A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's trail in the season series, 3-4...are 3-1 in Oakland and 0-3 in Baltimore...have a four-game losing streak, which marks the first time the A's have lost more than three consecutive games to Baltimore since May 23, 1998-April 23, 1999 when they lost eight straight...have won 20 of the the Orioles, against including 12 of the last 14 in Oakland...have won each of the previous three season series and 11 of the previous 12...are 75-35 (.682) against the Orioles since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning** which is the best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 242-241 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 120-125 in Oakland and 122-116 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 978-921 against Orioles/Browns/Brewers other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Hideki Matsui leads the American League in batting since the All-Star Break (.394) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.452).

Jemile Weeks has 71 hits, which are the most in Oakland history by a player over the first 58 games of his career

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1930 Lefty Grove wins his 20th game of the season, defeating St. Louis, 4-2...in 1983 Chris Codiroli and Dave Beard combine on a 4-0 shutout against California, the A's third consecutive shutout...the shutout comes as part of an Oakland record 37 consecutive scoreless innings...in 1991 Dennis Eckersley strikes out Chili Davis at Minnesota for his 2000th career strikeout...in 1996 Geronimo Berroa hits two home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Boston, the A's 199th and 200th of the season, to break the A's franchise record of 199...the A's would go on to hit 243 homers.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four straight and five of the last six games to fall a season-low 15 games under for the first time since September 9, 2009 (62-77)...have not been 16 games under .500 since September 5, 2009 (60-76)...are also a season-high 16½ games out of first place in the American League West...that is the A's largest deficit since finishing the 2009 season 22 games out...dropped back into fourth place in the West last night for the first time since July 20...have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 57 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...are 14-15 (.483) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 31-48 (.392) since then, which is the third worst record in the AL and fourth worst in the majors...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a four-game home losing streak, which matches the season high (May 30-June 14)...have not lost more than four straight home games since June 23-28, 2009 when they had a five-game home losing streak...are 0-4 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (0-1) and Toronto (four games)...it is one of two 10-game homestands this year (Sept. 12-22)...however, this stand marks the A's only home games over a stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where Oakland plays 19 of its 29 games on the road...began the stretch by going 4-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (2-1)...are 31-28 (.525) at home compared to 22-40 (.355) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...are 11-31 (.262) over the last 42 road games but have won two straight road series after going winless over the previous 12 road series (0-9-3)...the A's are batting .256 (499 for 1947) with 247 runs scored in 59 home games (4.18 per game) and .236 (503 for 2133) with 223 runs scored in 62 games on the road (3.60 per game)...have a 3.12 ERA (187 er in 540.0 ip) at home compared to 4.01 (241 er in 540.1 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the AL (Los Angeles, 3.09).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have set an Oakland record by hitting two home runs or fewer in each of the last 92 games...that tops the previous mark of 91 from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have gone homerless in each of the last five games, which is one short of the season high of six (May 16-21)...have 76 home runs for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 102 home runs and have hit fewer than 104 home runs in a season just twice in Oakland history (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978)...the pitching staff has allowed just 88 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.98 ERA (141 er in 255.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League and ranked third in the majors in ERA at the break but have the second highest post-break ERA in the majors (Baltimore, 5.01)...now have a 3.57 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.364) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (18) but have issued the second most walks (411)...A's starting pitchers are 10-13 with a 5.39 ERA (99 er in 165.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors in the last six games and now have 99 for the season, which is tied with Texas for second most in the majors (Cubs, 103)...have committed 100 errors in a season just once over the previous seven years (105 in 2009)...17 of the errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with Cincinnati and Chicago (NL) for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1999 when they had 18...the errors have led to 69 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors...are fourth in the American League in double plays (116).

OFFENSE: The A's are 29 for 137 (.212) on the homestand but are batting .285 (286 for 1005) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best mark in the American League...rank second in the AL in on-base percentage (.356) since the break, tied for second in triples (8), third in doubles (69) and walks (108) and fourth in runs (155) and slugging percentage (.447)...are hitting .315 (86 for 273) with runners in scoring position since the break...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.364) in the AL and are tied for the third fewest runs scored (470)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 84 of 120 (70.0%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the third lowest percentage in the AL...however, are 16 for 18 (88.9%) over the last 14 games.

PLAYERS USED: Bruce Billings became the 43rd player to appear in a game for Oakland this year on Sunday...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Billings is the 24th pitcher the A's have used this year, which is tied for the third highest total in Oakland history...the record is 26 in 1997 and 2009...Brandon Allen was player number 42 on Saturday...he is just the 19th non-pitcher to appear in a game for the A's, which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history...the A's have used just three right fielders (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently the fewest in Oakland history (used 4 in 1980).

