A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail in the season series, 4-6...have lost four of six in Oakland and split a four-game series in Seattle in April...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 37-49 (.430) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 287-213 (.574) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .578)...are 160-92 in Oakland and 127-121 in Seattle...including 51-57 at Safeco

Hideki Matsui is batting a Major League leading .466 (27 for 58) since the All-Star Break and Cliff Pennington ranks third with a .418 average (23 for 55).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1976** the A's steal a club record 12 bases in an 8-7, 12 inning loss in game one of a doubleheader at Minnesota...in that game, Craig Kusick's eighth inning homer off Vida Blue snaps Blue's club record string of 140.2 innings without a home run...in **1988** Jose Canseco hits his 100th career home run off Melido Perez in the A's 10-2 win at Chicago...in **1999** Miguel Tejada, Eric Chavez, Jason Giambi and John Jaha all homer in the fourth inning of the A's 10-6 win over Tampa Bay...the four home runs in an inning ties the Oakland record...in **2009** Rickey Henderson become the fifth player in Athletics history to have his uniform retired when the A's retire #24.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from Minnesota after taking three of four from Tampa Bay...that marks just the third time this year the A's have won back-to-back series...have not won three straight series since September 3-12 of last year...are now 10-6 (.626) since the All-Star Break, which is tied with Toronto for the second best record in the American League (Boston, 11-5)...went 39-53 (.424) before the break, which was the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...went 13-13 in July marking the first time the A's did not have a losing record in a month since last July when they went 14-10...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 27-39 (.409) since then...have spent each of the last nine days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 43 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

OFFENSE: The A's have collected at least eight hits in each of the 16 games since the All-Star Break to set an Oakland record for consecutive games with eight or more hits (previous 15, September 12-27, 1980)...it is the longest streak by an Athletics team since the 1944 Philadelphia A's had a 21-game streak from August 14-September 3...are batting a **Major League leading** .316 (175 for 553) since the break...also lead the majors in slugging percentage (.479) and on-base percentage (.388) since the break, rank second in fewest strikeouts (90), third in runs scored (100) and doubles (43), fourth in walks (65) and tied for fourth in triples (4)...are now batting .246 for the season, which is the highest the A's average has been outside the first five games of the season...have the second fewest runs scored (415) in the American League, the second lowest slugging percentage (.359) and the third lowest batting average (.246) and on-base percentage (.313)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Cleveland and Los Angeles for the most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's had 14 strikeouts yesterday, their fourth game of 14 or more strikeouts this year...those are the most games of 14 or more strikeouts in one season in Oakland history...have 764 strikeouts for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have compiled a 6.18 ERA (70 er in 102.0 ip) and .296 (122 for 411) opponents batting average over the last 12 games but are 7-5 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...have a 3.41 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.361) and have issued the second most walks (365)...A's starting pitchers are 7-8 with a 5.26 ERA (67 er in 114.2 ip) over the last 20 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.45 ERA (254 er in 662.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.35).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 79 games, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the record is 91 from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 63 home runs for the season, which is the **fewest in the American League** and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 95 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 80 home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high four bases yesterday...three of the steals were of third base, their most in a game since April 17, 1993 at Milwaukee when they also had three steals of third...the A's are now 74 for 108 (68.5%) in stolen base attempts for the season, which is the third lowest percentage in the American League...the pitching staff has 16 pickoffs, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (18).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 14 errors in 16 games since the All-Star Break...have 86 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...the errors have led to 59 unearned runs, which is tied with Houston for the most in the majors...last year, had just 60 unearned runs for the entire season...are third in the American League in double plays (110).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a nine-game, 11-day road trip to Seattle (three games), Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (three games) tonight...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Detroit (1-1) and New York (1-2) and are now 7-26 (.212) over their last 33 road games...are 0-8-3 over the last 11 road series and the 11 consecutive road series without winning a series is the A's longest such stretch since April 21-August 3, 1986 when they went 0-13-2 over a 15-series stretch...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won nine of the last 12 home games...for the season, the A's are 31-24 (.564) at home compared to 18-35 (.339) on the road...are tied for the fourth best home record in the American League but have the second worst road record...the A's are batting .260 (470 for 1810) with 237 runs scored in 55 home games (4.31 per game) and .232 (421 for 1818) with 178 runs scored in 53 games on the road (3.36 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The total air mileage on this road trip to Seattle, Tampa Bay and Toronto is 6,544 (source: travelmath.com)...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have played in all domes on a threecity road trip...the A's have a 3-4 record in domes this year...this trip also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 29 games from August 1 to September 1 on the road...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from September 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles and Kansas City for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Michael Wuertz on the disabled list Saturday, the 12th time they have used the DL this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they have fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).



FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season, which ties him for the American League lead...the A's are 9-14 (.391) in his starting assignments this vear and are 45-40 (.529) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 13 of his 23 starts, allowed one run or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed 7.1 shutout innings in his last start to snap his four-game losing streak...posted a 6.35 ERA during the streak...is now 3-9 with a 4.65 ERA (47 er in 91.0 ip) and .267 (90 for 337) opponents batting average over his last 15 starts after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in stolen bases allowed (23), ranks second in most walks (62), tied for second in wild pitches (11) and tied for sixth in losses (9)...the 11 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when three pitchers had at least 11 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14, Haynes 11).

