### A's vs. INDIANS

The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2008 as they trail 1-4 with two games remaining...have lost the first two meetings in Cleveland after losing two of three games in Oakland in May...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 249-219 against the Indians...that includes 132-96 in Oakland and 117-123 in Cleveland...including 32-54 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 884-1012 against the Indians.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Bailey** has converted each of his 10 save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 33 for 33 after the break in his career.

**Hideki Matsui** doubled in the sixth inning Monday night, the 488<sup>th</sup> of his professional career (245 in Japan, 243 in Major League Baseball)...that is the most by a Japanese player as Kazuyoshi Tatsunami of the Chunichi Dragons holds the Japanese Leagues doubles record with 487 (Ichiro Suzuki has a combined 487 in MLB and Japan).

**Scott Sizemore** has 11 doubles this month, which is one short of the Oakland record for doubles in August (12, Jason Giambi, 1999).

**Josh Willingham** is tied for third in the American League in home runs in August (8) and tied for fourth in the AL in home runs since the All-Star Break (12)...he leads the A's with 23 home runs and 79 RBI.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1996** Willie Adams tosses the A's third consecutive shutout, a 8-0 whitewashing of the Red Sox...it follows a combined shutout by Dave Telgheder and Buddy Groom against Boston and a Don Wengert blanking of the Orioles...in **1998** Rickey Henderson scores on a Jason Giambi fifth inning sacrifice fly in a game at Cleveland to become the sixth player in major league history to score 2000 runs in his career.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost each of the last four games to fall a season-low tying 15 games under .500 at 60-75 (also 53-68 on August 15)...have not been 16 games under .500 since September 5, 2009 (60-76)...trail Texas by 16½ games in the American League West, which matches the A's largest deficit of the season (last: August 19)...have not been farther back since finishing the 2009 season 22 games out...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 38-55 (.409) since then, which is the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have spent 38 of the last 39 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 72 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 24-21 (.533) record on the weekend (12-12 on Saturday, 12-9 on Sunday) compared to 36-54 (.400) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

**IN AUGUST:** The A's are 11-16 (.407) in August entering the final game today...this will be the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 last July...are hitting .246 (227 for 921) in August, which is third lowest in the American League...rank third in doubles (59) and fourth in triples (8)...have 28 home runs, which is their highest single month total since August, 2009 when they also had 28...have not hit 30 home runs in a month since hitting 36 in August, 2007...the pitching staff has a 5.09 ERA (133 er in 235.0 ip), which is second highest in the AL.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's are 21-22 (.488) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .273 (402 for 1470) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 5.06 ERA (212 er in 377.0 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the second highest post-break ERA in the majors (Seattle, 5.24)...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles (103) and triples (12) since the break, third in walks (147) and fourth in slugging (.442), on-base percentage (.340) and runs (218)...are hitting .309 (119 for 385) with runners in scoring position since the break...A's starting pitchers are 16-19 with a 5.24 ERA (146 er in 250.2 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have been held to six runs on 24 hits over the last four games after tallying 36 runs on 53 hits over the first four games of the road trip...are now batting .268 (77 for 287) with 42 runs scored in eight games on the road trip after hitting .213 with 31 runs scored in 10 games on the last homestand...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.246), on-base percentage (.313) and slugging percentage (.371) in the AL and the third fewest runs scored (533)...are on pace to score 640 runs and have not scored fewer than 646 runs in a non-strike season since 1979 (573)...have been shutout three times in the last 12 games and 14 times for the season, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff has compiled a 7.15 ERA (54 er in 68.0 ip) on the road trip, which has raised the season ERA .21 runs to 3.74...that ranks fourth in the American League...has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.376) and is tied for the lead in pickoffs (19) but has issued the third most walks (456)...is fifth in strikeouts (961) and are on pace for 1153, which would break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009...Brandon McCarthy tossed the A's fourth complete game of the season Monday night and the A's have lost all four of those games...set Oakland records for runs allowed (22) and base runners allowed (35) last Thursday in New York.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have gone homerless in each of the last three games after homering 10 times over the first five games of the trip...have 91 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...the pitching staff has allowed at least one home run in all eight games on the trip (17 home runs total), but still have an **AL low** 108 for the season...yielded a Major League record three grand slams last Thursday at New York and have six for the season, which is tied with the Cubs for the ML lead.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 106 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (113)...it is also the most by an A's team since the 2003 club had 107...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 73 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-5 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (0-2)...are 25-45 (.357) on the road, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Toronto (2-2) and are 35-30 (.538) at home...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Kansas City (three games)...are batting .253 (538 for 2129) at home and .240 (580 for 2420) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and sixth lowest in the majors...have a 3.09 ERA (204 er in 594.0 ip) at home compared to 4.36 (295 er in 608.1 ip) on the road.

