TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 2-team, 6-game road trip with the second of three games against the Athletics (0-1)...will also travel to Los Angeles (3 G)...were (2-5) on the recently concluded 2-team, 7-game homestand against the Chicago White Sox (0-3) and Los Angeles Angels (2-2)...today's game will not be televised but will be broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...lost yesterday and are 2-3 in last five games...have won 8 of 20, 13 of 30 and 15 of last 34 games...recorded club-record 17-game losing streak July 6-26...season-high 6G winning streak (May 18-23)...are 34-37 in games played at Safeco Field, 24-42 on the road...went 43-48 (.473) prior to the All-Star break, but 15-31 (.326) in 46 games since the ASG.

- Close Games -- 72 of 137 G have been decided by 2 or fewer runs (22-24 in 1-run, 10-16 in 2-run).
- The Mariners have used 128 different batting lineups in 137 games (105 different defensive lineups).
- Stingy on the Mound held opponents to 2 or less runs 48 times (38-10 in those G).

 Jason Vargas 3 shutouts are 3rd in AL Derek Holland & James Shields 4...T3rd most in singleseason club history behind Randy Johnson (4, 1994) and Dave Fleming (4, 1992).

 Franklin Gutierrez is batting .292 (28x96) over his last 25 G to raise season avg from .194 to .224.
- Ichiro has made 10 starts at DH this season (.341/14x41)...36 career starts at DH: .361/56x155.
- Dustin Ackley has recorded at least one hit in 50 of 66 G, and reached base safely in 55 of 66 G.

Franklin Gutierrez has not made error in CF in 277 G, 269 GS (779 errorless chances), AL record.

MARINERS VS. ATHLETICS...today is the 15th (9-5) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2011...Mariners are 4-3 in three trips to Oakland and 5-2 at Safeco...the Mariners went 6-13 against the A's last season, including 4-6 at home...Seattle is 52-38 vs. Oakland since 2007... Mariners trail the all-time series 216-288, including a 92-161 mark in Oakland.

TOO GOOD NOT TO SWING...Mike Carp is leading the Majors (min. 25 AB) in batting average on the first pitch, batting .593 (16x27) with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run and 11 RBI, slugging .852... Dustin Ackley is batting .474 (9x19), Miguel Olivo .333 (22x66), Ichiro .329 (24x73), Brendan Ryan .328 (19x58) when putting the ball in play on the first pitch.

DUSTING OFF THE COBWEBS...right-hander Shawn Kelley & left-hander Cesar Jimenez both appeared in yesterday's game...for Kelley, it was his first MLB appearance since June 15, 2010 following Tommy John surgery...Jimenez had not appeared in a game since Sept. 28, 2008.

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH?...Mike Carp put together an award worthy month of August ranking near the top of various offensive categories amongst rookies...25 RBI (1st), 8 2B (T1st), 6 HR (2nd), 14 extra-base hits (T2nd), 61 total bases (2nd) .898 OPS (4th), .545 slugging (4th), .313 batting average (5th), .353 on-base % (T6th)...check your local ballots.

ROAD WARRIOR...Kyle Seager hit .600 (15x25) on the last road trip...Seager is leading the American League (min. 45 AB) in road hitting since the All-Star break...is batting .396 (19x48) with 9 runs, 5 doubles, 2 home runs...ranks 6th during that time in on-base percentage (.420) & 5th in slugging (.667).

NEW NAME, SAME RESULT...Ichiro is a career .364 (149x409) hitter at O.co Coliseum, the highest lifetime batting average at the Oakland stadium by any hitter...followed by Derek Jeter (.348/94x270), Brian Harper (.345/39x113), Chili Davis (.342/63x184) & U.L. Washington (.339/38x112).

FAMILIAR FACES...with the rosters expanding, the Mariners made the following roster moves Thursday...RHP Shawn Kelley was recalled from AAA Tacoma, C Chris Gimenez was recalled from his rehab assignment with AAA Tacoma and activated & LHP Cesar Jimenez was selected from AAA...1B Justin Smoak was recalled from his rehab assignment and activated yesterday.

