#### A's vs. INDIANS

The A's trail in the season series, 1-3...lost the first meeting in Cleveland last night after losing two of three games in Oakland in May...won the season series last year 6-3 and have won each of the last two season series...are 12-8 against the Indians since 2009...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 249-218 against the Indians...that includes 132-96 in Oakland and 117-122 in Cleveland...including 32-53 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 884-1011 against the Indians.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his 10 save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 33 for 33 after the break in his career.

Hideki Matsui doubled in the sixth inning last night, the 488<sup>th</sup> of his professional career (245 in Japan, 243 in Major League Baseball)...that is the most by a Japanese player as Kazuyoshi Tatsunami of the Chunichi Dragons holds the Japanese Leagues doubles record with 487 (Ichiro Suzuki has a combined 487 in MLB and Japan).

**Scott Sizemore** has 11 doubles this month, which is one short of the Oakland record for doubles in August (12, Jason Giambi, 1999).

Josh Willingham is tied for third in the American League in home runs in August (8) and tied for fourth in the AL in home runs since the All-Star Break (12).

## THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1974 Claudell Washington has five hits in five at bats, collecting three singles, a double and a triple in the A's 10-5 win at Detroit...in 1995 the A's tie a club record with three triples in a 7-2 win at Baltimore...Brent Gates has one of those triples, and adds a single and a double to fall a home run short of the cycle...in 2001 Eric Chavez homers twice and has eight RBI in the A's 15-0 win at Baltimore.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three straight and four of the last five games after winning six of the previous eight games...were in a tie for first place in the American League West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 38-54 (.413) since then, which is the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have spent 37 of the last 38 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 71 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 24-21 (.533) record on the weekend (12-12 on Saturday, 12-9 on Sunday) compared to 36-53 (.404) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

**IN AUGUST:** The A's are 11-15 (.423) in August with two games remaining...this will be the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 last July...are hitting .247 (219 for 888) in August, which is third lowest in the American League...are tied for second in doubles (57) and rank fourth triples (8)...have 28 home runs, which is their highest single month total since August, 2009 when they also had 28...have not hit 30 home runs in a month since hitting 36 in August, 2007...the pitching staff has a 5.04 ERA (127 er in 227.0 ip), which is second highest in the AL.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's are 21-21 (.500) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .274 (394 for 1437) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 5.02 ERA (206 er in 369.0 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the second highest post-break ERA in the majors (Seattle, 5.08)...the offense ranks second in the AL in on-base percentage (.341), doubles (101) and triples (12) since the break, third in walks (145) and fourth in slugging (.446) and runs (216)...are hitting .314 (118 for 376) with runners in scoring position since the break...A's starting pitchers are 16-18 with a 5.17 ERA (141 er in 245.1 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have been held to four runs on 16 hits over the last three games after tallying 36 runs on 53 hits over the first four games of the road trip...are now batting .272 (69 for 254) with 40 runs scored in seven games on the road trip after hitting .213 with 31 runs scored in 10 games on the last homestand...for the season, have the second lowest batting average (.246) in the AL, the third lowest slugging percentage (.372) and the fourth fewest runs scored (531)...are on pace to score 642 runs and have not scored fewer than 646 runs in a non-strike season since 1979 (573)...have been shutout three times in the last 11 games and 14 times for the season, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

**PITCHING:** Brandon McCarthy tossed the A's fourth complete game of the season last night and the A's have lost all four of those games...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 7.20 ERA (48 er in 60.0 ip) on the road trip, which has raised the season ERA .19 runs to 3.72...that ranks fourth in the American League...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.375) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19) but are tied for the second most walks (454)...are fifth in strikeouts (958) and are on pace for 1158, which would break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009...set Oakland records for runs allowed (22) and base runners allowed (35) last Thursday in New York.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 10 home runs in the first seven games of the road trip, including a season-high tying three a week ago tonight (also May 2 vs. Texas)...the three-homer game snapped an Oakland record streak of 98 consecutive games with two home runs or fewer...now have 91 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...the pitching staff has allowed at least one home run in all seven games on the trip (15 home runs total), but still have an AL low 106 for the season...yielded a Major League record three grand slams last Thursday at New York and have six for the season, which is tied with the Cubs for the ML lead.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 106 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (111)...it is also the most by an A's team since the 2003 club had 107...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 73 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-4 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (0-1)...have won seven of their last 12 road games after losing 30 of the previous 37...are 25-44 (.362) on the road for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Toronto (2-2) and are 35-30 (.538) at home...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Kansas City (three games)...are batting .253 (538 for 2129) at home and .240 (572 for 2387) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and sixth lowest in the majors...have a 3.09 ERA (204 er in 594.0 ip) at home compared to 4.33 (289 er in 600.1 ip) on the road.

