#### A's vs. TWINS

The A's trail in the season series 2-4 and need to win each of the remaining two games to avoid losing the season series for the fourth time in the last six years...won two of three in Minnesota in April but have lost all three games in Oakland...are 22-30 (.423) against Minnesota since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 271-285 against Minnesota...that includes 150-124 in Oakland and 121-160 in Minnesota...are 328-354 all-time against the Twins and have a 975-990 record against the Twins/Senators

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in eight games since being reinstated from the disabled list July 7 and now has a 12.2 inning scoreless streak dating back to June 16.

Brian Fuentes made the 599<sup>th</sup> appearance of his career last night...needs one more to become the 16<sup>th</sup> active pitcher with 600 games pitched.

Hideki Matsui is batting .462 (24 for 52) with three home runs and 17 RBI since the All-Star BI since the All-Star leads the Majors in batting Break and RBI since the break.

Cliff Pennington is batting .438 (21 for 48) since the All-Star Break, which is second best in the majors...has a career and season high 13-game high A's hitting streak.

**Josh Willingham** had his 10<sup>th</sup> career two-homer game last night and is now batting .311 (19 for 61) with five home runs and 14 RBI in 17 games since being reinstated from the disabled list July 7.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1901 Napoleon Lajoie becomes the second player in American League history to hit for the cycle, following teammate Harry Davis who was the first 20 days earlier...in **2000** Sal Fasano has a career high five RBI and drives in every run in the A's 5-2 win over

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning three in a row and are now 8-6 (.571) since the All-Star Break...went 39-53 (.424) before the break, which was the third worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 25-39 (.391) since then...have spent each of the last seven days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 41 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting a Major League leading .312 (152 for 487) since the All-Star Break...have collected at least eight hits in each of the 14 games since the break, which is tied for the second longest streak of consecutive games with eight or more hits in Oakland history...also had a 14-game streak from September 22, 2000-April 6, 2001 and the record is 15 from September 12-27, 1980...also lead the majors in on-base percentage (.384) since the break, rank second in slugging (.478), tied for second in runs (85), third in fewest strikeouts (80), fourth in doubles (36) and tied for fourth in walks (56)...are now batting .244 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...also have the second lowest slugging percentage (.356), second fewest runs scored (400) and third lowest on-base percentage (.311)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Cleveland Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs in each of the last three games, which is their longest streak of consecutive multi-homer games this year...however, have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 77 games, which is the fourth longest streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 63 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 96 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 79 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL.

IN JULY: The A's are 11-13 in July and need to win each of the remaining two games to avoid posting a losing record for the sixth consecutive month (excludes October)...the last time the A's had at least six consecutive months with a losing record was from May 1997-May 1998 when they had seven straight...the A's have posted a losing record in each of the first four months of the season just three times in Oakland history (1979, 1993, 2009)...the last time the A's posted a winning record in a month was last July (14-10).

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.72 ERA (65 er in 87.0 ip) and .302 (106 for 351) opponents batting average over 650.0 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.37).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 13 errors in 14 games since the All-Star Break...have 85 errors for the season, which is tied with Texas for second most in the majors (Cubs, 91)...the errors have led to 58 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...last year, had just 60 unearned runs for the entire season...are third in the American League in double plays (108).

ON THE BASES: The A's pitching staff has 16 pickoffs, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (18)...the offense has been successful in just 10 of 22 (45.5%) stolen base attempts in July and the 12 caught stealing are the A's most in a month since August, 1995 when they also had 12...the A's have a stolen base percentage of 66.7 (68 for 102) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Chicago, 56.1%).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this seven-game homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (0-1)...went 3-1 on the last homestand and are 29-24 (.547) at home for the season compared to 18-35 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the AL...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Detroit (1-1) and New York (1-2) and are now 7-26 (.212) over their last 33 road games...that is the A's worst 33-game stretch on the road since May 24-August 5, 1986 when they also went 7-26...the A's are batting .256 (447 for 1744) with 222 runs scored in 53 home games (4.19 per game) and .232 (421 for 1818) with 178 runs scored in 53 games on the road (3.36 per game)...have a 2.94 ERA (159 er in 486.0 ip) at home compared to 3.92 (202 er in 463.1 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Following Sunday's game, the A's embark on a nine-game, 11-day road trip to Seattle, Tampa Bay and Toronto...the total air mileage on the trip is 6,544 (source: travelmath.com)...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have played in all domes on a three-city road trip...it is also the first time the A's have played three consecutive road series in domes...the A's have a 3-4 record in domes this year...the trip also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 29 games from August 1 to September 1 on the road...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from September 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles and Kansas City for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have just two players on the DL (Anderson and Braden), marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they have fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby)...have used the DL 11 times this year and have not used it fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 13<sup>th</sup> appearance and 11<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings five times, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

