A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail in the season series, 4-6...won four of the first five games, but have lost five straight, which is the A's longest losing streak against the Rangers since June 28-July 5, 2000 when they also lost five straight...have not lost six in a row since July 7, 1999-May 6, 2000...are 1-5 in Texas this year and 3-1 in Oakland...have lost the season series four times over the previous five seasons and are 49-56 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 290-300 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-139 in Oakland and 135-161 in Texas...including 68-73 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 387-382 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all six of his save chances since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 29 for 29 post-break in his career.

Hideki Matsui leads the majors in batting (.432) since the All-Star Break, ranks second in on-base percentage (.481), fourth in slugging (.663) and tied for fourth in RBI (24).

Jemile Weeks has 65 hits, which matches the best total in Oakland history by a player over the first 54 games of his career (Ben Grieve, 1997-98).

Josh Willingham has six home runs in his last 12 games and a team-leading 19 for the season...is tied for the American League lead in home runs since the All-Star Break (8) and is tied for seventh in RBI (22).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1996 Geronimo Berroa has his second three-homer game of the season in the A's 11-1 win over Minnesota...the two three-homer games tie a Major League record...in 2001 Jason Giambi hits his first career "walk-off" home run for his 1000th career hit as the A's defeat the Yankees, 4-2, for their 11th consecutive win.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games and have won back-to-back series for just the fourth time this year...have not won three straight series since Sept. 3-12 of last year...have also won four of the last five series and are 9-7 over that span...are 14-11 (.560) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...had the third worst record at the break in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 31-44 (.413) since then...have spent each of the last 20 days in third place in the AL West after a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 54 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...have a 23-16 (.590) record on the weekend (11-9 on Saturday, 12-7 on Sunday) compared to 30-48 (.385) during the week...are 23-22 (.511) in day games and 30-42 (.417) at night...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting a **Major League-leading** .296 (257 for 868) since the All-Star Break, which has boosted their overall batting average 14 points to .247...that is the highest the average has been outside the first five games of the season...also lead the majors in on-base percentage (.370) and slugging (.471) since the break, rank second in doubles (60), third in runs (145), fourth in walks (99) and tied for fourth in triples (7)...are hitting .331 (79 for 239) with runners in scoring position since the break...for the season, have the third lowest slugging percentage in the American League (.366), the fourth lowest batting average (.247) and the fourth fewest runs scored (460)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 83 of 118 (70.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...however, are 15 for 16 (93.8%) over the last 11 games, including 7 for 7 last Saturday night at Tampa Bay—the most steals by an Oakland team in 22 years (8 vs. Seattle, July 29, 1989).

THE LONG BALL: The A's did not homer yesterday, snapping their streak of five consecutive games with two home runs and eight consecutive games with at least one home run...have 13 home runs over the last nine games and 19 over the last 14...however, have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 88 games, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 91 games from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 76 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...the pitching staff has surrendered just 86 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.39 ERA (109 er in 182.0 ip) and .286 (211 for 737) opponents batting average over the last 21 games but are 11-10 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...now have a 3.49 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League...rank first in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.364), second in pickoffs (17) and fourth in strikeouts (831)...however, have issued 396 walks, which is second most in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 er in 32.0 ip) the last time through the rotation...however, are 10-13 with a 5.22 ERA (97 er in 167.1 ip) over the last 29 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.57 ERA (284 er in 715.0 ip) for the season, which is third lowest in the AL...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (62) and rank second in lowest opponents slugging percentage (.369) but have issued the second most walks (255).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 92 errors, which is second most in the American League...have made 100 errors in a season just once over the previous seven seasons (105 in 2009)...17 of the errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which leads the majors and are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1999 when they had 18...the errors have led to 63 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (114).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game homestand tonight against Texas (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Toronto (four games)...it is one of two 10-game homestands this year (Sept. 12-22)...however, this stand marks the A's only home games over a stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where Oakland plays 19 of its 29 games on the road...began the stretch by going 4-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (2-1)...are 31-24 (.564) at home compared to 22-40 (.355) on the road...have the fifth best home record in the American League and the third worst road record...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won nine of the last 12 home games...are 11-31 (.262) over the last 42 road games...have won three straight home series for the first time this year...have won two straight road series for the second time after going winless over the previous 12 road series (0-9-3)...the A's are batting .260 (470 for 1810) with 237 runs scored in 55 home games (4.31 per game) and .236 (503 for 2133) with 223 runs scored in 62 games on the road (3.60 per game)...have a 2.93 ERA (164 er in 504.0 ip) at home compared to 4.01 (241 er in 540.1 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-20 (.429) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League...are 7-10 (.412) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...the 17 extra inning games are tied for the most in the AL...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 14-27 (.341) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 13-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 12 times this year and currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season, his eight since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 7-9 (.438) in his starting assignments this year and his teams are 34-38 (.472) in his 72 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 13 of his 16 starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer all 16 times.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.78 ERA (10 er in 32.1 ip) in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...the four-game winning streak matches his career high (May 24-September 8, 2009)...is tied for second in the American League in wins since the break (Verlander, DET 5).