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** The A's are 11-15 during this stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they player 19 of their 29 games on the road...began the stretch with a 4-5 road trip, went 4-6 on the last homestand and finish it with this 10-game road trip that ends Thursday...beginning Friday, the A's will play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland through Sept. 22.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's fell to 17-23 (.425) in one-run games with the loss last night, which is the worst record in the American League and tied for second worst in the majors...are 8-10 (.444) in extra inning games...rank second in the AL in extra inning games and tied for second in losses...have won each of their last three extra inning games, which is their longest extra inning win streak since June 3-July 10, 2008 when they won four straight...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 15-27 (.357) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-25 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-18 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season, which ties him for the American League lead...the A's are 11-17 (.393) in his starting assignments this year and are 47-43 (.522) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 14 of his 28 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 16 times.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 1-5 with a 7.00 ERA (35 er in 45.0 ip) and .312 (59 for 189) opponents batting average in eight starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .240 opponents average in 20 starts before the break...has the third highest post-break ERA in the majors and is tied for third in losses.

6-0 THEN 3-12: Is 3-12 with a 5.19 ERA (69 er in 119.2 ip) and .282 (131 for 464) opponents batting average over his last 20 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but leads the majors in losses since May

IN AUGUST: Is 0-3 with a 6.91 ERA (22 er in 28.2 ip) in five starts in August...the highest single-month ERA of his career is 6.66 in July, 2009.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in stolen bases allowed (26) and wild pitches (12), ranks fifth in walks (70) and tied for fifth in losses (12)...the 26 stolen bases are the most allowed by an A's pitcher since Dave Stewart yielded 32 in 1987...the 12 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when two pitchers had at least 12 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-7 with a 3.15 ERA (32 er in 91.1 ip) and .241 (82 for 340) opponents batting average in 14 starts at home and 4-5 with a 5.24 ERA (47 er in 80.2 ip) and .282 (90 for 319) in 14 starts on the road...is now 23-17 with a 3.23 ERA (108 er in 301.0 ip) in 47 career starts in Oakland and 14-16 with a 4.68 ERA (128 er in 246.1 ip) in 43 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .178 (13 for 73) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...has yielded a .276 (43 for 156) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .342 (38 for 111) over his last 18 starts (since May 25).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or fewer in 18 of his last 20 starts and his run support average over that span is 2.86 (38 rs in 119.2 ip)...13 of those 38 runs of support came in one start, July 27 against Tampa Bay...has received run support of three runs or fewer in 23 of his 28 starts this year and his season RSA of 3.72 (71 rs in 172.0 ip) is ninth lowest in the American League.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-6 with a 3.38 ERA (29 er in 77.1 ip) in 11 starts during the day and 6-6 with a 4.75 ERA (50 er in 94.2 ip) in 17 starts at night...his career numbers are 12-12 with a 3.26 ERA (70 er in 193.1 ip) in 30 career starts during the day and 25-21 with a 4.22 ERA (166 er in 354.0 ip) in 60 starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 4-4 with a 3.54 ERA (27 er in 68.2 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more and 5-8 with a 4.53 ERA (52 er in 103.1 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest.

WINS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 27...won 10 games as a rookie in 2009 and 18 games last year...with one more win, he will become just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...has 37 career wins, which are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida

CAREER TRENDS: Went 10-14 with a 4.80 ERA and .271 opponents batting average over the first 33 starts of his career...then went 24-7 with a 2.55 ERA and .215 opponents batting average over a 37-start stretch from May 5, 2010 to May 9, 2011...is 3-12 with a 5.19 ERA (69 er in 119.2 ip) and .283 (131 for 463) opponents batting average in 20 starts since then.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-4, 10-inning win at New York last Wednesday...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Jeter in the third inning to tie the game at 1-1...also allowed a solo home run to Swisher in the sixth inning and was relieved by Fuentes to start the seventh with the A's trailing 2-1.

CAHILL vs. CLEVELAND: Is 2-1 with a 3.06 ERA (17.2 ip. 18 h, 10 r, 6 er, 9 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 3-1 A's win in Oakland May 4...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Hafner in the third inning...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings pitched...it was the sixth time in seven starts he allowed one run or fewer...the A's added a run in the fourth and one more in the eighth for the win...his other win came in a 6-1 A's victory at Cleveland August 25, 2010...allowed just one run in seven innings and it was unearned...Donald reached on a Kouzmanoff error to start the fifth, went to second on a ground out and scored on a Cabrera single...was aided by three double plays...the loss came in a 15-3 decision at Cleveland July 3, 2009...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Hafner in the second...was then charged with two unearned runs in the third following two errors by Crosby...also allowed four runs in the fourth on a RBI double by Cabrera and a two-run double by Choo...was relieved by Casilla, who allowed an inherited runner to score

RHP Rich Harden (4-2, 4.55 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...it will be his 100th career start as an Athletic...ranks fifth in the American League with 58 strikeouts since the All-Star Break...for the season, is averaging 10.36 strikeouts per nine innings, which ranks sixth best in the AL among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...is 2-0 with a 3.30 ERA and .171 opponents batting average in five starts at home and 2-2 with a 5.93 ERA and .292 opponents average in five starts on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 22-9 loss at New York last Thursday (4.1 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 1-0 with a 4.36 ERA in seven career appearances, six starts, against Cleveland....last faced the Indians April 12 last year with Texas, a start and no decision in a 4-2 Texas win in 10 innings (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 2 so).

## BOB MELVIN 6

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
