A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail in the season series 4-9 and with one more loss will lose the season series...are 2-4 in Oakland and 2-5 in Seattle...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 37-52 (.416) against Seattle since 2007...that is the lowest winning percentage by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 287-216 (.571) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 160-92 in Oakland and 127-124 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's played 33 hours and 50 minutes of baseball in the 10 games on the last road trip for an average time of game of 3 hours and 23 minutes...also had four rain delays totaling 5 hours and 29 minutes.

Andrew Bailey has converted all 10 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 33 for 33 in saves after the break in his career.

Cliff Pennington had a careerhigh tying four hits yesterday and went 17 for 42 (.405) on the road trip...he is now batting .347 (51 for 147) since the All-Star Break, which ranks fifth in the American League.

Jemile Weeks has a career-high nine-game hitting streak (15 for 39, .385)...leads American League rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21), third in hits (92), fourth in doubles (19) and fifth in extra base hits (27) despite spending the first two months of the season in the

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their five-game losing streak yesterday and are now 8-8 over the last 16 games...trail Texas by 16½ games in the American League West for the third consecutive day, which matches the A's largest deficit of the season...have not been farther back since finishing the 2009 season 22 games out...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 39-56 (.411) since then, which is the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have spent 40 of the last 41 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 74 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 24-21 (.533) record on the weekend (12-12 on Saturday, 12-9 on Sunday) compared to 37-55 (.402) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 22-23 (.489) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .272 (426 for 1566) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.84 ERA (216 er in 401.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles (106) and triples (12) since the break, third in walks (156) and fourth in slugging (.434), on-base percentage (.338) and runs (228)...are hitting .306 (126 for 412) with runners in scoring position since the break...A's starting pitchers are 17-19 with a 5.09 ERA (149 er in 263.2 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand tonight against Seattle (three games) and Kansas City (three games)...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Texas (0-3), Baltimore (2-1) and Toronto (2-2) and are 35-30 (.538) at home...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3)...are 26-46 (.361) on the road, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...are batting .253 (538 for 2129) at home and .240 (604 for 2516) on the road...have a 3.09 ERA (204 er in 594.0 ip) at home compared to 4.25 (299 er in 632.2 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and the fifth lowest in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Beginning tonight, the A's will play 16 of their next 19 games in Oakland in a stretch that runs through Sept. 22...the only exception is a three-game series at Texas next weekend...just completed a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

OFFENSE: The A's hit .264 with 52 runs, 28 doubles, 11 home runs and 15 stolen bases in 10 games on the last road trip after batting .213 with 31 runs, 17 doubles, five home runs and two stolen bases in 10 games on the last homestand...have the third lowest batting average (.246), on-base percentage (.313) and slugging percentage (.370) in the American League and the third fewest runs (543) and home runs (92)...are on pace to score 642 runs and have not scored fewer than 646 runs in a non-strike season since 1979 (573)...have not had an on-base percentage under .318 since 1982 (.309)...are on pace to hit 108 home runs...hit 109 home runs last year, which was the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1979 (108)...have been shutout 14 times, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff tossed its eighth shutout of the season yesterday and now has a 2.79 ERA (15 er in 48.1 ip) and 50 strikeouts over the last five games...has a 3.69 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...rank third with 990 strikeouts...have topped 1000 strikeouts 11 times in franchise history, including each of the last 10 seasons dating back to 2001...are on pace to break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (110), have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.375) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19)...have issued the third most walks (463)...Brandon McCarthy tossed the A's fourth complete game of the season Monday night and the A's have lost all four of those games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 107 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (114)...it is also the most by an A's team since the 2003 club also had 107....have not made more than 107 errors in a season since 2001 (125)...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 73 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 17-24 (.415) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (San Diego, 18-27 .400)...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-26 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-19 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

IN AUGUST: The A's finished August with an 11-17 (.393) record, which was third worst in the American League...it marked the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 last July...hit .244 in August, which was third lowest in the AL...tied for second in doubles (62) and ranked fourth in triples (8)...hit 29 home runs, which was their most in a month since hitting 36 in August, 2007...the pitching staff had a 4.93 ERA, which was second highest in the AL.

PLAYERS USED: Neil Wagner became the 45th player to appear in a game for Oakland on Wednesday...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Wagner is the 25th pitcher the A's have used this year, which is one short of the Oakland record of 26 set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the A's have used just three right fielders (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently the fewest in Oakland history (used 4 in 1980).

MOSCOSO'S CAREER HIGHS

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 19th appearance and 17th start of the season...the A's are 8-8 (.500) in his starting assignments, which are the only starting assignments of his career...has tossed six or more innings nine times, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

BRIEFLY: Is 3-4 with a 5.64 ERA (28 er in 44.2 ip) and .279 (50 for 179) opponents batting average in eight starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 19 after going 3-4 with a 2.16 ERA and .186 opponents batting average over his first 11 games, nine starts...began the season with the River Cats and was recalled by Oakland May 24...won each of his first two starts (3.27 ERA) but had his turn skipped because of an off day June 2...pitched twice in relief (3.00 ERA) before returning to the rotation June 7...went 1-3 with a 1.75 ERA in six starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7 as the A's did not need a fifth starter until July 19 because of the All-Star Break.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 2.81 ERA (15 er in 48.0 ip) and .207 (37 for 179) opponents batting average in eight starts at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.82 ERA (25 er in 46.2 ip) and .257 (47 for 183) opponents average in 10 games, eight starts, on the road.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has a 2.23 ERA (12 er in 48.1 ip) and .195 (33 for 169) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game and a 5.44 ERA (28 er in 46.1 ip) and .264 (51 for 193) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

