A's vs. YANKEES

The A's trail in the season series, 0-4...were swept in a three-game series in Oakland earlier this year and **now have a 11-game losing streak against the Yankees...that is an Oakland record for longest losing streak against New York and is the longest by an Athletics team since the Kansas City A's lost 14 in a row from Sept. 13, 1956-July 12, 1957...**have also lost 15 of the last 16 games and are batting .194 (97 for 501) with 39 runs scored over that span...have lost six straight and 13 of the last 14 in New York...have lost nine consecutive series, which is an Oakland record for consecutive series lost to any team...the previous was eight against Baltimore (May 13, 1977-April 29, 1979)...have lost each of the last three season series and are 4-24 (.143) against New York since 2008, which is the worst mark by an AL team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 218-259 against the Yankees...that includes 120-118 in Oakland and 98-141 in New York, including 1-10 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 759-1125 against the Yankees/Orioles.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1964**, Bert Campaneris homers twice in his major league debut as the A's defeat Minnesota, 4-3... in **1976**, Vida Blue tosses a six-hit shutout and strikes out 13 in the A's 2-0 win over Kansas City to record his 100th career victory...he would go on to win 124 games in an Oakland uniform, second only to Catfish Hunter's 131.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 4-3 to start the second half of the season after losing four straight and 13 of 18 going into the All-Star Break...in last night's 17-7 loss, allowed the most runs in an inning in four years (10 vs. STL, 6/16/07) and the most runs in a game in 11 years (18 at COL, 7/18/00)...Thursday's off day coupled with a Seattle loss moved the A's into a tie for third place, ending a streak of 49 consecutive days in sole possession of last place in the American League West...prior to the past two days, were last tied for third May 29...have not been alone in third since May 21... for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 34 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 21-36 (.368) since then...the A's .434 winning percentage is tied for third lowest in the AL...are 15-15 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 28-41 in games started by righties...are 19-19 in day games and 24-37 at night...made managerial change prior to June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has a 3.05 ERA (94 er in 277.0 ip) and .224 (232 for 1035) opponents batting average over the last 32 games...now has a 3.30 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the AL** and fifth lowest in the majors...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.355), ranks fourth in opponents batting (.243) and sixth in on-base percentage (.313) ...snapped a 22-game streak without hitting a batter last night when Cahill plunked Granderson in the first inning...it was the longest streak since Aug. 9-Sept. 2, 1992 (23 games)...have just 24 hit batters this year, the third fewest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-12 with a 3.25 ERA (69 er in 191.0 ip), .223 (162 for 717) opponents batting average, 58 walks and 157 strikeouts over the last 31 games after going 0-11 with a 7.30 ERA, .312 opponents batting average, 41 walks and 37 strikeouts over the previous 14 contests...have a 3.39 ERA (229 er in 608.1 ip) for the season, which is the second lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .300 (73 for 243) with 37 runs scored (5.29 per game) in seven games since the All-Star Break after batting .205 with 43 runs scored (2.39 per game) over the final 18 games before the break...lead the American League in batting since the break...however, are batting .238 overall, which is second lowest in the AL...also have the second lowest on-base percentage (.305) and slugging percentage (.342) and the second fewest runs scored (352)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit just 54 home runs, which is the **fewest in the American League** and tied with Houston for second fewest in the majors (San Diego, 51)...have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 70 games...since 1979, the only longer streak by an A's team was a 72-game streak from April 24-July 15, 1994...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...the pitching staff has allowed 21 home runs in the last 19 games after allowing two over the previous 13 contests...has surrendered 69 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the American League and rank second in the majors with 78 errors (Cubs, 87)...the errors have led to 55 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (100).

