A's vs. TWINS

The A's trail in the season series, 2-3...won two of three in Minnesota in April but were swept in a two-game series in Oakland in May...have won just one season series over the previous five seasons and are 22-29 against Minnesota since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 271-284 against Minnesota...that includes 150-123 in Oakland and 121-160 in Minnesota are 328-353 all-time against the Twins and have a 975-989 record against the Twins/Senators

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in eight games since being reinstated from the disabled list July 7 and now has a 12.2 inning scoreless streak dating back to June 16.

Hideki Matsui is batting .438 (21 for 48) with three home runs and 17 RBI since the All-Star Break...leads the Majors in RBI since the break and ranks fourth in batting.

Cliff Pennington is batting a Major League leading .455 (20 for 44) with two home runs and eight RBI since the All-Star Break...has a career and A's season high 12game hitting streak.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1969 Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to hit 40 home runs when he hits a solo shot in the first inning of the A's 6-5 win against the New York Yankees...a young rookie named Vida Blue recorded his first major ague win in that game ... in 1989 Rickey Henderson steals five bases but the A's lose 14-6 to Seattle...Henderson scores four runs without an official at bat as he walks in all four of his plate appearances...in **1992** Dennis Eckersley saves his 33rd Eckersley consecutive game to set a Major League record with 36 consecutive saves dating back to 1991...he would save 36 straight to start the season for a total of 40 consecutive saves

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped yesterday and are now 8-5 (.615) since the All-Star Break...that is tied for the fourth best record in the American League since the break...went 39-53 (.424) before the All-Star Break, which was the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have spent each of the last six days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 40 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 25-38 (.397) since then...are 16-15 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 31-43 in games started by righties...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting a **Major League leading** .317 (144 for 454) since the All-Star Break...have collected at least eight hits in each of the 13 games since the break, which is tied for the third longest streak of consecutive games with eight or more hits in Oakland history...had a 14-game streak from September 22, 2000-April 6, 2001 and the record is 15 from September 12-27, 1980...also lead the majors in on-base percentage (.389) and fewest strikeouts (72) since the break, rank second in slugging (.480), third in runs (80), fourth in doubles (35) and tied for fifth in walks (52)...are now batting .244 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...also have the second lowest slugging percentage (.355), second fewest runs scored (395) and third lowest on-base percentage (.311)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 76 games, which is the longest streak by an A's team since an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 61 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the American League** and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 94 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 78 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL (Los Angeles and New York, 76).

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.58 ERA (57 er in 78.0 ip) and .301 (94 for 312) opponents batting average over the last nine games but are 5-4 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...have a 3.38 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Los Angeles, 3.31)...have the lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.360) but have issued the third most walks (355)...A's starting pitchers are 5-7 with a 5.38 ERA (58 er in 97.0 ip) over the last 17 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.42 ERA (245 er in 644.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.32).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in 13 games since the All-Star Break...have 83 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 85) and third most in the majors (Chicago, 89)...the errors have led to 57 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...last year, had just 60 unearned runs for the entire season...are third in the AL in double plays (106).

ON THE BASES: The A's pitching staff has 16 pickoffs, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (18)...the offense has been successful in just 10 of 22 (45.5%) stolen base attempts in July and the 12 caught stealing are the A's most in a month since August, 1995 when they also had 12...the A's have a stolen base percentage of 66.7 (68 for 102) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Chicago, 56.1%).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this seven-game homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (three games)...had their five-game home winning streak snapped yesterday and have won seven of the last 10 games in Oakland...are 29-23 (.558) at home for the season compared to 18-35 (.339) on the road...are tied for the fifth best home record in the American League but have the third worst record on the road...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Detroit (1-1) and New York (1-2) and are now 7-26 (.212) over their last 33 road games...that is the A's worst 33-game stretch on the road since May 24-August 5, 1986 when they also went 7-26...the A's are batting .257 (439 for 1711) with 217 runs scored in 52 home games (4.17 per game) and .232 (421 for 1818) with 178 runs scored in 53 games on the road (3.36 per game)...have a 2.85 ERA (151 er in 477.0 ip) at home compared to 3.92 (202 er in 463.1 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Following Sunday's game, the A's embark on a nine-game, 11-day road trip to Seattle, Tampa Bay and Toronto...the total air mileage on the trip is 6,544 (source: travelmath.com)...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have played in all domes on a three-city road trip...it is also the first time the A's have played three consecutive road series in domes...the A's have a 3-4 record in domes this year...the trip also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 29 games from August 1 to September 1 on the road...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from September 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's blew a five-run lead for the second time this year yesterday when the Rays scored seven times in the seventh inning (April 5 at Toronto)...fell to 12-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later...the A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Cincinnati, 15-23)...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...the 16 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles and Kansas City for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Tyson Ross from the disabled list Monday and optioned him to Triple-A Sacramento, leaving Oakland with just two players on the DL (Brett Anderson and Dallas Braden)...this marks the first time since the end of the 2006 season that the A's have fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Bobby Crosby)...the A's have used the DL 11 times this year and have not used it fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season...the A's are 10-10 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 40-37 (.519) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 15 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

