A's vs. RED SOX

The A's trail in the season series, 1-4...split a two-game series in Oakland in April but were swept in a three-game series at Boston in June...are 26-26 against the Red Sox since 2006...that includes 18-10 in Oakland and 8-16 at Fenway...are 218-272 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 129-114 in Oakland, 88-157 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 860-1053 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

After a 1 hour and 29 minute rain delay prior to first pitch yesterday, the A's and Yankees played a 4 hour and 31 minute game...it was the longest nine-inning game in Oakland history by 16 minutes...the previous mark was 4 hours and 15 minutes at Tampa Bay, May 31, 2002...the two teams combined for 31 runs, which tied for the second highest total in Oakland history...it fell two short of the record of 33 in a 17-16 loss at Texas May 5, 2000...also combined for 52 base runners (hits, walks and hit by pitch) which was second most in a nine-inning game in Oakland history (53, April 27, 1980 at Minnesota).

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his 10 save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 33 for 33 after the break in his career.

Hideki Matsui ranks fifth in the American League with a .352 batting average since the All-Star Rreak

Josh Willingham is tied for second in the American League in home runs since the All-Star Break (11).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1916 Joe Bush no-hits Cleveland 5-0 in Philadelphia after lasting just three innings against Cleveland a day earlier...in 1973 Ken Holtzman tosses a four-hit shutout to improve to 19-11 in the A's 1-0 win over New York....Vic Davalillo's pinch hit RBI single in the eighth inning drives in the only run of the game.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last nine games after losing four straight...are 20-18 (.526) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 37-51 (.420) since then...have spent 33 of the last 34 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 67 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...are 10-12 (.455) in August and have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 last July...have a 24-19 (.558) record on the weekend (12-10 on Saturday, 12-9 on Sunday) compared to 35-52 (.402) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 22 runs yesterday at New York to set an Oakland record for runs allowed in a game...the previous mark was 20 (three times, last: April 13, 1993 at Detroit)...it was the seventh time in franchise history the A's allowed at least 22 runs in a game...the last time was April 23, 1955 when the Kansas City A's allowed a franchise record 29 runs against Chicago...now have a 5.04 ERA (188 er in 336.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the second highest post-break ERA in the majors (Seattle, 5.11)...yesterday's game upped the season ERA .15 runs to 3.68, which ranks fourth in the AL...issued 13 walks yesterday, which fell one short of the Oakland record and was the most in a game since June 11, 1996 at Cleveland when they also allowed 13...now have 445 walks for the season, which is second most in the AL...hit one batter and the 35 base runners are the most allowed in one game in Oakland history...the previous high was 31 (twice, last: April 13, 1993 at Detroit)...it was the most by an Athletics team since the Kansas City A's allowed 36 in the 29-6 loss against Chicago in 1955...surrendered 21 hits, the 15th time in Oakland history the A's allowed at least 21 hits in a game...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.371) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19)...are fifth in strikeouts (930) but are on pace for 1159, which would break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009...A's starting pitchers are 15-15 with a 5.03 ERA (125 er in 223.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

THE LONG BALL: The A's pitching staff allowed a season-high five home runs yesterday, including a Major League record three grand slams...have allowed six grand slams for the season, which is tied with the Cubs for the Major League lead...allowed 10 home runs in the three-game series at New York but still have an American League low 101 for the season...the offense hit seven home runs in the three-game series and the 17 combined home runs tied an Oakland record for a three-game series (Aug. 21-23, 1970 at Cleveland)...had a season-high tying three home runs Tuesday night (May 2 vs. Texas), snapping an Oakland record streak of 98 consecutive games with two home runs or fewer...now have 88 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .331 (37 for 112) with 21 runs scored in the first three games of the road trip after hitting .213 with 31 runs scored in 10 games on the last homestand...are now batting .279 (362 for 1299) since the All-Star Break after hitting .233 before the break...rank second in the AL in on-base percentage (.346), doubles (88) and triples (12) since the break, third in walks (130) and slugging (.453) and fourth in runs (197)...are hitting .313 (106 for 339) with runners in scoring position since the break...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.371) in the AL and the fourth fewest runs scored (512)...have been shutout a league-leading 13 times, which are the most by an A's team since the 1993 club was also shutout 13 times...have not been shutout more than 13 times since 1991 (14).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 103 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (108)...this is just the second time in the last eight years the A's have made 100 errors in a season (105 in 2009)...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 71 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (three games) and Cleveland (four games)...have won six of their last eight road games after losing 30 of the previous 37...have won three consecutive road series for the first time since June 29-July 18, 2010...are 24-41 (.369) on the road for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Toronto (2-2) and are 35-30 (.538) at home...are batting .253 (538 for 2129) with 268 runs scored in 65 home games (4.12 per game) and .241 (540 for 2245) with 244 runs scored in 65 games on the road (3.75 per game)...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and sixth lowest in the majors...have a 3.09 ERA (204 er in 594.0 ip) at home compared to 4.30 (271 er in 567.1 ip) on the road.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 10-12 during this stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they player 19 of their 29 games on the road...began the stretch with a 4-5 road trip, went 4-6 on the last homestand and conclude it with this 10-game road trip...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from Sept. 2-22.