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 23-18 (.561) record on the weekend (11-10 on Saturday, 12-8 on Sunday) compared to 30-50 (.375) during the week...are 23-24 (.489) in day games and 30-44 (.405) at night...are 19-19 (500) in games started by a left-handed pitcher and 34-49 (.410) against right-handers.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 15-21 (.417) in one-run games with the loss Sunday...that is the worst record in the AL and fourth worst in the majors...are 7-10 (.412) in extra inning games...the 10 extra inning losses and 17 games are tied for second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 7-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 14-27 (.341) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 13-24 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-18 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 12 times this year and currently have three players on the DL (Anderson, Braden and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished 2006 with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 16th appearance and 14th start of the season...the A's are 7-6 (.538) starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings seven times, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

BRIEFLY: Is 2-2 with a 6.08 ERA (18 er in 26.2 ip) in five starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19...began the season with the River Cats and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed just five earned runs over the first three innings of a game for a 1.14 ERA (39.1 ip) and .170 (24 for 141) opponents batting average...has a 6.03 ERA (25 er in 37.1 ip) and .281 (43 for 153) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .188 (42 for 223) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup and .352 (25 for 71) after that...opponents are hitting .196 (11 for 56) with runners in scoring position and .200 (14 for 70) when leading off an inning.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 5-5 with a 3.54 ERA (29 er in 73.2 ip) in 12 starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...made his two relief appearances on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3rd and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14inning loss on the 4th.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received 18 runs of support in his last three starts (17.0 ip, 9.53 RSA) after receiving just 10 runs of support over his previous eight starts (1.97 RSA)...has received no run support in five of his 13 starts this year.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high four games in a 2-0 win over Seattle July 6...posted a 2.43 ERA and .200 opponents during the losing streak, which spanned six games, including five starts.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July, 1968.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore June 7...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-4 loss at Chicago **June 12**...walked a career-high four batters in 6.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco June 18 in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the fifth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Philadelphia *June 24*...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and did not allow a run...Worley, Herndon, Perez and Stutes combined to shutout the A's on two hits...extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida June 29 in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings...Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle *July 6* in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss July 19 at Detroit...allowed career highs in runs (7), earned runs (6) and hits (9) and matched his high in home runs (2)...tossed just 4.2 innings, matching his fewest as a starter...blanked the Tigers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career high 12.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Tampa Bay *July 25* in Oakland...matched his career high by walking four batters and allowing two home runs...did not strike out a batter for the first time in a starting assignment...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 win over Minnesota July 30 in Oakland...retired 11 of the 12 batters he faced over innings three through six...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Tampa Bay August 5...blanked the Rays on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth and three more in the fifth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-3 win at Toronto last Thursday...retired each of the first nine batters and had a 6-0 lead when he walked Escobar to lead off the fourth inning... Escobar scored on a Pennington error and Encarnacion added a RBI single, the first hit of the game...was relieved by De Los Santos to start the seventh inning with a 10-2 lead.

MOSCOSO vs. BALTIMORE: Is 1-0 with a 4.02 ERA (11.2 ip, 14 h, 9 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, two starts...is 0-1 with 4.50 ERA (3 er in 6.0 ip) in two games at Camden Yards and 1-0 with a 9.53 ERA (6 er in 5.2 ip) in two games at his home ballparks...is 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (10.0 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 3 so) in two starts this year...the win came in the A's 6-4 victory in Oakland May 29...blanked the Orioles on two hits and a walk over the first four innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Pie, a bases loaded walk to Reimold and RBI ground outs by Markakis and Guerrero....the A's came back with four runs in the bottom of the fifth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Baltimore June 7...allowed a lead-off home runs to Hardy in the bottom of the first and Scott in the bottom of the fifth...those were the only two runs he would allow in 5.0 innings...Jakubauskas, Rapada, Accardo and Uehara combined to shutout the A's on five hits.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA (46.1 ip, 41 h, 22 r, 20 er, 16 bb, 52 so) and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (5-6, 3.62 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season, his ninth since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...had his winning streak snapped at a career-high tying four game in his last start, a 9-1 loss to Texas last Friday (3.1 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 5 er)...is now 4-1 with a 3.79 ERA in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...is tied for fourth in the American League in wins since the break...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 17 starts this year and has walked just 16 batters in 112.0 innings, an average of 1.29 per nine innings...has established career highs in innings pitched (112.0), strikeouts (74), complete games (2) and hits (119)...is 0-1 with a 4.70 ERA in six career appearances, four starts, against Baltimore...his last outing against the Orioles was a start and no decision in an 8-5 Texas loss at Baltimore April 26, 2009 (5.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so).

The A's bullpen has a 4.90 ERA (39 er in 71.2 ip) and .277 (80 for 289) opponents batting average over the last 22 games after posting a 1.80 ERA and .194 opponents average in its previous 21 games...is third in the American League with a 3.34 ERA on the season...also ranks second in opponents slugging percentage (.353) and third in fewest home runs (25)...has the fewest wins (12) and is tied for the third most losses (20)...has allowed just three home runs to first batters faced, which is the fewest in the AL, and has struck out 82, which is second most...has allowed 60 of 157 (38.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL

- Has a 1.74 ERA (2 er in 10.1 ip) in 11 outings since the All-Star Break and has converted all six of his save opportunities...is now a perfect 29 for 29 in save opportunities after the break in his career.
- Has held opponents to a .185 batting average, including .116 (5 for 43) against right-handers and .245 (12 for 49) against lefties...opponents are batting .208 (5 for 24) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 1.13 ERA (2 er in 16.0 ip) in 16 appearances at home compared to a 3.86 ERA (4 er in 9.1 ip) in his 10 road outings

BOB MELVIN 6

MANAGER

Named as A's interim manager, June 9, 2011

Birthdate: October 28, 1961

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.
