ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped a three-game winning streak last night...had lost four straight prior to that win streak...with a win today, would clinch their fourth series win in the past five series...are now 13-11 (.542) since the All-Star Break...went 39-53 (.424) before the break, which was the third worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 30-44 (.405) since then...have spent each of the last 20 days in third place in the AL West, the first time the A's have been alone in third since May 21...it follows a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 53 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...have a 23-16 (.590) record on the weekend (11-9 on Saturday, 12-7 on Sunday) compared to 29-48 (.377) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-5 on this nine-game, 11-day road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (1-1)...went 2-3 on the last road trip and are 10-31 (.244) over the last 41 road games...are 21-40 (.344) on the road for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...won the series at Tampa Bay over the weekend, snapping a streak of 12 consecutive road series without a win...that matched the third longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since April 21-Aug. 3, 1986 when they went 0-13-2 over a 15-series stretch...went 0-9-3 over that 12 series stretch and had not won a road series since taking two of three from Kansas City, May 6-8...are 31-24 (.564) at home, which is fifth best in the AL...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won nine of the last 12 home games...return home following the game Thursday for a 10-game homestand against Texas (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Toronto (four games)...it is one of two 10-game homestands this year (Sept. 12-22)...the A's are batting .260 (470 for 1810) with 237 runs scored in 55 home games (4.31 per game) and .234 (491 for 2095) with 213 runs scored in 61 games on the road (3.49 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and second lowest in the majors (Washington .228).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .295 (245 for 830) since the All-Star Break, which ranks second in the majors (Texas .296)...lead the majors in on-base percentage (.366) and slugging (.470) since the break, rank fifth in doubles (55), tied for fifth in triples (6) and fewest strikeouts (151), rank sixth in runs scored (135) and are tied for sixth in walks (90)...are now batting .246 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...tied for the second fewest runs scored (450), have the third lowest slugging percentage (.365) and own the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.314)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 83 of 118 (70.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...however, are 15 for 16 (93.8%) over the last 10 games, including 7 for 7 Saturday night at Tampa Bay—the most steals by an Oakland team in 22 years (8 vs. Seattle, July 29, 1989).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in eight consecutive games (13 home runs total), their longest such streak since they also homered in eight straight games May 17-25, 2008...the last time the A's homered in nine straight games was June 9-22, 2007 when they homered in 12 games in a row...however, have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 87 games, which the second longest such streak in Oakland...the record is 91 games from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 76 home runs for the season, which is the third fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 106 home runs...the Oakland record for fewest home runs in a season is 94 in 1968...the pitching staff has surrendered just 85 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.57 ERA (107 er in 173.0 ip) and .293 (206 for 704) opponents batting average over the last 20 games but are 10-10 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...now have a 3.50 ERA overall, which is second best in the American League...rank first in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.364), second in pickoffs (17) and fifth in strikeouts (822)...however, have issued 393 walks, which is second most in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-13 with a 5.36 ERA (96 er in 161.1 ip) over the last 28 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.59 ERA (283 er in 709.0 ip) for the season, which is third lowest in the AL...are tied for the league lead in fewest home runs allowed (62) and rank second in lowest opponents slugging percentage (.370) but have issued the second most walks (253).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 19 errors in 24 games since the All-Star Break...have 91 errors overall, which is second most in the American League...17 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which leads the majors and are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1999 when they had 18...the errors have led to 62 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (114).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The total air mileage on this road trip to Seattle, Tampa Bay and Toronto is 6,544 (source: travelmath.com)...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have played in all domes on a three-city road trip...the A's have a 6-9 (.400) record in domes this year...this trip also begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 29 games on the road from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from Sept. 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-20 (.429) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League...are 7-10 (.412) in extra inning games and the 17 extra inning games are tied for the most in the AL...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 14-27 (.341) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 13-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is four more than they had in 2010.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 12 times this year and currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished 2006 with one player on the DL (Crosby).

A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The Jays lead the season series, 3-2...all five games have been played in Toronto...the A's have lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons and are 12-19 (.387) against Toronto since 2008...all-time, the A's are 195-170 against the Blue Jays...that includes 94-86 in Oakland, 101-82 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 60-50 at Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey is a perfect 29 for 29 in save opportunities after the All-Star Break in his career...has not allowed a hit in six career outings against Toronto (8.1 ip, 1 bb, 9 so).

