A's vs. YANKEES

The A's have lost the season series as they trail 3-5 entering the final meeting today...however, have won this series, snapping a 10-series losing streak to the Yankees...that is an Oakland record for longest series losing streak against one team...had not won a series from New York since June 29-July 1, 2007...have not swept a series from the Yankees since June 9-11, 2006 at New York have won back-to-back games from the Yankees for the first time since June 30-July 1, 2007...went 0-3 in Oakland this year and are 3-2 in New York...have lost four consecutive season series to the Yankees and are 7-26 (.212) against New York since 2008...that is the worst record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...have lost 16 of their last 20 games against New York...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 221-260 against the Yankees...that includes 120-118 in Oakland and 101-142 in New York...including 4-11 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 762-1126 against the Yankees/Orioles

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his 10 save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 33 for 33 after the break in his career.

Hideki Matsui ranks fifth in the American League with a .348 batting average since the All-Star Break.

Josh Willingham is tied for second in the American League in home runs in August (7) and since the All-Star Break (11).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1986 Mark McGwire hits his first major league home run, a two-run shot in the fifth inning off Walt Terrell, in the A's 8-4 win at Detroit...in 2006 Barry Zito takes a no-hitter into the eighth inning and wins the 100th game of his career in the A's 9-3 win at Texas.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and six of the last eight games after losing four straight...are 20-17 (.541) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 37-50 (.425) since then...have spent 32 of the last 33 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 66 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...are 10-11 (.476) in August and have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 last July...have a 24-19 (.558) record on the weekend (12-10 on Saturday, 12-9 on Sunday) compared to 35-51 (.407) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-0), Boston (three games) and Cleveland (four games)...have won six of their last seven road games after losing 30 of the previous 37...have now won three consecutive road series for the first time since June 29-July 18, 2010...have not swept a road series since taking all four games at Seattle in the final series of the 2010 season (Sept. 30-Oct. 3)...are 24-40 (.375) on the road for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...with one more loss will clinch a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Toronto (2-2) and are 35-30 (.538) at home...are batting .253 (538 for 2129) with 268 runs scored in 65 home games (4.12 per game) and .238 (525 for 2205) with 235 runs scored in 64 games on the road (3.67 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...have a 3.09 ERA (204 er in 594.0 ip) at home compared to 4.01 (249 er in 559.1 ip) on the road.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 1.96 ERA (10 er in 46.0 ip) and .193 (32 for 166) opponents batting average over the last five games...now have a 4.55 ERA (166 er in 328.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA...have a 3.53 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the AL...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.366) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19) but have issued the second most walks (432)...rank sixth in strikeouts (921) but are on pace for 1157, which would break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009...A's starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 1.72 ERA (7 er in 36.2 ip) over the last five games...are now 15-15 with a 4.88 ERA (119 er in 219.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break...have a 3.65 ERA (320 er in 789.2 ip) for the season, which ranks third in the AL...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (68).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .306 (22 for 72) with 12 runs scored in the first two games of the road trip after hitting .213 with 31 runs scored in 10 games on the last homestand...are now batting .276 (347 for 1259) since the All-Star Break after hitting .233 before the break...rank second in the AL in on-base percentage (.344), doubles (84) and triples (11) since the break, third in walks (128) and slugging (.446) and fourth in runs (188)...are hitting .315 (101 for 321) with runners in scoring position since the break...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.245) and slugging percentage (.368) in the AL and the third fewest runs scored (503)...have been shutout a league-leading 13 times, which are the most by an A's team since the 1993 club was also shutout 13 times...have not been shutout more than 13 times since 1991 (14).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit five home runs in the first two games of this series, including a season-high tying three on Tuesday night (also May 2 vs. Texas)...the three-homer game snapped an Oakland record streak of 98 consecutive games with two home runs or fewer...now have 86 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 108 home runs and have hit fewer than 108 home runs in a non-strike season just twice in Oakland history (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978)...the pitching staff has allowed just 96 home runs, which is the **fewest in the AL** and tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 103 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (104)...this is just the second time in the last eight years the A's have made 100 errors in a season (105 in 2009)...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 71 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 10-11 during this stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they player 19 of their 29 games on the road...began the stretch with a 4-5 road trip, went 4-6 on the last homestand and conclude it with this 10-game road trip...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from Sept. 2-22.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in 10 of the previous 16 games...are 6-4 in those 10 games against lefties and 22-21 (.512) for the season...are 37-49 (.430) in games started by right-handers...the 43 games against left-handers are third most in the AL (Los Angeles 45, Boston 45)...are batting .235 (312 for 1326) against lefties compared to .250 (751 for 3008) against righties...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: Have won each of their last three extra inning games, which is their longest extra inning win streak since June 3-July 10, 2008 when they won four straight...are now 8-10 (.444) in extra inning games...are second in the AL in extra inning games and tied for second in losses...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 15-27 (.357) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 17-22 (.436) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the AL (Texas, 16-21)...are 14-25 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-18 in games decided in the last at bat...won for the seventh time last night when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 13 times and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Magnuson and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25).

