A's vs. RED SOX

The A's trail in the season series, 2-4...split a two-game series in Oakland in April and are 1-3 in Boston...are 27-26 against the Red Sox since 2006...that includes 18-10 in Oakland and 9-16 at Fenway...are 219-272 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 129-114 in Oakland, 89-157 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 861-1053 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's scored a season-high 15 runs last night after allowing an Oakland-record 22 runs the day before...the last team to allow 20 or more runs in a game and then scored 15 or more runs in their next game was the 1950 Pittsburgh Pirates, who lost to Brooklyn 21-12 on June 24 and then defeated the Dodgers the next day 16-11...the combined time of game for the A's last two games (both nine innings) is 8 hours and 7 minutes.

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his 10 save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 33 for 33 after the break in his career.

Josh Willingham has homered 10 times in his last 26 games...is tied for second in the American League in home runs since the All-Star Break (12) and in August (8)...he leads the A's with 23 home runs and 79 RBI for the season.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1948** Hank Majeski has six doubles in a doubleheader against St. Louis as the A's win 6-0 and 9-1...in **1982** Rickey Henderson steals four bases against the Milwaukee Brewers, breaking Lou Brock's major league single season record of 118...he would finish the season with 130 steals...in **2010** Brett Anderson allowed four runs in 2.0 innings, ending an Athletics record tying streak of 18 games with six or more innings and three earned runs or fewer by A's starting pitchers. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won seven of the last 10 games after losing four straight...are 21-18 (.538) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 38-51 (.427) since then...have spent 34 of the last 35 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 68 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...are 11-12 (.478) in August and have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 last July...have a 24-19 (.558) record on the weekend (12-10 on Saturday, 12-9 on Sunday) compared to 36-52 (.409) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

DAY/NIGHT DOUBLEHEADERS: The A's are scheduled to play a day/night doubleheader today for the fifth time in Oakland history...it will be their third at Boston (Aug. 10, 1971 and July 22, 1972)...had two during the 2000 season (July 17 at Colorado and Sept. 20 at Baltimore)...will have a Sunday off tomorrow for the 15th time in Oakland history...the last time was Sept. 7, 2008 (Baltimore) and the time before that was Sept. 17, 2000 when their scheduled game at Tampa Bay was postponed (and later cancelled) because of Hurricane Gordon.

OFFENSE: The A's **tied an Oakland record** last night with eight doubles (fifth time, last: June 6, 2009) and now have 12 doubles in the last two games and 18 in the last four...have scored 24 runs on 31 hits in the last two games and are batting .338 (53 for 157) with 36 runs scored in the first four games of the road trip after hitting .213 with 31 runs scored in 10 games on the last homestand...are now batting .281 (378 for 1344) since the All-Star Break, which ranks fourth in the American League...hit .233 before the break...rank second in the AL in on-base percentage (.348), doubles (96) and triples (12) since the break, third in walks (135) and slugging (.460) and fourth in runs (212)...are hitting .320 (115 for 359) with runners in scoring position since the break...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.248) and slugging percentage (.374) in the AL...have been shutout a league-leading 13 times, which are the most by an A's team since the 1993 club was also shutout 13 times...have not been shutout more than 13 times since 1991 (14).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in 10 of the previous 18 games and are scheduled to face a lefty in both games of today's doubleheader...are 6-4 in those 10 games against lefties and 22-21 (.512) for the season...are 38-50 (.432) in games started by right-handers...the 43 games against left-handers are third most in the American League (Los Angeles 46, Boston 46)...are batting .235 (312 for 1330) against lefties compared to .253 (782 for 3089) against righties...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.03 ERA (193 er in 345.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the AL in ERA at the break but have the third highest post-break ERA in the American League and majors...have a 3.69 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.373) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19) but have issued the second most walks (449)...are sixth in strikeouts (938) but are on pace for 1160, which would break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009...A's starting pitchers are 16-15 with a 5.06 ERA (129 er in 229.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break...set an Oakland record for runs allowed (22) and base runners allowed (35) in a game Thursday in New York...issued 13 walks, which fell one short of the Oakland record and was the most in a game since June 11, 1996 at Cleveland when they also allowed 13.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit nine home runs in the first four games of the road trip and now have 27 in August, which is their highest single month total since August, 2009 when they had 28...have not hit 30 home runs in a month since hitting 36 in August, 2007...had a season-high tying three home runs Tuesday night (May 2 vs. Texas), snapping an Oakland record streak of 98 consecutive games with two home runs or fewer...now have 90 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...the pitching staff has allowed 12 home runs on the road trip but still have an **AL low** 103 for the season...yielded a ML record three grand slams Thursday at New York and have six for the season, which is tied with the Cubs for the Major League lead.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 104 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (110)...this is just the second time in the last eight years the A's have made 100 errors in a season (105 in 2009)...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 71 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-0) and Cleveland (four games)...have won seven of their last nine road games after losing 30 of the previous 37...have won three consecutive road series for the first time since June 29-July 18, 2010...have not won more than three straight road series since taking seven straight from July 8-August 29, 2005...are 25-41 (.379) on the road for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Toronto (2-2) and are 35-30 (.538) at home...are batting .253 (538 for 2129) at home and .243 (556 for 2290) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and seventh lowest in the majors...have a 3.09 ERA (204 er in 594.0 ip) at home compared to 4.31 (276 er in 576.1 ip) on the road.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 11-12 during this stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they player 19 of their 29 games on the road...began the stretch with a 4-5 road trip, went 4-6 on the last homestand and conclude it with this 10-game road trip...after that, the A's play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland from Sept. 2-22.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 13 times and currently have four players on the DL (Anderson, Braden, Magnuson and Wuertz)...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times in a season since 2005 when they used it eight times...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times, which was second most in Oakland history to 2008 (25).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 18th appearance and 16th start of the season...the A's are 8-7 (.533) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings nine times, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