QUALIFICATIONS: Has 108.2 innings pitched, which is 8.1 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 70.0 innings, he ranks second in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.33), third in strikeout to walk ratio (4.63) and sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.41)

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .211 (28 for 133) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup and .295 (83 for 281) after that...has surrendered five home runs, all solo shots...four have been hit by left-handed hitters.

CAREER BESTS: Struck out five batters in his last start to bring his season total to a career-high 74...that tops his 69 from 2006...tossed 8.0 innings in his last start to establish a new career high for innings pitched with 108.2 (previously 101.2 in 2007)...already has a career high two complete games...has a 3.31 ERA and has not finished with a mark under 4.03 in his career.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 3-3 with a 2.05 ERA (13 er in 57.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more and 2-2 with a 4.70 ERA (27 er in 51.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 4-1 with a 3.20 ERA (16 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is tied for second most among American League pitchers (Verlander, DET 5)...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high five games in a 5-3 victory over Los Angeles July 15...it was his first win since April 10...the previous longest losing streak of his career was four from June 25 to September 10, 2006...posted a 3.72 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned seven starts.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto **April 5**...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle)...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota **April 10**...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss **April 15** against Detroit in Oakland...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle **April 21**...the complete game was his second of his career (also May 24, 2009 at Houston)...was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles **April 26**...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City **May 7**...both of his complete games have been losses...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago **May 13**...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Texas **July 9**...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning to tie the game...left with a 6-5 lead but Bailey allowed a two-run home run to Hamilton in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save and loss...snapped his losing streak at five games in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles **July 15** in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Detroit **July 20**...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed back-to-back singles to start the bottom of the sixth and was relieved by Devine...Devine allowed both of those runs to score for the blown save and a run of his own...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win over Minnesota **July 31** in Oakland...struck out a career-high nine batters, topping his previous high of eight.

LAST START: He combined with De Los Santos on a five-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win at Tampa Bay last Saturday...allowed all five of the hits and did not walk a batter in 8.0 innings...allowed a two out single to Longoria in the first inning but then retired each of the next 13 hitters before Chirinos singled to lead off the sixth...Chirinos went to second on a Rodriguez single and also doubled in the eighth inning and was the only runner to advance into scoring position off McCarthy.

MCCARTHY vs. TEXAS: Is 1-2 with a 3.54 ERA (28.0 ip, 22 h, 16 r, 11 er, 7 bb, 18 so, 5 hr) in six career appearances, four starts...that includes 1-1 with a 4.35 ERA (10 er in 20.2 ip) in four games, three starts in Texas, 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (1 er in 1.1 ip) in one game at U.S. Cellular Field and 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er in 6.0 ip) in one start in Oakland...is 1-1 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) in his four starting assignments...pitched for Texas from 2007-09 and is 8-6 with a 3.94 ERA (56 er in 128.0 ip) in 26 games, 25 starts, in Rangers Ballpark...is 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 14 h, 9 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the first no decision came in the A's 5-4 win in 10 innings May 2 in Oakland...allowed two runs in both the third and fifth innings but all of the runs were unearned...in each case, his own error led to the unearned runs...left after six innings trailing 4-3 but Willingham homered in the eighth and Matsui in the 10th for the win...also had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Texas July 9...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth on a Kinsler RBI double, an Andrus sacrifice fly, a Hamilton RBI ground out and a Beltre solo home run...the A's scored a run in the seventh to take a 6-5 lead but Bailey allowed a two-run home run to Hamilton in the bottom of the ninth for the blown save and loss.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (9-10, 3.93 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 26th start of the season...is 1-3 with a 7.86 ERA and .324 opponents batting average in five starts since the All-Star Break...his post-break ERA is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors...is now 3-10 with a 5.08 ERA and .281 opponents batting average over his last 17 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 5-5 with a 2.52 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in 12 starts at home and 4-5 with a 5.42 ERA and .281 in 13 starts on the road...has the ninth lowest home ERA in the AL but the second highest road ERA...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's win in 10 innings last Sunday at Tampa Bay (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 8-3 with a 2.19 ERA in 12 career starts against Texas...is 2-1 with a 1.25 ERA (21.2 ip, 17 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 14 so) in three starts this year.

