**THE TWINS:** The Twins are 3-2 on this 11-day, 10-game road trip after splitting a four-game series at Texas and winning in Oakland last night...tonight, the Twins will continue the trip with the second of a three-game series in Oakland...the Twins have won three in a row vs. the A's...following this series, the Twins have a scheduled off day on Monday before starting a three-game series in Anaheim on Tuesday...they are 5-1-2 in their last eight series.

**LIRIANO SETTLES IN, TWINS OFFENSE ROLLS:** The Twins beat the A's 9-5 last night in Oakland...Francisco Liriano (7-8) was the starter and winner, allowing two runs (both in the first inning) on six hits, with two walks and four strikeouts in 7.0 innings...Jose Mijares allowed a three-run homer in the eighth inning before Alex Burnett (0.1 ip) and Glen Perkins (0.2 ip) combined for a scoreless ninth inning...Trevor Plouffe was 2-for-6 with two rbi and three runs scored...Joe Mauer was 2-for-4 with two runs scored...Michael Cuddyer added a three-run homer and Jason Kubel had a two-run double...the Twins were 4-for-14 with runners in scoring position and left 11 runners on base.

**TWINS VS. OAKLAND:** The Twins have won their last three games vs. the A's and 11 of their last 16 games overall, dating back to September 13, 2009...over the 16 game stretch the Twins pitching staff has posted a 2.40 ERA (146.0 ip, 39 er), with the A's hitting just .236 (127-for-537) vs. the Twins...the Twins have won three games in a row in Oakland and five of their last six...the last time the Twins won four straight games in Oakland in one season, was a five-game streak from May 26-August 15, 1993.

**PERK PITCHING PERFECT:** Glen Perkins has allowed just one earned run over his last 18 appearances (dating back to June 26), going 3-0, 0.59 ERA (15.1 ip, 1 er) with two saves...he has allowed just five hits, two walks (both intentional) while recording 20 strikeouts...over that span, he has held opponents to a .102 (5-for-49) batting average...35 of his 43 appearances this season have been scoreless and he has yet to allow more than one run in an appearance.

**NATHAN FINDING HIS GROOVE:** Since coming back from the disabled list on June 24, Joe Nathan has pitched in 13 games, allowing just two runs in 12.1 innings (1.46 ERA)...he has allowed just seven hits and struck out 10 without allowing a walk...opponents are batting just .159 (7-for-44) off him during the 13-game stretch.

**COMPANY AT THE TOP:** Joe Nathan's save Tuesday night was the 255th of his career, and his 254th as a member of the Twins...he tied Rick Aguilera for first on the Twins All-Time saves list Wednesday night...additionally, Nathan has converted five consecutive save opportunities since moving back into the closer's role.

**THOME LOOKING TO CATCH SOME LEGENDS:** Jim Thome has 1,706 career walks, just two shy of tying Mel Ott for eighth on baseball's all-time list...additionally, Thome has 1,750 runs batted in, just two shy of tying Tony Perez for 27th on baseball's all-time list...Thome has a career .557 slugging percentage, tying him with Willie Mays and Mickey Mantle.

**MAUER PASSES PUCKETT ON TWINS ALL-TIME WALKS LIST:** After recording a walk last night, Joe Mauer (451) passed Kirby Puckett (450) to move into sole possession of seventh on the Twins All-Time list...comparatively, Puckett played 12 seasons for the Twins with a career .360 on-base percentage, while Mauer, currently in his eighth season, has a career .405 OBP.

**HITTERS THAT GET TO OAKLAND - AND HIT WELL AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Joe Mauer has a career .330 (63-for-191) batting average vs. Oakland, including hitting .324 (34-for-105) in Oakland...additionally, Delmon Young has hit .329 (27-for-82) in Oakland while Jason Kubel owns a career .313 (26-for-83) average in Oakland.

**GETTING A GOOD JUMP:** The Twins recorded two stolen bases last night and now rank 10th in the American League with 60 stolen bases this season...however, their 73.2% success rate (22 caught stealing) is tied for the fifth best percentage in the league...it was their 14th game of the season with two-or-more stolen bases.

**REVERE AND THE STOLEN BASE:** Ben Revere stole his 17th base of the season last night (he has been caught five times)...his 17 stolen bases are the sixth highest total by a Twins rookie...Denard Span (2008) sits sixth on that list with 18, while Luis Rivas (2001) holds the club record for stolen bases by a rookie with 31 in 2001.

**LAST START:** Was the loser in the Twins' 20-6 series opener loss at Texas, July 25 opposite Derek Holland...the last time the Twins allowed 20 or more runs was April 6, 1974 at Kansas City...Blackburn lasted only 2.2 innings, allowing nine runs (six earned) on 11 hits and two home runs while walking and striking out none...was relieved by Jose Mijares (0.2 ip, 4 er), Chuck James (1.0 ip, 4 er), Phil Dumatrait (1.2 ip, 0 er), Alex Burnett (1.0 ip, 2 er) and Michael Cuddyer...Cuddyer pitched for the first time in his career, tossing a scoreless eighth inning with two hits and one walk.

