A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The A's trail in the season series, 1-2...lost two of three here in Toronto in the second series of the season ...the A's have lost the previous three seasons and are 11-18 against Toronto since 2008...all-time, the A's are 194-169 against the Blue Jays...that includes 94-86 in Oakland, 100-81 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 59-49 at Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey is a perfect 28 for 28 in save opportunities after the All-Star Break in his career...has not allowed a base runner in five career outings against Toronto (7.1 ip, 9 so).

Hideki Matsui has a 15-game hitting streak (29 for 60, .483), which matches the A's season high and is the longest active streak in the American League...it is two short of his MLB high...has reached base safely in each of his 21 games since the All-Star Break and ranks second in the majors in batting (.451), slugging (.720) and on-base percentage (.495) since the break.

Cliff Pennington is batting .375 (24 for 64) since the All-Star Break, which ranks fourth in the American League.

Josh Willingham homered for the fourth time in his last nine games Sunday and now has a teamleading 17 home runs for the season...that is one more than the A's team leader from last year (Kouzmanoff).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** Campy Campaneris is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Washington...in **2002** the A's win the longest game by time in Oakland history as they defeat New York 3-2 in 16 innings in a game that last six hours exactly...Mark Ellis has a RBI single in the 16th inning to drive in the winning run.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three at Tampa Bay over the weekend and have won three of the last four series...are 7-6 over that span and 12-10 (.545) since the All-Star Break...went 39-53 (.424) before the break, which was the third worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 29-43 (.403) since then...have spent each of the last 17 days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 51 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...the A's have a 23-16 (.590) record on the weekend (11-9 on Saturday, 12-7 on Sunday) compared to 28-47 (.373) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's won the series at Tampa Bay, snapping a streak of 12 consecutive road series without a win...that matched the third longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since April 21-Aug. 3, 1986 when they went 0-13-2 over a 15-series stretch...went 0-9-3 over this 12 series stretch and had not won a road series since taking two of three from Kansas City, May 6-8...are 2-4 on this nine-game, 11-day road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (three games)...went 2-3 on the last road trip and are 9-30 (.231) over the last 39 road games...are 20-39 (.339) on the road for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League (Baltimore, 17-37)...are 31-24 (.564) at home, which is fifth best in the AL...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won nine of the last 12 home games...return home following the game Thursday for a 10-game homestand against Texas (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Toronto (four games)...it is one of two 10-game homestands this year (Sept. 12-22)...the A's are batting .260 (470 for 1810) with 237 runs scored in 55 home games (4.31 per game) and .234 (473 for 2024) with 205 runs scored in 59 games on the road (3.48 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting a **Major League-leading** .299 (227 for 759) since the All-Star Break...also lead the majors in on-base percentage (.370) and slugging (.473), are tied for third in doubles (54), rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (139), tied for fourth in triples (6), fifth in walks (86) and tied for fifth in runs scored (127)...are now batting .246 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have the third fewest runs scored (442), the third lowest slugging percentage (.364) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.314)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 83 of 118 (70.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...however, are 15 for 16 over the last eight games, including 7 for 7 Saturday night at Tampa Bay—**the most steals by an Oakland team in 22 years** (8 vs. Seattle, July 29, 1989).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in a season-high six consecutive games (nine home runs total)...however, have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 85 games, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 5, 1978-April 10, 1979...the record is 91 from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 72 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 102 home runs...the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 83 home runs, which is the **fewest in the AL** and fourth fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.65 ERA (98 er in 156.0 ip) and .298 (190 for 638) opponents batting average over the last 18 games and are 9-9 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...now have a 3.48 ERA overall, which is second best in the American League...rank first in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.364), second in pickoffs (17) and fourth in strikeouts (807)...however, have issued 384 walks, which is second most in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-12 with a 5.48 ERA (91 er in 149.1 ip) over the last 26 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.59 ERA (278 er in 697.0 ip) for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...have the second fewest home runs allowed (61) and the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.371) but have issued the second most walks (246).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 18 errors in 22 games since the All-Star Break...have 90 errors overall, which is second most in the American League...17 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which leads the majors and are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1999 when they had 18...the errors have led to 62 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (113).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The total air mileage on this road trip to Seattle, Tampa Bay and Toronto is 6,544 (source: travelmath.com)...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have played in all domes on a threecity road trip...the A's have a 5-8 (.385) record in domes this year...this trip also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 29 games on the road from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from Sept. 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-20 (.429) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League...are 7-10 (.412) in extra inning games and the 17 extra inning games are tied for the most in the AL...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 14-27 (.341) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 13-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL to Kansas City (10) and four more than they had in 2010.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 12 times this year and currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...it is the 152nd start of his career, his 96th as an Athletic...the A's are 3-3 (.500) in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 94-57 (.623) in his starting assignments in his career, including 61-34 (.642) with the A's...has tossed six or more innings in three of his six starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and

