A's vs. RAYS

The A's have won the first three games of this series and with a win today, would sweep a four-game series against the Rays for the second time in Oakland history (also September 10-13, 1999 at Tampa Bay)...have now won seven of the last nine games from the Rays...lost the season series last year, 4-5...went 4-3 in Oakland but lost both games in Tampa Bay...the A's have now lost the season series in three of the previous four years and are 20-21 against the Rays since 2007...all-time, the A's are 79-46 (.632) against Tampa Bay...that is the second best record against the Rays by any American League team (New York 146-83, .638)...are 46-18 in Oakland and 33-28 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in eight games since being reinstated from the disabled list July 7 and now has a 12.2 inning scoreless streak dating back to June 16.

Hideki Matsui is batting .444 (20 for 45) with three home runs and 17 RBI since the All-Star Break...leads the Majors in RBI since the break and is tied for third in batting...had five RBI last night, his eighth career game of five or more RBI.

Cliff Pennington is batting a Major League leading .487 (19 for 39) with two home runs and eight RBI since the All-Star Break...has a career and A's season high 11-game hitting streak.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1989**, after both teams score a run in the 10th inning, Carney Lansford's 11th inning single scores Stan Javier with the winning run in the A's 8-7 victory over Seattle...in **2002** Miguel Tejada has six RBI and the A's score 11 times in their final two at bats to win at Texas, 12-2...in **2009** Adam Kennedy goes 5 for 7 in the A's 9-8 win at Boston...it is the first of two five-hit games for Kennedy in 2009.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight for the first time since their season-best six-game winning streak from June 15-21...with a win today, the A's would record their first four-game series sweep since the final series of 2010 at Seattle...it would be just their fourth series sweep of the season...are now 8-4 (.667) since the All-Star Break, which is tied with Arizona, Philadelphia and San Francisco for the second best mark in the majors behind Boston (9-3)...went 39-53 (.424) before the All-Star Break, which was the third worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...have spent each of the last five days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 39 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 25-37 (.403) since then...are 16-15 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 31-42 in games started by righties...are 20-20 in day games and 27-37 at night...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

OFFENSE: The A's scored nine runs in the fourth inning last night, their most in an inning since June 1, 2008 when they scored nine runs in the seventh inning at Texas...it was the A's most runs in the fourth inning since July 22, 1975 when they scored nine at Detroit...had seven hits in the inning, their most since September 19, 2009 when they had seven in the first against Cleveland...collected a season-high 17 hits overall and are now batting a **Major League leading** .321 (134 for 417) since the All-Star Break...also lead the majors in on-base percentage (.397) and fewest strikeouts (63) since the break, rank third in slugging (.475), fourth in doubles (33), tied for fourth in walks (51) and tied for fifth in runs scored (72)...are now batting .243 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...also have the second lowest slugging percentage (.353), second fewest runs scored (387) and third lowest on-base percentage (.311)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 75 games, which is the longest streak by an A's team since an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 59 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the American League** and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 92 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 75 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL (Los Angeles, 74).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.09 ERA (88 er in 193.2 ip) in the month of July...that includes a 2.34 ERA (31 er in 119.0 ip) at home and a 6.87 ERA (57 er in 74.2 ip) on the road...are 9-4 at home and 2-7 on the road in July...have a 3.31 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Los Angeles, 3.28)...have the lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.358) but have issued the third most walks (349)...A's starting pitchers are 5-7 with a 5.54 ERA (56 er in 91.0 ip) over the last 16 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.42 ERA (243 er in 638.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.27).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last four games and have 11 errors in 12 games since the All-Star Break...have 83 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 85) and third most in the majors (Chicago, 89)...the errors have led to 57 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...last year, had just 60 unearned runs for the entire season...are third in the AL in double plays (104).

ON THE BASES: The A's pitching staff has 16 pickoffs, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (18)...the offense has been successful in just 10 of 22 (45.5%) stolen base attempts in July and the 12 caught stealing are the A's most in a month since August, 1995 when they also had 12...the A's have a stolen base percentage of 66.7 (68 for 102) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, 56.1%).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-0 on this seven-game homestand against Tampa Bay (3-0) and Minnesota (three games)...went 3-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles and have won five straight and seven of the last eight at home...are 29-22 (.569) at home for the season compared to 18-35 (.339) on the road...are tied for the fourth best home record in the American League but have the third worst record on the road...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Detroit (1-1) and New York (1-2) and are now 7-26 (.212) over their last 33 road games...that is the A's worst 33-game stretch on the road since May 24-August 5, 1986 when they also went 7-26...the A's are batting .256 (429 for 1674) with 209 runs scored in 51 home games (4.10 per game) and .232 (421 for 1818) with 178 runs scored in 53 games on the road (3.36 per game)...have a 2.71 ERA (141 er in 468.0 ip) at home compared to 3.92 (202 er in 463.1 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and second lowest in the majors (San Francisco, 2.71).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles and Kansas City for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-21 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Tyson Ross from the disabled list Monday and optioned him to Triple-A Sacramento, leaving Oakland with just two players on the DL (Brett Anderson and Dallas Braden)...this marks the first time since the end of the 2006 season that the A's have fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Bobby Crosby)...the A's have used the DL 11 times this year and have not used it fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...it is the 150th start of his career, his 94th as an Athletic...the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 94-55 (.631) in his starting assignments in his career, including 61-32 (.656) with the A's...has tossed six or more innings in two of his four starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer twice.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 3 for 22 (.136) with two walks (.208 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .219 (7 for 32) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .219 (7 for 32) the second time and .292 (7 for 24) after that...his career numbers are .197 (244 for 1237) the first time, .223 (252 for 1132) the second time and .267 (219 for 821) after that...has allowed at least one home run in all four of his starts (five total)...four of his five home runs have been hit by right-handed hitters and four have been solo shots

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

SINCE 2003: Has 881 strikeouts in 869.0 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.12 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 10.00)...has a .224 (715 for 3190) opponents batting average over that span, which is fourth best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221; Jason Schmidt, .223; Lincecum, .223).