ON THE BASES: The A's pitching staff has 16 pickoffs, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (17)...the offense has been successful in just 8 of 18 (44.4%) stolen base attempts over the last 12 games...has a stolen base percentage of 67.3 (68 for 101) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this five-game road trip to Detroit (1-1) and New York (0-1, three games)...snapped a six-game road losing streak with the win on Wednesday and are now 6-25 over their last 31 contests on the road...that is the A's worst 31-game stretch on the road since May 26-Aug. 4, 1986 when they also went 6-25...are 17-34 (.333) on the road for the season, compared to 26-22 (.542) at home...have the third worst road record in the American League...return home following the game Sunday for a seven-game homestand against Tampa Bay (four games) and Minnesota (three games)...went 3-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles...are batting .250 (393 for 1575) with 183 runs scored in 48 home games (3.81 per game) and .227 (396 for 1743) with 169 runs scored in 51 games on the road (3.31 per game)...have the second lowest road batting average in the majors (Washington, .224).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 13-20 (.394) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and tied with San Diego for second worst in the majors (Cincinnati, 14-22)...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 11-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, second most in the AL to KC (0) and four more than they had in 2010.

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season...went 39-53 (.424), which was the fourth worst record at the break in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (37-52, .416)...the pitching staff posted a 3.13 ERA, which was their lowest at the break since 1990 (3.09)...had 629 strikeouts, which was second best in Oakland history (635 in 2008)...the offense batted .233 with a .337 slugging percentage and .299 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is the lowest in Oakland history at the break and the batting average and slugging percentage is third lowest...hit 50 home runs, which is second fewest in Oakland history...averaged 3.42 runs, which was third lowest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 11 times this year...have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Ross) and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one...have used the DL 98 times since the start of the 2007 season...used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...it is the 149th start of his career, his 93rd as an Athletic...the A's are 2-1 (.667) in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 93-55 (.628) in his starting assignments in his career, including 60-32 (.652) with the A's...has tossed six or more innings in two of his three starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer twice.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

WITH THE A'S: His start July 1 against Arizona was his first as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 37-20 record and a 3.47 ERA (216 er in 559.2 ip) in 100 games, 92 starts...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

SINCE 2003: Has 878 strikeouts in 863.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.12 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 10.00)...has a .224 (710 for 3170) opponents batting average over that span, which is fourth best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221; Jason Schmidt, .223; Lincecum .223).

FIRST START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona July 1 in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...the A's scored a run in the fourth and four more in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler to start the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas July 7...allowed runs in four of his five innings...Kinsler scored on a ground out in the first and Hamilton had a RBI single in the third...Kinsler added a RBI single in the fourth followed by a Hamilton sacrifice fly and Young hit a leadoff home run in the fifth...Holland shutout the A's on four hits.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in the second game of the doubleheader against Los Angeles a week ago today in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Trumbo in the second inning but then retired 12 of the next 14 batters he faced...the A's scored twice in the fourth and once in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a solo home run to Wells in the sixth...left after seven innings with the score tied 3-3.

HARDEN vs. NEW YORK: Is 1-3 with a 5.10 ERA (42.1 ip, 44 h, 24 r, 24 er, 26 bb, 41 so, 4 hr) in nine career appearances, including seven starts...that includes 1-1 with a 5.16 ERA (13 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA (4 er in 3.2 ip) in one start in Yankee Stadium...is also 0-0 with a 13.50 ERA (1 er in 0.2 ip) in one relief appearance in Texas and 0-1 with a 3.52 ERA (6 er in 15.1 ip) in the old Yankee Stadium...is 1-3 with a 5.22 ERA (23 er in 39.2 ip) in his seven starts...faced the Yankees twice last year while pitching for Texas and was 0-1 with a 10.38 ERA (4.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 7 bb, 5 so)...the loss came in a start on April 18 at New York, a 5-2 decision...lasted just 3.2 innings, allowing a Cano sacrifice fly in the first and three more runs in the third on a Teixeira home run and a Pena two-run single...also allowed a run in 0.2 innings of relief in Texas September 11.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and went 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts...struck out 12 batters in 7.2 innings...allowed a .115 (3 for 26) opponents batting average, including .083 (1 for 12) against left-handed hitters and .143 (2 for 14) against right-handers.

