A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail in the season series, 4-8...won four of the first five games, but have lost seven straight, which is the A's longest losing streak against the Rangers since June 19-Sept. 30, 1986 when they lost nine straight...have lost the first two games of this series and have not been swept by the Rangers in Oakland since May 2-4, 2005...are 1-5 in Texas this year and 3-3 in Oakland...have lost the season series four times over the previous five seasons and are 49-58 against Texas since the start of the 2006 season...are 290-302 alltime against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 155-141 in Oakland and 135-161 in Texas...including 68-73 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 387-384 against the Rangers/Senators

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all six of his save chances since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 29 for 29 post-break in his career.

Hideki Matsui leads the majors in batting (.410) since the All-Star Break, ranks second in on-base percentage (.470), sixth in slugging (.630) and tied for ninth in RBI (24).

Jemile Weeks has 68 hits, which are the most by an Oakland Athletic over the first 56 games of his career.

Josh Willingham has six home runs in his last 14 games and a team-leading 19 for the season...is tied for third in the American League in home runs since the All-Star Break (8).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1933** Jimmie Foxx hits for the cycle and drives in nine runs in the A's 11-5 win over Cleveland...in **1987** Mark McGwire breaks the Major League rookie home run record with his 39th of the season, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of the A's 7-6 win at California...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 round trippers.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games to fall a season-high 14½ games out of first place in the American League West...that is the A's largest deficit since finishing the 2009 season 22 games out...are 13 games under .500, which is one short of the season low (three times, last: 49-63 on August 5)...are 14-13 (.519) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...had the third worst record at the break in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 31-46 (.403) since then...have spent each of the last 22 days in third place in the AL West after a streak of 59 consecutive days with at least a share of last place...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 56 days in third, five days tied for third and 60 days in fourth...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed four errors yesterday, which was one short of the season high of five on Opening Night, April 1 against Seattle...have made eight errors in the last four games and now have a **Major League-leading** 98 for the season...have committed 100 errors in a season just once over the previous seven years (105 in 2009)...17 of the errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with Cincinnati for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1999 when they had 18...the errors have led to 67 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors...are tied third in the AL in double plays (116).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to five hits in each of the last two games and are batting just .208 (80 for 385) against Texas this year...are batting .286 (267 for 932) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best mark in the American League...rank second in the AL in on-base percentage (.360), slugging percentage (.458), doubles (66) and triples (8) since the break, third in walks (104) and fourth in runs (147)...are hitting .318 (81 for 255) with runners in scoring position since the break...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.245) and slugging percentage (.365) in the American League and are tied for the third fewest runs scored (462)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 84 of 119 (70.6%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...however, are 16 for 17 (94.1%) over the last 12 games.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have gone homerless in each of the last three games after homering in a seasonhigh eight consecutive games...have 13 home runs over the last 11 games and 19 over the last 16...however, have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 90 games...the Oakland record for consecutive games with fewer than three home runs is 91 from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 76 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...the pitching staff has surrendered just 86 home runs, which is the **fewest in the AL** and third fewest in the majors.

PLAYERS USED: Yesterday, Brandon Allen became the 42nd player to appear in a game for Oakland this year...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Allen is just the 19th non-pitcher to appear in a game for the A's, which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history...the A's have used just three right fielders (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently the fewest in Oakland history (used 4 in 1980).

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 23-17 (.575) record on the weekend (11-10 on Saturday, 12-7 on Sunday) compared to 30-49 (.380) during the week...are 23-23 (.500) in day games and 30-43 (.411) at night...are 19-18 (514) in games started by a left-handed pitcher and 34-48 (.415) against right-handers.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.94 ERA (130 er in 237.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League and ranked third in the majors in ERA at the break but have the third highest post-break ERA in the AL and the majors...now have a 3.53 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.365) and are tied for second in pickoffs (17) but have issued the third most walks (399)...A's starting pitchers are 10-12 with a 5.27 ERA (91 er in 155.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (0-2), Baltimore (three games) and Toronto (four games)...it is one of two 10-game homestands this year (Sept. 12-22)...however, this stand marks the A's only home games over a stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where Oakland plays 19 of its 29 games on the road...began the stretch by going 4-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (2-1)...are 31-26 (.544) at home compared to 22-40 (.355) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-1) and Minnesota (2-1)...are 11-31 (.262) over the last 42 road games but have won two straight road series after going winless over the previous 12 road series (0-9-3)...the A's are batting .256 (480 for 1874) with 239 runs scored in 57 home games (4.19 per game) and .236 (503 for 2133) with 223 runs scored in 62 games on the road (3.60 per game)...have a 3.03 ERA (176 er in 522.0 ip) at home compared to 4.01 (241 er in 540.1 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.02)

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-20 (.429) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League to Texas (14-19)...are 7-10 (.412) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...the 17 extra inning games are tied for the most in the AL...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 14-27 (.341) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 13-22 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 12 times this year and currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...it is the 153^{rd} start of his career, his 97^{th} as an Athletic...the A's are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 95-57 (.625) in his starting assignments in his career, including 62-34 (.646) with the A's...has tossed six or more innings in four of his seven starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer five times...is

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed at least one home run in each of his seven starts this year (eight total)...also allowed a home run in his final outing of 2010 and has a career-long streak of eight consecutive games with a home run allowed...seven of the eight home runs he has allowed this year have been hit by right-handed hitters...five have been solo shots.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .193 (11 for 57) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .232 (13 for 56) the second time and .238 (10 for 42) after that...his career numbers are .197 (248 for 1262) the first time, .223 (258 for 1156) the second time and .265 (222 for 839) after that...opponents are batting .245 (24 for 98) with the bases empty and .175 (10 for 57) with runners on base.

