A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The A's trail in the season series, 3-4...lost the first meeting in Oakland last night after going 3-3 in Toronto...the A's have lost the season series each of the previous three years and are 13-20 against Toronto since 2008...all-time, the A's are 196-171 against the Blue Jays...that includes 94-87 in Oakland, 102-82 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's game at Texas Sept. 10 will be televised by FOX and will now start at 1:11 PDT instead of 5:05 PDT.

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his seven save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 30 for 30 after the break in his career.

Hideki Matsui is tied for second in the American League with a .385 (45 for 117) batting average since the All-Star Break.

Jemile Weeks leads American League rookies in triples (8), is tied for third in hits (75), doubles (14) and multiple hit games (23) and ranks fourth in stolen bases (13) and total bases (105).

Josh Willingham hit his 20th home run of the season Tuesday night, his fourth career 20-homer season.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1931 Lefty Grove wins his 16th consecutive game, tying the American League record set by Walter Johnson and Joe Wood in 1912...in 1989, in the midst of a 19-game hitting streak, Carney Lansford records his 1000th hit in an A's uniform to become the fifth Oakland player to reach that plateau...in 1991 Jose Canseco hits his 200th career home run in the A's 8-7 win at Minnesota...he becomes the second Oakland Athletic and fifth Athletic all-time to reach the 200 plateau...in 2010 Trevor Cahill allows seven hits, ending a modern major league record tying stretch of 20 consecutive starts with six hits or fewer and five innings or more.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last seven games and 10 of the last 16...are 14 games under .500, which is one short of the season-low of 15 (53-68 on August 15)...are 16-16 (.500) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...remain a season-high 16½ games out of first place in the American League West for the fourth consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit since finishing the 2009 season 22 games out...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 33-49 (.402) since then, which is the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have spent 26 of the last 27 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 60 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 23-18 (.561) record on the weekend (11-10 on Saturday, 12-8 on Sunday) compared to 32-51 (.386) during the week...are 24-24 (.500) in day games and 31-45 (.408) at night...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to faced left-hander Brett Cecil today, the eighth time in the last 12 games they have faced a left-handed starting pitcher...are 4-3 over the previous seven games against lefties and 20-20 (.500) for the season...are 35-49 (.417) in games started by right-handers...the 40 games against left-handers are third most in the AL (Los Angeles 42, Boston 41)...are batting .238 (298 for 1254) against lefties compared to .249 (728 for 2920) against righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the 12th time last night, which is the most in the American League...it also matches the most by an A's team over the last 18 years (also 2005)...are now batting .229 (53 for 231) with 24 runs scored over the first seven games of the homestand...however, are hitting .282 (310 for 1099) since the All-Star Break, which ranks fourth in the AL...also rank second in the AL in on-base percentage (.353), walks (117) and triples (11) since the break (.353), tied for second in doubles (75), third in slugging (.450) and fourth in runs (169)...are hitting .312 (92 for 295) with runners in scoring position since the break...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.367) in the AL and the fourth fewest runs scored (484)...have been successful in just 84 of 120 (70.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...however, are 16 for 18 (88.9%) over the last 18 games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in the last nine games and have 101 for the season, which is tied with Texas for second most in the majors (Cubs, 103)...this is the second time in the last eight years the A's have made 100 errors in a season (105 in 2009)...17 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with Cincinnati and Chicago (NL) for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 2001 club also had 17...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1999 when they had 18...the errors have led to 70 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit two home runs or fewer in each of the last 95 games...that is an Oakland record, topping the previous mark of 91 from July 31, 1974-May 16, 1975...the A's last three-homer game was May 2 vs. Texas...have 79 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 103 home runs and have hit fewer than 104 home runs in a season just twice in Oakland history (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978)...the pitching staff has allowed just 90 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.98 ERA (156 er in 282.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League and ranked third in the majors in ERA at the break but have the third highest post-break ERA in the majors...now have a 3.60 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the AL but is the highest it has been outside the first five games of the season...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.366) and rank second in pickoffs (18) but have issued the second most walks (418)...A's starting pitchers are 12-14 with a 5.52 ERA (112 er in 182.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-5 on this 10-game homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Toronto (0-1)...it is one of two 10-game homestands this year (Sept. 12-22)...however, this stand marks the A's only home games over a stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where Oakland plays 19 of its 29 games on the road...began the stretch by going 4-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (2-1)...are 33-29 (.532) at home compared to 22-40 (.355) on the road...have the third worst road record in the American League...are 11-31 (.262) over the last 42 road games but have won two straight road series after going winless over the previous 12 road series (0-9-3)...the A's are batting .256 (523 for 2041) with 261 runs scored in 62 home games (4.21 per game) and .236 (503 for 2133) with 223 runs scored in 62 games on the road (3.60 per game)...have a 3.21 ERA (202 er in 567.0 ip) at home compared to 4.01 (241 er in 540.1 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA (Los Angeles, 3.12).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 16-21 (.432) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are 7-10 (.412) in extra inning games...the 10 extra inning losses and 17 games are tied for second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 7-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 14-27 (.341) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 13-24 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 9-18 in games decided in the last at bat.