STRIKEOUTS: Matched his career high with 11 strikeouts in his last start and now has 52 strikeouts since the All-Star Break...that ranks fifth in the American League...had 60 strikeouts in 53.0 innings for the season, an average of 10.19 per nine innings...that is sixth best in the AL among pitchers with 50 or more

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .210 opponents batting average including .165 (15 for 91) against left-handed hitters and .250 (26 for 104) against right-handers...has surrendered seven of his eight home runs to righties for a .471 slugging percentage...lefties are slugging .264...five of his eight home runs allowed have been with the bases empty...has yielded a .188 (13 for 69) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .225 (16 for 71) the second time and .218 (12 for 55) after that...his career numbers are .196 (250 for 1274) the first time, .223 (261 for 1171) the second time and .263 (224 for 852) after that.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 3-0 with a 1.78 ERA (5 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts against American League East teams and 1-2 with a 5.86 ERA (18 er in 27.2 ip) in five starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-2 with a 4.88 ERA (15 er in 27.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or fewer and 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA (8 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts on six days rest or

HOME AND AWAY: is 2-0 with a 3.30 ERA (11 er in 30.0 ip) and .171 (18 for 105) opponents batting average in five starts at home and 2-2 with a 4.70 ERA (12 er in 23.0 ip) and .256 (23 for 90) opponents average in four starts on the road...is now 21-10 with a 3.01 ERA (111 er in 332.1 ip) in 56 career appearances in the Coliseum and 38-26 with a 4.02 ERA (253 er in 566.1) in 108 career appearances in all

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 after going 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento (7.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr)...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

SINCE 2003: Has 918 strikeouts in 898.2 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.19 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 800 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 9.96)...has a .223 (735 for 3297) opponents batting average over that span, which is third best using the 800 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221; Lincecum, .221).

WITH THE A'S: His start July 1 against Arizona was his first as an Athletic since July 6, 2008, a loss in the A's 4-3 decision at Chicago (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...picked up the win against the Diamondbacks for his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 11 so)...began his career with the A's in 2003 and has compiled a 40-21 record and a 3.47 ERA (229 er in 594.2 ip) in 106 games, 98 starts...his .656 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008 and went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

2011 START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona July 1 in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas *July* 7...allowed runs in four of his five innings and Holland shutout the A's on four hits...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in the second game of the doubleheader against Los Angeles July 16 in Oakland...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Wells in the sixth inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at New York **July 23**...allowed a RBI single to Martin in the second inning and a solo home run to Swisher in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 10-8 loss to Tampa Bay July 28 in Oakland...did not allow a hit until Zobrist singled to lead off the fifth...left after six innings with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed seven runs in the seventh inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Seattle August 2...allowed a two-run double to Carp in the first inning and a two-out, two-run home run to Wells in the sixth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win at Toronto August 9...surrendered a lead off home run to Encarnacion in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Texas August 14 in Oakland...did not allow a home run, snapping a career-long streak of eight consecutive games with a home run allowed dating back to his final outing of 2010.

LAST START: He combined with Bailey and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Toronto last Friday in Oakland...tossed seven innings and allowed both of the hits...struck out a career-high tying 11...loaded the bases with no outs in the first inning but then struck out the next three batters...did not allow a hit until Arencibia singled with one out in the fifth.

HARDEN vs. NEW YORK: Is 2-3 with a 4.91 ERA (47.2 ip, 49 h, 26 r, 26 er, 30 bb, 47 so, 5 hr) in 10 career appearances, including eight starts...that includes 1-1 with a 5.16 ERA (13 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (6 er in 9.0 ip) in two starts in Yankee Stadium...is also 0-0 with a 13.50 ERA (1 er in 0.2 ip) in one relief appearance in Texas and 0-1 with a 3.52 ERA (6 er in 15.1 ip) in the old Yankee Stadium...is 2-3 with a 5.00 ERA (25 er in 45.0 ip) in his eight starts...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-3 A's win at New York July 23...allowed a RBI single to Martin in the second inning but the A's came back with two runs in the third and another in the sixth...blanked the Yankees on two hits and three walks from the third through fifth innings but then allowed a solo home run to Swisher in the sixth...was relieved by Ziegler following the home run and left with a 3-2 lead.

LHP Gio Gonzalez (10-11, 3.24 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 26th start of the season...is 2-5 with a 5.31 ERA in seven starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERÁ in 18 starts before the break...is tied for second in the American League in losses since the break...is 8-4 with a 2.36 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in 14 starts at home compared to 2-7 with a 4.50 ERA and .275 opponents average in 11 starts on the road...is tied for second in the AL in home wins and tied for third in road losses...snapped his career-high tying five-game losing streak in his last start, a 5-1 A's win over Toronto last Saturday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 9 so)...is 1-1 with a 5.64 ERA in four career starts against Boston...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-3 A's loss in Oakland April 20 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 9 so)...is 1-6 with a 5.06 ERA in eight starts against AL East teams this year compared to 9-5 with a 2.43 ERA in 17 starts against everyone else.

The A's bullpen has a 2.37 ERA (19.0 ip, 17 h, 6 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 21 so) over the last eight games after posting a 5.06 ERA over the previous six contests...now has a 3.29 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...also ranks fourth in opponents slugging (.357) and has allowed the fourth fewest home runs (27)...has the fewest wins (13)...has retired 22 of the last 25 first batters faced...has allowed just five home runs to first batters faced for the season, which is third fewest in the AL, but have two in the last two games...has struck out 89 first batters faced, which is second most in the AL...has allowed 60 of 163 (36.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL

- Has converted all 10 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break...is now a perfect 33 for 33 in save opportunities following the break in his career.
- Is 18 for 20 (90.0%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...is 69 for 78 (88.5%) in his career, which is the best mark in Oakland history...ranks sixth on the Oakland career saves list (Isringhausen is 5th, 75).
- Has allowed at least one run in five of his last seven outings (5 er in 7.0 ip, 6.43 ERA) after allowing just one earned run in his previous 10 outings (0.96 ERA).

BOB MELVIN 6

Named as A's interim manager, June 9, 2011

Birthdate: October 28, 1961

Birthplace/Resides: Palo Alto, California / New York, New York

Contract Status: Signed through 2011

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.
