A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail in the season series, 4-7...won four of the first five games, but have lost six straight, which is the A's longest losing streak against the Rangers since July 7, 1999-May 6, 2000 when they also lost six straight...have not lost more than six in a row since June 19-Sept. 30, 1986 when they dropped nine straight...are 1-5 in Texas this year and 3-2 in Oakland...have lost the season series four times over the previous five seasons and are 49-57 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 290-301 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-140 in Oakland and 135-161 in Texas...including 68-73 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 387-383 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all six of his save chances since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 29 for 29 post-break in his career.

Hideki Matsui leads the majors in batting (.423) and on-base percentage (.477) since the All-Star Break, ranks fifth in slugging (.649) and tied for seventh in RBI (24).

Josh Willingham has six home runs in his last 13 games and a team-leading 19 for the season...is tied for second in the American League in home runs since the All-Star Break (8) and is tied for 10th in RBI (22).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1977 Mitchell Page steals his 26th consecutive base without being caught, setting an American League record...the record comes to an end two days later when he is picked off by Cleveland's Rick Waits...in 1989 Dave Parker's first inning home run off California's Bert Blyleven is the 3000th home run in Oakland A's history...in 2005 Dennis Eckersley becomes the fourth player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 43.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the previous five series but are just 9-8 since that stretch began...are 14-12 (.538) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...had the third worst record at the break in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...have won each of the previous two series, marking just the fourth time this year the A's have won back-to-back series...have not won three straight series since Sept. 3-12 of last year...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 31-45 (.408) since then...are now 13½ games behind Texas, which is one-half game short of the season high of 14 (July 19)...have spent each of the last 21 days in third place in the AL West after a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 55 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .291 (262 for 900) since the All-Star Break after hitting .233 before the break...**lead the majors** in on-base percentage since the break (.366), rank second in slugging (.463) and doubles (63), third in batting, fourth in walks (103) and tied for fourth in runs (146) and triples (7)...are hitting .328 (80 for 244) with runners in scoring position since the break...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.366) in the American League and the fourth fewest runs scored (461)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 83 of 118 (70.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...however, are 15 for 16 (93.8%) over the last 11 games, including 7 for 7 a week ago tonight at Tampa Bay—the most steals by an Oakland team in 22 years (8 vs. Seattle, July 29, 1989).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have gone homerless in back-to-back games after homering in a season-high eight consecutive games...have 13 home runs over the last 10 games and 19 over the last 15...however, have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 89 games, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 91 games from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 76 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...the pitching staff has surrendered just 86 home runs, which is the **fewest in the AL** and fourth fewest in the majors.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 23-16 (.590) record on the weekend (11-9 on Saturday, 12-7 on Sunday) compared to 30-49 (.380) during the week...are 23-22 (.511) in day games and 30-43 (.411) at night...are 19-18 (514) in games started by a left-handed pitcher and 34-47 (.420) against right-handers.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.42 ERA (115 er in 191.0 ip) and .286 (222 for 775) opponents batting average over the last 22 games and are 11-11 over that span...had a 2.55 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over the previous 22 games but were 8-14 over that stretch...now have a 3.51 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League...rank first in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.364) and second in pickoffs (17) and third in most walks (398).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-14 with a 5.75 ERA (102 er in 170.2 ip) over the last 30 games after posting a 1.86 ERA over the previous 20 contests...have a 3.62 ERA (289 er in 718.1 ip) for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (62) and rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.371) but have issued the second most walks (255).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 94 errors, which is second most in the American League to Texas (96)...have made 100 errors in a season just once over the previous seven seasons (105 in 2009)...17 of the errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with Cincinnati for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1999 when they had 18...the errors have led to 66 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors...are third in the AL in double plays (115).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (0-1), Baltimore (three games) and Toronto (four games)...it is one of two 10-game homestands this year (Sept. 12-22)...however, this stand marks the A's only home games over a stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where Oakland plays 19 of its 29 games on the road...began the stretch by going 4-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (2-1)...are 31-25 (.554) at home compared to 22-40 (.355) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won nine of the last 13 home games...are 11-31 (.262) over the last 42 road games...have won three straight home series for the first time this year...have won two straight road series for the second time after going winless over the previous 12 road series (0-9-3)...the A's are batting .258 (475 for 1842) with 238 runs scored in 56 home games (4.25 per game) and .236 (503 for 2133) with 223 runs scored in 62 games on the road (3.60 per game)...have a 2.98 ERA (170 er in 513.0 ip) at home compared to 4.01 (241 er in 540.1 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-20 (.429) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League...are 7-10 (.412) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...the 17 extra inning games are tied for the most in the AL...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 14-27 (.341) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 13-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 12 times this year and currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 26th start of the season, which ties him for the American League lead...the A's are 10-15 (.400) in his starting assignments this year and are 46-41 (.529) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 13 of his 25 starts, allowed one run or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 1-3 with a 7.86 ERA (23 er in 26.1 ip) and .324 (36 for 111) opponents batting average in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .240 opponents average in 20 starts before the break...his post-break ERA is the highest in the majors...his post-break opponents batting average is fifth highest in the AL.

