A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The season series is even at three games each...this is the Blue Jays first visit to Oakland in 2011...the A's lost two of three in Toronto in April and won two of three at Rogers Centre last week...the A's have lost the season series each of the previous three years and are 13-19 against Toronto since 2008...all-time, the A's are 196-170 against the Blue Jays...that includes 94-86 in Oakland, 102-82 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's game at Texas Sept. 10 will be televised by FOX and will now start at 1:11 PDT instead of 5:05 PDT.

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his seven save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 30 for 30 after the break in his career.

Hideki Matsui ranks third in the American League with a .385 (45 for 117) batting average since the All-Star Break.

Each of **Scott Sizemore**'s last six hits have been doubles...the longest such streak in Oakland history is seven by Carlos Gonzalez from May 30-June 7, 2008.

Josh Willingham hit his 20th home run of the season Tuesday night, his fourth career 20-homer season.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1990 Rickey Henderson hits a two-run homer to break a 1-1 tie in the A's 3-1 win at Baltimore...it is Henderson 744th run as an Athletic, most ever by an Oakland player...in 1991 Dave Stewart records his 1000th strikeout in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-4 loss at Minnesota...in 1996 Mark McGwire hits his 145th career home run in the Coliseum, breaking Reggie Jackson's Coliseum Home Run record...in 2004 Erubiel Durazo hits three home runs to account for all of the A's scoring in a 5-4 win at Baltimore.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing four in a row...are 6-9 over the last 15 games and 16-15 (.516) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...remain a season-high 16½ games out of first place in the American League West for the third consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit since finishing the 2009 season 22 games out...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 34-48 (.415) since then, which is the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have spent 25 of the last 26 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 59 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 23-18 (.561) record on the weekend (11-10 on Saturday, 12-8 on Sunday) compared to 32-50 (.390) during the week...are 24-24 (.500) in day games and 31-44 (.413) at night...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in six of the previous 10 games and are scheduled to face a lefty three times in this four-game series against Toronto...are 4-2 over the last six games started by a left-handed pitcher and 20-19 (.513) for the season...compared to 35-49 (.417) against right-handers...the 39 games against left-handers are third most in the American League (Los Angeles 42, Boston 41)...the A's are batting .241 (295 for 1223) against lefties compared to .249 (728 for 2920) against righties.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .287 (307 for 1068) since the All-Star Break, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in slugging percentage since the break (.460), ranks second in on-base percentage (.359), triples (11) and walks (115), tied for second in doubles (75) and third in runs (169)...are hitting .317 (92 for 290) with runners in scoring position since the break...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.247) and slugging percentage (.369) in the AL and the fourth fewest runs scored (484)...have been shutout 11 times, which is tied for the most in the AL...have been successful in just 84 of 120 (70.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...however, are 16 for 18 (88.9%) over the last 17 games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors in the last eight games and have 100 for the season, which is tied with Texas for second most in the majors (Cubs, 103)...this is the second time in the last eight years the A's have made 100 errors in a season (105 in 2009)...17 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with Cincinnati and Chicago (NL) for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1999 when they had 18...the errors have led to 70 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 94 games...that is an Oakland record, topping the previous mark of 91 from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 79 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 104 home runs and have hit fewer than 104 home runs in a season just twice in Oakland history (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978)...the pitching staff has allowed just 89 home runs, which is the **fewest in the AL** and third fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.91 ERA (149 er in 273.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League and ranked third in the majors in ERA at the break but have the third highest post-break ERA in the majors...now have a 3.57 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.366) and rank second in pickoffs (18) but have issued the second most walks (415)...A's starting pitchers are 12-13 with a 5.33 ERA (105 er in 177.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Toronto (four games)...it is one of two 10-game homestands this year (Sept. 12-22)...however, this stand marks the A's only home games over a stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where Oakland plays 19 of its 29 games on the road...began the stretch by going 4-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (2-1)...are 33-28 (.541) at home compared to 22-40 (.355) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...are 11-31 (.262) over the last 42 road games but have won two straight road series after going winless over the previous 12 road series (0-9-3)...the A's are batting .259 (520 for 2010) with 261 runs scored in 61 home games (4.28 per game) and .236 (503 for 2133) with 223 runs scored in 62 games on the road (3.60 per game)...have a 3.15 ERA (195 er in 558.0 ip) at home compared to 4.01 (241 er in 540.1 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 16-21 (.432) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are 7-10 (.412) in extra inning games...the 10 extra inning losses and 17 games are tied for second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 7-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 14-27 (.341) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 13-24 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-18 in games decided in the last at bat.

PLAYERS USED: Bruce Billings became the 43rd player to appear in a game for Oakland this year on Sunday...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Billings is the 24th pitcher the A's have used this year, which is tied for the third highest total in Oakland history...the record is 26 in 1997 and 2009...Brandon Allen was player number 42 on Saturday...he is just the 19th non-pitcher to appear in a game for the A's, which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history...the A's have used just three right fielders (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently the fewest in Oakland history (used 4 in 1980).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 13 times this year and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Magnuson and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished the 2006 season with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 27th start of the season, which ties him for the American League lead...the A's are 10-16 (.385) in his starting assignments this year and are 46-42 (.523) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 14 of his 26 starts, allowed one run or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 1-4 with a 6.95 ERA (26 er in 33.2 ip) and .307 (43 for 140) opponents batting average in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .240 opponents average in 20 starts before the break...has the second highest post-break ERA in the American League (Vargas, SEA 7.39) and is tied for third in losses.