LAST THREE STARTS: Is 1-2 with a 5.17 ERA (9 er in 15.2 ip) and four home runs allowed in his last three starts after going 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA and no home runs over his previous four starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS. Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.67) and seventh in opponents batting average (.222) and slugging percentage (.328)...is also third in walks (57) and tied for eighth in hit batters (7).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-2 with a 1.88 ERA (15 er in 72.0 ip) and .186 (47 for 253) opponents batting average in 11 starts at home and 2-5 with a 3.76 ERA (22 er in 52.2 ip) and .267 (56 for 210) opponents average in nine starts on the road...is tied for the American League lead in home wins and ranks second in ERA and opponents batting average...over the last two years, he is 15-5 with a 2.28 ERA (44 in 174.0 ip) and .194 (120 for 619) opponents average in 27 starts at home and 9-11 with a 3.87 ERA (65 er in 151.1 ip) and .260 (154 for 592) average in 26 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .183 (20 for 109) average with runners in scoring position, which is second lowest in the American League (Garcia, NYY .180)...opponents are batting .269 (47 for 175) with no outs and .194 (56 for 288) with one or two outs...has held the first three spots in the batting order to a .198 (34 for 172) average...six of the 10 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.

THE LAST TWO YEARS: Is 24-16 with a 3.02 ERA (109 er in 325.1 ip) over the last two years...the ERA is seventh lowest in the American League over that span (min. 200 ip) and the wins rank eighth.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-4 with a 2.14 ERA (16 er in 67.1 ip) and .206 (50 for 243) opponents batting average in 11 starts at night compared to 5-3 with a 3.30 ERA (21 er in 57.1 ip) and .241 (53 for 220) average in nine starts during the day...has the third lowest night ERA in the American League

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.15 ERA (28 er in 80.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 1.81 ERA (9 er in 44.2 ip) from the fifth inning on...has allowed eight of his 10 home runs over the first four innings of a game

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer 12 of his 21 starts...has just 11 runs of support in his seven losses this year (38.1 ip, 2.58 RSA) and 29 runs of support in his 27 career losses (132.1 ip, 1.97 RSA)...is 26-1 in 35 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-26 in 42 starts with support of two or fewer.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team and was the A's lone selection...entered the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with two outs and the bases empty and struck out the only batter he faced, Jay Bruce.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Is 2-2 with a 3.97 ERA (10 er in 22.2 ip) over his first four starts of July...went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week ending July 3 after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a Major League leading 16 strikeouts in two starts...shared the honors with Toronto's Jose Bautista...it marked his first Player of the Week award.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-5 loss at New York last Sunday...allowed a seasonhigh six earned runs...the A's scored twice in the second inning but he allowed a run in the bottom of the second on a Jones RBI single...allowed a two-run double to Nunez in the fourth to give the Yankees a 3-2 lead and then surrendered three more runs in the fifth...Granderson hit a two-run home run and Jones added a RBI single.

GONZALEZ vs. MINNESOTA: Is 2-2 with an 8.03 ERA (24.2 ip, 31 h, 24 r, 22 er, 13 bb, 21 so, 5 hr) in five career starts...is 1-1 with a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts at Target Field, 0-1 with a 21.00 ERA (7 er in 3.0 ip) in one start in the Metrodome and 1-0 with a 12.10 ERA (13 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 1-0 A's win at Minnesota April 9...combined with Balfour and Fuentes on a five-hit shutout...tossed six innings and allowed four of the hits...was 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (13.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 5 bb, 11 so) in two starts last year...allowed a career high 11 runs on a career high tying 10 hits in just 2.2 innings in a 14-13 A's win on July 20, 2009 in Oakland...left trailing 11-2 and the Twins built a 12-2 lead before the A's came back with three in the third, two in the fourth and seven in the seventh.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Guillermo Moscoso (3-5, 3.47 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 13th appearance and 11th start of the season... is 0-1 with a 10.24 ERA in two starts since he was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento July 19... went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA over his final six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break...has allowed just three earned runs over the first three innings of a game for a 0.89 ERA and .157 opponents batting average...has a 6.14 ERA and .279 opponents average from the fourth inning on...has allowed a .189 opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup and .340 after that...opponents are hitting .184 with runners in scoring position...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-5 A's win over Tampa Bay last Monday (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb)...has never faced the Twins in his career.

The A's bullpen allowed eight runs yesterday, equaling the second most runs the bullpen has allowed in a game this year...also allowed eight runs April 15 against Detroit and the season high is 10 runs on May 19 against Minnesota...now has a 7.54 ERA (19 er in 22.2 ip) over its past seven games but has a 3.13 ERA (34 er in 97.2 ip) over its past 35 games (since June 17)...has a 3.29 ERA for the season, which is tied for third lowest in the American League...has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.345) in the AL and is tied for the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.316)...has the fewest wins (11) and is tied for the most losses (19)...has allowed the third fewest home runs (20)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (72)



Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