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** The A's are 11-16 during this stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of their 29 games on the road...began the stretch with a 4-5 road trip, went 4-6 on the last homestand and finish it with this 10-game road trip that ends tomorrow...beginning Friday, the A's will play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland through Sept. 22.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 17-23 (.425) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and tied for second worst in the majors...are 8-10 (.444) in extra inning games...are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games and losses...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are now 15-27 (.357) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-25 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-18 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 11<sup>th</sup> start of the season...it is the 156<sup>th</sup> start of his career, his 100<sup>th</sup> as an Athletic...will become the 21<sup>st</sup> pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...the A's are 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 96-59 (.619) in his starting assignments in his career, including 63-36 (.636) with the A's...has tossed six or more innings in five of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer six times...is 42-0 in 58 career starts with run support of four or more.

**STRIKEOUTS:** Ranks fifth in the American League with 58 strikeouts since the All-Star Break...that includes a career-high tying 11 August 19 against Toronto...has 66 strikeouts in 57.1 innings for the season, an average of 10.36 per nine innings...that is seventh best in the AL among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .234 opponents batting average including .173 (18 for 104) against left-handed hitters and .289 (33 for 114) against right-handers...has surrendered eight of his 10 home runs to righties for a .535 slugging percentage...lefties are slugging .298...six of his 10 home runs allowed have been with the bases empty...has yielded a .218 (17 for 78) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .225 (18 for 80) the second time and .267 (16 for 60) with six of his 10 home runs after that...his career numbers are .198 (254 for 1283) the first time, .223 (263 for 1180) the second time and .266 (228 for 857) after that.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-2 with a 5.90 ERA (21 er in 32.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or fewer and 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA (8 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts on six days rest or more.

**HOME AND AWAY:** is 2-0 with a 3.30 ERA (11 er in 30.0 ip) and .171 (18 for 105) opponents batting average in five starts at home and 2-2 with a 5.93 ERA (18 er in 27.1 ip) and .292 (33 for 113) opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 21-10 with a 3.01 ERA (111 er in 332.1 ip) in 56 career appearances in the Coliseum and 38-26 with a 4.08 ERA (259 er in 570.2) in 109 career appearances in all other parks.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 after going 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento (7.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr)...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10<sup>th</sup> career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

**SINCE 2003:** Has 924 strikeouts in 903.0 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.21 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 900 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 9.94)...has a .224 (745 for 3320) opponents batting average over that span, which is third best using the 900 innings pitched minimum (Lincecum, .221; Johan Santana, .221).

**WITH THE A'S:** Is 40-21 with a 3.53 ERA (235 er in 599.0 ip) in 107 games, 99 starts, in an A's uniform...his .656 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...began his career with the A's in 2003 and was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008...went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

**2011 START-BY-START:** Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona **July 1** in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...it was his first start as an Athletic since July 6, 2008 and his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas **July 7**...allowed runs in four of his five innings and Holland shutout the A's on four hits...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in the second game of the doubleheader against Los Angeles **July 16** in Oakland...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Wells in the sixth inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at New York **July 23**...allowed a RBI single to Martin in the second inning and a solo home run to Swisher in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 10-8 loss to Tampa Bay **July 28** in Oakland...did not allow a hit until Zobrist singled to lead off the fifth...left after six innings with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed seven runs in the seventh inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Seattle **August 2**...allowed a two-run double to Carp in the first inning and a two-out, two-run home run to Wells in the sixth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win at Toronto **August 9**...surrendered a lead off home run to Encarnacion in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Texas **August 14** in Oakland...did not allow a home run, snapping a career-long streak of eight consecutive games with a home run allowed dating back to his final outing of 2010...combined with Bailey and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Toronto **August 19** in Oakland...tossed seven innings and allowed both of the hits...struck out a career-high tying 11.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 22-9 loss at New York last Thursday...allowed a leadoff triple to Jeter in the first and he scored on a ground out...the A's then took a 7-1 lead before he allowed a solo home run to Martin in the fourth inning...then surrendered a grand slam to Cano in the fifth, making the score 7-6...was relieved with one out and a runner on second in the fifth inning...the Yankees then scored 16 runs off the A's bullpen over the final three innings.

