ROSTER ACTIVITY—The Rays have optioned RH Jay Buente—who had been recalled yesterday and made his Rays debut last night—to Triple-A Durham and selected the contract of RH Rob Delaney...this is Delaney's second stint with the Rays this season...the 26-year-old was initially recalled on May 7 and appeared in 3 games.

RAY MATTER—The Rays are a season-high 10.5 games behind firstplace Boston and 7.5 GB of New York in the AL Wild Card race, their largest deficits since the final day of the 2009 season...Rays have lost 15 of their last 24 games beginning June 27.

- Through July 7 the Rays were 49-39, matching their season high-water mark of 10 games over .500, and 3.5 games back in the East...since then they are 4-10 and have dropped 7.0 games in the standings while Boston has gone 11-3...during this 4-10 stretch, 7 of the games have been decided by one run (Rays are 2-5 in these games).

  The Rays have lost 6 of their last 7 road games after starting
- the season 28-18 on the road...they have scored 4.94 R/G on the road (3<sup>rd</sup> in AL, 4<sup>th</sup> in majors) but only 3.27 R/G at home (26<sup>th</sup> in majors).
- Τß The Rays are 15-13 in one-run games—11-5 at home and 4-8 on the road.
- Τß The Rays are 1-5-1 in their last 7 series after going 5-1-0 in their prev. 6 series.
- The Rays are 39-13 (.750) when scoring first, compared to 14-36 (.280) when the opponent scores first.

OAKLAND & THE TRIP—This 4-game series is the Rays first against Oakland this season, the last AL club they have played this season... they will meet again at Tropicana Field, Aug 5-7...Rays are 46-78 (.371) all-time, but 21-19 (.525) in the last five seasons (2007-11)... they are 18-45 (.286) all-time at O.co Coliseum.

- Rays are 1-4 on this 10-game road trip, their second-longest of the season, to Kansas City (1-2), Oakland (0-2) and Seattle (July 29-31).
- This trip begins a stretch of 20 straight games against a teams with current records of .500 or worse-A's, Mariners and Blue Jays are a combined 183-229 (.444).

BIG GAME CATCHES BIG TRAIN—Tonight is the 705<sup>th</sup> straight game in which the Rays have started a pitcher under the age of 30, breaking the major league record of 704 set by the 1913-17 Washington Senators, led by Hall of Famer **Walter Johnson**...the last start by a Rays pitcher 30 or older was RH **Jae Seo**, who started on his 30<sup>th</sup> birthday on May 24, 2007 vs. SEA...prior to that, the Rays hadn't started a pitcher 30 or over since 32-year-old LH **Mark Hendrickson** on June 25, 2006 vs. ATL...this means the Rays have not started a pitcher beyond his 30<sup>th</sup> birthday in 836 consecutive games (837 including today)—more than 5 years ago.

- In the 704 games (since May 25, 2007) Rays have used only 14 starters, fewest in MLB...all 14 were either drafted and developed by the Rays (8) or acquired by trade (6)...all 7
- used this season were drafted/developed by the Rays. Rays are 377-327 (.536) during this time, 5<sup>th</sup> best in MLB. Of the six pitchers listed below who are no longer in the organization, the Rays traded five, netting five players on the active roster: OF Matt Joyce, INF Sean Rodriguez, OF Sam Fuld, C Robinson Chirinos and C Kelly Shoppach.

ZORILLA TAKES OVER—After his home run last night, Ben Zobrist now leads the majors with 51 extra-base hits, ahead of BOS Adrian Gonzalez, TOR Jose Bautista and ARI Justin Upton (50 each)...he already led the majors with 33 doubles...Rays have never had a player lead the league in either category over a full season...has an XBH in 5 consecutive games (5-2B, 2-HR)...has 16 doubles in his last 37 games

- Zobrist is on pace for 80 extra-base hits and a club-record 52 doubles... Aubrey Huff holds the club records in both with 47 doubles and 84 extra-base hits in 2003.
- Batting .500 (10-20) on the trip with 2 HR, 5 2B, 6 RBI, 3 BB.

**EVAN LONGORIA**—Upon further review by Stats Inc., **Evan Longoria** on Sun at KC and Mon at OAK become just the 4<sup>th</sup> player since 1946 to record 4 SO (or more) one day and draw 4 BB (or more) the next:

Longoria leads the AL with 37 RBI since June 11, in 38 games, one shy of CHC Aramis Ramirez for the ML lead... during this span is batting .333 (17-for-51) with RISP after starting the year 4-for-25 thru 35 games.

LEFT HANGING -The Rays went 0-for-7 with RISP last night and are 1-for-20 in the series...they are batting .150 (9-for-60) with RISP on the road trip and a major-league-worst .154 (14-for-91) beginning July 17, the date of their 16-inning game vs. Boston.

The Rays are batting .203 (14-for-69) this season with the bases loaded, worst in the AL...in their last 15 plate apps with the bases loaded, they are 0-for-12 and have scored only 4 times, on a walk, HBP, sac fly and an error.

WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE—Over the last 10 gamesbeginning with the 16-inning game July 17 vs. BOS—the Rays bullpen has allowed 30 walks in 31.2 IP...they are 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA (31.2-IP, 19-ER) and are 2-for-6 in save opps...over these same 10 games, Rays starting pitchers have a 2.76 ERA (65.1-IP, 20-ER)...7 of these 10 starts have lasted at least 6.0 IP with 2 ER allowed or less.

PICKOFF ARTIST—RH James Shields leads majors with 10 pickoffs and (according to Stats Inc.) is only the third RHP since the stat was first recorded in 1974 to record 10 pickoffs in a season, joining CWS Jack McDowell (13 in 1993) and TEX Charlie Hough (16 in 1988)... Hough was the last RHP to lead the majors over a full season.

<u>PARTNERS IN POWER PITCHING</u>—With a combined 292 strikeouts, RH James Shields (151 SO) and LH David Price (141 SO) have more than any other teammates in the AL, while their combined 304.2 IP rank  $2^{nd}$  in the AL.

YEAR OF THE ROOKIE—The Rays have used 14 different rookies this season, tops in the majors and 2 shy of the club record of 16 rookies, set in 2001...they have used 9 rookie pitchers, tied for the ML lead...the Rays have 8 rookies on their active roster...6 players have made their ML debuts with the Rays this season...Rays have used a rookie starting pitcher 25 times, most in the majors.

#### TONIGHT'S START & 2011 NOTES

- Twenty-nine-year-old is the senior member of the Rays rotation...will be making his 22nd start of the season and 172<sup>nd</sup> of his career.
- Was named to his first All-Star Team, selected by the players' ballot...did not participate because he pitched the prior Sunday at NYY
- Last start: Defeated CC Sabathia, 2-1, on Thursday vs. NYY...his line: 7.2 IP, 6 H, 1 R/ER, 3 BB, 6 SO, 117 pitches, 71 strikes...held the Yankees scoreless until yielding an RBI double to Robinson Cano, the final batter he faced in the 8<sup>th</sup> inning...was supported by Evan Longoria's 1<sup>st</sup>-inning solo homer and Sam Fuld's RBI triple in the 5th
- In his 9 wins has allowed 6 ER in 76 IP (0.71 ERA).
- Has 17 starts of at least 7 IP, most in the AL and tied with PHI Roy Halladay, DET Justin Verlander and NYY CC Sabathia for most in the majors...has 13 starts of at least 7 IP with 2 ER or less, T-2<sup>nd</sup> in the majors behind LAA Jered Weaver (14).
- The Rays have scored 2 runs or less in 10 of his 21 starts...despite the lack of run support, Shields is 4-6 in those starts
- Has not allowed a stolen base all season—and only three runners have even attempted to steal.
- **League Ranks:** Leads the majors in complete games...his 3 shutouts are tied for the AL lead...3<sup>rd</sup> in the AL (4<sup>th</sup> in majors) in strikeouts...4<sup>th</sup> in the AL (7<sup>th</sup> in majors) in ERA...5<sup>th</sup> in the AL/majors in IP...6<sup>th</sup> in the AL in in the AL (7<sup>th</sup> in majors) in ERA...5<sup>th</sup> in the AL/majors in IP...6<sup>th</sup> in the AL in opp avg. (.212).
- Has held right-handed batters to a .188 avg. (49-for-261), 5<sup>th</sup> lowest among AL starters.
- Has a 26-25 career record with a 4.53 ERA (447-IP, 225-ER) in the  $2^{nd}$  half...is 39-34 with a 3.69 ERA (686.0-IP, 281-ER) in the  $1^{st}$  half.
- Leads majors with 10 pickoffs and (according to Stats Inc.) is only the third right-handed pitcher since the stat was first recorded in 1974 to record 10 pickoffs in a season, joining CWS Jack McDowell (13 in 1993) and TEX Charlie Hough (16 in 1988)...Hough was the last RHP to lead the majors
- Has only lost once this season (July 16 vs. BOS) when the Rays have scored more than 3 runs of support.
- Rays are 13-8 in his 21 starts despite his run support avg. of 2.82 R/9 IP (156.1-IP, 49-RS), 2<sup>nd</sup> received 2.25 R/9 IP (84-IP, 21-RS) at home, the 6<sup>th</sup> lowest in the majors. In his 7 CG this season, the Rays offense has only scored a total of 19 runs (2.71 runs per game). lowest in the AL and 3<sup>rd</sup> lowest in MLB...has
- Complete Game James: Is just the 3rd different pitcher since 2000 with 7 or more complete games before the All-Star break, joining TOR/PHI Roy Halladay in 2010 and OAK Mark Mulder in 2003.
- Has more CG than 25 other teams in MLB this season and more than the Yankees (4) and Red Sox (1) combined.
- His 7 complete games and 3 shutouts are both club records for a single season...was the first Ray to throw 3 straight complete games...in only one season (2000 with 7) have the Rays had more CG wins as a team than Shields' 6 this year.
- Recorded 3 consecutive CG wins, June 14-24...allowed only 1 ER and yielded just 12 hits for a .135 opp avg. (12-for-89)...had 24 SO and 4 BB.
- Set club records before the All-Star break in ERA (2.33), innings pitched (142.1) and strikeouts (137).
- Led the majors with 42 strikeouts in interleague play, one shy of the ML single-season record held by MIN Francisco Liriano (43 SO in 2006)... also led the majors with 3 complete games (in 4 starts), tying the all-time ML mark for a single season...tied for the ML lead with 34.0 IP (tied with NYY Freddy Garcia) and 3 wins (several others).
- Was named AL Co-Player of the Week for June 12-19, his second time winning the award this year...was also named Player of the Week for April 17-24 after throwing back-to-back complete-game wins with a pair of 4-hitters, April 19 vs. CWS and April 24 at TOR.
- For his career, has a 3.18 ERA (401.1-IP, 142-ER) from March–May but a 4.51 ERA (725-IP, 363-ER) through the rest of the season (June–Oct).
- Broke camp as the No. 2 starter, after starting Opening Day each of the last three seasons (2008-10), most in club history. Is the Rays all-time leader in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and quality starts.

