A's vs. RAYS

The A's lead the season series, 4-2...are 1-1 in Tampa Bay following last night's win and 3-1 in Oakland...have now won eight of the last 12 games from the Rays...lost the season series last year, 4-5...went 4-3 in Oakland but lost both games in Tampa Bay...the A's have lost the season series in three of the previous four years and are 21-23 against the Rays since 2007...all-time, the A's are 80-48 (.625) against Tampa Bay...that is the second best record against the Rays by any American League team...are 46-19 in Oakland and 34-29 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp stole a career-high four bases last night—one shy of the Oakland mark (5, Campaneris and Henderson)—and now leads the American League with 37 stolen bases.

Brian Fuentes made the 600th appearance of his career Monday night to become the 16th active pitcher with 600 games pitched.

Hideki Matsui has a 14-game hitting streak (28 for 55, .509)...is batting a Major League-leading .468 (36 for 77) since the All-Star Break to inflate his average 59 points to a season-high .268.

Josh Willingham hit his teamleading 16th home run Wednesday, matching the A's team leader from last year (Kouzmanoff).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1968, Joe Keough homers in his first major league at bat off New York's Lindy McDaniel at Yankee Stadium...in 1971, Vida Blue becomes Oakland's first 20-game winner when he shuts out the White Sox 1-0 on a five hitter at the Coliseum...he would go on to win 24 games and the American League MVP and Cy Young awards.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Applied the brakes to a four-game losing streak last night....however, have lost six of the last nine games...are 11-10 (.500) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...the A's record at the break was third worst in the AL and fifth worst in the majors..... went 13-13 in July, marking the first time the A's did not have a losing record in a month since last July when they went 14-10...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 28-43 (.394) since then...have spent each of the last 15 days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 49 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...thee A's have a 22-16 (.579) record on the weekend (11-9 on Saturday, 11-7 on Sunday) compared to 28-47 (.373) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this nine-game, 11-day road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (1-1) and Toronto (three games)...went 2-3 on the last road trip and are 8-30 (.211) over the last 38 road games...are 0-9-3 over the last 12 road series and the 12 consecutive road series without winning a series matches the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since April 21-Aug. 3, 1986 when they went 0-13-2 over a 15-series stretch...the record is 21 straight from Sept. 11, 1978-July 26, 1979 (0-19-2)...are now 19-39 (.328) on the road for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League (Baltimore, 17-37) and third worst mark in the majors...are 31-24 (.564) at home, which is tied for the fifth best home record in the American League...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won nine of the last 12 home games...the A's are batting .260 (470 for 1810) with 237 runs scored in 55 home games (4.31 per game) and .233 (463 for 1988) with 200 runs scored in 58 games on the road (3.45 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting a **Major League-leading** .300 (217 for 723) since the All-Star Break...also lead the majors in on-base percentage (.369) and slugging (.470), rank third in doubles (53) and runs scored (122), and fifth in fewest strikeouts (130) and most walks (80)...are now batting .246 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have the second fewest runs scored (437), the second lowest slugging percentage (.362) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.313)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied with Tampa Bay, Cleveland and Los Angeles for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 83 of 118 (70.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL, yet stole seven bags in seven attempts last night—the most steals by an Oakland team in 22 years (8 at Minnesota, July 29, 1989).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.79 ERA (94 er in 146.0 ip) and .301 (180 for 598) opponents batting average over the last 17 games and are 8-9 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...now have a 3.48 ERA overall, second best in the American League...rank first in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.363), second in pickoffs (17), and fourth in strikeouts (800)...however, have issued 382 walks, tied for second most in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-12 with a 5.53 ERA (88 er in 143.1 ip) over the last 25 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.58 ERA (275 er in 691.0 ip) for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...have the second fewest home runs allowed (60) and the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.371) but have issued the second most walks (244).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 84 games, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the record is 91 from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 70 home runs for the season, which is the second fewest in the American League and fourth fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 100 home runs...the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 81 home runs, which is the **fewest in the AL** and fourth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 18 errors in 21 games since the All-Star Break...have 90 errors overall, which is second most in the American League and third most in the majors...17 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which leads the majors and are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the errors have led to 62 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (113).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The total air mileage on this road trip to Seattle, Tampa Bay and Toronto is 6,544 (source: travelmath.com)...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have played in all domes on a three-city road trip...the A's have a 4-8 (.333) record in domes this year...this trip also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 29 games on the road from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from Sept. 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games, which is the second worst record in the AL...the 16 extra inning games are third most in the AL...are 13-27 (.325) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 12-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 12 times this year and currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season, which ties him for the American League lead...the A's are 9-15 (.375) in his starting assignments this year and are 45-41 (.523) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 13 of his 24 starts, allowed one run or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 1-5 with a 6.13 ERA (27 er in 39.2 ip) and .310 (49 for 158) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...has tossed fewer than five innings in four of those starts.

6-0 THEN 3-10: Is 3-10 with a 5.12 ERA (54 er in 95.0 ip) and .283 (102 for 361) opponents batting average over his last 16 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but is tied for the Major League lead in losses since May 15 (Kuroda, LAD and Happ, HOU).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for first for most walks (64) in the American

League, ranks second in stolen bases allowed (23), third in wild pitches (11) and tied for fifth in losses (10)...the 11 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when three pitchers had at least 11 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14, Haynes 11).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 with a 2.52 ERA (22 er in 78.2 ip) and .231 (66 for 286) opponents batting average in 12 starts at home and 4-5 with a 5.50 ERA (42 er in 68.2 ip) and .284 (77 for 271) in 12 starts on the road...has the ninth lowest home ERA in the American League but the second highest road ERA...is now 23-15 with a 3.06 ERA (98 er in 288.1 ip) in 45 career starts in Oakland and 14-16 with a 4.72 ERA (123 er in 234.1 ip) in 41 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .177 (11 for 62) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is fifth lowest in the American League...has allowed a .246 (32 for 130) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .318 (27 for 85) over his last 14 starts (since May 25).