**HARDEN vs. CLEVELAND:** Is 1-0 with a 4.36 ERA (33.0 ip, 25 h, 19 r, 16 er, 19 bb, 33 so, 5 hr) in seven career appearances, six starts...is 0-0 with a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in three games, two starts, at Progressive Field, 1-0 with a 2.81 ERA (5 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 0-0 with a 10.80 ERA (6 er in 5.0 ip) in one start at Chicago...has not faced the Indians this year...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 4-2 Texas win in 10 innings April 12...allowed a solo home run to Choo in the first inning but then blanked the Indians on one hit over the next four innings...had a 2-1 lead entering the bottom of the sixth but allowed a sacrifice fly to Peralta to tie the game.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Gio Gonzalez (11-11, 3.35 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 27<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is 3-5 with a 5.44 ERA in eight starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for fourth in the American League in losses since the break...ranks ninth in the American League with 160 strikeouts, which is sixth most in Oakland history at the end of August...is 8-4 with a 2.36 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in 14 starts at home compared to 3-7 with a 4.65 ERA and .276 opponents average in 12 starts on the road...is tied for second in the AL in home wins and tied for third in road losses...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 15-5 A's win at Boston last Friday (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is 4-0 with a 0.89 ERA in five career starts against Cleveland...has not allowed a run in his last three starts and has a 20.2 inning scoreless streak against the Indians...his last start was a win August 24, 2010 at Cleveland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 7 so).

**Save/Save Opportunities: 33/49 (67.3%)**

The A's bullpen has compiled a 8.61 ERA (22 er in 23.0 ip) on the road trip and has issued 17 walks in 23.0 innings...that includes an Oakland bullpen record 16 runs and 12 walks last Thursday at New York...now has a 4.70 ERA (66 er in 126.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and the third most walks (168)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (92) and tied for fourth in fewest first batter home runs (7)...four of those seven first batter home runs have come on the road trip...has allowed 64 of 173 (37.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Seattle, 42.0).

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 27<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 12-14 (.462) in his starting assignments this year and are 42-41 (.506) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in 18 of his 26 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** Is 3-5 with a 5.44 ERA (29 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for second in the American League in losses since the break (**Duensing**, MIN 6).

**STRIKEOUTS:** Ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in the American League in strikeouts (160)...his 160 strikeouts are sixth most in Oakland history at the end of August and are the most since Barry Zito had 168 in 2001...had 111 strikeouts at the All-Star Break, which tied for the fourth best pre-Break total in Oakland history...it was the most at the break since Jose Rijo also had 111 in 1986.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for the American League lead in walks (76), ranks fourth in strikeouts per nine innings (8.94), tied for seventh in losses (11) and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in hit batters (8)...the 11 losses are a career-high.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has the fifth lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.337) and the ninth lowest batting average (.233)...opponents are batting .196 (27 for 138) with runners in scoring position, which is seventh lowest...has yielded just 13 home runs in 161.0 innings for an average of 0.64 per nine innings, which is eighth lowest...seven of the 11 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 8-4 with a 2.36 ERA (24 er in 91.1 ip) and .196 (64 for 326) opponents batting average in 14 starts at home compared to 3-7 with a 4.65 ERA (36 er in 69.2 ip) and .276 (77 for 279) opponents average in 12 starts on the road...is tied for second in the American League in home wins and tied for third in road losses...ranks fourth in the AL in home ERA and opponents batting average...over the last two years, he is 16-7 with a 2.47 ERA (53 in 193.1 ip) and .198 (137 for 692) opponents average in 30 starts at home and 10-13 with a 4.22 ERA (79 er in 168.1 ip) and .265 (175 for 661) average in 29 starts on the road.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 5-4 with a 3.82 ERA (27 er in 63.2 ip) in 10 starts during the day and 6-7 with a 3.05 ERA (33 er in 97.1 ip) in 16 starts at night...has the sixth lowest night ERA in the American League...is now 15-8 with a 3.73 ERA (76 er in 183.1 ip) in 30 career games during the day compared to 18-23 with a 4.28 ERA (148 er in 311.0 ip) in 59 contests at night.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of two runs or fewer 15 of his 26 starts...has just 19 runs of support in his 11 losses this year (61.0 ip, 2.80 RSA) and 37 runs of support in his 31 career losses (155.0 ip, 2.15 RSA)...is 28-2 in 38 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-29 in 45 starts with support of two or fewer.

**LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Snapped his career-high tying five-game losing streak with a win over Toronto August 20...posted a .790 ERA and allowed a .304 opponents batting average during the streak which lasted five starts from July 24 to Aug. 15...also lost five straight from Aug. 17, 2008-June 30, 2009.