walked two batters or fewer three times... is 42-0 in 57 career starters with run support of four or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 5 for 32 (.156) with four walks (.250 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .184 (9 for 49) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .234 (11 for 47) the second time and .265 (9 for 34) after that...his career numbers are .196 (246 for 1254) the first time, .223 (256 for 1147) the second time and .266 (221 for 831) after that.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed at least one home run in each of his six starts this year (seven total)...also allowed a home run in his final outing of 2010 and now has a career-long streak of seven consecutive games with a home run allowed...six of the seven home runs he has allowed this year have been hit by right-handed hitters...four have been solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: is 1-0 with a 3.32 ERA (7 er in 19.0 ip) and .169 (11 for 65) opponents batting average in three starts at home and 1-2 with a 6.19 ERA (11 er in 16.0 ip) and .277 (18 for 65) opponents average in three starts on the road...is now 20-10 with a 3.00 ERA (107 er in 321.1 ip) in 54 career appearances in the Coliseum and 37-26 with a 4.05 ERA (252 er in 559.1) in 107 career appearances in all other parks.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 after going 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento (7.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr)...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

SINCE 2003: Has 895 strikeouts in 880.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.15 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 9.97)...has a .224 (723 for 3232) opponents batting average over that span, which is fourth best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221; Lincecum, .222; Jason Schmidt, .223).

WITH THE A'S: His start July 1 against Arizona was his first as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 38-21 record and a 3.50 ERA (224 er in 576.2 ip) in 103 games, 95 starts...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

FIRST START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona July 1 in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...the A's scored a run in the fourth and four more in the fifth to give him a 5-1 lead...allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler to start the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas July 7...allowed runs in four of his five innings...Kinsler scored on a ground out in the first and Hamilton had a RBI single in the third...Kinsler added a RBI single in the fourth followed by a Hamilton sacrifice fly and Young hit a leadoff home run in the fifth inning...Holland shutout the A's on four hits.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in the second game of the doubleheader against Los Angeles July 16 in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Trumbo in the second inning but then retired 12 of the next 14 batters he faced...the A's scored twice in the fourth and once in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a solo home run to Wells in the sixth inning...left after seven innings with the score tied 3-3.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at New York July 23...allowed a RBI single to Martin in the second inning but the A's came back with two runs in the third and another in the sixth...blanked the Yankees on two hits and three walks from the third through fifth innings but then allowed a solo home run to Swisher in the sixth...was relieved by Ziegler following the home run and left with a 3-2 lead.

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-8 loss to Tampa Bay July 28 in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before walking Jennings to start the fourth inning...did not allow a hit until Zobrist singled to lead off the fifth...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Jennings in the sixth inning...left after six innings with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed seven runs in the seventh inning...Ziegler was charged with the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Seattle a week ago today...allowed a two-run double to Carp in the first inning but then blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the next four innings...allowed a two-out, two-run home run to Wells in the sixth inning and was relieved by De Los Santos following the homer with the A's trailing 4-0.

