A's vs. INDIANS

The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2008 as they trail 1-5 entering the final meeting today...lost two of three in Oakland and have lost the first three games of this series...have not been swept by the Indians in a four-game series since April 26-29, 1999 in Oakland...have not been swept in a four-game series in Cleveland since July 14-16, 1995...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 249-220 against the Indians...that includes 132-96 in Oakland and 117-124 in Cleveland...including 32-55 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 884-1013 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The time of game last night was 5 hours and 2 minutes, the A's second longest game of the season...Oakland has played 30 hours and 44 minutes of baseball over the first nine games of the trip (3:24 average per game) and has four rain delays totaling 5 hours and 29 minutes.

The 16-inning game last night was the 16th of 16 or more innings in Oakland history and was the longest since a 17-inning game on June 17, 2006 against Los Angeles (NL).

There were a combined 34 strikeouts in the game last night, which was third most in Oakland history (43, July 9, 1971 vs. CAL and 35, Aug. 6, 2007 at TEX).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1906 Jack Coombs and Boston's Joe Harris go the distance in a 24 inning, 4-1 A's victory that lasts four hours and 47 minutes...Coombs strikes out 18...in 1974 Sal Bando hits a tworun homer in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit...it is his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...in 2002 Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Minnesota 7-5 to set a franchise record with their 18th consecutive win...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost their fifth consecutive game this morning to fall a season-low 16 games under .500 at 60-76...this is the first time the A's have been 16 games under .500 since September 5, 2009 (60-76)...have not been 17 under since September 4, 2009 (59-76)...trail Texas by 16½ games in the American League West for the second consecutive day, which matches the A's largest deficit of the season (last: August 19)...have not been farther back since finishing the 2009 season 22 games out...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 38-56 (.404) since then, which is the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have spent 39 of the last 40 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 73 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 24-21 (.533) record on the weekend (12-12 on Saturday, 12-9 on Sunday) compared to 36-55 (.396) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 17-24 (.415) in one-run games with the loss last night...that is the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (San Diego, 18-27 .400)...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...are now 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-26 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-19 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

IN AUGUST: The A's finished August with an 11-17 (.393) record, which was third worst in the American League...it marked the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 last July...hit .244 (239 for 978) in August, which was third lowest in the AL...tied for second in doubles (62) and ranked fourth in triples (8)...hit 29 home runs, which was their most in a month since hitting 36 in August, 2007...the pitching staff had a 4.93 ERA (137 er in 250.1 ip), which was second highest in the AL.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 21-23 (.477) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .271 (414 for 1527) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.95 ERA (216 er in 392.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL and majors...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles (105) and triples (12) since the break, third in walks (152) and fourth in slugging (.437), on-base percentage (.338) and runs (221)...are hitting .301 (120 for 399) with runners in scoring position since the break...A's starting pitchers are 16-19 with a 5.22 ERA (149 er in 256.2 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to nine runs on 36 hits over the last five games after tallying 36 runs on 53 hits over the first four games of the road trip...are now batting .259 (89 for 344) with 45 runs scored in nine games on the road trip after hitting .213 with 31 runs scored in 10 games on the last homestand...for the season, have the third lowest batting average (.245), on-base percentage (.312) and slugging percentage (.370) in the AL and the third fewest runs (536)...are on pace to score 638 runs and have not scored fewer than 646 runs in a non-strike season since 1979 (573)...have been shutout three times in the last 13 games and 14 times for the season, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff had 19 strikeouts last night, which was the fourth highest single game total in Oakland history...it was the most since August 6, 2007 at Texas when they had 21...rank fourth in the American League with 980 strikeouts for the season and are one pace for 1167, which would break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009...the A's have compiled a 6.26 ERA (58 er in 83.1 ip) on the road trip, which has raised the season ERA .19 runs to 3.72...that ranks fourth in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.376) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19) but have issued the third most walks (459)...Brandon McCarthy tossed the A's fourth complete game of the season Monday night and the A's have lost all four of those games.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have allowed at least one home run in all nine games on the trip (19 home runs total), but still have an **American League low** 110 home runs for the season...yielded a Major League record three grand slams a week ago today at New York and have six for the season, which is tied with the Cubs for the ML lead...the offense has hit 92 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 106 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (114)...it is also the most by an A's team since the 2003 club had 107...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 73 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-6 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (0-3)...are 25-46 (.352) on the road, which is the third worst record in the AL...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Toronto (2-2) and are 35-30 (.538) at home...return home following the game today for a six-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Kansas City (three games)...are batting .253 (538 for 2129) at home and .239 (592 for 2477) on the road...have the lowest road batting average in the AL and sixth lowest in the majors...have a 3.09 ERA (204 er in 594.0 ip) at home compared to 4.31 (299 er in 623.2 ip) on the road.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 11-17 during this stretch from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they player 19 of their 29 games on the road...began the stretch with a 4-5 road trip, went 4-6 on the last homestand and finish it with this 10-game road trip that ends today...beginning tomorrow, the A's will play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland through Sept. 22.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 3-5 with a 5.44 ERA (29 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for fourth in the American League in losses since the break.