6-0 THEN 3-11: Is 3-11 with a 4.98 ERA (60 er in 108.1 ip) and .278 (115 for 414) opponents batting average over his last 18 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but is tied for the ML lead in losses since May 15 (Kuroda, LAD).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second
in the American League in stolen bases allowed (25) and wild pitches (12), fourth in walks (66) and tied for
fifth in losses (11)the 25 stolen bases are the most allowed by an A's pitcher since Dave Stewart yielded
32 in 1987the 12 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when two pitchers had at least 12
(Stein 15, Candiotti 14)

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-6 with a 2.62 ERA (25 er in 86.0 ip) and .232 (73 for 315) opponents batting average in 13 starts at home and 4-5 with a 5.42 ERA (45 er in 74.2 ip) and .281 (83 for 295) in 13 starts on the road...has the eighth lowest home ERA in the American League but the fourth highest road ERA...is

(126 er in 240.1 ip) in 42 starts on the road. **OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .176 (12 for 68) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is second lowest in the American League...has yielded a .259 (37 for 143) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .327 (32 for 98) over his last 16 starts (since May 25).

now 23-16 with a 3.07 ERA (101 er in 295.2 ip) in 46 career starts in Oakland and 14-16 with a 4.72 ERA

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or fewer in 16 of his last 18 starts and his run support average over that span is 3.07 (37 rs in 108.1 ip)...13 of those 36 runs of support came in one start, July 27 against Tampa Bay...has received run support of three runs or fewer in 21 of his 26 starts this year and his season RSA is 3.92 (70 rs in 160.2 ip).

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 2-2 with a 5.59 ERA (23 er in 37.0 ip) in six starts against American League East teams this year and 7-9 with a 3.42 ERA (47 er in 123.2 ip) in 20 starts against everyone else...is now 7-10 with a 6.02 ERA (78 er in 116.2 ip) in 20 career starts against the East compared to 30-22 with a 3.20 ERA (149 er in 419.1) in 68 starts against everyone else.

WINS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 27...won 10 games as a rookie in 2009 and 18 games last year...with one more win, he will become just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...has 27 wins over the last two years, which are tied for fifth in the American League...has 37 career wins, which are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

CAREER BESTS: Struck out four batters in his last start to bring his season total to 118...that matches his career high from last year...has issued 66 walks, which is six short of his high of 72 from his rookie season of 2009.

CAREER TRENDS: Went 10-14 with a 4.80 ERA and .271 opponents batting average over the first 33 starts of his career...then went 24-7 with a 2.55 ERA and .215 opponents batting average over a 37-start stretch from May 5, 2010 to May 9, 2011...is 3-11 with a 4.98 ERA (60 er in 108.1 ip) and .278 (115 for 414) opponents batting average in 18 starts since then.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Texas last Saturday in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters before Andrus reached second on a Sogard error in the fourth inning...set down the next five batters before Torrealba singled with one out in the sixth inning to break up the no-hitter...he was caught stealing but a double-error by Weeks and a double by Kinsler gave the Rangers a 1-0 lead...also allowed RBI doubles to Napoli in the seventh and Andrus in the eighth...left trailing 3-1 and the bullpen allowed an inherited runner to score.

CAHILL vs. TORONTO: Is 1-2 with an 5.70 ERA (23.2 ip, 23 h, 17 r, 15 er, 10 bb, 13 so, 5 hr) in four career starts...is 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA (6 er in 5.1 ip) in one start in Oakland and 1-1 with a 4.42 ERA (9 er in 18.1 ip) in three starts at Rogers Centre...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's win at Toronto April 7...shutout the Blue Javs on one hit over the first five innings, a Hill single in the second...allowed his only run in the sixth inning when Arencibia doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored on a Nix single...Romero shutout the A's on three hits over the first seven innings before the A's scored twice in the eighth for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Rich Harden (3-2, 4.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...has 907 strikeouts in 891.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.15 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 9.99)...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 0-2 with a 6.53 ERA in four starts on five days rest or fewer and 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA in four starts on six days rest or more...opponents are batting .252 with the bases empty and .191 with runners on base...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's loss to Texas last Sunday (4.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 4 so)...is 1-3 with a 5.11 ERA in nine career starts against Toronto...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's victory at Toronto August 9 (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so).

The A's bullpen has a 4.75 ERA (41 er in 77.2 ip) and .278 (87 for 313) opponents batting average over the last 25 games after posting a 1.80 ERA and .194 opponents average in its previous 21 games...is third in the American League with a 3.34 ERA on the season...also ranks second in opponents slugging percentage (.353) and is tied for second in fewest home runs (25)...has the fewest wins (12) and is tied for the third most losses (20)...has allowed just three home runs to first batters faced, which is the fewest in the AL, and has struck out 83, which is second most...has allowed 60 of 160 (37.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL

- Has held opponents to a .216 batting average, including .188 (9 for 48) against right-handers and .241 (13 for 54) against lefties.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