HARDEN vs. TORONTO: Is 0-3 with a 5.74 ERA (42.1 ip, 36 h, 29 r, 27 er, 27 bb, 43 so, 7 hr) in eight career starts...the Blue Jays are one of two American League teams he has never defeated (Baltimore)...is 0-2 with a 13.50 ERA (18 er in 12.0 ip) in three starts at Rogers Centre, 0-1 with a 2.70 ERA (8 er in 26.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 0-0 with a 2.45 ERA (1 er in 3.2 ip) in one start in Texas...has not faced Toronto this year...the first start came in Texas in the Rangers 7-4 loss...allowed a leadoff home run to Gonzalez in the third and issued back-to-back bases loaded walks to Snider and Bautista in the fourth...his second start came in a 16-10 loss at Toronto...Texas scored three times in the first inning but he allowed three runs in the Blue Jays eight-run third inning on a solo home run by Overbay and a three-run home run by Snider.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (9-9, 3.10 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season...is 0-3 with a 8.72 ERA over his last three starts...is also 1-4 with a 6.26 ERA and four home runs allowed in his five four starts after going 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA and no home runs over his previous four starts...has allowed 24 runs over his last five starts after yielding 23 over his previous 12 starts (2.16 ERA)...ranks third in the American League in strikeouts per nine innings (9.11) and is tied for ninth in strikeouts (138)...however, ranks second in walks (64) and tied for 10th in hit batters (7)...is 7-3 with a 2.21 ERA and .201 opponents batting average in 12 starts at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.27 ERA and .280 opponents average in 10 starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-4 A's loss at Seattle last Wednesday (6.1 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 9 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.20 ERA in three career starts against Toronto...last faced the Blue Jays last year on August 18, a no decision in the A's 5-4 win (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 6 so).

- Has a 1.08 ERA (1 er in 8.1 ip) in nine outings since the All-Star Break and has converted all five of his save opportunities...is now a perfect 28 for 28 in save opportunities after the All-Star Break in his career.
- Has held opponents to a .188 batting average, including .132 (5 for 38) against right-handers and .234 (11 for 47) against lefties...opponents are batting .182 (4 for 22) with runners in scoring position.
- Has not faced the Blue Jays this year...has not allowed a base runner in five career outings against Toronto (7.1 ip, 9 so)...is 1-0 and has converted all three of his save opportunities.
- Has a 0.60 ERA (1 er in 15.0 ip) in 15 appearances at home compared to a 4.32 ERA (4 er in 8.1 ip) in his nine road outings.
- Has recorded 64 saves in his career, which ranks sixth in Oakland history... is 11 saves away from tying Jason Isringhausen for fifth most. Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right forearm...it was his second career stint on the DL...was reinstated May 29.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).



MONTH-BY-MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 4.50 ERA in five starts in July...that was his highest single month ERA in September, 2009 when he also had a 4.50 ERA...went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

GONZALEZ vs. TORONTO: Is 1-1 with a 3.20 ERA (19.2 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 8 bb, 18 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...including 1-0 with a 1.98 ERA (13.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 14 so) in two starts last year...the win came in a 4-3 A's victory May 1...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing a lead off single to Lewis in the fourth inning...he scored on a fielders choice and the bullpen allowed an inherited runner of his to score in the seventh...then had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win August 18 in Oakland...shutout the Blue Jays on a hit and a walk over the first four innings before allowing a run in the fifth when a two-out popup by Lewis dropped in front of home plate, scoring Overbay from second...left with a 4-1 lead but the pen then allowed three runs in the ninth inning for the blown save before the A's scored a run in the bottom of the ninth for the win...the loss came in a 5-1 A's loss at Rogers Centre on August 6, 2008...allowed a three-run home run to Barajas in the first inning but blanked the Blue Jays on one walk over the next five innings...allowed a leadoff single to Lind in the seventh and was relieved by Casilla who allowed him to score.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed just five earned runs over the first three innings of a game for a 1.24 ERA (36.1 ip) and .182 (24 for 132) opponents batting average…has a 6.29 ERA (24 er in 34.1 ip) and .286 (40 for 140) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