WINS: Picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start...won 10 games as a rookie in 2009 and 18 games last year...with one more win, he will become just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...is 27-16 with a 3.12 ERA (116 er in 335.0 ip) and .230 (279 for 1215) opponents batting average in 52 starts since May 1, 2010...the wins are fifth most in the majors over that span...is 37-30 (.553) in his career and the wins are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

RUN SUPPORT: Received 13 runs of support in his last start after receiving a total of 13 runs combined over his previous 11 starts (64.2 ip, 1.81 RSA)...has received run support of three runs or fewer in 19 of his 23 starts this year.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .153 (9 for 59) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is second lowest in the American League...has allowed a .224 (26 for 114) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .304 (21 for 69) over his last 13 starts (since May 25)

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-3 with a 2.06 ERA (12 er in 52.1 ip) in eight starts against American League West competition this year and 6-6 with a 4.43 ERA (45 er in 91.1 ip) in 15 starts against everyone else...now has a 14-9 record and a 2.30 ERA (47 er in 184.0 ip) in 29 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 23-21 with a 4.49 ERA (167 er in 334.2 ip) in 56 starts against everyone else.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 with a 2.52 ERA (22 er in 78.2 ip) in 12 starts at home and 4-4 with a 4.87 ERA (35 er in 64.2 ip) in 11 starts on the road...ranks eighth in the American League in home ERA...is now 23-15 with a 3.06 ERA (98 er in 288.1 ip) in 45 career starts in Oakland and 14-15 with a 4.53 ERA (116 er in 230.1 ip) in 40 starts on the road.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day April 1 in Oakland...became the A's sixth different Opening Day starter in the last six years...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...improved to 6-0 in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9** but was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss ended a career-high seven-game winning streak as he also won his final start of 2010...lost his careerhigh fifth consecutive decision in the A's 7-4 loss to Kansas City June 14 in Oakland...tossed 7.2 innings in a 2-0 loss at Texas July 10 to go over the 500 innings pitched mark for his career...tossed a career-high 119 pitches in a 4-2 loss to Los Angeles in the first game of the doubleheader on **July 16** in Oakland...allowed a career high 10 runs in a career low 2.0 innings in the A's 17-7 loss at New York **July 22**...it was the 22^{nd} time in Oakland history a pitcher allowed 10 runs, the sixth time against the Yankees...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to allow 10 runs with 2.0 innings pitched or fewer.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-4 win over Tampa Bay last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed 7.1 scoreless innings, his second scoreless outing of the season...surrendered four hits and four walks and allowed just three runners to advance into scoring position.

CAHILL vs. SEATTLE: Is 2-3 with a 2.42 ERA (48.1 ip, 44 h, 15 r, 13 er, 17 bb, 31 so, 4 hr) in eight career starts...has allowed one earned run or fewer in six of his eight starts...is 2-1 with a 3.04 ERA (8 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts in Seattle and 0-2 with a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland...is 1-0 with a 1.53 ERA (17.2 ip, 16 h, 4 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 15 so) in three starts this year...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day April 1 in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he walked Cust with the bases loaded in the third inning...was relieved by Blevins with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second...Blevins got the final out but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was the first time in his 63 career starts the A's bullpen blew a save...then picked up the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle April 23...allowed a run in the second on a Wilson RBI single but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-2, 10-inning loss in Oakland July 5...allowed an unearned run in the second inning when Ackley singled, stole second, went to third on a Suzuki error and scored on a Peguero sacrifice fly...also allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the seventh and left trailing 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the eighth and ninth innings to get him off the hook.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Rich Harden (2-1, 4.30 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder and was reinstated July 1...opponents are 4 for 27 (.148) with three walks (.233 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .171 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .231 the second time and .296 after that...had a no decision in his last start, a 10-8 A's loss to Tampa Bay last Thursday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 12 career appearances, nine starts, against Seattle...is 5-0 with a 0.86 ERA in nine career appearances, six starts, at Safeco Field...his ERA at Safeco Field is the lowest among all pitchers with 25.0 or more innings pitched...has faced the Mariners just once over the last four years and it came last year on September 29 in Texas (4.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 2 so)

11-19, 3.30 ERA (305.0 ip, 267 h, 134 r, 112 er, 133 bb, 274 so, 21 hr) Save/Save Opportunities: 27/38 (71.1%) The A's bullpen has a 6.47 ERA (32.0 ip, 36 h, 26 r, 23 er, 23 bb, 38 so, 5 hr) over its past 10 games after compiling a 1.80 ERA over its previous Save/Save Opportunities: 27/38 (71.1%) 28 contests...now has a 3.30 ERA for the season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...also has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.344) and third fewest home runs (21)...has the fewest wins (11) and is tied for the most losses (19)...have allowed just two home runs to first batters faced, which is fewest in the AL, and have struck out 74, which is second most.

FIRST START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona July 1in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...the A's scored a run in the fourth and four more in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler to start the seventh.



Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.
