A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail in the season series 5-9 and with one more loss will lose the season series...are 3-4 in Oakland and 2-5 in Seattle...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 38-52 (.422) against Seattle since 2007...that is the lowest winning percentage by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 288-216 (.571) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 161-92 in Oakland and 127-124 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all 10 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 33 for 33 in saves after the break in his career.

Cliff Pennington hit his careerhigh seventh home run of the season last night...also has a career high 51 RBI...is batting 344 (52 for 151) since the All-Star Break, which ranks fifth in the American League.

Jemile Weeks has a career-high 10-game hitting streak (16 for 42, .381)...leads American League rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21), third in hits (93), fourth in doubles (19) and fifth in extra base hits (27) despite spending the first two months of the season in the minors.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1932 Jimmie Foxx hits his 50th and 51st home runs of the season to become the third player to reach 50 in one season, joining Babe Ruth and Hack Wilson...in 1947 Bill McCahan no hits the Washington Senators, 3-0...in 1988 Dennis Eckersley sets an Oakland record with his 37th save of the season...he would go on to save 45, becoming the first Athletic to reach the 40 plateau...in 1997 Ben Grieve makes his major league debut and ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 12-3 win over San Francisco.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing five in a row...trail Texas by 16½ games in the American League West for the fourth consecutive day, which matches the A's largest deficit of the season...have not been farther back since finishing the 2009 season 22 games out...the A's tragic number for elimination in the West is eight...are 21½ games behind Boston in the Wild Card and the tragic number for elimination in the Wild Card is four...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 40-56 (.417) since then, which is the third worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have spent 41 of the last 42 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 75 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 24-21 (.533) record on the weekend (12-12 on Saturday, 12-9 on Sunday) compared to 38-55 (.409) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 23-23 (.500) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .272 (436 for 1603) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.76 ERA (217 er in 410.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles (108) and on-base percentage (.341) since the break, tied for second in triples (12), third in walks (164) and fourth in slugging (.435) and runs (237)...are hitting .311 (132 for 424) with runners in scoring position since the break...A's starting pitchers are 18-19 with a 4.99 ERA (150 er in 270.2 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Seattle (1-0) and Kansas City (three games)...went 4-6 on the last homestand and are 36-30 (.545) at home...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and are 26-46 (.361) on the road, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...are batting .253 (548 for 2162) at home and .240 (604 for 2516) on the road...have a 3.06 ERA (205 er in 603.0 ip) at home compared to 4.25 (299 er in 632.2 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and the fifth lowest in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 1-0 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of next 19 games in Oakland...the only exception is a three-game series at Texas next weekend...just completed a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

OFFENSE: The A's have the third lowest batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.370) in the American League, the third fewest home runs (93) and the fourth fewest runs (552)...are on pace to hit 109 home runs...hit 109 home runs last year, which was the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1979 (108)...have a .314 on-base percentage and have finished under .318 since 1982 (.309)...have been shutout 14 times, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has a 2.51 ERA (16 er in 57.1 ip) and 59 strikeouts over the last six games...has a 3.67 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...rank third with 999 strikeouts...have topped 1000 strikeouts 11 times in franchise history, including each of the last 10 seasons dating back to 2001...are on pace to break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (110), have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.374) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19)...have issued the third most walks (464)...Brandon McCarthy tossed the A's fourth complete game of the season Monday night and the A's have lost all four of those games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 108 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (116)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 74 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 17-24 (.415) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (San Diego, 18-27 .400)...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-26 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-19 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

IN AUGUST: The A's finished August with an 11-17 (.393) record, which was third worst in the American League...it marked the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 last July...hit .244 in August, which was third lowest in the AL...tied for second in doubles (62) and ranked fourth in triples (8)...hit 29 home runs, which was their most in a month since hitting 36 in August, 2007...the pitching staff had a 4.93 ERA, which was second highest in the AL.

PLAYERS USED: Last night, Michael Taylor and Andrew Carignan became the 46th and 47th players to appear in a game for the A's...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Carignan is the 26th pitcher the A's have used this year, which ties the Oakland record set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the last time the A's used more pitchers was in 1955 when the Kansas City A's used 27...Taylor became the A's fourth right fielder (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history (also 1980).

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his third complete game of the season in his last start and has taken the loss in all three games (April 21 at Seattle, May 7 at Kansas City, August 29 at Cleveland)...the three complete games are tied for ninth in the American League...since 1995, the only other Oakland pitchers with three complete game losses in one season are Mark Mulder and Barry Zito in 2003.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 6-2 with a 3.77 ERA (24 er in 57.1 ip) in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-5 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 starts before the break...is tied for fourth in the American League in wins since the break.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has 133.2 innings pitched, which is 4.1 innings short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 100 innings, he ranks third in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.48) and fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.54) and strikeout to walk ratio (4.23).