RUN SUPPORT: Has been the starting pitcher in two of the A's three 1-0 losses and four of the 14 shutouts...has received no run support in six of his 16 starts...has received 24 runs of support in his last six starts (35.0 ip, 6.17 RSA) after receiving just 10 runs of support over his previous eight starts (1.97 RSA).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (13.0 ip) in two starts against American League West teams this year and has not allowed an earned run in seven career appearances against the West (18.2 ip).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 6-7 with a 3.83 ERA (39 er in 91.2 ip) in 15 starts and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) in two relief appearances...made his two relief appearances on consecutive days at Boston June 3 and 4...pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on the 3rd and was charged with the loss in the A's 9-8, 14-inning loss on the 4th.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Snapped his losing streak at a career high four games in a 2-0 win over Seattle July 6...posted a 2.43 ERA and .200 opponents during the losing streak, which spanned six games, including five starts.

IN JUNE: Went 0-4 despite a 2.25 ERA in seven games, five starts, in June...tied for fourth in the American League in ERA in the month but tied for the lead in losses...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to go 0-4 or worse in a month and post an ERA under 3.00...the last AL pitcher to go 0-4 or worse and post an ERA of 2.25 or lower is Tom Murphy who went 0-4 with a 1.85 ERA for the California Angels in July, 1968.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the first start of his career in the A's 6-1 win at Los Angeles May 24...it was the first win of his Major League career...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...walked a career-high four batters in 6.1 innings in a 5-4 loss at Chicago June 12... extended his losing streak to four game in the A's 3-0 loss to Florida **June 29** in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings...Nolasco shutout the A's on five hits and two walks...combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle **July 6** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss July 19 at Detroit...allowed a career-high nine hits and matched his high with two home runs...blanked the Tigers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career high 12.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Tampa Bay July 25 in Oakland...matched his career high by walking four batters and allowing two home runs...did not strike out a batter for the first time in a starting assignment...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 win over Minnesota July 30 in Oakland...retired 11 of the 12 batters he faced over innings three through six...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Tampa Bay August 5...blanked the Rays on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth and three more in the fifth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-3 win at Toronto August 11...retired each of the first nine batters and had a 6-0 lead before allowing his first run...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-4 win over Baltimore August 16 in Oakland...had a 4-1 lead and he allowed a RBI double to Guerrero in the fourth and a RBI single to Bell in the fifth...had his career-high two-game winning streak snapped in the A's 1-0 loss to Toronto August 21 in Oakland, despite allowing just one run in 8.0 innings...Perez and Janssen combined to shutout the A's on

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive starts in the A's 9-3 loss in the first game of the doubleheader last Saturday at Boston...allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying nine hits in 4.0 innings...it was his shortest outing as a starter...allowed runs in each of his four innings, including a two-run home run by Varitek in the second inning and a two-run double by Ortiz in the third.

MOSCOSO vs. SEATTLE: Combined with Devine and Bailey on a two-hit shutout in his only career appearance, a start in a 2-0 A's win this year on July 6 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed both of the hits...did not allow a runner past first base...retired the first four batters, allowed a single to Ackley and then retired 12 straight...also issued a one-out walk to Figgins in the sixth and a leadoff single to Kennedy in the seventh.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-3 with a 3.88 ERA (46.1 ip, 41 h, 22 r, 20 er, 16 bb, 52 so) and .230 opponents batting average in nine games, eight starts...struck out 52 in 46.1 innings, an average of 10.10 per nine innings...issued just 16 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.3 to 1...allowed just three home runs in 46.1 innings...the River Cats were 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts and walked two batters or fewer five times...allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine outings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (7-7, 3.64 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season, his 12th since being reinstated from the disabled list July 3...is 6-2 with a 3.77 ERA in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...is tied for third in the American League in wins since the break...has 133.2 innings pitched, which is 3.1 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 100 innings, he ranks third in the AL in fewest walks per nine innings (1.48) and fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.54) and strikeout to walk ratio (4.23)...tossed his third complete game of the season in his last start, 2-1 A's loss at Cleveland last Monday (8.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...has taken the loss in all three of his complete games...is 1-4 with a 5.02 ERA in nine career appearances, including seven starts, against Seattle...is 0-2 despite a 1.84 ERA (14.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year.

The A's bullpen recorded 13 strikeouts Wednesday, which was third most by the bullpen in Oakland history (16, Aug. 10, 1972 vs. Chicago and 14, Aug. 6, 2007 at Texas)...had a 6.03 ERA (23 er in 34.1 ip) on the road trip and issued 18 walks in 34.1 innings...now has a 4.38 ERA (67 er in 137.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and is tied for the third most losses (22)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (93) and tied for third in fewest first batter home runs (7)...four of those seven first batter home runs came on the last road trip...has allowed 65 of 176 (36.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in
