A's vs. MARINERS

The A's trail in the season series 6-9 and with one more loss will lose the season series...are 4-4 in Oakland and 2-5 in Seattle...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 39-52 (.429) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team against the Mariners over that span...all-time, the A's are 289-216 (.572) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 162-92 in Oakland and 127-124 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted all 10 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 33 for 33 in saves after the break in his career.

Cliff Pennington has career highs in home runs (7) and RBI (53)...is batting .342 (53 for 155) since the All-Star Break, which ranks fifth in the American League...is 15 for 26 (.577) with runners in scoring position over his last 27 games and ranks fifth in the AL with a .356 average with RISP for the season.

Jemile Weeks has a career-high 11-game hitting streak (17 for 46, .370)...leads American League rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21), third in hits (94), fourth in doubles (19) and fifth in extra base hits (27) despite spending the first two months of the season in the minors.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1973** the A's defeat the California Angels 4-3 as Ken Holtzman wins his 20th game en route to a 21-13 season...in **2000** Mike Stanley is a perfect 5 for 5 with five RBI in the A's 10-0 win over Toronto...in **2002** the A's blow an 11-0 lead against Kansas City but Scott Hatteberg hits a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 12-11 win, the A's American League record breaking 20th consecutive victory.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing five in a row...trail Texas by 15½ games in the American League West and the tragic number for elimination in the West is eight...are 21½ games behind Boston in the Wild Card and the tragic number for elimination in the Wild Card is three...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 41-56 (.423) since then, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL and tied for fifth worst in the majors...have spent 42 of the last 43 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 76 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 25-21 (.544) record on the weekend (13-12 on Saturday, 12-9 on Sunday) compared to 38-55 (.409) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

PITCHING: Brandon McCarthy struck out 10 yesterday to put the A's pitching staff over 1000 strikeouts for the 11th consecutive season and 12th time in franchise history (since 1901)...the A's rank third in the American League in strikeouts (1009) and are on pace to break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009...McCarthy's complete game was the A's fifth of the season, but it was the first complete game victory...the A's have a 2.17 ERA (16 er in 66.1 ip) and 69 strikeouts over the last seven games but are just 3-4 over that span...have a 3.64 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (110), have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.372), are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19) and have the third lowest batting average (.248)...have issued the third most walks (464)...A's starting pitchers have allowed just one earned run over the last three games (23.0 ip, 0.39 ERA) and have a 3.72 ERA (351 er in 850.0 ip) for the season, which is third lowest in the AL.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 24-23 (.511) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .271 (442 for 1633) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.66 ERA (217 er in 419.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles since the break (109), tied for second in triples (12), third in walks (168) and fourth in on-base percentage (.340) and runs (240)...are hitting .310 (133 for 429) with runners in scoring position since the break...A's starting pitchers are 19-19 with a 4.82 ERA (150 er in 279.2 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this six-game homestand against Seattle (2-0) and Kansas City (three games)...went 4-6 on the last homestand and are 37-30 (.552) at home...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and are 26-46 (.361) on the road, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...are batting .253 (554 for 2192) at home and .240 (604 for 2516) on the road...have a 3.01 ERA (205 er in 612.0 ip) at home compared to 4.25 (299 er in 632.2 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 2-0 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception is a three-game series at Texas next weekend...just completed a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

OFFENSE: The A's have the third lowest batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.370) in the American League, the third fewest home runs (94), the fourth fewest runs (555) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.314)...are on pace to hit 110 home runs...hit 109 home runs last year, which was the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1979 (108)...have not finished with an on-base percentage under .318 since 1982 (.309)...have been shutout 14 times, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 109 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (116)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 74 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 17-24 (.415) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (San Diego, 18-28 .391)...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games over the last three years...are 14-26 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-19 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

IN AUGUST: The A's finished August with an 11-17 (.393) record, which was third worst in the American League...it marked the seventh consecutive month in which the A's did not finish above .500...have not finished a month with a winning record since going 14-10 last July...hit .244 in August, which was third lowest in the AL...tied for second in doubles (62) and ranked fourth in triples (8)...had the second highest ERA (4.93).

