A's vs. RAYS

The A's lead the season series, 3-2...are 0-1 in Tampa Bay following last night's loss and 3-1 in Oakland...have now won seven of the last 11 games from the Rays...lost the season series last year, 4-5...went 4-3 in Oakland but lost both games in Tampa Bay...the A's have now lost the season series in three of the previous four years and are 20-23 against the Rays since 2007...litime, the A's are 79-48 (.622) against Tampa Bay...that is tied for the second best record against the Rays by any American League team...are 46-19 in Oakland and 33-29 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour had his 14.2-inning scoreless streak snapped last night, which had matched his career high set with Tampa Bay in 2008.

Brian Fuentes made the 600th appearance of his career Monday night to become the 16th active pitcher with 600 games pitched (now has 602).

Hideki Matsui has a 13-game hitting streak (27 for 51, .529)...is batting a Major League leading .479 (35 for 73) since the All-Star Break to up his average 59 points to a season-high .268.

Cliff Pennington is batting .393 (24 for 61) since the All-Star Break, which ranks sixth in the majors.

Josh Willingham hit his teamleading 16th home run of the season Wednesday, matching the A's team leader from last year (Kouzmanoff).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1933 Pinky Higgins hits for the cycle in the A's 12-8 win over the Washington Senators...in 2001 the A's defeat the Tigers 6-3 to complete a four-game sweep of Detroit, their first four-game sweep of the Tigers since July 1-3, 1955.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four in a row and six of the last eight games...are 10-10 (.500) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...the A's record at the break was third worst in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...are 49-63 for the season and the 14 games under .500 match the season low (39-53 on July 10 and 40-54 on July 16)...went 13-13 in July marking the first time the A's did not have a losing record in a month since last July when they went 14-10...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 27-43 (.386) since then...have spent each of the last 14 days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 48 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...the A's have a 21-16 (.568) record on the weekend (10-9 on Saturday, 11-7 on Sunday) compared to 28-47 (.373) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-4 on this nine-game, 11-day road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (0-1) and Toronto (three games)...went 2-3 on the last road trip and are 7-30 (.189) over the last 37 road games...are 0-9-3 over the last 12 road series and the 12 consecutive road series without winning a series matches the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since April 21-August 3, 1986 when they went 0-13-2 over a 15-series stretch...the record is 21 straight from September 11, 1978-July 26, 1979 (0-19-2)...are now 18-39 (.316) on the road for the season, which is the second worst mark in the majors (Baltimore, 17-37)...are 31-24 (.564) at home, which is tied for the fifth best home record in the American League...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won nine of the last 12 home games...the A's are batting .260 (470 for 1810) with 237 runs scored in 55 home games (4.31 per game) and .232 (453 for 1955) with 192 runs scored in 57 games on the road (3.37 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting a **Major League leading** .300 (207 for 690) since the All-Star Break...also lead the majors in on-base percentage (.368), are tied for second in slugging (.467), rank third in doubles (51) and runs scored (114), fifth in fewest strikeouts (120) and tied for fifth in walks (74)...are now batting .245 for the season, which is tied for second lowest in the American League...have the second fewest runs scored (429), the second lowest slugging percentage (.361) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.312)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Cleveland and Los Angeles for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 76 of 111 (68.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.18 ERA (94 er in 137.0 ip) and .309 (175 for 567) opponents batting average over the last 16 games and are 7-9 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...now have a 3.51 ERA overall, which is the highest it has been outside the first six games of the season...rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.365) and pickoffs (17), third in ERA and fourth in strikeouts (795)...however, have issued the third most walks (380).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-12 with a 5.85 ERA (88 er in 135.1 ip) over the last 24 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.62 ERA (275 er in 683.0 ip) for the season, which is tied for fourth lowest in the AL...have the second fewest home runs allowed (60) and the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.373) but have issued the second most walks (244).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 83 games, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the record is 91 from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 68 home runs for the season, which is the second fewest in the American League and fourth fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 98 home runs and the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 81 home runs, which is the **fewest in the AL** and fifth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 18 errors in 20 games since the All-Star Break...have 90 errors overall, which is second most in the American League and third most in the majors...17 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which leads the majors and are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the errors have led to 62 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (112).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The total air mileage on this road trip to Seattle, Tampa Bay and Toronto is 6,544 (source: travelmath.com)...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have played in all domes on a three-city road trip...the A's have a 3-8 (.273) record in domes this year...this trip also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 29 games on the road from August 1 to September 1...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from September 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are third most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 12 times this year and currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season, his seventh since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 6-9 (.400) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 33-38 (.465) in his 71 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 12 of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer all 15 times.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 3.70 ERA (10 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts since the All-Star Break...is tied for first in the American League in wins since the break...the three-game winning streak is one short of his career high of four from May 24-September 8, 2009...went 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has walked just 16 batters in 100.2 innings, an average of 1.43 per nine innings...based on a minimum of 70 innings, that is the third lowest mark in the American League...with 69 strikeouts, his ratio of 4.31 strikeouts per walk is fourth best...has allowed just five home runs for an average of 0.45 innings, which is the sixth lowest mark.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 3-1 with a 3.89 ERA (16 er in 37.0 ip) in six starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .218 (27 for 124) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .303 (79 for 261) after that...has surrendered five home runs, all solo shots...four have been hit by left-handed hitters.