**MONTH-BY-MONTH:** Went 2-3 with a 5.52 ERA in five starts in August...that was his highest single month ERA since July, 2009 when he had a 7.48 ERA...went 2-3 with a 4.50 ERA in five starts in July...at the time, that was his highest single month ERA in September, 2009 when he also had a 4.50 ERA...went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest single-month ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April.

**ALL-STAR:** Was named to his first American League All-Star team and was the A's lone selection...entered the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with two outs and the bases empty and struck out the only batter he faced, Jay Bruce.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week ending July 3 after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a Major League leading 16 strikeouts in two starts...shared the honors with Toronto's Jose Bautista...it marked his first Player of the Week award.

**LAST START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 15-5 win at Boston last Friday...allowed a RBI single to Gonzalez in the first inning but the A's came back with two runs in the second and six more in the fourth to build an 8-1 lead...he allowed back-to-back home runs to Pedroia and Ortiz in the bottom of the fourth to make the score 8-3...Ellsbury tripled to lead off the fifth and scored on a ground out for his other run.

**GONZALEZ vs. CLEVELAND:** Is 4-0 with a 0.89 ERA (30.1 ip, 23 h, 5 r, 3 er, 13 bb, 26 so, 3 hr) in five career starts...has not allowed a run in his last three starts and has a 20.2 inning scoreless streak against the Indians...that is the longest by an A's pitcher against Cleveland since Bob Welch had a 28.0-inning streak from July 19, 1988-May 16, 1990...is 3-0 with a 0.92 ERA (2 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts in Cleveland and 1-0 with a 0.84 ERA (1 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland...has not faced the Indians this year...went 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (20.2 ip, 15 h, 7 bb, 15 so) in three starts against Cleveland in 2010...prior to that the last Major League pitcher to make at least three starts against the Indians without allowing a run is Bob Welch, who did it for Oakland in 1989 (21.0 innings)...in all three of his start in 2010, the bullpen completed the shutout.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 21<sup>st</sup> start of the season, his 12<sup>th</sup> since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...the A's are 9-11 (.450) in his starting assignments and his teams are 36-40 (.474) in his 76 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 16 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 19 times.

**(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE:** Tossed his third complete game of the season in his last start and has taken the loss in all three games (April 21 at Seattle, May 7 at Kansas City, August 29 at Cleveland)...the three complete games are **red** **for ninth** in the American League...since 1995, the only other Oakland pitchers with three complete game losses in one season are Mark Mulder and Barry Zito in 2003.

**SINCE THE BREAK:** Is 6-2 with a 3.77 ERA (24 er in 57.1 ip) in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...is **red** **for second** in the American League in wins since the break (**Verlander**, **DET 8**).

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Has 133.2 innings pitched, which is 4.1 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 100 innings, he ranks **third** in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.48), **fourth** in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.54) and **fifth** in strikeout to walk ratio (4.23).

**CAREER BESTS:** Won his seventh game of the season August 23, which matches his career high set in 2009 with Texas...already has career highs in innings pitched (133.2), strikeouts (93) and complete games (3)...is scheduled to make his 21<sup>st</sup> start today, which is one short of his career high from 2007...has a 3.64 ERA and has not finished with a mark under 4.03 in his career.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Is 6-3 with a 3.86 ERA (30 er in 70.0 ip) in 11 starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Has committed four errors, which is **red** **for third most** among American League pitchers...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

**2011 HIGHLIGHTS:** Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto **April 5**...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle)...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota **April 10**...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss **April 15** against Detroit in Oakland...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10<sup>th</sup> as Fuentes took the loss...it was the first of three times he has left the game with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also July 9, July 20)...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle **April 21**...the complete game was his second of his career (also May 24, 2009 at Houston)...was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles **April 26**...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City **May 7**...snapped his losing streak at a career-high five games in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles **July 15** in Oakland...it was his first win since April 10...the previous longest losing streak of his career was four from June 25 to September 10, 2006...posted a 3.72 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned seven starts...combined with De Los Santos on a five-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win at Tampa Bay **August 6**...had his winning streak snapped at a career-high tying four games in a 9-1 loss to Texas in Oakland **August 12**...allowed a career-high tying seven runs...left the game after 3.1 innings with a right knee contusion...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-5 win at New York **August 23**...issued a season-high three walks, snapping a 21-start streak with two walks or fewer.

**Contract Status:** Signed through 2011

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