ROOKIE RBI RECORD...Mike Carp finished August with 25 RBI, tying the rookie club record for RBI in a month with Danny Tartabull (July 1986)...set the August rookie RBI record (previous: 20, Carlos Guillen, 2000) and was just the 8th time in club history a rookie has recorded at least 20 RBI in a month...Carp recorded at least one hit in 24 of 27 games in August (.313/35x112, 15 R, 8 2B, 6 HR, 25 RBI), including a majority of his 20-game hitting streak (July 30-Aug. 21).

LEFTY SLUGGER...Mike Carp is batting .349 (15x43) with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs and 15 RBI against LHP this season...with records going back to 1974, Carp's .721 slugging percentage is 8th-highest by a left-handed batter against left-handed pitching (min. 40 PA)...his 1.125 OPS (.721 SLG/.404 OBP) ranks 9th...Ken Griffey Jr. recorded a .741 SLG vs. LHP in 1996 (186 PA).

.300 ROOKIES...Dustin Ackley (.295) and Mike Carp (.296) both have a chance to hit .300 this season...if the rookie duo both hit .300, they would become just the 8th pair of rookie teammates since 1950 to hit at least .300 (min. 200 AB), and the first pair in MLB since Atlanta's Wilson Betemit & Jeff Francoeur in 2005...first in AL since Boston's Fred Lynn & Jim Rice in 1975...just 7 total American League rookies have hit at least .300 since 2000...Ichiro (2001) & Phil Bradley (1984) are the only Mariners rookies in club history to hit .300 in a season.

YOUNG, BUT SWINGING IT ... the Mariners currently have 5 rookie position players on the roster Ackley, Carp, Robinson, Seager and Wells -- and the 5 have combined for the following line: 198 games, .280 average (198x707), 85 runs, 41 doubles, 7 triples, 22 home runs and 95 RBI.

PURSUIT OF 200...Ichiro is going to have to go on a tear to record his 11th consecutive 200-hit season...lchiro has recorded 157 hits and needs 43 more hits over the last 25 games to reach the milestone and set the all-time record for 200-hit seasons in a career (currently tied with Pete Rose)...Ichiro's record for hits in September is 44 in 28 games in 2004 (had 41 in 27 G in '10).

AS YOU KNOW...the current Mariners rookies are batting .280 this season...BUT DID YOU KNOW?... that Seattle rookies have collected 251 hits this season and rank second in the Majors in rookie hits?...Seattle trails only the Minnesota Twins who have 262 rookie hits...since the All-Star break, Mike Carp (51) and Dustin Ackley (51) rank 4th and 5th respectively in the Majors in hits by a rookie.

ABOUT PINEDA..

- Will be making 26th Major League start today vs. the Athletics; his 3rd start vs. Oakland this season.
- Recorded a career minor league record of 31-14 with a 2.49 ERA (112 ER, 404.1 IP) in 86 G/71 GS.
- Signed as a non-drafted free agent Dec. 5, 2005; signed by Mariners scouts Patrick Guerrero and Franklin Taveras.
- Made professional debut in 2006 in the Dominican Summer League (2-1, 0.44, 8 G, 3 GS).
- Was a finalist for the 2010 USA Today Minor League Player of the Year, winning the fan vote portion of the award.
- Ranked by MLB.com (#13) and Baseball America (#16) as one of the top prospects in baseball heading into 2011.
- Named by Baseball America as the No. 3 prospect in the Southern League and Pacific Coast League.
- the 7th-youngest player on a 2011 Opening Day roster at 22 years, 72 days (as of March 31)...was the 3rd-youngest AL player behind Royals LHP Tim Collins (21.222) and White Sox LHP Chris Sale (22.001).
- Pineda is 6-7, 260...he is listed in the Mariners 2011 Media Guide at 6-5. 245.

LAST TIME OUT...L#8 as the White Sox shut out the Mariners 3-0 on Aug. 27...allowed 2 runs on 3 hits over 6.0 innings, while walking 1 and striking out 8...recorded his 17th quality start of the season.

ROOKIE RANKINGS ... amongst AL rookie starters, ranks 1st in strikeouts (156), starts (25) and opponent batting average (.209), and 2nd in innings pitched (153.0) and ERA (3.71).

