 hits in the first 36 games of his career, which ranks second in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1969, at the age of 19 years, 357 days, Vida Blue becomes the first Oakland teenage pitcher to start a game...he takes the loss in the A's 7-3 decision at California, allowing five runs, three earned, on six hits and one walk while striking out one in 5.1 innings...in 2009 the A's trail Minnesota 12-2 entering the bottom of the third inning but come back to win 14-13, setting an Oakland record for biggest come-from-behind victory.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of five games to start the second half of the season after losing four straight and 13 of 18 going into the All-Star Break...are now a season-high 14 games behind Texas in the American League West...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since they finished the 2009 season 22 games out...the A's .433 winning percentage is third lowest in the AL...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 20-35 (.364) since then...have spent each of the last 48 days and 55 of the last 56 in sole possession of last place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, three days tied for third and 59 days in fourth...made a managerial change prior to the June 9 game, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has a 2.49 ERA (72 er in 260.0 ip) and .212 (204 for 961) opponents batting average over the last 29 games...now has a 3.13 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the majors**...ranks second in the majors with 16 pickoffs...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.351) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.310) and fourth in opponents batting (.240)...has recorded 46 strikeouts over the past five games and now has 675 strikeouts for the season, which ranks fifth in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-11 with a 2.69 ERA (55 er in 184.0 ip), .215 (147 for 683) opponents batting average, 55 walks and 151 strikeouts over the last 29 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks and 37 strikeouts over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.22 ERA (215 er in 601.1 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, 3.01).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .302 (51 for 169) over their last five games after batting .205 over the final 18 games before the All-Star Break...are now batting .236 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...also have the second lowest on-base percentage (.303) and slugging percentage (.340)...have scored just 338 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...have been shutout twice in the last nine games and 11 times this year, which is tied for the most in the AL...scored seven runs before the first out was recorded Sunday against Los Angeles, the first time that has happened in Oakland history...finished the first inning with eight runs, which are the A's most runs in an inning this year...it marked the sixth time in Oakland history the A's scored eight or more runs in the first inning, the first time since September 3, 2006 when they scored nine against Baltimore.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 52 home runs, which is the **fewest in the American League** and second fewest in the majors (San Diego, 50)...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 68 games...since 1979, the only longer streak by an A's team was a 72-game streak from April 24-July 15, 1994...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed 19 home runs in the last 17 games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...has surrendered 67 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last four games (five total) and now have 77 for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Chicago, 84)...13 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the AL and ranks fourth in the majors...the errors have led to 55 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...are tied for third in the AL in double plays (97).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this five-game road trip to Detroit (0-1) and New York (three games)...are now 16-33 (.327) on the road compared to 26-22 (.542) at home...have the third worst road record in the American League...have a six-game road losing streak and have now lost 24 of the last 29 games on the road, which is the A's worst 29-game stretch on the road since May 25-August 2, 1986 when they also went 5-24...are batting .250 (393 for 1575) with 183 runs scored in 48 home games (3.81 per game) and .224 (374 for 1669) with 155 runs scored in 49 games on the road (3.16 per game)...the batting average is tied with Washington for the lowest road average in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied with Los Angeles for the worst record in the American League...the 16 extra inning games are also tied with the Angels for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 10-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...are 13-20 (.394) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the AL and the second worst in the majors (Cincinnati, 14-22)...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (8) and four more than they had all last year.

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season...went 39-53 (.424), which was the fourth worst record at the break in Oakland history...it was the worst since going 37-52 (.416) in 1997...the A's 12-game deficit in the AL West matches their largest at the break over the last 10 years (2009)...the pitching staff posted a 3.13 ERA, which was their lowest at the break since 1990 (3.09)...had 629 strikeouts, which was the second best total in Oakland history (635 in 2008)...the offense batted .233 with a .337 slugging percentage and .299 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is the lowest in Oakland history at the break, the batting average is third lowest (.231 in 1982, .233 in 1979) and the slugging percentage is third lowest (.329 in 1968, .337 in 1979)...hit 50 home runs, which is second fewest in Oakland history (42 in 1968)...averaged 3.42 runs, which was third lowest (3.32 in 1978, 3.34 in 1968).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season, his fourth since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 3-9 (.250) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 30-38 (.441) in his 68 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 10 of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer all 12 times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up his first win since April 10 in his last start, snapping his losing streak at a career-high five games...his previous high was four from June 25 to September 10, 2006...posted a 3.72 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned seven starts.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 1-1 with a 4.00 ERA (8 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

QUALIFICATIONS: Has allowed just three home runs in 81.2 innings and his average of 0.33 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest among American League pitchers with at least 70 innings pitched...all three of the home runs are solo shots...has issued just 13 walks for an average of 1.43 per nine innings...that ranks third lowest in the AL using the same minimum...with 53 strikeouts, his ratio of 4.08 strikeouts per walk is fifth best.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .192 (19 for 99) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .319 (67 for 210) after that...opponents are batting .321 (18 for 56) with runners in scoring position.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or less in eight of his 12 starts...his season run support is 4.08 (37 rs in 81.2 ip)...has 10 runs of support in his five losses (35.1 ip, 2.55 RSA).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitchers...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

