ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series at Seattle and have lost five of the last seven games...are 10-9 (.526) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...the A's record at the break was third worst in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...are 49-62 for the season and the 13 games under .500 are one short of the season low of 14 (39-53 on July 10 and 40-54 on July 16)...went 13-13 in July marking the first time the A's did not have a losing record in a month since last July when they went 14-10...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 27-42 (.391) since then...have spent each of the last 13 days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 47 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...the A's have a 21-16 (.568) record on the weekend (10-9 on Saturday, 11-7 on Sunday) compared to 28-46 (.378) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this nine-game, 11-day road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (three games)...went 2-3 on the last road trip and are 7-29 (.194) over the last 36 road games...are 0-9-3 over the last 12 road series and the 12 consecutive road series without winning a series matches the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since April 21-August 3, 1986 when they went 0-13-2 over a 15-series stretch...the record is 21 straight from September 11, 1978-July 26, 1979 (0-19-2)...are now 18-38 (.321) on the road for the season, which is the second worst mark in the American League (Baltimore, 17-37)...are 31-24 (.564) at home, which is the fifth best home record in the AL...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won nine of the last 12 home games...the A's are batting .260 (470 for 1810) with 237 runs scored in 55 home games (4.31 per game) and .232 (446 for 1922) with 188 runs scored in 56 games on the road (3.36 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting a **Major League leading** .304 (200 for 657) since the All-Star Break...also lead the majors in on-base percentage (.374), rank second in slugging (.466), tied for second in doubles (50), third in runs scored (110), fourth in fewest strikeouts (112) and fifth in walks (73)...are now batting .245 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have the second fewest runs scored (425), the second lowest slugging percentage (.360) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.313)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Cleveland and Los Angeles for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 75 of 109 (68.8%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.21 ERA (89 er in 129.0 ip) and .304 (161 for 529) opponents batting average over the last 15 games and are 7-8 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...now have a 3.50 ERA overall, which is the highest it has been outside the first six games of the season...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.363), rank second in pickoffs (17), third in ERA and fourth in strikeouts (790)...however, have issued the third most walks (375).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-10 with a 5.79 ERA (84 er in 130.2 ip) over the last 23 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.60 ERA (271 er in 678.1 ip) for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.373) and second fewest home runs allowed (60) but have issued the second most walks (241).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 82 games, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the record is 91 from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 66 home runs for the season, which is tied with Seattle for the **fewest in the American League** and tied for third fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 96 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 81 home runs, which is the **fewest in the AL** and fifth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 17 errors in 19 games since the All-Star Break...have 89 errors overall, which is second most in the American League and third most in the majors...16 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which leads the majors and are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club had 17...the errors have led to 59 unearned runs, which is tied with Houston for the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (111).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The total air mileage on this road trip to Seattle, Tampa Bay and Toronto is 6,544 (source: travelmath.com)...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have played in all domes on a three-city road trip...the A's have a 3-7 (.300) record in domes this year...this trip also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 29 games on the road from August 1 to September 1...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from September 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League (Texas, 12-18)...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are tied with Los Angeles and Kansas City for the most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 12 times this year and currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).

A's vs. RAYS

The A's lead the season series 3-1 after winning three of four in Oakland last week...have now won seven of the last 10 games from the Rays...lost the season series last year, 4-5...went 4-3 in Oakland but lost both games in Tampa Bay...the A's have now lost the season series in three of the previous four years and are 20-22 against the Rays since 2007...all-time, the A's are 79-47 (.627) against Tampa Bay...that is the second best record against the Rays by any American League team (New York 146-83, .638)...are 46-19 in Oakland and 33-28 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has a 14.2-inning scoreless streak, which matches his career high set with Tampa Bay in 2008.

Hideki Matsui has a 12-game hitting streak (25 for 47, .532)...is batting a Major League leading .478 (33 for 69) since the All-Star Break to up his average 56 points to a season-high .265.

Cliff Pennington is batting .404 (23 for 57) since the All-Star Break, which ranks fourth in the majors.

Josh Willingham hit his team-leading 16th home run of the season Wednesday, matching the A's team leader from last year (Kouzmanoff).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz wins his 20th game...in **1992** Jose Canseco walks in his first two at bats against the Texas Rangers after tying a club record with five walks the day before to set an Oakland record with seven consecutive walks...in **2008** Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings at Toronto to extend his scoreless streak to 34.0 innings to break the Oakland record for consecutive scoreless innings by a reliever...the streak, which broke Paul Lindblad's record of 32.1 set in 1975, reached 39 innings before coming to an end.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th appearance and 12th start of the season...the A's are 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings six times, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

BRIEFLY: Is 1-1 with a 7.31 ERA (13 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19...began the season with the River Cats and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed just five earned runs over the first three innings of a game for a 1.35 ERA (33.1 ip) and .182 (22 for 121) opponents batting average...has a 5.51 ERA (20 er in 32.2 ip) and .271 (36 for 133) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .198 (38 for 192) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup and .333 (20 for 60) after that...opponents are hitting .205 (9 for 44) with runners in scoring position.

RUN SUPPORT: Received eight runs of support in his last start after receiving a combined 10 runs of support over his previous eight starts (45.2 ip, 1.97 RSA)...has received no run support in four of his 11 starts.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 4-4 with a 3.43 ERA (24 er in 63.0 ip) in 10 starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...made his two relief appearances on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3rd and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4th.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high four games in a 2-0 win over Seattle July 6...posted a 2.43 ERA and .200 opponents during the losing streak, which spanned six games, including five starts.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July, 1968.