CAREER BESTS: Struck out a career high nine batters in his last start to bring his season total to 69...that matches his career high from 2006...has 100.2 innings pitched, which is one inning short of his career high of 101.2 in 2007...already has a career high two complete games.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 2-3 with a 2.39 ERA (13 er in 49.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more and 2-2 with a 4.70 ERA (27 er in 51.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is tied for second most among American League pitcher...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high five games in a 5-3 victory over Los Angeles July 15...it was his first win since April 10...the previous longest losing streak of his career was four from June 25 to September 10, 2006...posted a 3.72 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned seven starts.

2011 START-BY-START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto April 5...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle)...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota *April 10*...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss April 15 against Detroit in Oakland...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle April 21...the complete game was his second of his career (also May 24, 2009 at Houston)...was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles April 26...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Texas *May 2* in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City **May 7...**both of his complete games have been losses...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 13...**allowed all four of the runs in the second inning...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning loss to Minnesota May 18...retired 13 of the final 17 hitters he faced and left trailing 3-2...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Seattle July 4 in Oakland...faced the minimum over the first five innings thanks to two double plays...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Texas *July 9*...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning to tie the game...left with a 6-5 lead but Bailey allowed a two-run home run to Hamilton in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save and loss...snapped his losing streak at five games in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles *July 15* in Oakland...blanked the Angels on three hits over the first four innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Detroit *July 20*...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed back-to-back singles to start the bottom of the sixth and was relieved by Devine...Devine allowed both of those runs to score for the blown save and a run of his own...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Tampa Bay July 26...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a one-out solo home run to Zobrist in the eighth inning.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win over Minnesota last Sunday in Oakland...struck out a career-high nine batters, topping his previous high of eight (twice, last: September 27, 2006 at Cleveland)...allowed two runs in the first inning when Revere tripled and scored on a ground out and Valencia singled to drive in Cuddyer...also allowed a two-out solo home run to Thome in the third but the A's scored six time in the bottom of the inning...blanked the Twins on two hits over his final three innings.

McCARTHY vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 2-2 with a 3.57 ERA (40.1 ip, 44 h, 21 r, 16 er, 15 bb, 29 so, 5 hr) in eight career games, seven starts...is 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (6 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts at Tropicana Field and 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (10 er in 30.1 ip) in six games in his home ballparks...is 2-1 with a 3.20 ERA (14 er in 39.1 ip) in his seven starts...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's win in Oakland July 26...blanked the Rays on five hits and two walks over the first seven innings and did not allow a runner past second base...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a one-out solo home run to Zobrist in the eighth inning.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (9-10, 3.91 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season...is 1-5 with a 6.13 ERA (27 er in 39.2 ip) and .310 (49 for 158) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...has tossed fewer than five innings in four of those starts...is now 3-10 with a 5.12 ERA (54 er in 95.0 ip) and .283 (102 for 361) opponents batting average over his last 16 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 5-5 with a 2.52 ERA (22 er in 78.2 ip) and .231 (66 for 286) opponents batting average in 12 starts at home and 4-5 with a 5.50 ERA (42 er in 68.2 ip) and .284 (77 for 271) in 12 starts on the road...is 2-2 with a 5.81 ERA (20 er in 31.0 ip) in five starts against American League East teams this year and 7-8 with a 3.40 ERA in 19 starts against everyone else...is 2-1 with a 5.00 ERA (18.0 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 10 er, 8 bb, 13 so, 4 hr) in three career starts against Tampa Bay, all in Oakland.

The A's bullpen has a 5.40 ERA (43.1 ip, 53 h, 32 r, 26 er, 25 bb, 48 so, 5 hr) over its past 14 games after compiling a 1.80 ERA over its previous 28 contests...now has a 3.27 ERA for the season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...also ranks second in opponents slugging percentage (.347) and fewest home runs (21)...has the fewest wins (11) and second most losses (19)...has allowed just two home runs to first batters faced, which is the fewest in the AL, and has struck out 76, which is second most.

- Has held opponents to a .175 batting average, including .139 (5 for 36) against right-handers and .205 (9 for 44) against lefties...opponents are batting .200 (4 for 20) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a save in two outings against Tampa Bay this year (1.1 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...has converted all three of his save opportunities in nine career outings against the Rays (2 er in 11.0 ip, 1.64 ERA).

- Had his 14.2-inning scoreless streak snapped last night, which had matched his career high (June 8-July 9, 2008)...has allowed just two runs over his last 21 games since May 28 (21.0 ip, 0.86 ERA) after posting a 3.18 ERA over his first 23 contests
