WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 3-game series in Oakland, the beginning of a 10-game roadtrip that includes 4 contests with the Angels and 3 with the White Sox...Texas was 4-2 on its homestand with Cleveland (2-1) and Seattle (2-1)...club has won 5 of 7, but is 10-11 in last 21 contests since the 12-game win streak...team is 22-11 last 33 games and 30-18 last 48...Texas has gone 43-29 (.597) beginning May 22...club is 57-51 beg. April 12 after a 9-1 start.

-At 66-52 (.559), the Rangers have the 3rd-best record in the A.L., 6th-best in majors...club has been season-high 15 games over .500 4 times (after wins 7/19 at LAA, 7/23 vs. TOR, 7/25 vs. MIN, and 8/9 vs. SEA), but is now 0-4 when trying to reach 16 games over .500...the Rangers were 67-51 after 118 games in both 2009 and 2010.

--Since the All-Star Break, the Rangers are 15-11 (.577), matching the 6th best record in the majors and 3rd in the A.L. behind the Red Sox (17-9) and Yankees (18-10)

ON TOP IN WEST: With the Angels' loss on Thursday, Texas increased its lead in the A.L. West to 2.0 games, its biggest advantrage since August 1 (2.0 GA)...club's last advantage of more than 2.0 games was a 3.0 lead on July 26...the Rangers have led the division by at least 1.0 game for 37 straight days beginning July 6...Texas has had sole possession of first place in the A.L. West for 73 of the last 76 days beginning May 16, including 37 straight days beginning July 6, as Texas has not been out of first since May 15 (-0.5 GB)...team has had at least a share of the division lead for 120 of 134 days in 2011, club's 4thmost days in first place ever in a single season...Texas has been in 1st in West for 238 of 252 days beginning June 8, 2010.

ON THE ROAD: This 10-game trip matches the Rangers' longest of 2011 in terms of games...club went 3-7 in Minnesota (1-3), New York (0-3), and Atlanta (2-1), June 9-19...Texas has dropped 6 of its last 8 road games beginning July 20 after winning the previous 5 and 9 of the previous 11 away from home...of the 6 road defeats since July 20, 5 have been by a single run...club's 11-8 (.579) road record since June 17 is 4th best in the A.L....overall road winning percentage of .482 (27-29) ranks 8th in the A.L....teams was 28-28 thru 56 road contests in 2010 (28-29 thru 57 games).

--Texas has lost its last 3 road series, going 1-2 at the Angels, Blue Jays, and Tigers...club;s longest string of consecutive road series defeats in 2011 is 4 to the Tigers, Yankees, A's, and Mariners, April 11-May 5.

--Beginning August 8, Texas will play 28 of its final 47 games against the A's, Angels, and Mariners.

--Texas is 7-7 in A.L. West parks this season, winning 5 of the last 7.

VERSUS OAKLAND: The Rangers are 6-4 against the A's in 2011, winning the last 5 games, all in Arlington since a loss on May 9 at Rangers Ballpark...that includes a 4-game sweep, July 7-10, the Rangers' 1st vs. the A's since June 19-22 at old Arlington Stadium...this is Texas' longest winning streak vs. Oakland since 5 wins in a row, June 28-July 5, 2000...last longer win streak was 6 straight victories, July 7, 1999-May 6, 2000...the Rangers last longer win streak in one season against the A's was 9 victories in a row, June 19-Sept. 30, 1986...Texas has won 9 of the last 13 meetings with Oakland beginning Sept. 24, 2010 with a 56-49 edge beginning 2006...Rangers' all-time advantage is 300-290, the most lifetime wins ersus any club.

In Oakland: Texas lost 3 of 4 in its only 2011 visit to the Coliseum, April 29-May 2...the Rangers won the final 3 meetings here a year ago but are just 10-14 in this oark since the start of 2009...all-time, the A's have a 155-139 edge here.

ONE-RUN WOES: With Wednesday's 4-3 loss to Seattle, the Rangers are 14-19 in games decided by one run in 2011...that .424 winning percentage is the 3rd lowest in the majors in one-run games to San Diego at .390 (16-25) and Cincinnati at .391 (18-28)...club has drpped 6 of its last 9 one-run decisions beginning July 20.

--Texas is just 3-16 in road games decided by one run, dropping the last 5 since a 3-2 victory in Houston on June 29...the club's .158 winning percentage in one-run road games is the lowest in the majors (KC, 4-13, .235 is next) and the Rangers have 2nd most defeats to Cincinnati's 20 one-run road losses.