PLAYERS USED: Bruce Billings became the 43rd player to appear in a game for Oakland on Sunday...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Billings is the 24th pitcher the A's have used this year, which is tied for the third highest total in Oakland history...the record is 26 in 1997 and 2009...Brandon Allen was player number 42 on Saturday...he is just the 19th non-pitcher to appear in a game for the A's, which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history...the A's have used just three right fielders (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently the fewest in Oakland history (used 4 in 1980).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 13 times and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Magnuson and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25)...had two players on the DL from July 25-29, marking the first time since the end of the 2006 season they had fewer than three players on the DL...finished 2006 with one player on the DL (Crosby).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...it is the 154th start of his career, his 98th as an Athletic...the A's are 4-4 (.500) in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 95-58 (.621) in his starting assignments in his career, including 62-35 (.633) with the A's...has tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer five times...is 42-0 in 57 career starters with run support of four or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .210 (13 for 62) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .238 (15 for 63) the second time and .239 (11 for 46) after that...his career numbers are .197 (250 for 1267) the first time, .224 (260 for 1163) the second time and .265 (223 for 843) after that...opponents are batting .252 (26 for 103) with the bases empty and .191 (13 for 68) with runners on base.

THE LONG BALL: Did not allow a home run in his last start, snapping a career-long streak of eight consecutive games with a home run allowed dating back to his final outing of 2010...has surrendered eight home runs this year, seven of which have been hit by right-handed hitters...five have been solo shots.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-2 with a 6.53 ERA (15 er in 20.2 ip) in four starts on five days rest or fewer and 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA (8 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts on six days rest or more.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 after going 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento (7.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr)...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

SINCE 2003: Has 907 strikeouts in 891.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.15 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 9.98)...has a .224 (733 for 3273) opponents batting average over that span, which is fourth best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221; Lincecum, .222; Jason Schmidt, .223).

WITH THE A'S: His start July 1 against Arizona was his first as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 39-21 record and a 3.51 ERA (229 er in 587.2 ip) in 105 games, 97 starts...his .650 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

2011 START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona **July 1** in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced with the one exception a Pena two-out home run in the second...had a 5-1 lead when he allowed a Drew RBI single in the sixth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas **July 7**...allowed runs in four of his five innings...Kinsler scored on a ground out in the first and Hamilton had a RBI single in the third...Kinsler added a RBI single in the fourth followed by a Hamilton sacrifice fly and Young hit a leadoff home run in the fifth inning...Holland shutout the A's on four hits...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in the second game of the doubleheader against Los Angeles **July 16** in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Trumbo in the second inning but then retired 12 of the next 14 batters he faced...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Wells in the sixth inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at New York **July 23**...allowed a RBI single to Martin in the second inning and a solo home run to Swisher in the sixth...was relieved by Ziegler following the home run and left with a 3-2 lead...had a no decision in the A's 10-8 loss to Tampa Bay **July 28** in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters before walking Jennings to start the fourth inning...did not allow a hit until Zobrist singled to lead off the fifth...allowed a two-run home run to Jennings in the sixth inning...left after six innings with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed seven runs in the seventh inning...Ziegler was charged with the blown save and loss...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Seattle **August 2**...allowed a two-run double to Carp in the first inning and a two-out, two-run home run to Wells in the sixth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win at Toronto **August 9**...surrendered a lead off home run to Encarnacion in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...the A's scored twice in the sixth and once in the seventh to give him a 3-1 lead.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Texas last Sunday in Oakland...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a bases loaded walk to Napoli and a Moreland sacrifice fly...also issued a bases loaded walk to Young in the fourth inning...was relieved by Billings to start the fifth with the A's trailing 4-0...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the fifth and four times in the sixth to get him off the hook.

HARDEN vs. TORONTO: Is 1-3 with a 5.11 ERA (49.1 ip, 41 h, 30 r, 28 er, 29 bb, 51 so, 8 hr) in nine career starts...is 1-2 with a 9.00 ERA (19 er in 19.0 ip) in four starts at Rogers Centre, 0-1 with a 2.70 ERA (8 er in 26.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 0-0 with a 2.45 ERA (1 er in 3.2 ip) in one start in Texas...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's victory at Toronto August 9...surrendered a lead off home run to Encarnacion in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...the A's scored twice in the sixth and once in the seventh to give him a 3-1 lead...was relieved by Balfour to start the eighth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (9-11, 3.36 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season...is 0-5 with a 7.90 ERA and .304 opponents batting average over his last five starts...the losing streak matches his career high (Aug. 17, 2008-June 30, 2009)...is 1-5 with a 6.29 ERA in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for the Major League lead in losses since the break and has the fourth highest ERA in the American League since the break...is 7-4 with a 2.48 ERA and .201 opponents batting average in 13 starts at home compared to 2-7 with a 4.50 ERA and .275 opponents average in 11 starts on the road...lost his fifth consecutive start in the A's 6-2 loss to Baltimore last Monday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 1-2 with a 4.01 ERA in four career starts against Toronto...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 8-4 A's loss at Toronto August 10 (5.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 4 so)...is 0-6 with a 5.85 ERA in seven starts against AL East teams this year compared to 9-5 with a 2.43 ERA in 17 starts against everyone else.

The A's bullpen has a 4.54 ERA (41 er in 81.1 ip) over the last 26 games after posting a 1.80 ERA in its previous 21 games...is third in the American League with a 3.30 ERA on the season...also ranks second in opponents slugging percentage (.351) and is tied for second in fewest home runs (25)...has the fewest wins (12) and is tied for the third most losses (20)...has allowed just three home runs to first batters faced, which is the fewest in the AL, and has struck out 85, which is second most...has allowed 60 of 161 (37.3%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the second highest percentage in the AL.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season...the A's are 10-14 (.417) in his starting assignments this year and are 40-41 (.494) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 17 of his 24 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 7.90 ERA (27.1 ip, 34 h, 25 r, 24 er, 18 bb, 27 so) and .304 (34 for 112) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the losing streak matches his career high (Aug. 17, 2008-June 30, 2009).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 1-5 with a 6.29 ERA (24 er in 34.1 ip) in six starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is **tied for the Major League lead** in losses since the break...ranked fifth in the American League in ERA at the break but has the **third** highest ERA in the AL since the break.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