**TWO STARTS AGO...:** Did not factor into the decision in the Twins' 7-5 victory, July 20 vs. Cleveland opposite Josh Tomlin...started the final game of a four-game series with the Indians, guiding them to a series-tye...came within one strikeout of tying his season and career-high, fanning seven...allowed three runs (one earned) to score in the fourth inning on two hits and one error...he threw 104 pitches, 65 strikes.

**FIRST-HALF WRAP:** Went 7-6, 4.24 (110.1 ip, 52 er) with 31 walks and 58 strikeouts in 18 starts.  
 » Made his first start, April 3 at Toronto, earning the win, allowing two runs (one earned) on six hits in 5.2 ip.  
 » Surpassed 600.0 innings for his career, May 4 at Chicago (AL).  
 » Made his 100th career start, May 14 vs. Toronto...also set a career-high with eight strikeouts in that start.  
 » Recorded his 300th career strikeout, May 24 at Seattle, fanning Miguel Olivo in the second inning.  
 » Pitched his fifth career complete game, May 24 vs. Seattle.  
 » Went 3-0, 2.53 (42.2 ip, 12 er) in six starts in May...his 42.2 ip ranked fifth in the AL and 10th in baseball.  
 » Left his start on June 4 at Kansas City with back tightness.  
 » Tied a career-high for a win-streak, winning his fifth straight decision, May 4-June 16.  
 » Was tied with Scott Baker for most wins on the Twins staff.

**ROAD WOES:** Is 5-4, 4.83 (63.1 ip, 34 er) in 11 road starts this season...he has won four of his last six decisions on the road posting an ERA of 4.63 (44.2 ip, 23 er) in eight starts...he began his career going 9-24 in his first 33 road decisions from 2007-August 23, 2010 but since has gone 6-5 in his last 11 road decisions.  
 » He is 15-29, 5.26 (354.0 ip, 207 er) in 64 career road games (60 starts), compared to his career home record of 24-14, 3.61 (343.2 ip, 138 er) in 57 career games (53 starts).  
 » The Twins are 5-6 in 2011 and 23-41 in career road games when Blackburn starts.

**UPS AND DOWNS:** Went 1-4, 5.14 (28.0 ip, 16 er) in April, 3-0, 2.53 (42.2 ip, 12 er) in May, and 2-2, 3.82 (30.2 ip, 13 er) in June...is 1-1, 6.57 (24.2 ip, 18 er) since the beginning of July...went 4-4, 3.20 (64.2 ip, 23 er) in his first ten starts this season, and has gone 3-3, 5.28 (61.1 ip, 43 er) in his last 11.

**TAKING OFFENSE:** He has a run support average of 4.21 this season (59 runs of support total)...he has left the game with three-or-fewer runs of support in 14 of his past 23 starts dating back to September 28, 2010...he has left with zero runs in five starts this season.

**THE DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES:** Through games of July 30 last season, Blackburn was 7-7, 6.66 (104.0 ip, 77 er) in 19 starts with opponents batting .340 (148-for-435)...this season he is 7-7, 4.21 (126 ip, 59 er) in 21 starts with opponents batting .294 (148-for-503).  
 » He moved to the bullpen after his start on July 18, 2010 for one relief outing then was optioned to Triple-A Rochester July 30 (clearing a roster spot for Matt Capps)...in four starts with the Red Wings he went 1-0, 2.49 (21.2 ip, 6 er)...recalled on August 22.

**TWIN KILLINGS:** He has induced 11 ground ball double plays this season after recording 21 in 2010...since the start of the 2010 season, he has recorded at least one ground ball double play in 28 of his 47 starts, going 15-8 when he induces at least one GIDP (he has induced at least one GIDP in nine of his 21 starts this season, going 5-3 in those games)...his 77 ground ball double plays since the start of 2008 are 11th-most in baseball and third-most in the American League, behind Mark Buehrle (95) and Felix Hernandez (92).  
 » His 31 GIDP's induced in 2008 are the third-most for a single season in baseball since 2008, behind Mark Buehrle's 34 in 2008 and Tim Hudson's 32 in 2010.

**MISC. BLACKBURN:**

- » He needs just 2.1 innings to reach 700.0 innings pitched for his career...24 different Twins have reached 700.0 innings pitched in a Twins uniform.
- » He is holding opponents to a batting average of .183 (10-for-55) with runners in scoring position and two outs...they are batting .252 (30-for-119) with runners in scoring position.
- » His 65 quality starts are tied for 12th in the American League since the start of 2008.
- » His 2.03 walks-per-9.0 innings pitched ranks sixth in the American League since 2008...Kevin Slowey ranks third (1.47), Carl Pavano ranks fourth (1.72) and Scott Baker ranks eighth (2.22).
- » He has posted a 66.8 ground ball percentage this season, which ranks fourth in the American League, behind Trevor Cahill (70.8%), Fausto Carmona (69.7%) and Justin Masterson (67.8%).