6-0 THEN 3-10: Is 3-10 with a 5.08 ERA (57 er in 101.0 ip) and .281 (108 for 385) opponents batting average over his last 17 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but is tied for second in the majors in losses since May 15 (Kuroda, LAD 11).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in stolen bases allowed (25), tied for second in walks (66), third in wild pitches (11) and tied for fifth in losses (10)...the 25 stolen bases are the most allowed by an A's pitcher since Dave Stewart yielded 32 in 1987...the 11 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when three pitchers had at least 11 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14, Haynes 11).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 with a 2.52 ERA (22 er in 78.2 ip) and .231 (66 for 286) opponents batting average in 12 starts at home and 4-5 with a 5.42 ERA (45 er in 74.2 ip) and .281 (83 for 295) in 13 starts on the road...has the eighth lowest home ERA in the American League but the second highest road ERA...is now 23-15 with a 3.06 ERA (98 er in 288.1 ip) in 45 career starts in Oakland and 14-16 with a 4.72 ERA (126 er in 240.1 ip) in 42 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .169 (11 for 65) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Cueto, CIN .143)...has yielded a .248 (34 for 137) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .315 (29 for 92) over his last 15 starts (since May 25).

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-4 with a 3.04 ERA (19 er in 56.1 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition this year and 6-6 with a 4.45 ERA (48 er in 97.0 ip) in 16 starts against everyone else...now has a 14-10 record and a 2.59 ERA (54 er in 188.0 ip) in 30 career starts against AL West teams, compared to 23-21 with a 4.49 ERA (170 er in 340.2 ip) in 57 starts against everyone else.

WINS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 27...won 10 games as a rookie in 2009 and 18 games last year...with one more win, he will become just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...has 27 wins over the last two years, which are tied for fifth in the American League...has 37 career wins, which are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

CAREER BESTS: Has 114 strikeouts, which is four short of his career high of 118 from last year...has issued 66 walks, which is six short of his high of 72 from his rookie season of 2009.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or fewer in 15 of his last 17 starts and his run support average over that span is 3.21 (36 rs in 101.0 ip)...13 of those 36 runs of support came in one start, July 27 against Tampa Bay...has received run support of three runs or fewer in 20 of his 25 starts this year and his season RSA is 4.05 (69 rs in 153.1 ip).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win in 10 innings at Tampa Bay last Sunday...allowed a run to score on a fielders choice in the third inning but the A's tied the game at 1-1 with a run in the fourth...allowed a lead off home run to Kotchman in the bottom of the fourth and a Jennings RBI single but the A's came back with three in the fifth to take a 4-3 lead...was relieved by Fuentes to start the seventh inning...he retired the only two batters he faced and was relieved by Balfour who allowed a home run to Longoria for the blown save.

CAHILL vs. TEXAS: Is 8-3 with a 2.19 ERA (78.0 ip, 66 h, 22 r, 19 er, 22 bb, 47 so, 8 hr) in 12 career starts...has no more than four wins against any other team...has allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of his 12 starts...is 3-1 with a 1.27 ERA (5 er in 35.1 ip) in five starts in Texas and 5-2 with a 2.95 ERA (14 er in 42.2 ip) in seven starts in Oakland...is 2-1 with a 1.25 ERA (21.2 ip, 17 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 14 so) in three starts this year...the first win came in a 3-1 A's victory in Oakland April 29...tossed 7.0 shutout innings, scattering seven hits and four walks...left with a 7-0 lead...also picked up the win in the A's 7-2 victory at Texas May 9...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed one run, his third consecutive start of seven or more innings and one run or fewer...the Rangers scored their only run on a lead-off home run by Moreland in the fifth...was the losing pitcher in a 2-0 loss at Texas July 10...blanked the Rangers on four hits over the first five innings...had retired nine consecutive batters before walking Hamilton with two outs in the sixth inning...Beltre followed with a home run for the only two runs of the game...Harrison and Lowe combined to shutout the A's on six hits and a walk.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Rich Harden (3-2, 4.07 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...has allowed at least one home run in each of his seven starts this year (eight total)...is 1-0 with a 3.32 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in three starts at home and 2-2 with a 4.70 ERA and .256 opponents average in four starts on the road...is now 20-10 with a 3.00 ERA in 54 career appearances in the Coliseum and 38-26 with a 4.02 ERA in 108 career appearances in all other parks...is 39-21 in his career with the A's and his .650 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's win at Toronto Tuesday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...is 5-3 with a 4.54 ERA in 13 career appearances, 12 starts, against Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-0 A's loss at Texas July 7 (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 2 so).

The A's bullpen has a 4.79 ERA (33 er in 62.0 ip) and .277 (69 for 249) opponents batting average over the last 20 games after posting a 1.80 ERA and .194 opponents average in its previous 21 games...ranks second in the American League in ERA (3.28) and opponents slugging percentage (.350) and is third in fewest home runs (24)...has the fewest wins (12) and is tied for the fourth most losses (19)...has allowed just three home runs to first batters faced, which is the fewest in the AL, and has struck out 79, which is second most...has allowed 55 of 151 (36.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