RUN SUPPORT: The A's were shutout 1-0 in his last start...has been the starting pitcher in two of the A's three 1-0 losses this year and four of the 13 shutouts...has received no run support in six of his 15 starts...has received 22 runs of support in his last five starts (31.0 ip, 6.39 RSA) after receiving just 10 runs of support over his previous eight starts (1.97 RSA).

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his career-high two-game winning streak snapped in his last start, despite allowing just one run in 8.0 innings...is 2-1 with a

just one run in 8.0 innings…is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA over his last three starts (20.0 ip, 11 h, 6 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 17 so).

BRIEFLY: Is 3-3 with a 4.65 ERA (21 er in 40.2 ip) in seven starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19...began the season with the River Cats and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has allowed just six earned runs over the first three innings of a game for a 1.19 ERA (45.1 ip) and .165 (26 for 158) opponents batting average...has a 5.36 ERA (27 er in 45.1 ip) and .265 (49 for 185) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .219 (75 for 343) opponents batting average, which is seventh lowest among American League pitchers with 90 or more innings pitched...opponents are hitting .187 (48 for 257) the first two times through the lineup and .314 (27 for 86) after that...has yielded a .190 (12 for 63) average with runners in scoring position.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 6-6 with a 3.29 ERA (32 er in 87.2 ip) in 14 starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...made his two relief appearances on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the $3'^{d}$ and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4^{th} .

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high four games in a 2-0 win over Seattle July 6...posted a 2.43 ERA and .200 opponents during the losing streak, which spanned six games, including five starts.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July, 1968.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...walked a career-high four batters in 6.1 innings in a 5-4 loss at Chicago June 12...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Philadelphia June 24 ... tossed 7.0 innings and did not allow a run... Worley, Herndon, Perez and Stutes combined to shutout the A's on two hits...extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida June 29 in Oakland ... struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings ... Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle July 6 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss July 19 at Detroit...allowed career highs in runs (7), earned runs (6) and hits (9) and matched his high in home runs (2)...tossed just 4.2 innings, matching his fewest as a starter...blanked the Tigers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career high 12.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Tampa Bay July 25 in Oakland...matched his career high by walking four batters and allowing two home runs...did not strike out a batter for the first time in a starting assignment...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 win over Minnesota July 30 in Oakland...retired 11 of the 12 batters he faced over innings three through six...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Tampa Bay August 5...blanked the Rays on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth and three more in the fifth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-3 win at Toronto August 11 ... retired each of the first nine batters and had a 6-0 lead before allowing his first run...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-4 win over Baltimore August 16 in Oakland...had a 4-1 lead and he allowed a RBI double to Guerrero in the fourth and a RBI single to Bell in the fifth.


LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Toronto last Sunday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...allowed the only run of the game in the seventh inning when Bautista led off the inning with a home run...retired 22 of the final 24 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point...Perez and Janssen combined to shutout the A's on one hit.

MOSCOSO vs. BOSTON: Is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so) in two career appearances...both came in relief this year at Boston...tossed 2.1 scoreless innings in relief of Josh Outman June 3 and allowed two hits while striking out three...was charged with the loss the next day in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss...entered the game start the bottom of the 14th and retired the first two batters before Crawford doubled...intentionally walked Lowrie but Drew followed with the game-winning RBI single.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA (46.1 ip, 41 h, 22 r, 20 er, 16 bb, 52 so) and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