HOME AND AWAY: is 1-0 with a 3.32 ERA (7 er in 19.0 ip) and .169 (11 for 65) opponents batting average in three starts at home and 2-2 with a 4.70 ERA (12 er in 23.0 ip) and .256 (23 for 90) opponents average in four starts on the road...is now 20-10 with a 3.00 ERA (107 er in 321.1 ip) in 54 career appearances in the Coliseum and 38-26 with a 4.02 ERA (253 er in 566.1) in 108 career appearances in all other parks.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-2 with a 5.94 ERA (11 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts on five days rest or fewer and 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA (8 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts on six days rest or more.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 after going 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento (7.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr)...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

SINCE 2003: Has 903 strikeouts in 887.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.16 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 9.97)...has a .224 (728 for 3257) opponents batting average over that span, which is fourth best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221; Lincecum, .222; Jason Schmidt, .223).

WITH THE A'S: His start July 1 against Arizona was his first as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 39-21 record and a 3.47 ERA (225 er in 583.2 ip) in 104 games, 96 starts...his .650 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

2011 START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona July 1 in Oakland ... it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas July 7 ... allowed runs in four of his five innings ... Kinsler scored on a ground out in the first and Hamilton had a RBI single in the third...Kinsler added a RBI single in the fourth followed by a Hamilton sacrifice fly and Young hit a leadoff home run in the fifth inning...Holland shutout the A's on four hits...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in the second game of the doubleheader against Los Angeles **July 16** in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Trumbo in the second inning but then retired 12 of the next 14 batters he faced...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Wells in the sixth inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at New York July 23...allowed a RBI single to Martin in the second inning and a solo home run to Swisher in the sixth...was relieved by Ziegler following the home run and left with a 3-2 lead ... had a no decision in the A's 10-8 loss to Tampa Bay July 28 in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters before walking Jennings to start the fourth inning.. .did not allow a hit until Zobrist singled to lead off the fifth...allowed a two-run home run to Jennings in the sixth inning...left after six innings with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed seven runs in the seventh inning....Ziegler was charged with the blown save and loss...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Seattle August 2 ... allowed a two-run double to Carp in the first inning and a two-out, two-run home run to Wells in the sixth.

LAST START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win at Toronto last Tuesday...surrendered a lead off home run to Encarnacion in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...the A's scored twice in the sixth and once in the seventh to give him a 3-1 lead...was relieved by Balfour to start the eighth.

HARDEN vs. TEXAS: Is 5-3 with a 4.54 ERA (71.1 ip, 65 h, 39 r, 36 er, 32 bb, 67 so, 4 hr) in 13 career appearances, 12 starts...that includes 4-1 with a 2.45 ERA (12 er in 44.0 ip) in seven games, six starts, in Oakland and 1-2 with a 7.90 ERA (24 er in 27.1 ip) in six starts in Texas...is 5-3 with a 4.61 ERA (36 er in 70.1 ip) in his 12 starting assignments...pitched for Texas last year and is 3-4 with a 5.72 ERA (46 er in 72.1 ip) in 16 career appearances at Rangers Ballpark...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-0 A's loss at Texas July 7...allowed runs in four of his five innings...Kinsler scored on a ground out in the first and Hamilton had a RBI single in the third...Kinsler added a RBI single in the fourth followed by a Hamilton sacrifice fly and Young hit a leadoff home run in the fifth inning...Holland shutout the A's on four hits.

LHP Gio Gonzalez (9-10, 3.25 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season...is 0-4 with a 8.44 ERA and .330 opponents batting average over his last four starts...the losing streak is one short of his career high...is 1-4 with a 6.35 ERA in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...ranked fifth in the American League in ERA at the break but has the third highest ERA in the AL since the break...is 7-3 with a 2.21 ERA and .201 opponents batting average in 12 starts at home compared to 2-7 with a 4.50 ERA and .275 opponents average in 11 starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-4 A's loss at Toronto Wednesday (5.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 4 so)...is 1-1 with a 2.59 ERA in four career starts against Baltimore...including 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 14 h, 6 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 10 so) in two starts this year...is 0-5 with a 5.82 ERA in six starts against AL East teams this year compared to 9-5 with a 2.43 ERA (29 er in 107.1) in 17 starts against everyone else.



Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
