ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 5-4 to start the second half of the season after losing four straight and 13 of 18 going into the All-Star Break...are 44-57 (.436) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last two days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 36 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 22-37 (.373) since then...are 15-15 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 29-42 in games started by righties...are 20-20 in day games and 24-37 at night...made a managerial change prior to June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Tyson Ross from the disabled list and optioned him to Triple-A Sacramento, leaving Oakland with just two players on the DL (Brett Anderson and Dallas Braden)...this marks the first time since the end of the 2006 season that the A's have fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Bobby Crosby)...the A's have used the DL 11 times this year and have not used it fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting a **Major League leading** .308 (98 for 318) since the All-Star Break...hit .233 before the break, which was second worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...also top the majors in on-base percentage (.380) since the break and are third in the AL in slugging (.440)...are hitting .240 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the AL...also have the second lowest slugging percentage (.347) and third lowest on-base percentage (.307)...are averaging 5.11 (46 runs in 9 games) runs per game since the All-Star Break after averaging 3.42 before the break...have 361 runs scored for the season, which is second fewest in the AL...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 72 games, which is the longest streak by an A's team since the 1994 club also had a 72-game streak from April 24-July 15...the last streak longer than 72 is an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 56 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the American League** and tied with Houston for second fewest in the majors (San Diego, 53)...the pitching staff has surrendered just 71 home runs, which is the **fewest in the AL** and tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's compiled an 8.36 ERA (39 er in 42.0 ip) and allowed a .331 (58 for 175) opponents batting average in five games on the road trip...now have a 5.32 ERA (66 er in 111.2 ip) over the last 13 games after posting a 1.88 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.33 ERA for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majors...also have the lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.356) and the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.244)...have issued the third most walks (338) and have the fourth most strikeouts (710)

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers were 1-3 with an 11.63 ERA (28 er in 21.2 ip) and .367 (36 for 98) opponents batting average in five games on the road trip...are now 3-7 with a 6.37 ERA (50 er in 70.2 ip) over the last 13 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...now have a 3.45 ERA (237 er in 618.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Los Angeles, 3.36).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 79 errors, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Chicago, 88)...the errors have led to 55 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (102).

ON THE BASES: The A's pitching staff has 16 pickoffs, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (18)...the offense has been successful in just 8 of 19 (42.1%) stolen base attempts over the last 15 games...has a stolen base percentage of 66.7 (68 for 102) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game homestand against Tampa Bay (four games) and Minnesota (three games) tonight...went 3-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles...are 26-22 (.542) at home compared to 18-35 (.339) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Detroit (1-1) and New York (1-2) and are now 7-26 (.212) over their last 33 road games...that is the A's worst 33-game stretch on the road since May 24-August 5, 1986 when they also went 7-26...the A's are batting .250 (393 for 1575) with 183 runs scored in 48 home games (3.81 per game) and .232 (421 for 1818) with 178 runs scored in 53 games on the road (3.36 per game)...have a 2.71 ERA (133 er in 441.0 ip) at home compared to 3.92 (202 er in 463.1 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and second lowest in the majors (San Francisco, 2.71).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 11-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's posted a losing record before the All-Star Break for the third consecutive season...went 39-53 (.424), which was the fourth worst record at the break in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (37-52, .416)...the pitching staff posted a 3.13 ERA, which was their lowest at the break since 1990 (3.09)...had 629 strikeouts, which was second best in Oakland history (635 in 2008)...the offense batted .233 with a .337 slugging percentage and .299 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage is the lowest in Oakland history at the break and the batting average and slugging percentage is third lowest...hit 50 home runs, which is second fewest in Oakland history...averaged 3.42 runs, which was third lowest.

A's vs. RAYS

The A's and Rays meet for the first time this year tonight...the A's lost the season series last year, 4-5...went 4-3 in Oakland but lost both games in Tampa Bay...the A's have now lost the season series in three of the previous four years and are 17-21 against the Rays since 2007...all-time, the A's are 76-46 against Tampa Bay...that includes 43-18 in Oakland and 33-28 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Joey Devine has not allowed a home run this season and now has an 87-game, 83.0-inning, 341-batter homerless streak...last allowed a home run April 7, 2006 at San Francisco (Alou).

Hideki Matsui was named American League Player of the Week today after batting .571 with two home runs and seven RBI in five games...it was his fourth career Player of the Week award, his first since June 20, 2005...is batting .469 (15 for 32) with two home runs and 11 RBI since the All-Star Break...is tied for the AL lead in RBI since the break.

