WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers and A's conclude this series today...Texas has won the 1st 2 games while capturing 5 of 6 and 7 of its last 9 games...club is 7-4 in August and 12-11 since the 12-game win streak...team is 17-11 since the All-Star break, 24-11 last 35 games and 32-18 in the last 50...Texas has gone 45-29 beginning May 22 and is 59-51 beg. April 12 after a 9-1 start. -At 68-52 (.567), the Rangers have the 3rd-best record in the A.L., 6th-best in majors...**Texas is a season best 16 games over .500**, the club's best mark since the end of 2010 (90-72)...the Rangers have matched 1977, 1996, 2004, and 2009 for 2nd best record ever after 120 games. -Rangers' **12-game win streak July 4-19** was 2nd-longest in club history, longest in majors since Boston, 12 straight June 16-29, 2006...since '02, only win streak longer than Rangers' 12 G: Oakland's 20 G Aug. 13-Sept. 4, 2002.

ON TOP IN WEST: Texas' win on Saturday increased its advantage in the A.L. West to 3.0 games, its largest since July 26 (3.0 GA)...club's last advantage of more than 3.0 games was a 4.0 lead on July 25...the Rangers have led the division by at least 1.0 game for 39 straight days beginning July 6...Texas has had sole possession of first place in the A.L. West for 75 of the last 78 days beginning May 16, including 39 straight days beginning July 6, as Texas has not been out of first since May 15 (-0.5 GB)...team has had at least a share of the division lead for 122 of 136 days in 2011, club's 4th-most days in first place ever in a single season...Texas has been in 1st in West for 240 of 254 days beginning June 8, 2010.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers have won 3 consecutive away games and are 13-8 (.619) away from home since June 17, 3rd best in the A.L. in that span...overall road winning percentage of .500 (29-29) ranks 8th in the A.L....club was last above the .500 mark on the road on July 20 (25-24).

VERSUS THE A.L. WEST: The Rangers are 22-12 (.647) vs. A.L. West opponents this season, winning 16 of the last 20 games beginning May 15...Texas has the 3rd best winning percentage against its own division of any major league club in 2011, behind .698 (30-13) for Boston vs. the A.L. East and .648 (35-19) for Milwaukee vs. the N.L. Central...Texas is 9-7 in A.L. West parks this season, winning 7 of the last 9...the Rangers have a 2.82 ERA (94 ER/300.0 IP) vs. the 3 A.L. West opponents this season while holding those foes to a .221 (246-1114) batting average.

VERSUS OAKLAND: The Rangers are 8-4 against the A's in 2011, winning the last 7 games since a loss on May 9 at Rangers Ballpark...the current streak matches the Rangers' 5th longest ever vs. the A's, the longest since 9 straight wins, June 19-Sept. 30, 1986...Texas has won 11 of the last 15 meetings with Oakland beginning Sept. 24, 2010 with a 58-49 edge beginning 2006...Rangers' all-time advantage is 302-290, the most lifetime wins ersus any club...Texas is 3-3 at the Coliseum this season and has won 6 of 9 beginning last Sept. 24...club is 12-14 in this park since the start of 2009...all-time, the A's have a 155-141 edge here...Texas, which swept a 4-game series from the A's, July 7-10 in Arlington, have not won all games of a series at the Coliseum since going 3-0, May 2-4, 2005.

--Texas has defeated the A's by 6 or more runs 4 times this season, 3 in OAK.

OVERALL EFFORT: With 9-1 and 7-1 wins in this series, it marks the 1st time that the Rangers have scored 7+ runs in consecutive games, while holding opposition to one or zero runs in both contests since May 10 (at CWS) and 12 (vs. SEA), 2009, both 7-1 victories...it's the 1st time club has had as many as 16 runs in back-to-back wins, with opposition scoring one-or-less in each contest, since Sept. 17 (vs. LAA) and 18 (vs. SEA), 2006, a pair of 8-1 victories.

PITCHING PROWESS: The Rangers have allowed just 2 runs and 10 hits with 5 walks and 23 strikeouts in 18.0 innings in the 1st 2 games of this series.

-club has a 3.04 ERA (105 ER/311.0 IP) in the last 35 G since July 4 to drop from 4.01 to 3.73, 6th in A.L....current mark would be Texas' 7th lowest ever in a season and best since team record 3.31 in 1983.

-staff has permitted one or fewer runs in a game on 28 occasions in 2011, 3rd most in the A.L. behind the Angels (31) and Rays (30) after 26 times in all of 2010

-Saturday was the 23rd game with 10+ strikeouts for the Rangers this season, 5th most in the A.L....club has 10+ K's in 3 straight games for 2nd time this season (June 16-18) and has never done that for 4 consecutive games.