CAREER BESTS: Won his seventh game of the season August 23, which matches his career high set in 2009 with Texas...already has career highs in innings pitched (133.2), strikeouts (93) and complete games (3)...is scheduled to make his 21st start today, which is one short of his career high from 2007...has a 3.64 ERA and has not finished with a mark under 4.03 in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Seven of the eight home runs he has allowed have been solo shots and seven have been hit by left-handed hitters...has a .445 opponents slugging percentage against left-handed hitters and .342 against right-handers...has allowed a .386 (22 for 57) batting average and three of his eight home runs to the opponents number three hitter.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 3-2 with a 4.84 ERA (31 er in 57.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest and 4-5 with a 2.72 ERA (23 er in 76.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more and.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 6-3 with a 3.86 ERA (30 er in 70.0 ip) in 11 starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 3...was placed on the 15-day DL May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a stress reaction in his right scapula...it was his sixth career stint on the DL...made two starts on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton and was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 0 bb, 8 so)...had a no decision in a start at San Jose June 23 (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 so)...then picked up the win in the Ports 4-3 win over Bakersfield in Stockton June 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 4 so).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors, which is tied for third most among American League pitchers...was charged with two errors May 2 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to commit two errors in one game since Ariel Prieto on May 20, 1997 at Texas...had just three errors in 110 career games entering the season.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss at Toronto April 5...it was his first start in the majors since Oct. 2, 2009 at Seattle)...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota April 10...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss April 15 against Detroit in Oakland...left the game after 6.2 innings with a 1-0 lead...however, the A's gave up one run in the ninth and seven in the 10th as Fuentes took the loss...it was the first of three times he has left the game with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also July 9, July 20)...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle April 21...the complete game was his second of his career (also May 24, 2009 at Houston)...was charged with the loss in the A's 8-3 defeat in Los Angeles April 26...allowed a career-high-tying seven runs on a career-high 14 hits in 5.1 innings...the 14 hits were the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since Barry Zito allowed 15 hits on July 8, 2003 against Tampa Bay...tossed his second complete game of the season in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City May 7...snapped his losing streak at a career-high five games in the A's 5-3 win over Los Angeles July 15 in Oakland...it was his first win since April 10...the previous longest losing streak of his career was four from June 25 to September 10, 2006...posted a 3.72 ERA during the losing streak, which spanned seven starts...combined with De Los Santos on a five-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win at Tampa Bay August 6...had his winning streak snapped at a career-high tying four games in a 9-1 loss to Texas in Oakland August 12...allowed a career-high tying seven runs...left the game after 3.1 innings with a right knee contusion...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-5 win at New York **August** 23...issued a season-high three walks, snapping a 21-start streak with two walks or fewer.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Cleveland on Monday...tossed a completegame five-hitter and struck out a career-high 10 batters...it was his third of the season and fourth of his career...all three this year have been losses...allowed a RBI double to Fukudome in the sixth and a solo home run to Santana in the seventh.

McCARTHY vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-4 with a 5.02 ERA (43.0 ip, 44 h, 24 r, 24 er, 10 bb, 35 so, 10 hr) in nine career appearances, including seven starts...is 1-1 with a 3.90 ERA (12 er in 27.2 ip) in five games in his home ballparks and 0-3 with a 7.04 ERA (12 er in 15.1 ip) in four games at Safeco Field...is 1-3 with a 5.03 ERA (22 er in 39.1 ip) in his seven starting assignments...is 0-2 despite a 1.84 ERA (14.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...the first loss came in a 1-0 decision at Seattle April 21...tossed a complete-game four-hitter but Hernandez, Wright and League combined to shutout the A's on five hits...allowed the only run of the game on a one-out home run by Kennedy in the fourth inning...then lost 2-1 in Oakland July 4...retired each of the first nine batters before Suzuki singled to lead off the fourth...faced the minimum over the first five innings thanks to two double plays...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Bard in the sixth and a RBI double to Smoak in the seventh...the A's were limited to a run on three hits by Pineda and the Mariners bullpen.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (9-13, 4.26 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 30th start of the season...went 0-4 with a 7.15 ERA and .327 opponents batting average in six starts in August...the losing streak is one short of his career high of five (May 15-June 14, 2011)...is 1-6 with a 7.15 ERA in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA in 20 starts before the break...has the highest post-break ERA in the majors and is tied for second in losses...is 3-13 with a 5.33 ERA over his last 21 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but leads the majors in losses since May 15...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss at Cleveland on Tuesday (5.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 2-4 with a 3.44 ERA in nine career starts against Seattle...including 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (21.2 ip, 28 h, 11 r, 10 er, 8 bb, 17 so) in four starts this year.

The A's bullpen has a 5.70 ERA (23 er in 36.1 ip) over its past 10 games...now has a 4.32 ERA (67 er in 139.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.04 ERA before the break...has the fewest wins in the American League (13) and is tied for the third most losses (22)...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (94) and tied for second in fewest first batter home runs (7)...four of those seven first batter home runs came on the last road trip...has allowed 65 of 176 (36.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Seattle, 43.0).

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a 233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.