MARINERS ROOKIE RANKINGS ... amongst Mariners rookies in franchise history, ranks 1st in average (.209), 3rd in K's (156), 4th in ERA (3.71) and quality starts (17), T7th in wins (9), 8th in GS (25) and 7th in innings pitched (153.0).

ROOKIE STARTS...is the 8th pitcher in club history to record at least 25 starts during a rookie season...he is the first to crack the 25-start rookie club since Freddy Garcia tied the club record with 33 starts in 1999...Pineda joins Dave Fleming (33 in 1992), Freddy Garcia (33 in 1999), Mark Langston (33 in 1984), Matt Young (32 in 1983), Rich DeLucia (31 in 1991), Bob Wolcott (28 in 1996) and Mike Moore (27 in 1982)...he is also the 7th rookie in club history to pass 150.0 innings pitched.

HIGH RATE OF RETURN...Michael strikes out 9.18 batters per 9.0 innings, that is the most by an American League rookie pitcher since Herb Score (CLE, 1955, 9.70)...rookie record for K/9.0 is held by Kerry Wood (12.58 in 1998)... last MLB rookie with higher K/9.0 was Rick Ankiel (9.98 in 2000).

HE'S IN CONTROL...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.12, recording 156 strikeouts and only 50 walks...that is the 13th-best mark by any qualifying rookie pitcher dating back to 1901 (min 1.0 IP/Tm G), and the 4th-best by any AL rookie pitcher during the same time frame...Michael is a lock to shatter the Mariners single-season rookie record of 1.89 by Freddy Garcia in 1999 (170 K's, 90 BB)...Erik Hanson had a 2.34 mark in 1989, but pitched only 113.1 innings...the Mariners single-season record (non-rookie) is 4.52 by Randy Johnson in 1995 (294 strikeouts, 65 walks).

NOW THAT IS A LOT OF K'S ... Pineda registered a career-high 10 strikeouts while allowing only 1 hit in 6.1 innings on July 30 vs. Tampa Bay...became the 7th rookie (16th time) in club history to record a double-digit strikeout performance, first since Felix Hernandez on Aug. 15, 2005 vs. KC...Freddy Garcia (4x), Mark Langston (4x), Randy Johnson (3x), Byron McLaughlin (2x) and Erik Hanson also had a 10+ strikeout performance during their rookie season.

LOOKING FOR DOUBLE DIGIT WINS...Pineda is taking his 5th shot at earning his 10th win of the season tonight (3 ND, L)...he is already the 10th player in franchise history to record at least 9 wins during his rookie season...it is the most wins by a Mariners rookie pitcher since John Halama (11) and Freddy Garcia (17) in 1999...his next win will put him 6th in team history for wins during a rookie campaign...the most wins by a rookie is 17 (Dave Fleming; 1992, Freddy Garcia; 1999 and Mark Langston; 1984).

THROUGH 25 CAREER STARTS

Pineda has recorded 156 strikeouts through his first 25 starts of his Major League career; most strikeouts by a Mariner in the first 25 appearances of a career...Felix Hernandez ranks 2nd with 154...Hernandez has the club record through 26 starts at 159 strikeouts.

PUNCHOUTS...enters today's start ranked T12th in the AL (tops among Major League rookies) with 156 strikeouts...has recorded at least 5 strikeouts in 20 of 25 starts, including 10 consecutive April 12-June 1... became just the 2nd Mariners rookie to record at least 5 strikeouts in 10 straight starts: Mark Langston, 13 straight during AL Rookie Pitcher of the Year season in 1984.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS..