2011 START-BY-START: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles **May 24**...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...just three runners advanced into scoring position...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore **May 29** in Oakland...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore **June 7**...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-4 loss at Chicago **June 12**...walked a career-high four batters in 6.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco **June 18** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the fifth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Philadelphia **June 24**...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...Worley, Herndon, Perez and Stutes combined to shutout the A's on two hits...extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida **June 29** in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings...Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle **July 6** in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss **July 19** at Detroit...allowed career highs in runs (7), earned runs (6) and hits (9) and matched his high in home runs (2)...tossed just 4.2 innings, matching his fewest as a starter...blanked the Tigers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career high 12.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Tampa Bay **July 25** in Oakland...matched his career high by walking four batters and allowing two home runs...did not strike out a batter for the first time in a starting assignment.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 win over Minnesota last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cuddyer in the first inning but the A's came back with a run in the bottom of the first...yielded a RBI single to Young in the second but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second to take the lead for good...retired 11 of the 12 batters he faced over innings three through six...was relieved by Ziegler with runners on first and second and one out in the seventh.

MOSCOSO vs. TAMPA BAY: Made his only career appearance this year July 25 in Oakland, a start and no decision in the A's 7-5 win...matched his career high by walking four batters and allowing two home runs...did not strike out a batter for the first time in a starting assignment...allowed a solo home run to Zobrist in the first inning but the A's scored twice in the second...allowed a RBI double to Jennings in the third to tie the game and the Rays scored two more runs in the fifth on a RBI fielders choice and an Upton RBI triple...surrendered a lead off home run to Shoppach in the sixth and was relieved by Wuertz with the A's trailing 5-2...Oakland scored once in the bottom of the sixth, three times in the seventh and once in the eighth for the win.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA (46.1 ip, 41 h, 22 r, 20 er, 16 bb, 52 so) and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (4-5, 3.58 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season, his seventh since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...is 3-0 with a 3.70 ERA in four starts since the All-Star Break and is tied for the American League lead in wins since the break...the three-game winning streak is one short of his career high of four...went 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...has walked just 16 batters in 100.2 innings, an average of 1.43 per nine innings...based on a minimum of 70 innings, that is the third lowest mark in the AL...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-3 A's win over Minnesota last Sunday in Oakland...struck out a career high nine (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb)...is 2-2 with a 3.57 ERA in eight career games, seven starts, against Tampa Bay...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's win in Oakland July 26 (8.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

The A's bullpen has a 5.63 ERA (40.0 ip, 45 h, 28 r, 25 er, 23 bb, 46 so, 5 hr) over its past 13 games after compiling a 1.80 ERA over its previous 28 contests...now has a 3.28 ERA for the season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...also has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.343), the second fewest home runs (21) and the third lowest opponents batting average (.237)...has the fewest wins (11) and second most losses (19)...has allowed just two home runs to first batters faced, which is the fewest in the AL, and has struck out 76, which is second most.

- Has a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in seven outings since the All-Star Break and has converted all four of his save opportunities...is now a perfect 27 for 27 in save opportunities after the All-Star Break in his career.
- Has held opponents to a .167 batting average, including .114 (4 for 35) against right-handers and .209 (9 for 43) against lefties...opponents are batting .167 (3 for 18) with runners in scoring position.
- Recorded the save in his only outing against Tampa Bay July 25 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...has converted all three of his save opportunities in eight career outings against the Rays (2 er in 10.2 ip, 1.69 ERA).
- Has a 0.64 ERA (1 er in 15.0 ip) in 15 appearances at home compared to a 5.14 ERA (4 er in 7.0 ip) in his seven road outings.
- Has recorded 63 saves in his career, which ranks sixth in Oakland history...is 12 saves away from tying Jason Isringhausen for fifth most.
- Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Extended his scoreless streak to 14.2 innings Sunday, which matches his career high (June 8-July 9, 2008)...has allowed just one run over his last 20 games since May 28 (20.1 ip, 0.44 ERA) after posting a 3.18 ERA over his first 23 contests.
- Has held opponents to a .187 batting average (28 for 150)...the average includes a .160 (12 for 75) mark against left-handers and .143 (4 for 28) with runners in scoring position.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win over Minnesota last Sunday in Oakland...struck out a career-high nine batters, topping his previous high of eight (twice, last: September 27, 2006 at Cleveland)...allowed two runs in the first inning when Revere tripled and scored on a ground out and Valencia singled to drive in Cuddyer...also allowed a two-out solo home run to Thome in the third but the A's scored six time in the bottom of the inning...blanked the Twins on two hits over his final three innings.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season, which **ties him for the American League lead...** the A's are 9-15 (.375) in his starting assignments this year and are 45-41 (.523) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 13 of his 24 starts, allowed one run or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 1-5 with a 6.13 ERA (27 er in 39.2 ip) and .310 (49 for 158) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...has tossed fewer than five innings in four of those starts.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Improved to 6-0 in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas **May 9** but was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 15** in Oakland...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss ended a career-high seven-game winning streak as he also won his final start of 2010...lost his career-high fifth consecutive decision in the A's 7-4 loss to Kansas City **June 14** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 119 pitches in a 4-2 loss to Los Angeles in the first game of the doubleheader on **July 16** in Oakland...allowed a career high 10 runs in a career low 2.0 innings in the A's 17-7 loss at New York **July 22**...it was the 22nd time in Oakland history a pitcher allowed 10 runs, the sixth time against the Yankees...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to allow 10 runs with 2.0 innings pitched or fewer.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Seattle on Monday...allowed seven runs on a career-high tying 12 hits (also September 26, 2010 vs. Texas) in just 4.0 innings...yielded five runs in the second inning on a Gutierrez RBI double, a Suzuki fielders choice and an Ackely three-run triple...also allowed a RBI single to Oliva in the fourth and was relieved by Norberto after surrendering a leadoff single to Smoak in the fifth...Norberto allowed Smoak to score on a wild pitch.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.
