A's vs. TWINS

The A's trail in the season series 3-4 entering the final meeting today...won two of three in Minnesota in April but are 1-3 in Oakland...have lost the season series in three of the previous five seasons and are 23-30 (.433) against Minnesota since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 272-285 against Minnesota...that includes 151-124 in Oakland and 121-160 in Minnesota...are 329-354 all-time against the Twins and have a 976-990 record against the Twins/Senators

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has not allowed a run in nine games since being reinstated from the disabled list July 7 and now has a 13.2 inning scoreless streak dating back to June 16.

Brian Fuentes made the 599th appearance of his career Friday night...needs one more to become the 16th active pitcher with 600 games pitched.

Hideki Matsui is batting .473 (26 for 55) with three home runs and 17 RBI since the All-Star Break...leads the Majors in batting and on-base percentage (.532) since the break.

Cliff Pennington is batting .431 (22 for 51) since the All-Star Break, which is second best in the majors...has a career and A's season high 14-game hitting streak.

Josh Willingham is batting .308 (20 for 65) with five home runs and 15 RBI in 18 games since being reinstated from the disabled list July 7.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1972 Vida Blue tosses a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat Texas 2-0 in 1:52...Joe Rudi drives in both of the A's runs with sacrifice flies as the A's are also limited to two hits...in 1973 Ken Holtzman pitches all 11 innings of the A's 4-3 win over Minnesota...Ray Fosse drives in the winning run with a sacrifice fly.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 9-6 (.600) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the fourth best record in the American League...went 39-53 (.424) before the break, which was the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 26-39 (.400) since then...have spent each of the last eight days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 42 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

OFFENSE: The A's collected 12 hits last night and now have at least eight hits in each of the 15 games since the All-Star Break...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive games with eight or more hits (September 12-27, 1980)...are batting a **Major League leading** .315 (164 for 521) since the break...also lead the majors in slugging percentage (.482) and on-base percentage (.388) since the break, are third in runs scored (93), tied for third in doubles (40) and walks (62), fourth in fewest strikeouts (86) and tied for fourth in triples (4)...are now batting .245 for the season, which is the highest the A's average has been outside the first five games of the season...have the second fewest runs scored (408) in the American League, the second lowest slugging percentage (.358) and the third lowest batting average (.245) and on-base percentage (.313)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Cleveland and Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 78 games, which is the fourth longest streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 63 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the American League** and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 95 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 79 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL.

IN JULY: The A's are 12-13 in July and need a win today to avoid posting a losing record for the sixth consecutive month (excludes October)...the last time the A's had at least six consecutive months with a losing record was from May 1997-May 1998 when they had seven straight...the A's have posted a losing record in each of the first four months of the season just three times in Oakland history (1979, 1993, 2009)...the last time the A's posted a winning record in a month was last July (14-10).

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.28 ERA (67 er in 96.0 ip) and .296 (114 for 385) opponents batting average over the last 11 games but are 6-5 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...have a 3.41 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...have the lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.360) and rank third in strikeouts (750)...have issued the second most walks (363)...A's starting pitchers are 6-8 with a 5.30 ERA (64 er in 108.2 ip) over the last 19 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.44 ERA (251 er in 656.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.34).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 14 errors in 15 games since the All-Star Break...have 86 errors for the season, which is tied with Texas for second most in the majors (Cubs, 93)...the errors have led to 59 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...last year, had just 60 unearned runs for the entire season...are third in the American League and majors in double plays (109).