CLOSE CALLS: Have won each of their last three extra inning games, which is their longest extra inning win streak since June 3-July 10, 2008 when they won four straight...are now 8-10 (.444) in extra inning games...are second in the AL in extra inning games and tied for second in losses...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 15-27 (.357) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 17-22 (.436) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the AL (Texas, 16-21)...are 14-25 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-18 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

DAY/NIGHT DOUBLEHEADERS: The A's are scheduled to play a day/night doubleheader tomorrow for the fifth time in Oakland history...it will be their third at Boston (Aug. 10, 1971 and July 22, 1972)...had two during the 2000 season (July 17 at Colorado and Sept. 20 at Baltimore)...will have a Sunday off for the 15th time in Oakland history...the last time was Sept. 7, 2008 (Baltimore) and the time before that was Sept. 17, 2000 when their scheduled game at Tampa Bay was postponed (and later cancelled) because of Hurricane Gordon.

GONZALEZ' CAREER HIGHS

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 26th start of the season...the A's are 11-14 (.440) in his starting assignments this year and are 41-41 (.500) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 18 of his 25 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his career-high tying five-game losing streak in his last start...posted a .790 ERA and allowed a .304 opponents batting average during the streak which lasted five starts from July 24 to Aug. 15...also lost five straight from Aug. 17, 2008-June 30, 2009.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 2-5 with a 5.31 ERA (25 er in 42.1 ip) in seven starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for second in the majors in losses since the break (Duensing, MIN 6).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in walks (73), ranks fourth in strikeouts per nine innings (8.98), tied for seventh in losses (11), 10th in strikeouts (155) and tied for 10th in hit

batters (8)...the 11 losses are a career-high...had 111 strikeouts at the All-Star Break, which tied for the fourth best pre-Break total in Oakland history...it was the most at the break since Jose Rijo also had 111 in 1986.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.324)...opponents are batting .195 (26 for 133) with runners in scoring position, which is sixth lowest in the AL...has yielded just 11 home runs in 155.1 innings for an average of 0.64 per nine innings...that is sixth lowest in the AL...seven of the 11 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-4 with a 2.36 ERA (24 er in 91.1 ip) and .196 (64 for 326) opponents batting average in 14 starts at home compared to 2-7 with a 4.50 ERA (32 er in 64.0 ip) and .275 (70 for 255) opponents average in 11 starts on the road...is tied for second in the American League in home wins and tied for third in road losses...ranks fourth in the AL in home ERA and opponents batting average...over the last two years, he is 16-7 with a 2.47 ERA (53 in 193.1 ip) and .198 (137 for 692) opponents average in 30 starts at home and 9-13 with a 4.15 ERA (75 er in 162.2 ip) and .264 (168 for 637) average in 28 starts on the road.