STARTERS: The Rangers have received 3 straight quality starts with the starters allowing 14 hits and 5 R-4 ER in 18.1 innings in that span.

--Texas starters won 58 games and had 76 quality starts *all of last season*...current ERA would be 6th best all-time, best since 1983 (3.34).

AND IN RELIEF:...The bullpen has worked 7.2 scoreless innings since Koji Uehara allowed a run in the 7th inning on Wednesday vs. Seattle and has issued just one run in 18.2 innings in the last 6 games...relievers have posted a 1.45 mark (8 ER/49.2 IP) over the last 15 games, issuing one or zero ER in 14 of those contests, to fall from 4.52 to 4.05, lowest since June 5 (4.04).

STINGY ON THE ROAD: The Rangers have the lowest road earned run average in the major leagues at 3.08...the current mark would be the lowest in the majors for a season since Montreal's 2.69 mark in 1992 and the 2nd-lowest such figure in the A.L. for a single season over the past 39 seasons from 1973-2011 or since the advent of the designated hitter, and best in team history for any season, surpassing a 3.15 mark in 1977...the 3.08 figure would be the 8th lowest overall mark in both leagues since 1973.

MINOR LEAGUE MILESTONE: Round Rock defeated Oakland's AAA club Sacramento, 6-3 on Saturday, giving Express manager Bobby Jones 1500 career minor league managerial wins...all of those have come in the Texas organization with Charlotte (1988-90); Tulsa (1991-92; 1995-2000); Oklahoma City (1993-94; 2002-10); and Round Rock (2011)...the 1499 wins are 7th most among active minor league skipper with Lakeland's Dave Huppert the leader at 1665...Round Rock has the best record in the PCL at 71-50.

ANGELS NEXT: The Rangers open a 4-game series in Anaheim on Monday...Texas is 4-5 against the Halos in 2011, losing the last 2 of a 3-game set at Angels Stadium, July 19-21...Rangers have lost 11 of 15 in Anaheim beginning Sept. 28, 2009.

SHORTS: This is the 2nd time this season Texas has won back-to-back games by 6+ runs, the other July 6 (vs. BAL) and 7 (vs. OAK), and 1st on the road since Aug. 1-2, 2006 at MIN (9-0 and 10-2)...club is 19-16 in day games this season, winning 5 of the last 7 beginning July 10...club has won all games of a series 7 times in 2011, twice on the road (4 games each at CLE, 6/2-5 and SEA, 7/14-17)...Rangers are one of 4 ML teams with 3 11-game winners, joining Atlanta, Detroit, and Philadelphia...all 9 Texas starters hit safely for 4th time this season on Saturday (4/2 vs. BOS; 5/30 at TB; 6/28 at HOU)...Matt Harrison has induced 28 GIDPs in 2011, 2 shy of the Rangers single season club record shared by Rick Honeycutt (1983) and Kevin Brown (1991).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#54 Matt Harrison, LHP (10-8, 3.06)

TODAY: The 25-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 23rd start and appearance in this afternoon's series finale against the A's here at the Coliseum...including the 4.0 scoreless innings in a rainout on May 11, Harrison has unofficially worked 11.2 consecutive scoreless innings against Oakland...achieved his first career 10-win season in last start on Monday, a 9-2 victory over Seattle, posting his staff-leading 16th quality start of the season...his 3.06 ERA ranks 10th in the A.L., 4th-lowest by any left-hander in the league...will working on extended 5-days' rest due to Thursday's off day, as he has gone 4-3 with a 3.86 ERA (24 ER/56.0 IP) with an extra days' rest this season...has won 5 of 7, and 7 of his last 11 decisions beginning May 22, posting a 2.45 ERA (25 ER/92.0 IP) over that span of 14 starts to fall from 4.27...has induced 28 GDP's in '11, most in the majors and 4 more than the next closest pitcher (LAA's Tyler Chatwood).

BREAKOUT YEAR: Has already established career highs in wins, starts, innings, losses, and strikeouts...tied with C.J. Wilson for staff lead with 16 quality starts in '11...entering this season, Harrison had a total of 11 quality games in his first 32 career starts from 2008-10.

NEED YOUR SUPPORT: Has the lowest run support average among Texas starters at 4.55 per 9 innings...while that ranks middle of the pack in the majors this season, the only A.L. pitchers with 10-or-more wins on less run support than Harrison are: Jered Weaver (14-5 on 3.06 RSA), James Shields (11-9 on 3.16), Dan Haren (12-6 on 3.27), Felix Hernandez (10-10 on 3.76) and Ricky Romero (10-9 on 4.53)...has received 3-runs-or-less in 6 of last 7 outings and 15 of 22 starts this season, including one or zero runs 7 times...entered this season with an average of 7.21 runs of support per 9 innings in his first 32 career starts.