2011 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto **April 5**...gave up only one run over the first five innings when Hill drove in Escobar on a force out...however, then allowed four runs, three earned, in the sixth inning...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota **April 10**...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss **April 15** against Detroit in Oakland...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle **April 21**...the complete game was his second of his career (also May 24, 2009 at Houston)...allowed the game's only run in the fourth inning when Kennedy hit a home run with one out...was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles **April 26**...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Texas **May 2** in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City **May 7**...both of his complete games have been losses...allowed seven hits and walked two...retired each of the first 14 batters before Hosmer singled with two outs in the fifth...then allowed three runs in the sixth inning on RBI singles by Cabrera and Gordon and a Butler sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with three in the eighth but he allowed an Aviles sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth for the loss...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 13**...allowed all four of the runs in the second inning...the first run scored on a fielders choice but Vizquel followed with a RBI double and Beckham scored on a sacrifice fly before his own error on a pickoff attempt allowed Vizquel to score...shutout the Rangers on two hits over his final five innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning loss to Minnesota **May 18**...allowed a RBI single to Morneau in the first inning but the A's came back with two runs in the second...then allowed two runs in the third on a two-run single by Plouffe...then retired 13 of the final 17 hitters he faced...the A's scored once in the sixth inning to tie the game and he was relieved by Balfour to start the eighth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Seattle **July 4** in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters before Suzuki singled to lead off the fourth...faced the minimum over the first five innings thanks to two double plays...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Bard in the sixth and a RBI double to Smoak in the seventh...the A's were limited to a run on three hits by Pineda and the Mariners bullpen...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Texas **July 15**...the A's scored four times in the second inning but he allowed an unearned run in the bottom of the second on a Torrealba RBI double...the A's added another run in the fifth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the inning to tie the game...Kinsler had a RBI double, Andrus a sacrifice fly, Hamilton a RBI ground out and Beltre a solo home run...the A's scored a run in the seventh to take a 6-5 lead but Bailey allowed a two-run home run to Hamilton in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He snapped his losing streak at five games in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles last Friday in Oakland...the A's scored three times in the third and once in the fourth and he blanked the Angels on three hits over the first four innings before allowing a RBI double to Aybar in the fifth...allowed a one out single to Callaspo in the sixth and was relieved by Wuertz who allowed that run to score.

McCARTHY vs. DETROIT: Is 1-3 with a 3.99 ERA (38.1 ip, 43 h, 18 r, 17 er, 8 bb, 27 so, 4 hr) in 13 career appearances, including six starts...is 1-0 with a 2.53 ERA (3 er in 10.2 ip) in four games in his home ballpark and 0-3 with a 4.55 ERA (14 er in 27.2 ip) in nine games at Comerica Park...is 0-3 with a 3.90 ERA (12 er in 27.2 ip) in his six starting assignments...had a no decision in his only start this year, an 8-4 A's loss in 10 innings April 15 in Oakland...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and was relieved by Breslow with two outs in the seventh and a 1-0 lead...Fuentes allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save and the Tigers scored seven times in the 10th inning before the A's came back with three runs in the bottom of the inning.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (8-8, 3.16 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season...is 0-3 with a 3.42 ERA (10 er in 26.1 ip) over his last four starts...has a total of two runs of support over that stretch...is now 2-8 with a 4.08 ERA (37 er in 81.2 ip) and a .258 (77 for 299) opponents batting average over his last 13 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 0-3 with a 9.72 ERA (16.2 ip, 17 h, 18 r, 18 er, 8 bb, 8 so, 5 hr) in three career starts against New York...the Yankees are the only American League team (besides the A's) that he has never defeated and the three losses match his most against any team.

The A's bullpen has a 1.77 ERA (14 er in 71.0 ip) over the past 27 games dating back to June 17...is 2-4 with nine saves, one blown save, a .196 (50 for 255) opponents batting average and two home runs allowed over that span...now has a 2.94 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...has the lowest opponents batting average (.228) and slugging percentage (.331) in the AL and the second lowest on-base percentage (.305)...has the fewest wins (9) and the most losses (18)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (65)...has allowed the third fewest home runs (16).

- Recorded the 60th save of his career last Friday against Los Angeles and is now one away from tying Jay Howell for sixth in Oakland history.
- Has allowed four runs in his last five appearances (3 er in 4.2 ip, 5.79 ERA) after allowing just one run over his first 12 outings (0.73 ERA)
- Has held opponents to a .153 batting average, including .120 (3 for 25) against right-handers and .176 (6 for 34) against lefties.
- Has not faced the Tigers this year...has a win and has converted both of his save opportunities in five career appearances against Detroit (5.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 1.69 ERA).
- Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list July 7...has appeared in four games since his return and retired all 12 batters he has faced (4.0 ip, 5 so).
- Ranks third among American League relievers in first batter strikeouts (15) and is tied for sixth in wins (4).
- Has held opponents to a .180 (23 for 128) batting average, including .145 (9 for 62) against left-handers and .136 (3 for 22) with runners in scoring position.