AGAINST THE EAST: Defeated Toronto in his last start, his first win against an American League East team since July 21, 2010 against Boston...is 1-6 with a 5.06 ERA (27 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts against AL East teams this year compared to 9-5 with a 2.43 ERA (29 er in 107.1) in 17 starts against everyone else...over the last two years, he is 3-9 with a 5.06 ERA (53 er in 94.1 ip) in 16 starts against the East compared to 22-11 with a 2.58 ERA (75 er in 261.2 ip) in 42 starts against the rest of baseball.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-4 with a 3.82 ERA (27 er in 63.2 ip) in 10 starts during the day and 5-7 with a 2.85 ERA (29 er in 91.2 ip) in 15 starts at night...has the sixth lowest night ERA in the American League...is now 15-8 with a 3.73 ERA (76 er in 183.1 ip) in 30 career games during the day compared to 17-23 with a 4.24 ERA (144 er in 305.1 ip) in 58 contests at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer 15 of his 25 starts...has just 19 runs of support in his 11 losses this year (61.0 ip, 2.80 RSA) and 37 runs of support in his 31 career losses (155.0 ip, 2.15 RSA)...is 27-2 in 37 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-29 in 45 starts with support of two or fewer.

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team and was the A's lone selection...entered the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with two outs and the bases empty and struck out the only batter he faced, Jay Bruce.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Is 1-3 with a 5.33 ERA (15 er in 25.1 ip) over his first four starts in August...went 2-3 with a 4.50 ERA in five starts in July...that was his highest single month ERA in September, 2009 when he also had a 4.50 ERA...went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week ending July 3 after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a Major League leading 16 strikeouts in two starts...shared the honors with Toronto's Jose Bautista...it marked his first Player of the Week award.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 victory over Toronto last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Encarnacion in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in eight innings of work...retired 15 straight after allowing a lead off single to Thames in the third and set down 22 of the final 24 batters he faced.

GONZALEZ vs. BOSTON: Is 1-1 with a 5.64 ERA (22.1 ip, 27 h, 14 r, 14 er, 11 bb, 25 so, 4 hr) in four career starts...is 0-0 with a 5.23 ERA (6 er in 10.1 ip) in two starts at Fenway Park and 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (8 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-3 A's loss in Oakland April 20...the A's scored a run in the first inning but he allowed a RBI single to Crawford in the second...also allowed a lead off home run to Youkilis in the fourth inning and a two-run home run to Lowrie in the sixth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

RHP Guillermo Moscoso (6-7, 3.28 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 18th appearance and 16th start of the season...the A's were shutout in his last start and he has been the starting pitcher in four of the A's 13 shutouts this year...has received no run support in six of his 15 starts...is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA over his last three starts and is 3-3 with a 4.65 ERA in seven starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19...has allowed just six earned runs over the first three innings of a game for a 1.19 ERA...has a 5.36 ERA from the fourth inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 1-0 A's loss to Toronto last Sunday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so) in two career appearances against Boston...both came in relief this year at Fenway.

RHP Graham Godfrey (1-1, 4.24 ERA): Is scheduled to be recalled from Triple-A Sacramento tomorrow to make his fourth start of the season with the A's...was previously with the club from June 10 to July 6...was the losing pitcher in his last Major League start, a 4-1 loss at New York-NL (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...made his ML debut with a start and no decision at Chicago-AL June 10 (4.1 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 13-3 with a 2.75 ERA in 18 games, 17 starts, with Sacramento...is leading the Pacific Coast League in wins and his ERA would be second best but he is 4.2 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...has allowed a .225 opponents batting average and just six home runs in 101.1 innings...went 6-2 with a 3.00 ERA in nine games, eight starts, following his option July 7.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

13-21, 3.65 ERA (367.1 ip, 339 h, 178 r, 149 er, 165 bb, 325 so, 31 hr)

The A's bullpen allowed 16 runs, all earned, on 11 hits and 12 walks in 3.2 innings yesterday at New York...the runs and walks set Oakland records for most by the bullpen in one game...the 16 runs were the most by an Athletics bullpen since Aug. 19, 1962 against New York when the Kansas City A's also allowed 16...the walks were the most since the 1959 Kansas City A's had 12 against Chicago April 22...the season ERA for the bullpen jumped .36 runs from 3.29 to 3.65...were third among American League bullpens in ERA before the game but now rank eighth...the pen now has a 5.05 ERA (63 er in 112.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the AL (13), the third most walks (165) and is tied for the third most losses (21)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (89) and is tied for second in fewest first batter home runs (6)...allowed three of those six first batter home runs in the three-game series at New York...has allowed 64 of 169 (37.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Seattle, 40.0).