ON THE BASES: The A's pitching staff has 16 pickoffs, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (18)...the offense has been successful in just 12 of 24 (50.0%) stolen base attempts in July and the 12 caught stealing are the A's most in a month since August, 1995 when they also had 12...the A's have a stolen base percentage of 67.3 (70 for 104) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Chicago, 56.1%).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this seven-game homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (1-1)...went 3-1 on the last homestand and are 30-24 (.556) at home for the season compared to 18-35 (.339) on the road...have the second worst road record in the AL...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Detroit (1-1) and New York (1-2) and are now 7-26 (.212) over their last 33 road games...that is the A's worst 33-game stretch on the road since May 24-August 5, 1986 when they also went 7-26...the A's are batting .258 (459 for 1778) with 230 runs scored in 54 home games (4.26 per game) and .232 (421 for 1818) with 178 runs scored in 53 games on the road (3.36 per game)...have a 2.93 ERA (161 er in 495.0 ip) at home compared to 3.92 (202 er in 463.1 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Following the game today, the A's embark on a nine-game, 11-day road trip to Seattle, Tampa Bay and Toronto...the total air mileage on the trip is 6,544 (source: travelmath.com)...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have played in all domes on a three-city road trip...it is also the first time the A's have played three consecutive road series in domes...the A's have a 3-4 record in domes this year...the trip also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 29 games from August 1 to September 1 on the road...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from September 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles and Kansas City for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Michael Wuertz on the disabled list yesterday, the 12th time they have used the DL this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...had two players on the DL from Monday through Friday, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they have fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season, his sixth since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 5-9 (.357) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 32-38 (.457) in his 70 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 11 of his 14 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer all 14 times.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 2-1 with a 3.77 ERA (13 er in 31.0 ip) in five starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

QUALIFICATIONS: Has allowed just four home runs in 94.2 innings and his average of 0.38 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest among American League pitchers with at least 70 innings pitched...has issued just 16 walks for an average of 1.52 per nine innings...that is third lowest in the AL using the same minimum...with 60 strikeouts, his ratio of 3.75 strikeouts per walk is fifth best.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .191 (22 for 115) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .311 (76 for 244) after that...has surrendered four home runs, all solo shots...three have been hit by left-handed hitters.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 1-2 with a 4.73 ERA (24 er in 45.2 ip) in seven starts on four days rest and 2-3 with a 2.39 ERA (13 er in 49.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or less in nine of his 14 starts...his season run support is 4.37 (46 rs in 94.2 ip)...has 10 runs of support in his five losses (35.1 ip, 2.55 RSA).

CAREER BESTS: Has 94.2 innings pitched, which is 7.0 innings short of his career high of 101.2 in 2007...has 60 strikeouts, which is nine short of his high of 69 in 2006.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high five games in a 5-3 victory over Los Angeles July 15...it was his first win since April 10...the previous longest losing streak of his career was four from June 25 to September 10, 2006...posted a 3.72 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned seven starts.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitcher...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

2011 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto **April 5**...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle)...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota **April 10**...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss **April 15** against Detroit in Oakland...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle **April 21**...the complete game was his second of his career (also May 24, 2009 at Houston)...was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles **April 26**...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Texas **May 2** in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City **May 7**...both of his complete games have been losses...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 13**...allowed all four of the runs in the second inning...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning loss to Minnesota **May 18**...retired 13 of the final 17 hitters he faced and left trailing 3-2...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Seattle **July 4** in Oakland...faced the minimum over the first five innings thanks to two double plays...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Texas **July 9**...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning to tie the game...left with a 6-5 lead but Bailey allowed a two-run home run to Hamilton in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save and loss...snapped his losing streak at five games in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles **July 15** in Oakland...blanked the Angels on three hits over the first four innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Detroit **July 20**...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed back-to-back singles to start the bottom of the sixth and was relieved by Devine...Devine allowed both of those runs to score for the blown save and a run of his own.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Tampa Bay on Tuesday...blanked the Rays on five hits and two walks over the first seven innings and did not allow a runner past second base...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a one-out solo home run to Zobrist in the eighth inning.