YOUNG AND HITTING STREAKS: This is Michael's 3rd hitting streak of 10+games in 2011 as he had a 15-gamer, April 9(2)-25 and a 13-game streak, June 14-28...this marks the 6th different season that Young has had at least 3 hitting streaks of 10+ games: 4 in 2005 and 2007 and 3 in 2004, 2008, and 2009...his 24 career hitting streaks of 10 or more games are 5 more than any player in club history (I.Rodriguez-19) and are tied for 8th most among active players...Derek Jeter leads that group with 39 (Elias Sports Bureau).

BORN ON THE FOURTH OF JULY: Texas also has the majors' top two hitters since July 4 among players with at least 100 plate apperances: Mike Napoli at .3913 (36-92) and Michael Young at .3909 (52-133).

STINGY ON THE ROAD: Despite a 27-29 record, the Rangers have the lowest road earned run average in the major leagues at 3.15...the current mark would be the lowest in the majors for a season since Montreal's 2.69 mark in 1992...Texas' current mark would be the 5th-lowest such figure in the A.L. for a single season over the past 39 seasons from 1973-2011 or since the advent of the designated hitter, and 2nd best in team history, a fraction behind 1977:

FELIZ GETS IT DONE: Since the start of 2010, Neftali Feliz is 3-0 with a 0.76 ERA (3 ER/35.1 IP) in 36 games against A.L. West opponents, holding Angels/A's/Mariners to a .098 AVG/.130 OBP/.107 SLG slash line with just one extra-base hit (a double) plus 12 walks and 31 strikeouts.

ROSTER MOVE: On Thursday, the Rangers activated OF Craig Gentry from the 7-day concussion DL and optioned RHP Darren O'Day to Round Rock (AAA)...Gentry was injured sliding into 2nd base on July 24 vs. Toronto and went on the concussion DL on July 28...he played in 5 games on rehab assignment at Round Rock, batting .273 (6-22) with a home run.

MISCELLANEOUS: Saturday's game will be a FOX national telecast going to 16% of the U.S. with Glen Kuiper and Tom Grieve on the call...it will be the Rangers 6th Saturday FOX appearance of the season with Sept. 3 at Boston still to come...Josh Hamilton snapped a 20-game home run drought with his 4th inning blast against Seattle on Wednesday...lan Kinsler has homered in each of the last 2 games and leads the majors with 18 homers in the leadoff spot, one more than Milwaukee's Rickie Weeks....the Rangers lead the majors with 132 double plays turned but have the ML 2nd lowest team fielding percentage at .978...Seattle hitters are now 0-for-39 lifetime off Neftali Feliz with 16 K's.

#36 C.J. Wilson, LHP (10-5, 3.35)

TONIGHT: The 30-year-old All-Star left-hander is scheduled to make his 25th start and appearance on Friday night at the Oakland Coliseum, the 64th start of his career...ranks among A.L. leaders in strikeouts (7th, 146), innings (8th, 161.1), and winning pct. (T9th, .667)...has 10 HR allowed, already matching his '10 total, but has far better strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.65) than last season (1.83)...has gone 0-2 last 4 starts after winning his previous 6 decisions...last 3 starts: 0-1, 7.54 ERA (12 ER/14.1 IP) to raise season figure from 2.94 to 3.35, 7th among A.L. lefties and 20th in the league overall...has lasted 4.0 innings-or-less in 2 of last 3 (only outings less than 5.0 innings in '11) after going 6.0-or-more in 12 straight...will be working on extended 5 days' rest following Thursday's off day, taking a no decision in his last start on Saturday, a 7-5 loss to Cleveland.

<u>CJ IN AZ:</u> Wilson was named to his first All-Star team prior to his start on July 3 as one of 7 manager's selections by A.L. skipper Ron Washington...joined Rick Honeycutt ('83) and Kenny Rogers ('95, '04, '05) as just the 3rd Rangers LHP to ever be selected for the Midsummer Classic...Cliff Lee also represented Texas in 2010, but was named to the team prior to his trade from Seattle...Wilson worked the 4th inning and took the loss in a 5-1 defeat to the N.L., allowing 2 singles to Carlos Beltran and Matt Kemp ahead of Prince Fielder's 3-run homer (1.0 IP, 3 H, 3 R-ER, 1 HR, 0 BB, 1 SO, 22 pitches/14 strikes).

WINNING GAME PLAN: Wilson has won 10 games for a 2nd straight season, joining Colby Lewis as first Rangers to do that since Kevin Millwood in 2006-07...last Texas lefty?: Kenny Rogers in 2004-05...Texas has won 37 of the southpaw's 57 starts (37-20) since the beginning of 2010 and 25 of his last 39 starts beginning July 18, 2010; the 37 wins are 4th-most by any ML team in an individual pitcher's start since the beginning of 2010...in the same span, the Phillies are 42-15 in Roy Halladay's starts, the Yankees are 41-18 in C.C. Sabathia's starts, and the Tigers are 39-20 in Justin Verlander's starts.