WITH THE A'S: His start July 1 against Arizona was his first as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 38-20 record and a 3.47 ERA (218 er in 565.0 ip) in 101 games, 93 starts...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

FIRST START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona July 1 in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...the A's scored a run in the fourth and four more in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler to start the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas July 7...allowed runs in four of his five innings...Kinsler scored on a ground out in the first and Hamilton had a RBI single in the third...Kinsler added a RBI single in the fourth followed by a Hamilton sacrifice fly and Young hit a leadoff home run in the fifth inning...Holland shutout the A's on four hits.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in the second game of the doubleheader against Los Angeles July 16 in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Trumbo in the second inning but then retired 12 of the next 14 batters he faced...the A's scored twice in the fourth and once in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a solo home run to Wells in the sixth inning...left after seven innings with the score tied 3-3.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at New York last Saturday...allowed a RBI single to Martin in the second inning but the A's came back with two runs in the third and another in the sixth...blanked the Yankees on two hits and three walks from the third through fifth innings but then allowed a solo home run to Swisher in the sixth...was relieved by Ziegler following the home run and left with a 3-2 lead.

HARDEN vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 3-2 with a 5.01 ERA (32.1 ip, 35 h, 19 r, 18 er, 11 bb, 33 so, 6 hr) in six career appearances, all starts...is 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (6 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in his home ballparks and 2-1 with a 5.31 ERA (12 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts at Tropicana Field...has faced the Rays just once since 2006 and that was last year on June 6 while pitching for Texas...was the losing pitcher in the Rangers 9-5 loss...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Jaso in the third...also allowed a leadoff home run to Pena in the fourth and a Longoria RBI single in the fifth.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and went 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts...struck out 12 batters in 7.2 innings...allowed a .115 (3 for 26) opponents batting average, including .083 (1 for 12) against left-handed hitters and .143 (2 for 14) against right-handers.

2010 RECAP: Was 5-5 with a 5.58 ERA in 20 games, 18 starts, with Texas in a season where he was bothered by injuries and control problems much of the season, which resulted in two stints on the disabled list...the ERA was the highest of his major league career...issued 62 walks in 92.0 innings, an average of 6.07 per nine innings...that was the highest ratio in the majors among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...it was also sixth highest in team history and the highest since 1987 (Bobby Witt, 8.81; Mitch Williams, 7.79)...walked five or more batters in six of his 18 starts, including a season high six April 18 at New York and May 14 at Toronto.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for 10th in the American League in hit batters (9)...tied for fourth on the club in strikeouts (75), was fifth in starts and pitched the sixth most innings (92.0)...was also second on the team in hit batters and third in walks.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .238 (40-for-168) against right-handed hitters and .273 (51-for-187) against left-handers...yielded a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .220 the second time and .372 after that...posted a 4.40 ERA at home and 6.70 on the road...was 2-3 with a 4.41 ERA in nine starts on four days rest and 3-2 with a 6.47 ERA in his other nine starts...compiled a 0-3 record and a 7.43 ERA in six outings during the day and was 5-2 with a 4.96 ERA in 14 night games...went 2-0 in four starts with run support of four or more and is 42-0 in 56 such starts in his career.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (9-7, 2.67 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season...is 1-2 with a 5.17 ERA and four home runs allowed in his last three starts after going 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA and no home runs over his previous four starts...is 7-2 with a 1.88 ERA and .186 opponents batting average in 11 starts at home and 2-5 with a 3.76 ERA and .267 opponents average in nine starts on the road...over the last two years, he is 15-5 with a 2.28 ERA in 27 starts at home and 9-11 with a 3.87 ERA in 26 starts on the road...is 24-16 with a 3.02 ERA over the last two years...the ERA is seventh lowest in the American League over that span and the wins rank eighth...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-5 A's loss at New York last Sunday (4.2 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is 2-2 with an 8.03 ERA in five career starts against Minnesota...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 1-0 A's win at Minnesota April 9 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...combined with Balfour and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout.

The A's bullpen has a 2.47 ERA (94.2 ip, 77 h, 31 r, 26 er, 49 bb, 93 so, 4 hr) over its past 34 games (since June 17)...is 4-4 with 12 saves, two blown saves and a .222 (77 for 347) opponents batting average over that span...now has a 3.08 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...is tied for the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.338) in the AL and has the fourth lowest batting average (.233) and on-base percentage (.312)...has the fewest wins (11) and is tied for the second most losses (18)...is tied for the second fewest home runs (18)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (72).

- Has held opponents to a .159 batting average, including .133 (4 for 30) against right-handers and .179 (7 for 39) against lefties.

- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

LAST THREE STARTS: is 1-2 with a 5.17 ERA (9 er in 15.2 ip) and four home runs allowed in his last three starts after going 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA and no home runs over his previous four starts.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