McCARTHY vs. MINNESOTA: Is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (34.2 ip, 30 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in eight career appearances, including three starts...is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (2 er in 7.1 ip) in one start at Target Field, 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in one appearance in the Metrodome and 0-0 with a 1.85 ERA (5 er in 24.1 ip) in six games, two starts, in his home ballparks...is 1-0 with a 2.42 ERA (6 er in 22.1 ip) in his three starts...is 1-0 with a 3.14 ERA (14.1 ip, 18 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 so) in two starts this year...the win came in a 5-3 A's victory at Minnesota April 10...shutout the Twins on six hits over the first seven innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the eighth inning...put runners on second and third with one out and was relieved by Blevins who allowed both inherited runners to score...then had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning loss in Oakland May 18...allowed a RBI single to Morneau in the first inning but the A's came back with two runs in the second...allowed two runs in the third on a two-run single by Plouffe...then retired 13 of the final 17 hitters he faced...the A's scored once in the sixth inning to tie the game and he was relieved by Balfour to start the eighth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (9-9, 3.58 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season...tossed 7.1 shutout innings in his last start, a 13-4 A's win over Tampa Bay last Wednesday (4 h, 4 bb, 6 so), to snap his four-game losing streak...posted a 6.35 ERA during the streak...is now 3-9 with a 4.65 ERA and .267 opponents batting average over his last 15 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start and needs one more win to become just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...is 2-3 with a 2.42 ERA in eight career starts against Seattle...has allowed one earned run or fewer in six of his eight starts...is 1-0 with a 1.53 ERA (17.2 ip, 16 h, 4 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 15 so) in three starts this year.

The A's bullpen has a 7.14 ERA (29.0 ip, 33 h, 26 r, 23 er, 20 bb, 33 so, 5 hr) over its past nine games...has a 4.23 ERA (72.1 ip, 66 h, 40 r, 34 er, 39 bb, 69 so, 7 hr) in 25 games in July after posting a 2.61 ERA in 26 games in June...has a 3.34 ERA for the season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.345) in the AL, the fourth lowest batting average (.235) and is tied for the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.316)...has the fewest wins (11) and is tied for the most losses (19)...has allowed the third fewest home runs (21)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (73).

- Has a 0.64 ERA (1 er in 14.0 ip) in 14 appearances at home compared to a 5.14 ERA (4 er in 7.0 ip) in his seven road outings.
- Has held opponents to a .162 batting average, including .121 (4 for 33) against right-handers and .195 (8 for 41) against lefties...opponents are batting .176 (3 for 17) with runners in scoring position.

WITH THE A'S: His start July 1 against Arizona was his first as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 38-20 record and a 3.47 ERA (220 er in 571.0 ip) in 102 games, 94 starts...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

FIRST START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona July 1 in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...the A's scored a run in the fourth and four more in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler to start the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas July 7...allowed runs in four of his five innings...Kinsler scored on a ground out in the first and Hamilton had a RBI single in the third...Kinsler added a RBI single in the fourth followed by a Hamilton sacrifice fly and Young hit a leadoff home run in the fifth...Holland shutout the A's on four hits.

HARDEN vs. SEATTLE: Is 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA (56.0 ip, 40 h, 15 r, 15 er, 22 bb, 57 so, 3 hr) in 12 career appearances, nine starts...is 5-0 with a 0.86 ERA (4 er in 42.0 ip) in nine career appearances, six starts, at Safeco Field, 0-2 with a 6.30 ERA (7 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA (4 er in 4.0 ip) in one start in Texas...his ERA at Safeco Field is the lowest among all pitchers with 25.0 or more innings pitched...is 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA (14 er in 52.0 ip) in his nine starting assignments...has faced the Mariners just once over the last four years and it came last year on September 29 in Texas...started and had a no decision in the Rangers 6-5 win...allowed a two-run home run to Smoak in the first inning and a two-run double to Gutierrez in the fifth...left trailing 4-1 but the Rangers scored once in the seventh, three times in the eighth and once in the ninth for the win.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and went 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts...struck out 12 batters in 7.2 innings...allowed a .115 (3 for 26) opponents batting average, including .083 (1 for 12) against left-handed hitters and .143 (2 for 14) against right-handers.

2010 RECAP: Was 5-5 with a 5.58 ERA in 20 games, 18 starts, with Texas in a season where he was bothered by injuries and control problems much of the season, which resulted in two stints on the disabled list...the ERA was the highest of his major league career...issued 62 walks in 92.0 innings, an average of 6.07 per nine innings...that was the highest ratio in the majors among pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...it was also sixth highest in team history and the highest since 1987 (Bobby Witt, 8.81; Mitch Williams, 7.79)...walked five or more batters in six of his 18 starts, including a season high six April 18 at New York and May 14 at Toronto...tied for 10th in the AL in hit batters (9)...went 2-0 in four starts with run support of four or more and is 42-0 in 57 such starts in his career.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