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 2-2 with a 5.81 ERA (20 er in 31.0 ip) in five starts against American League East teams this year and 7-8 with a 3.40 ERA in 19 starts against everyone else...is now 7-10 with a 6.10 ERA (75 er in 110.2 ip) in 19 career starts against the East compared to 30-21 with a 3.19 ERA in 67 starts against everyone else.

WINS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 27...won 10 games as a rookie in 2009 and 18 games last year...with one more win, he will become just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...has 27 wins over the last two years, which are tied for fifth in the American League...has 37 career wins, which are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or fewer in 15 of his last 16 starts and his run support average over that span is 3.03 (32 rs in 95.0 ip)...13 of those 32 runs of support came in one start, July 27 against Tampa Bay...has received run support of three runs or fewer in 20 of his 24 starts this year and his season RSA is 3.97 (65 rs in 147.1 ip).

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Improved to 6-0 in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas *May 9* but was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago *May 15* in

Oakland...is the first A's pitcher to start the season 6-0 since Jim Corsi went 6-0 in 1996...is the first A's starting pitcher to begin the season 6-0 since Dave Stewart in 1990...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletics pitcher to go 6-0 or better coupled with a sub-2.00 ERA in his first eight starts of a season since Sam Gray went 8-0 with a 1.43 ERA in his first eight starts in 1925...the loss ended a career-high seven-game winning streak as he also won his final start of 2010...lost his career-high fifth consecutive decision in the A's 7-4 loss to Kansas City *June 14* in Oakland...tossed a career-high 119 pitches in a 4-2 loss to Los Angeles in the first game of the doubleheader on *July 16* in Oakland...allowed a career high 10 runs in a career low 2.0 innings in the A's 17-7 loss at New York *July 22*...it was the 22nd time in Oakland history a pitcher allowed 10 runs, the sixth time against the Yankees...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to allow 10 runs with 2.0 innings pitched or fewer.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Seattle on Monday...allowed seven runs on a career-high tying 12 hits (also September 26, 2010 vs. Texas) in just 4.0 innings...yielded five runs in the second inning on a Gutierrez RBI double, a Suzuki fielders choice and an Ackely three-run triple...also allowed a RBI single to Oliva in the fourth and was relieved by Norberto after surrendering a leadoff single to Smoak in the fifth...Norberto allowed Smoak to score on a wild pitch.

CAHILL vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 2-1 with a 5.00 ERA (18.0 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 10 er, 8 bb, 13 so, 4 hr) in three career starts, all in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 13-4 A's win July 27...tossed 7.1 scoreless innings, his second scoreless outing of the season...surrendered four hits and four walks and allowed just three runners to advance into scoring position...the other win came in a 4-3 A's victory last year August 19...all three runs came on home runs as he allowed a two-run shot to Pena in the fourth and a solo shot to Longoria in the sixth...was trailing 3-1 entering the bottom of the sixth before the A's scored three times for the win...the loss came in his only start of 2009, an 8-2 A's loss in Oakland on April 24, 2009...allowed seven runs in 2.2 innings...allowed a Crawford RBI double in the first and a Gross leadoff home run in the second before the Rays scored five times in the third inning...allowed a three-run home run to Pena, a RBI single to Navarro and a RBI double to Iwamura.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Rich Harden (2-2, 4.63 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season... was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 ...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...has 895 strikeouts in 880.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003... was the losing pitcher in his last start, an A's 4-2 loss at Seattle Tuesday (5.2, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 7 so, hr)... is 0-3 with a 5.74 ERA (42.1 ip, 36 h, 29 r, 27 er, 27 bb, 43 so, 7 hr) in eight career starts vs. Toronto... the Blue Jays are one of two American League teams he has never defeated (Baltimore)... has not faced the Blue Jays this year.

The A's bullpen has a 5.28 ERA (44.1 ip, 53 h, 32 r, 26 er, 27 bb, 48 so, 5 hr) over its past 15 games after compiling a 1.80 ERA over its previous 28 contests...now has a 3.26 ERA for the season, which ranks second lowest in the American League...also ranks second in opponents slugging percentage (.346) and fewest home runs (21)...has the fewest wins (11) and second most losses (19)...has allowed just two home runs to first batters faced, which is the fewest in the AL, and has struck out 76, which is second most.

- Has a 1.23 ERA (1 er in 7.1 ip) in eight outings since the All-Star Break and has converted all four of his save opportunities...is now a perfect 27 for 27 in save opportunities after the All-Star Break in his career
- Has held opponents to a .175 batting average, including .139 (5 for 36) against right-handers and .205 (9 for 44) against lefties...opponents are batting .200 (4 for 20) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a save in two outings against Tampa Bay this year (1.1 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...has converted all three of his save opportunities in nine career outings against the Rays (2 er in 11.0 ip, 1.64 ERA).
- Has a 0.64 ERA (1 er in 15.0 ip) in 15 appearances at home compared to a 4.91 ERA (4 er in 7.1 ip) in his eight road outings.
- Has recorded 63 saves in his career, which ranks sixth in Oakland history...is 12 saves away from tying Jason Isringhausen for fifth most.
- Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).