MONTH TO REMEMBER: Went 3-0 with a 2.04 ERA (8 ER/35.1 IP) in 5 starts in July, allowing just 3 walks with 26 strikeouts, as Texas won each of his 5 starts...despite leading all Rangers with the 8th-best ERA in the A.L. last month at 2.04, Harrison was not selected club's player of the month, as Derek Holland posted 3 shutouts in July to take the honors...Harrison led the A.L. and ranked 3rd in the majors with an 8.67 strikeout-to-walk ratio last month, as only WSH's Jordan Zimmerman (13.50) and PHI's Roy Halladay (9.67) had better marks among ML qualifiers...the 2.04 ERA was easily Harrison's lowest ever in a month as a starter.

FEW RUNS ALLOWED IN WINS: Harrison has 10 wins this season and in each one of those wins he has allowed 2 earned runs or less, including one or zero earned runs 9 times...his 9 wins with one-or-zero earned runs allowed are the most by a Ranger in a season since Kenny Rogers in 2005 (9), and are T6th-most in majors this season being only Jered Weaver (11), Justin Verlander (11), C.C. Sabathia (10) and Yovani Gallardo (10)...5 other players have 9 such victories with Harrison.

LAST START: Achieved his first career 10-win season with Monday's victory, posting his staff-leading 16th quality start of the season (7.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 0 BB, 6 SO, 102 pitches/62 strikes)...Rangers became the first team in 2011 to have 5 different pitchers reach the 10-win mark, matching a club record...induced 2 more double-play balls to raise his major league-leading total to 28...Texas scored 6 times over the next 3 innings, after the Mariners tied the game at 2 in the 3rd inning.

VS. OAKLAND: Has gone 4-1, 3.66 (13 ER/32.0 IP) over 8 games/5 starts in his career against the Athletics, including 4-1, 2.15 (7 ER/29.1 IP) with one complete game as a starter...has split a pair of decisions against Oakland this season, posting a 3.86 ERA (4 ER/9.1 IP)...in 7-2 loss on 5/1 at OAK, allowed 3 first-inn. runs and exited w/ bases loaded in 2nd in shortest start of career...bested Trevor Cahill in 2-0 first "half" finale win 7/10 (7.2 IP, 0 R) with benefit of Beltre 2-run HR...did not allow a runner to advance past 2nd base, while holding the Athletics without an extra-base hit...also had 7-0 lead and 4.0 SHO IP erased in 5/11 rainout.

ON THE ROAD: Has gone 4-4, 2.95 (21 ER/64.0 IP) in 10 road starts, quality starts in 7 of 10 away starts this season...opponents batting .230 (52-226) opponents avg., 14th-lowest in A.L. and 42 points lower than opponents avg. at home (.272)...in 24 career road starts, is 11-9, 4.38 (71 ER/146.0 IP).

NOTHING EXTRA: Among Rangers, Harrison's .380 opp. SLG is 3rd-lowest in rotation (Ogando, .343; Wilson, .360) and ranks 21st among A.L. qualifiers...has surrendered just 2 HR in last 6 starts and 6 HR over his last 14, including a span of 4 starts with no HR from May 22-June 12, which matched the longest such streak of his career (also 4 straight, April 27-May 14, 2009)...has allowed one or zero HR in 21 of 22 starts, as his 0.78 HR per 9 inn. ranks 17th in A.L., 3rd among Rangers (Wilson, 0.56; Ogando, 0.74).

BY THE NUMBERS: Team is 13-9 in 22 starts...has logged 6.0-or-more innings in 19 of 22 starts, including at least 7.0 innings 10 times...Torrealba has caught 13 of his starts (3-6, 4.29, 37 ER/77.2 IP), while Napoli has caught 9 (7-2, 1.48 ERA, 10 ER/60.2 IP) - plus the rainout...Torrealba has caught 8 of last 11 starts (2-3, 3.33, 19 ER/51.1 IP)...right-handers hitting 35 points lower (.245) than lefties (.280)...opposition just 1-for-4 in stolen base attempts...opponents batting .310 w/ RISP, .352 w/ RISP and 2 out...leads the majors with 28 GDP...only member of season-opening rotation w/o a CG.

IN THE REARVIEW: Had a 3.38 ERA (11 ER/29.1 IP) over 5 starts in June, 2nd-lowest among Texas starters for the month (Wilson-2.72), this despite a string of ailments...missed scheduled start June 2 at CLE due to a blister on his left index finger, pitched through a kidney stone on June 7 vs. DET, and left his start on June 12 at MIN after being struck by line drive (bruised left triceps), which forced him to exit that outing.