- 2nd rookie pitcher in club history to be named to the All-Star team (Matt Young, 1983)...named as replacement for Justin Verlander... was one of 3 Mariners pitchers on the AL All-Star squad (Brandon League & Felix Hernandez).
- Threw a scoreless 3rd inning in the All-Star game with 2 K's...first AL All-Star to record 2 or more strikeouts as a rookie since Don Schwall in 1961.
- Became 2nd Mariners starter to hold opponents to a sub .200 batting average prior to the All-Star break (Randy Johnson, .182 in '97).
- Back-to-back starts with 7.0 shutout innings, and tossed career-high streak of 14.0 consecutive scoreless innings May 16-21...is the 3rd Mariners rookie pitcher with back-to-back starts of at least 7.0 or more IP and 0 runs allowed: Mark Langston (June 26-July 1, 1984) & Bob Stoddard (Sept. 12-17, 1982).
- Named American League April Rookie Pitcher of the Month going 4-1 with a 2.01 (7 ER, 31.1 IP) in 5 starts.
- Made Major League debut in start April 5 at Texas...struck out first batter faced (Kinsler) on 3 pitches...first Mariner since Joel Pineiro in 2000 to record a quality start in his Major League debut (6.0,5,3,3,1,4).
- Became the first Mariners rookie pitcher to crack the Opening Day starting rotation since Freddy Garcia in 1999...also the first Mariners pitcher to make his Major League debut in a start since Felix Hernandez on Aug. 4, 2005
- Earned first career win April 12 vs. TOR (7.1,5,2,1,2,7) in Safeco Field debut.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: BLAKE BEAVAN (3-4, 4.11)

22-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 11th career Major League start tomorrow vs. the Athletics...ND in his last start 8/29 in Mariners 5-3 win over the Angels (7.0,8,3,3,0,0,HR)...is 0-2, 6.29 ERA (17 ER, 24.1 IP) in last 4 start after going 3-2, 2.83 in first 6 MLB starts...set franchise record opening career with 6 straight quality starts (longest since Jered Weaver in '06)...made his MLB debut July 3 against SD, earning the win allowing 1 run on 3 hits in 7.0 innings...**AAA Tacoma** - went 5-3, 4.45 ERA (46 ER, 93.0 IP) in 16 starts for the Rainiers...**vs. OAK** - making his 2nd career start vs. Oakland...recorded the win in Mariners 8-4 win over the A's on Aug. 1 (6.2,7,3,3,2,3)...will make his first career start in OAK.

BONUS NOTES

200 PUNCHOUTS...Felix Hernandez has recorded 204 strikeouts this season, giving him his 3rd consecutive 200-strikeout season (217 in '09, 232 in '10)...is the 3rd pitcher in club history with 200 K's in 3 consecutive season, joining Randy Johnson (5 straight, 1991-95) and Mark Langston (3 straight, 1986-88)...Johnson (7 seasons) and Langston (4 seasons) are the only pitchers in club history ahead of Felix for total 200-strikeout seasons...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the only other pitcher to have a trio of 200-K seasons at 25 or younger over the last 20 years is Kerry Wood (1998, 2001, 2002).

DOUBLE-DIGIT STREAKS...Ichiro has three double-digit hitting streaks this season (13 G – Aug. 17-30, 11 G – June 11-23, 10 G – Aug. 3-14)...now has recorded 40 single-season hitting streaks of at least 10 games in his career...dating back to 1918, records show that Ichiro has the 5th-most (tied) double-digit hitting streaks: 1. Ty Cobb (65), 2. Hank Aaron (44), 3. Al Simmons (42), 4. Stan Musial (41), T5. Ichiro (40), T5. Pete Rose (40)...research help from *Retrosheet.org*.

ROOKIE WINS...the Mariners have recorded 19 wins by rookie pitchers, leading the Major Leagues...the Mariners have recorded wins this season from RH Michael Pineda (9), RH Blake Beavan (3), LH Charlie Furbush (2), RH Tom Wilhelmsen (2), RH Josh Lueke (1), RH Chance Ruffin (1) and LH Anthony Vasquez (1)...it is the most by Mariners rookies since Freddy Garcia (17), John Halama (9) and Gil Meche (8) combined for 34 wins in 1999.

YOUNG GUN...Michael Pineda ranks 2nd in the American League averaging 9.18 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (156 K's, 153.0 IP)...that's the most by an AL rookie pitcher since Herb Score (CLE, 1955, 9.70)...rookie record for K/9.0 is held by Kerry Wood (12.58 in 1998)...last MLB rookie with higher K/9.0 was Rick Ankiel (9.98 in 2000)...the Mariners rookie record heading into this season was 8.16 K/9.0 IP by Mark Langston in 1984 (204 K's, 225.0 IP)... Pineda's 156 strikeouts currently rank 3rd in club rookie history behind Langston (204 in 1984) and Freddy Garcia (170 in 1999).