2010 RECAP: Was 5-5 with a 5.58 ERA in 20 games, 18 starts, with Texas in a season where he was bothered by injuries and control problems much of the season, which resulted in two stints on the disabled list...the ERA was the highest of his major league career...issued 62 walks in 92.0 innings, an average of 6.07 per nine innings...that was the highest ratio in the majors among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...it was also sixth highest in team history and the highest since 1987 (Bobby Witt, 8.81; Mitch Williams, 7.79)...walked five or more batters in six of his 18 starts, including a season high six April 18 at New York and May 14 at Toronto.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for 10th in the American League in hit batters (9)...tied for fourth on the club in strikeouts (75), was fifth in starts and pitched the sixth most innings (92.0)...was also second on the team in hit batters and third in walks.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .238 (40-for-168) against right-handed hitters and .273 (51-for-187) against left-handers...yielded a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .220 the second time and .372 after that...his career numbers are .197 (242 for 1229), .223 (251 for 1126) and .266 (217 for 815).

THIS AND THAT: Posted a 4.40 ERA at home and 6.70 on the road...was 2-3 with a 4.41 ERA in nine starts on four days rest and 3-2 with a 6.47 ERA in his other nine starts...compiled a 0-3 record and a 7.43 ERA in six outings during the day and was 5-2 with a 4.96 ERA in 14 night games...went 5-5 with a 5.34 ERA in 18 starts and 0-0 with a 13.50 ERA in two relief appearances...his longest outing was 7.0 innings twice and he tossed six or more innings in six of his 18 starts...the Rangers were 11-7 (.611) in his starting assignments...went 2-0 in four starts with run support of four or more and is 41-0 in 55 such starts in his career.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (9-6, 2.33 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 20th start of the season...has allowed one run or fewer in four of his last five starts and is 3-1 with a 1.36 ERA (5 er in 33.0 ip) and .175 (21 for 120) opponents batting average over that span... ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.33), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.319), eighth in opponents batting average (.217) and tied for 11th in wins (9)... Ranks second in the American League in strikeouts per nine innings (8.93)...had 111 strikeouts at the All-Star Break, which tied for the fourth best pre-Break total in Oakland history...it was the most at the break since Jose Rijo also had 111 in 1986...the top three are Vida Blue (188 in 1971), Vida Blue (120 in 1975) and Catfish Hunter (119 in 1972)... is 24-15 with a 2.89 ERA (103 er in 320.2 ip) over the last two years...the ERA is fifth lowest in the American League over that span and the wins rank eighth... is 26-1 in 35 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-25 in 41 starts with support of two or fewer... in his last start Sunday, he was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Los Angeles in Oakland (7.0 ip, 4 h, 0 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 8 so)... is 1-3 with a 6.33 ERA (21.1 ip, 18 h, 15 r, 15 er, 17 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in four career starts vs. New York...is 1-0 with a 1.35 ERA (1 er in 6.2 ip) in one start in Yankee Stadium...was the losing pitcher in his only start (6.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 4 so, 1 hr) vs. NY this year, a 4-2 A's loss in Oakland June 1...the big blows in that game were a first-inning RBI double by Rodriguez and fourth-inning three-run HR by Swisher.

The A's bullpen has a 2.44 ERA (22 er in 81.0 ip) over the past 29 games dating back to June 17...is 3-4 with 10 saves, two blown saves, a .214 (63 for 295) opponents batting average and three home runs allowed over that span...now has a 3.10 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...has the second lowest slugging percentage (.334), third lowest on-base percentage (.311) and fourth lowest opponents batting average (.232) in the AL...has the fewest wins (10) and is tied for the most losses (18)...tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (16)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (67).

- Recorded the 61st save of his career Wednesday in Detroit, which ties him with Jay Howell for sixth place in Oakland history.
- Has allowed four runs in his last six appearances (3 er in 5.2 ip, 4.76 ERA) after allowing just one run over his first 12 outings (0.73 ERA)
- Has held opponents to a .145 batting average, including .107 (3 for 28) against right-handers and .176 (6 for 34) against lefties.
- Faced the Yankees once earlier this year on June 1 (1.0 ip)...has converted all three of his save opportunities in seven career appearances against New York (8.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 1.13 ERA).
- Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.