OTHER STARTS: Made Opening Day rotation for 3rd straight season (started 3rd game), only pitcher to make that claim over last 3 years...began year with 4 straight QS...won first start 4/3 vs. BOS, matching career high with 8 K's and besting Lackey in 12-5 victory that secured a season-opening series sweep...struck out Ellsbury with bases loaded to end the 7th...won back end of twinbill 4/9 at BAL-G2, allowing just a Jones solo HR in 2nd of 13-1 victory...retired final 18 straight after HR...earned 3rd straight win 4/15 at NYY, Rangers' lone win of series...took first loss despite QS 4/20 vs. LAA, a 4-1 defeat in matchup with Weaver (CG)...lasted 3.0 inn. in 10-3 defeat 4/26 vs. TOR (7 ER/3.0 IP)...in 7-2 loss on 5/1 at OAK, allowed 3 first-inn. runs and exited w/ bases loaded in 2nd in shortest start of career...season-high 119 pitches in 4-1 loss 5/6 vs. NYY (6.0 IP, 3 R-2 ER)...retired 10 straight and 13 of final 16 BF, but matched career high with 5 walks...had 7-0 lead and 4.0 SHO IP erased in 5/11 rainout vs. OAK...did not factor into decision in 4-3 loss 5/17 at CWS, holding Sox scoreless thru 4 until surrendering a 2-out, 3-run HR to no. 9 hitter Brent Morel in 5th that followed 2 of the 4 walks he issued...snapped 5-start winless streak in 2-0 victory 5/22 at PHI (8.1 IP, 0 R)...retired 16 of 22 batters and faced the min. in 4 of his 6 inn., tossing 6.0 SHO IP in 10-1 win 5/28 vs. KC...missed start 6/2 at CLE with blister on left index finger...loss 6/7 vs. DET was first in over a month (May 6)...had tossed 19.1 consec. scoreless inn. until Tigers' 4-run 4th inning in that loss...took 6-1 loss 6/12 at MIN (6.0 IP, 2 R-ER); was forced to exit in 7th, trailing just 1-0, after taking line drive off left triceps...took no decision in 5-4, 10-inning win 6/18 at ATL, returning to mound after 2-inn. 16-min. delay...won 6/24 vs. NYM (7.0 IP, 1 R-ER), first win since 5/28...took 7-0 loss 6/30 at HOU (6.0 IP, 5 ER), giving up Lee solo HR to start 4th and 4 runs in 5th...took ND in QS 7/5 vs. BAL, season-high 11 hits allowed...both runs allowed on solo HR to Hardy and Wieters, first time all season to allow multiple HR...bested Cahill in 2-0 first "half" finale win 7/10 vs. OAK (7.2 IP, 0 R) with benefit of Beltre 2-run HR...earned 3-1 win 7/17 at SEA to complete 4-game sweep, needing only a Moreland 3-run HR off former Rangers prospect Beavan...took ND 7/23 vs. TOR despite matching career high with 8 K's, with Texas scoring twice in 9th for walk-off win...earned 4-1 win 7/28 vs. MIN; lone run on Thome 2-out RBI single in 6th...snapped 3-game win streak in 5-4 loss on 8/3 at DET, allowing lead-off man reached in 5 of his 6 frames and 3 of 4 runs driven in with 2 outs.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER: RHP Alexi Ogando (11-5, 3.22 ERA in 22 games/starts)

The 27-year-old right-hander and 2011 American League All-Star is scheduled to make his 23rd start and appearance on Monday night to kick off a 4-game series against the Angels in Anaheim...is tied with Lewis and Wilson for the team lead with 11 wins (T7th in A.L.) and ranks among A.L. leaders in ERA (15th, 3.22), opponents avg. (.9th, .227) and opponents OBP (.8th, .282)...will be pitching on extended 5 days' rest after taking a no decision in the Rangers 7-6 walk-off win over Seattle on Tuesday in Arlington despite exiting with a 6-3 deficit prior to the conclusion of the 3rd inning (2.2 IP, 8 H, 6 R-ER, 2 BB, 0 SO, 70 pitches/42 strikes)...Texas bullpen combined for 6.1 scoreless frames, while the offense staged comeback - ending with Hamilton's walk-off single in the bottom of the 9th...Ogando was placed on the MLB Paternity Leave List between his last 2 starts (Aug. 6-8)...has gone 2-0 with a 0.41 ERA (1 ER/22.0 IP) in 10 career games against the Angels, both wins coming in his only career starts on May 13 in Arlington and July 19 at Angels Stadium - two starts: 2-0, 0.63 ERA (1 ER/14.1 IP)...is 4-3 with a 3.10 ERA (21 ER/61.0 IP) in 10 road starts this season, going 2-1, 2.25 (5 ER/20.0 IP) over his last 3 outings away from Arlington to drop road ERA from 3.10...is 7-2, 3.55 (25 ER/63.1 IP) in 11 starts this season on 5-or-more days of rest (4-3, 2.93 ERA in 11 starts on 4 days' rest).