BRIEFLY: Began the season at Sacramento and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was

optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break...was recalled July 19 and is 0-1 with a 10.24 ERA (11 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts since his return.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed just three earned runs over the first three innings of a game for a 0.89 ERA (30.1 ip) and .157 (17 for 108) opponents batting average...has a 6.14 ERA (20 er in 29.1 ip) and .279 (34 for 122) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .189 (33 for 175) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup and .340 (18 for 53) after that...opponents are hitting .184 (7 for 38) with runners in scoring position.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in four of his last seven starts and has three runs of support or fewer in seven of his nine starts...has run support of 3.14 (18 rs in 51.2 ip) as a starter for the season.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-4 with a 3.49 ERA (22 er in 56.2 ip) in nine starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...made his two relief appearances on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4<sup>th</sup>.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high four games in a 2-0 win over Seattle July 6...posted a 2.43 ERA and .200 opponents during the losing streak, which spanned six games, including five starts.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July, 1968.

2011 START-BY-START: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...just three runners advanced into scoring position...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore May 29 in Oakland...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore June 7...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-4 loss at Chicago June 12 ... walked a career-high four batters in 6.1 innings ... had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco June 18 in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the fifth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Philadelphia June 24...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...Worley, Herndon, Perez and Stutes combined to shutout the A's on two hits...extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida June 29 in Oakland ... struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings ... Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle July 6 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss July 19 at Detroit...allowed career highs in runs (7), earned runs (6) and hits (9) and matched his high in home runs (2)...tossed just 4.2 innings, matching his fewest as a starter...blanked the Tigers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career high 12.0 innings...the streak ended when a Jackson error allowed Martinez to score in the fourth...then allowed six runs in the fifth inning, including an Ordonez sacrifice fly, a Cabrera two-run home run, a Peralta RBI single and a Guillen two-run home run

LAST START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Tampa Bay last Monday in Oakland...matched his career high by walking four batters and allowing two home runs...did not strike out a batter for the first time in a starting assignment...allowed a solo home run to Zobrist in the first inning but the A's scored twice in the second...allowed a RBI double to Jennings in the third to tie the game and the Rays scored two more runs in the fifth on a RBI fielders choice and an Upton RBI triple...surrendered a lead off home run to Shoppach in the sixth and was relieved by Wuertz with the A's trailing 5-2...Oakland scored once in the bottom of the sixth, three times in the seventh and once in the eighth for the win.

MOSCOSO vs. MINNESOTA: Is making his first career appearance and start.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in nine dames. eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (3-5, 3.52 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 15<sup>th</sup> start of the season, his sixth since coming off the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula and is 2-1 with a 3.77 ERA in five starts since his return...based on a minimum of 70 innings pitched, he ranks third in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.52) and fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.38)...has 94.2 innings pitched, which is 7.0 innings short of his career high of 101.2 in 2007...has 60 strikeouts, which is nine short of his high of 69 in 2006... was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's win over Tampa Bay on Tuesday (8.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA in eight career appearances, including three starts, against Minnesota...is 1-0 with a 3.14 ERA (14.1 ip, 18 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 so) in two starts this year.



**RUN SUPPORT:** Received 13 runs of support in his last start after receiving a total of 13 runs combined over his previous 11 starts (13 rs in 64.2 ip, 1.81 RSA)...has received run support of three runs or fewer in 19 of his 23 starts this year.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .153 (9 for 59) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is second lowest in the American League...has allowed a .224 (26 for 114) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .304 (21 for 69) over his last 13 starts (since May 25).

### **BOB MELVIN**

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