The A's bullpen has a 5.11 ERA (32 er in 56.1 ip) and a .288 (66 for 229) opponents batting average over the last 19 games after posting a 1.80 ERA and .194 opponents average in its previous 21 games...ranks second in the American League in ERA (3.31), tied for second in opponents slugging percentage (.354) and is third in fewest home runs (24)...has the fewest wins (12) and is tied for the third most losses (19)...has allowed just three home runs to first batters faced, which is the fewest in the AL, and has struck out 79, which is second most...has allowed 54 of 150 (36.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.

- Has a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) in 10 outings since the All-Star Break and has converted all six of his save opportunities...is now a perfect 29 for 29 in save opportunities after the All-Star Break in his career.
- Has held opponents to a .182 batting average, including .125 (5 for 40) against right-handers and .229 (11 for 48) against lefties...opponents are batting .174 (4 for 23) with runners in scoring position.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 26th start of the season, which **ties him for the American League lead...** the A's are 10-15 (.400) in his starting assignments this year and are 46-41 (.529) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 13 of his 25 starts, allowed one run or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 1-3 with a 7.86 ERA (23 er in 26.1 ip) and .324 (36 for 111) opponents batting average in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .240 opponents average in 20 starts before the break...his post-break ERA is the **highest** in the American League and **fourth** highest in the majors...his post-break opponents batting average is **fourth** highest in the AL.

6-0 THEN 3-10: Is 3-10 with a 5.08 ERA (57 er in 101.0 ip) and .281 (108 for 385) opponents batting average over his last 17 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but is **tied for the Major League lead in losses since May 15 (Kuroda, LAD).**

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is **tied for the American League lead** in stolen bases allowed (25), ranks **second** in most walks (66), **tied for second** in wild pitches (11) and **tied for sixth** in losses (10)...the 25 stolen bases are the most allowed by an A's pitcher since Dave Stewart yielded 32 in 1987...the 11 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when three pitchers had at least 11 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14, Haynes 11).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 with a 2.52 ERA (22 er in 78.2 ip) and .231 (66 for 286) opponents batting average in 12 starts at home and 4-5 with a 5.42 ERA (45 er in 74.2 ip) and .281 (83 for 295) in 13 starts on the road...has the **eighth** lowest home ERA in the American League but the **third** highest road ERA...is now 23-15 with a 3.06 ERA (98 er in 288.1 ip) in 45 career starts in Oakland and 14-16 with a 4.72 ERA (126 er in 240.1 ip) in 42 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .169 (11 for 65) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is **second** lowest in the American League...has yielded a .248 (34 for 137) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .315 (29 for 92) over his last 15 starts (since May 25).

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-4 with a 3.04 ERA (19 er in 56.1 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition this year and 6-6 with a 4.45 ERA (48 er in 97.0 ip) in 16 starts against everyone else...now has a 14-10 record and a 2.59 ERA (54 er in 188.0 ip) in 30 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 23-21 with a 4.49 ERA (170 er in 340.2 ip) in 57 starts against everyone else.

WINS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 27...won 10 games as a rookie in 2009 and 18 games last year...with one more win, he will become just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...has 27 wins over the last two years, which are **tied for fifth** in the American League...has 37 career wins, which are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

CAREER BESTS: Has 114 strikeouts, which is four short of his career high of 118 from last year...has issued 66 walks, which is six short of his high of 72 from his rookie season of 2009.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or fewer in 15 of his last 17 starts and his run support average over that span is 3.21 (36 rs in 101.0 ip)...13 of those 36 runs of support came in one start, July 27 against Tampa Bay...has received run support of three runs or fewer in 20 of his 25 starts this year and his season RSA is 4.05 (69 rs in 153.1 ip).

WITH THE A'S: His start July 1 against Arizona was his first as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 39-21 record and a 3.47 ERA (225 er in 583.2 ip) in 104 games, 96 starts...his .650 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