Jemile Weeks ninth inning single yesterday was the 50th hit of his career...it came in his 39th game...no player in Oakland history has reached 50 hits in as few games...the previous best was by Mitchell Page who reached 50 in his 41st game.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1930** the A's have two triple steals in the same game...Al Simmons, Bing Miller and Dib Williams turn the trick in the first inning and Mickey Cochrane, Simmons and Jimmie Foxx steal together in the fourth inning...in **1936** Frankie Hayes ties a major league record with four doubles in a game against Cleveland...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits a 488 foot home run into the fifth deck at SkyDome, the longest home run in the majors since all home runs have been measured starting in 1992.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th appearance and 10th start of the season...the A's are 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings five times, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

BRIEFLY: Began the season at Sacramento and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break...was recalled last Tuesday and is 0-1 with a 11.57 ERA (6 er in 4.2 ip) in one start since his return.

RECENTLY: Allowed seven runs, six earned, on nine hits in 4.2 innings his last start after allowing just five runs, four earned, on 12 hits in 24.2 innings over his previous four starts (0.36 ERA, .126 opponents batting average).

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: All seven of the runs he allowed in his last start came after the third inning...has allowed just one earned run over the first three innings of a game for a 0.33 ERA (1 er in 27.1 ip) and .135 (13 for 96) opponents batting average...has a 5.60 ERA (17 er in 27.1 ip) and .273 (30 for 110) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .209 (43 for 206) batting average, including .198 (17 for 86) against right-handed hitters...has allowed a .163 (8 for 49) average to batters leading off an inning but has issued seven walks (.268 on-base percentage)...opponents are batting .175 (28 for 160) the first two times through the lineup and .326 (15 for 46) after that.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in four of his last seven starts and has three runs of support or fewer in seven of his nine starts...has run support of 3.14 (18 rs in 51.2 ip) as a starter for the season.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-45 with a 2.96 ERA (17 er in 51.2 ip) in eight starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...made his two relief appearances on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3rd and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4th.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high four games in a 2-0 win over Seattle July 6...posted a 2.43 ERA and .200 opponents during the losing streak, which spanned six games, including five starts.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July, 1968.

2011 START-BY-START: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles **May 24**...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...just three runners advanced into scoring position...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore **May 29** in Oakland...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore **June 7**...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-4 loss at Chicago **June 12**...walked a career-high four batters in 6.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco **June 18** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the fifth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Philadelphia **June 24**...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...Worley, Herndon, Perez and Stutes combined to shutout the A's on two hits...extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida **June 29** in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings...Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle **July 6** in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss last Tuesday at Detroit...allowed career highs in runs (7), earned runs (6) and hits (9) and matched his high in home runs (2)...tossed just 4.2 innings, matching his fewest as a starter...blanked the Tigers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career high 12.0 innings...the streak ended when a Jackson error allowed Martinez to score in the fourth...then allowed six runs in the fifth inning, including an Ordonez sacrifice fly, a Cabrera two-run home run, a Peralta RBI single and a Guillen two-run home run.

MOSCOSO vs. TAMPA BAY: Has never faced the Rays in his career.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (2-5, 3.74 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season, his fifth since being reinstated from the DL July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula and is 1-1 with a 4.70 ERA in four starts since his return...has allowed just three home runs in 86.2 innings and his average of 0.31 home runs per nine innings is third lowest among American League pitchers with at least 70 innings pitched...using the same minimum, he is also third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.45)...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-5 A's win at Detroit last Wednesday (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 1-2 with a 4.18 ERA in seven career games, six starts, against Tampa Bay...last faced the Rays on September 27, 2009 in Texas and had a no decision in the Rangers 7-6 loss (7.2 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 1 bb, 3 so).

The A's bullpen has a 4.87 ERA (20.1 ip, 22 h, 11 r, 11 er, 14 bb, 20 so, 1 hr) over the past five games but has a 2.45 ERA (88.0 ip, 69 h, 27 r, 24 er, 48 bb, 83 so, 3 hr) in its past 30 games (since June 17)...now has a 3.08 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.333) in the AL, is tied for the third lowest on-base percentage (.312) and has the fifth lowest batting average (.232)...has the fewest wins (10) and is tied for the most losses (18)...is tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (17)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (68).

- Has a 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip) in 12 appearances at home compared to a 5.14 ERA (4 er in 7.0 ip) in his seven road outings.
- Has held opponents to a .154 batting average, including .138 (4 for 29) against right-handers and .167 (6 for 36) against lefties.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