JUNE BOON: Was voted the Rangers Player of the Month for June after going 3-0 with a 2.72 ERA (11 ER/36.1 IP) over 5 starts during the month...had 2nd-most homerless innings of any ML pitcher in June (Cliff Lee, 0 HR in 42.0 IP)...in 10 June starts in 2009-10, Wilson went 6-0 with 2.90 ERA (22 ER/68.1 IP)...Wilson's 2.90 ERA ranks 9th among A.L. pitchers (min. 65.0 IP) in June over last 2 seasons.

LEADERBOARD: Wilson is one of Rangers' ML-high 5 pitchers with 10+ wins, T2nd-most wins on staff behind Ogando (11-5)...ranks among A.L. leaders in strikeouts (7th, 146), innings (8th, 161.1), and winning pct. (T9th, .667), while his 3.35 ERA is 7th among A.L. lefties and 20th in the league overall...his 19 steals are 6th-most allowed in A.L., most by any A.L. lefty and 2nd-most by any southpaw in the majors behind the Dodgers' Ted Lilly (25).

LAST START: Did not factor into the decision in his last start on Saturday, a 7-5 loss to Cleveland (6.2 IP, 5 H, 3 R-2 ER, 2 BB, 9 SO, 112 pitches/69 strikes)...held Indians scoreless thru 6, as all 3 runs in 7th were charged to Wilson - 2 of those following his departure on a balk and an infield error...still allowed 3 of the 5 batters he faced in that frame to reach (1B, 2B, BB)...Tribe plated 4 runs off Feliz (3 ER, BS)/Tateyama (1 ER) in 9th to erase 4-3 deficit.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 3-5 with a 4.50 ERA (31 ER/62.0 IP) and 5 saves in 34 career games vs. Oakland, incl. 2-2, 4.01 (15 ER/33.2 IP) in 5 starts...has gone 1-2, 4.71 (11 ER/21.0 IP) in 3 starts in '11..took losses in first 2 outings on 4/29 at the Coliseum and 5/9 at Rangers Ballpark, both starts opposite Trevor Cahill, the latter of which saw him become first Ranger to lose a game with 7.0+ IP/2-H-or-less since Hough on 8/15/89 at SEA; won his 3rd start opposite Gio Gonzalez on 7/8 in Arlington, final outing prior to All-Star break..is 0-2, 4.00 (8 ER/18.0 IP) with 2 saves in 14 career games here at the Coliseum, lone career start coming in that 4/29 loss.

ON THE ROAD: Is 5-4, 2.76 (26 ER/84.2 IP) in 12 road starts this season, posting 7th-lowest road ERA in A.L...has lost 2 straight road starts after winning 4 straight decisions over a span of 5 outings away from Arlington from June 5-July 17...his road ERA over past 2 seasons (2.84) is nearly a full run lower than home ERA (3.82) and ranks 3rd in A.L., 9th in majors.

<u>PUNCHOUTS:</u> Has posted 5 games of 10+ strikeouts this season, a club record for a left-hander in a single season (previous Cliff Lee, 3 in 2010)...Wilson became just the 2nd pitcher in Texas history to have 4 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in a season before June 1...the other?: Nolan Ryan in 1989 (6)...club record for a single season is 18 by Ryan in 1989, although 2nd-highest total in Rangers history (8 by Ryan in 1990) is within reach...Wilson had 3 games of 10+ K's in May, joining Colby Lewis (3 10-K games in April '10) as only Texas pitchers with 3 such games in a month since Nolan Ryan in Sept. '90 (3).

2011: Team is 13-11 in his 24 starts, with Wilson taking decisions in 15 of those (10-5)...bat-terymates: Torrealba (15 starts), Napoli (6), Teagarden (3)...baserunners are 19-for-24 in steal attempts vs. Wilson...club record for most stolen bases allowed in a single-season by a left-handed pitcher is 22 by Jon Matlack in 1980...has tossed at least 6.0 frames in 20 of 24 starts, with at least 7.0 innings 15 times...had streaks of 7.0+ frames in 5 straight twice this season (4/18-5/9 and 6/28-7/21), longest streak of career...has permitted 10 HR this season to equal his total for all of 2010...has allowed 8 of his 10 HR's with 2 outs in an inning...of the 10 HR, 7 have either tied the game or given the opponent the lead...no HR in 17 of his 24 starts, just 2 HR in last 12 starts combined...his 0.56 HR-per-9.0 IP ranks 5th-best in the A.L.