STRIKEOUTS: Ranks 10th in the American League in strikeouts (160)...his 160 strikeouts are sixth most in Oakland history at the end of August and are the most since Barry Zito had 168 in 2001...had 111 strikeouts at the All-Star Break, which tied for the fourth best pre-Break total in Oakland history...it was the most at the break since Jose Rijo also had

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League lead in walks (76), ranks fourth in strikeouts per nine innings (8.94), tied for eighth in losses (11) and tied for ninth in hit batters (8)...the 11 losses are a career-high.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has the fifth lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.337)...opponents are batting .196 (27 for 138) with runners in scoring position, which is seventh lowest...has yielded just 13 home runs in 161.0 innings for an average of 0.64 per nine innings, which is ninth lowest...seven of the 11 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-4 with a 2.36 ERA (24 er in 91.1 ip) and .196 (64 for 326) opponents batting average in 14 starts at home compared to 3-7 with a 4.65 ERA (36 er in 69.2 ip) and .276 (77 for 279) opponents average in 12 starts on the road...is tied for second in the American League in home wins and tied for third in road losses...ranks fourth in the AL in home opponents batting average and fifth in ERA...over the last two years, he is 16-7 with a 2.47 ERA (53 in 193.1 ip) and .198 (137 for 692) opponents average in 30 starts at home and 10-13 with a 4.22 ERA (79 er in 168.1 ip) and .265 (175 for 661) average

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-4 with a 3.82 ERA (27 er in 63.2 ip) in 10 starts during the day and 6-7 with a 3.05 ERA (33 er in 97.1 ip) in 16 starts at night…has the ninth lowest night ERA in the American League…is now 15-8 with a 3.73 ERA (76 er in 183.1 ip) in 30 career games during the day compared to 18-23 with a 4.28 ERA (148 er in 311.0 ip) in 59 contests at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer 15 of his 26 starts...has just 19 runs of support in his 11 losses this year (61.0 ip, 2.80 RSA) and 37 runs of support in his 31 career losses (155.0 ip, 2.15 RSA)...is 28-2 in 38 career starts with run support of three or more and 5-29 in 45 starts with support of two or fewer.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his career-high tying five-game losing streak with a win over Toronto August 20...posted a .790 ERA and allowed a .304 opponents batting average during the streak which lasted five starts from July 24 to Aug. 15...also lost five straight from Aug. 17, 2008-June 30, 2009.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 5.52 ERA in five starts in August...that was his highest single month ERA since July, 2009 when he had a 7.48 ERA...went 2-3 with a 4.50 ERA in five starts in July...at the time, that was his highest single month ERA in September, 2009 when he also had a 4.50 ERA...went 2-3 with a 2.72 ERA in six starts in June and tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts (36)...was 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in May...that was the lowest singlemonth ERA of his career (1.98 in August, 2010) and was fourth best in the AL...also tied for fifth in wins and tied for 10th in strikeouts (35)...went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team and was the A's lone selection...entered the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with two outs and the bases empty and struck out the only batter he faced, Jay Bruce.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week ending July 3 after going 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA and a Major League leading 16 strikeouts in two starts...shared the honors with Toronto's Jose Bautista...it marked his first Player of the Week award.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 15-5 win at Boston last Friday...allowed a RBI single to Gonzalez in the first inning but the A's came back with two runs in the second and six more in the fourth to build an 8-1 lead...he allowed back-to-back home runs to Pedroia and Ortiz in the bottom of the fourth to make the score 8-3...Ellsbury tripled to lead off the fifth and scored on a ground out for his other run.

GONZALEZ vs. CLEVELAND: Is 4-0 with a 0.89 ERA (30.1 ip, 23 h, 5 r, 3 er, 13 bb, 26 so, 3 hr) in five career starts...has not allowed a run in his last three starts and has a 20.2 inning scoreless streak against the Indians...that is the longest by an A's pitcher against Cleveland since Bob Welch had a 28.0-inning streak from July 19, 1988-May 16, 1990...is 3-0 with a 0.92 ERA (2 er in 19.2 ip) in three starts in Cleveland and 1-0 with a 0.84 ERA (1 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland...has not faced the Indians this year...went 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (20.2 ip, 15 h, 7 bb, 15 so) in three starts against Cleveland in 2010...prior to that the last Major League pitcher to make at least three starts against the Indians without allowing a run is Bob Welch, who did it for Oakland in 1989 (21.0 innings)...in all three of his start in 2010, the bullpen completed the shutout.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Guillermo Moscoso (6-8, 3.80 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 19th appearance and 17th start of the season...is 3-4 with a 5.64 ERA and .279 opponents batting average in eight starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19 after going 3-4 with a 2.16 ERA and .186 opponents batting average over his first 11 games, nine starts...is 4-2 with a 2.81 ERA in eight starts at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.82 ERA in 10 games, eight starts, on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-3 A's loss at Boston in the first game of the doubleheader last Saturday (4.0 ip, 9 h, 8 r, 7 er, 2 bb)...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in his only career appearance against Seattle, a start in a 2-0 A's win this year on July 6 in Oakland (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 5 so).

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.