Hideki Matsui had his 15-game hitting streak snapped Tuesday night...the streak matched the A's season high and was the longest active streak in the American League...it was two short of his MLB high...batted .483 (29 for 60) during the streak...leads the majors in batting (.416) and is tied for fourth in on-base percentage (.471) since the All-Star Break and is seventh in slugging (.663).

Cliff Pennington is batting .342 (25 for 73) since the All-Star Break.

Josh Willingham homered for the sixth time in his last 11 games last night and now has a team-leading 19 home runs for the season...that is three more than the A's team leader from last year (Kouzmanoff)...is tied for most home runs (8) and tied for the fourth most RBI (22) in the AL since the All-Star Break.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1978, Rick Langford tosses a three-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota in the A's 2-0 victory...in 2003, Tim Hudson tosses a complete game two-hit shutout and needs just 93 pitches to defeat Boston, 4-0.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 15th appearance and 13th start of the season...the A's are 6-6 (.500) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings six times, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

BRIEFLY: Is 1-2 with a 7.40 ERA (17 er in 20.2 ip) in three starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19...began the season with the River Cats and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed just five earned runs over the first three innings of a game for a 1.24 ERA (36.1 ip) and .182 (24 for 132) opponents batting average...has a 6.29 ERA (24 er in 34.1 ip) and .286 (40 for 140) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .198 (41 for 207) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup and .354 (23 for 65) after that...opponents are hitting .200 (10 for 50) with runners in scoring position and .200 (13 for 65) when leading off an inning.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 4-5 with a 3.72 ERA (28 er in 67.2 ip) in 11 starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...made his two relief appearances on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3rd and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4th.

RUN SUPPORT: Received no run support in his last start and the A's have not scored a run while he was pitching in five of his 12 starts this year...has received 18 runs of support in his last 10 starts (56.2 ip, 2.86 RSA), but eight of those runs came in one start (July 30 vs. Minnesota).

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high four games in a 2-0 win over Seattle July 6...posted a 2.43 ERA and .200 opponents during the losing streak, which spanned six games, including five starts.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July, 1968.

2011 START-BY-START: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles **May 24**...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...just three runners advanced into scoring position...won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore **May 29** in Oakland...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore **June 7**...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-4 loss at Chicago **June 12**...walked a career-high four batters in 6.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco **June 18** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the fifth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Philadelphia **June 24**...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...Worley, Herndon, Perez and Stutes combined to shutout the A's on two hits...extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida **June 29** in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings...Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle **July 6** in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss **July 19** at Detroit...allowed career highs in runs (7), earned runs (6) and hits (9) and matched his high in home runs (2)...tossed just 4.2 innings, matching his fewest as a starter...blanked the Tigers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career high 12.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Tampa Bay **July 25** in Oakland...matched his career high by walking four batters and allowing two home runs...did not strike out a batter for the first time in a starting assignment...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 win over Minnesota **July 30** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cuddyer in the first inning but the A's came back with a run in the bottom of the first...yielded a RBI single to Young in the second but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second to take the lead for good...retired 11 of the 12 batters he faced over innings three through six...was relieved by Ziegler with runners on first and second and one out in the seventh.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Tampa Bay last Friday...blanked the Rays on two hits and a walk over the first three innings...loaded the bases with one out in the fourth inning and allowed a run to score on a Chirinos ground out...then allowed RBI doubles to Longoria and Kotchman in the fifth and was relieved by De Los Santos with a runner on second and the A's trailing 3-0...De Los Santos allowed the runner to score.

MOSCOSO vs. TORONTO: Has faced the Blue Jays once in his career and it came in relief June 9, 2009 at Texas...entered the game in the sixth inning with the Rangers trailing 5-0...walked a batter in the sixth and then allowed two runs in the seventh on a Rolan RBI double and an Overbay RBI single.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA (46.1 ip, 41 h, 22 r, 20 er, 16 bb, 52 so) and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.