#### **#70 JOE MADDON, MANAGER**

- Is the longest-tenured and winningest manager in Rays history...owns a 457-455 (.501) record over his 6 seasons (2006-11)...only 6 managers in baseball have been at their current post longer than Maddon...Rays were 518-775 (.401) prior to his arrival.
- Is 484-479 (.503) in his career, including an interim stint with the Angels in 1999 (19-10)...won his 400<sup>th</sup> career game Aug 17, 2010 vs. TEX. Has been ejected a franchise-record 21 times in his career and five times this season (July 17 vs. BOS by Chad Fairchild; July 1 vs. STL by Vic Carapazza; June 13 at DET by John Tumpane; May 4 vs. TOR by Joe West; April 10 at CWS by Dana DeMuth). Finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the BBWAA balloting for 2010 AL Manager of the Year, trailing Ron Gardenhire and Ron Washington...won the award in 2008
- after guiding the Rays to the World Series, and finished one vote shy of becoming the first to win the award unanimously.
- Managed the American League to a 4-3 win over the NL in the 80th All-Star Game at St. Louis July 14, 2009.
- This is the second year of a three-year contract through 2012

- Has started 6 of 9 games (appeared in 8) since being recalled July 18 as Jose Lobaton was placed on the 15-day DL. Is 3-for-22 since doubling in his first ML at-bat July 18 vs. NYY...was the 6<sup>th</sup> in Rays history to record an extra-base hit in his first plate app.
- In 68 games at Triple-A Durham this season, batted .265 (66-for-249) with 11 2B, 5 HR and 22 RBI...had a .176 (12-for-68) avg. in 17 games in April...since the start of May, has batted .298 (54-for-181) with 5 HR and 20 RBI in 51 games.
- Batted .314 (22-for-70) vs. LHP compared to .246 (44-for-179) vs. RHP with Durham this season.
- Hit .429 (9-for-21) with 2 HR, 2 2B, 3B and 8 RBI in 9 games during spring training...was optioned to Durham on March 15.
- Was acquired from the Cubs in the offseason along with four others in exchange for RH Matt Garza and two others.

  27-year-old is in his 11<sup>th</sup> professional season, but has only been a catcher for three...former infielder first caught in the low minors in 2008 and committed to full-time backstop duty entering 2009..named Best Defensive Catcher in the Cubs system by Baseball America in 2009 and 2010.

- Has a 45.1 groundball pct., the 6<sup>th</sup>-lowest percentage in the AL.
- Opposing 7-8-9 hitters are batting .318 (42-for-148), while 1-thru-6 hitters are batting .273 (82-for-300)...no. 9 hitters are batting .372 (16-for-43).
- Has allowed only 1 HR over his last 4 starts after allowing 12 HR his previous 8 starts.
- Has averaged 4.13 SO/9 IP, the 3rd lowest mark in majors...had a 6.56 SO/9 IP ratio coming into the season
- Among ML pitchers with at least 18 starts, his 50 SO are the lowest total in MLB...next closest is DET Brad Penny with 53. Has allowed 13.79 baserunners per 9 IP (109-IP, 167-BR), the 3<sup>rd</sup>-highest mark in the AL.
- Opposing batters have only missed on 12.3 percent of their swings against Davis, the 2<sup>nd</sup> -lowest pct. in the majors.
- On March 31 agreed to a seven-year contract with the Rays, with the first four years (and \$12.6 million) guaranteed...the Rays hold three one-year options for 2015, 2016 and 2017, with a maximum value of \$35.1 million if the options are exercised...he will donate a portion of his contract to the Rays Baseball Foundation