PLAYERS USED: Friday night, Michael Taylor and Andrew Carignan became the 46th and 47th players to appear in a game for the A's...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Carignan is the 26th pitcher the A's have used this year, which ties the Oakland record set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the last time the A's used more pitchers was in 1955 when the Kansas City A's used 27...Taylor became the A's fourth right fielder (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history (also 1980).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 30th start of the season, which ties him for the American League lead...the A's are 11-18 (.379) in his starting assignments this year and are 47-44 (.516) in his career...has tossed at least seven innings in 14 of his 29 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 17 times.

IN AUGUST: Went 0-4 with a 7.15 ERA (27 er in 34.0 ip) and .327 (48 for 147) opponents batting average in six starts in August...the losing streak is one short of his career high of five (May 15-June 14, 2011)...the ERA was his highest for one month in his career...tied for second in the American League in losses in August and had the second highest ERA.

SINCE THE BREAK: Is 1-6 with a 7.15 ERA (40 er in 50.1 ip) and .314 (66 for 210) opponents batting average in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 3.12 ERA and .240 opponents average in 20 starts before the break...has the second highest post-break ERA (Duensing, MIN 7.76) in the majors and is tied for second in losses (Vargas, SEA 7).

6-0 THEN 3-13: Is 3-13 with a 5.33 ERA (74 er in 125.0 ip) and .285 (138 for 485) opponents batting average over his last 21 starts (since May 15) after going 6-0 with a 1.72 ERA and .209 opponents average over his first eight starts...was tied for the Major League lead in wins through May 14 but leads the majors in losses since May 15...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is just the fourth pitcher since 1900 start a season 6-0 or better and then fall at least four games under .500 later that season: Joe Benz, CWS (6-0, then 12-17), Jim Lonborg, BOS (6-0, 7-11) and Rick Honeycutt, SEA (6-0, 10-17).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in wild pitches (13), is third in stolen bases allowed (26), tied for third in losses (13) and fifth in walks (72)...the 26 stolen bases are the most allowed by an A's pitcher since Dave Stewart yielded 32 in 1987...the 13 wild pitches are the most by an Athletic since 1998 when two pitchers had at least 13 (Stein 15, Candiotti 14).

CAREER HIGHS: Was charged with his 13th loss of the season in his last start, which matches his career high from his rookie season of 2009...increased his walk total to 72, which also matches his high from 2009...already has a career high in strikeouts (128).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-7 with a 3.15 ERA (32 er in 91.1 ip) and .241 (82 for 340) opponents batting average in 14 starts at home compared to 4-6 with a 5.44 ERA (52 er in 86.0 ip) and .285 (97 for 340) in 15 starts on the road...is now 23-17 with a 3.23 ERA (108 er in 301.0 ip) in 47 career starts in Oakland and 14-17 with a 4.76 ERA (133 er in 251.2 ip) in 44 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .184 (14 for 76) batting average against the opponents number three hitter, which is second lowest in the American League...has yielded a .277 (44 for 159) average with runners in scoring position...that includes .111 over his first 10 starts and .342 (39 for 114) over his last 19 starts (since May 25).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of one run or fewer in each of his last four starts (3 rs in 24.0 ip, 1.13 RSA) and two runs or fewer in 17 of his last 20 starts...has support of three runs or fewer in 24 of his 29 starts for the season and his RSA of 3.65 (72 rs in 177.1 ip) is eighth lowest in the American League.

WINS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 27...won 10 games as a rookie in 2009 and 18 games last year...with one more win, he will become just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-03) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...has 37 career wins, which are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 24th birthday (42, Vida Blue).

CAREER TRENDS: Went 10-14 with a 4.80 ERA and .271 opponents batting average over the first 33 starts of his career...then went 24-7 with a 2.55 ERA and .215 opponents batting average over a 37-start stretch from May 5, 2010 to May 9, 2011...is 3-13 with a 5.33 ERA (74 er in 125.0 ip) and .285 (138 for 484) opponents batting average in 21 starts since then.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss at Cleveland last Tuesday...allowed a two-run double to Fukudome in the third inning and the A's scored once in the fifth to make the score 2-1...then allowed a two-run home run to Santana in the sixth and hit the next batter before he was relieved by De Los Santos, who allowed a two-run home run to Hannahan.

CAHILL vs. SEATTLE: Is 2-4 with a 3.44 ERA (52.1 ip, 56 h, 22 r, 20 er, 19 bb, 33 so, 4 hr) in nine career starts...is 2-2 with a 4.88 ERA (15 er in 27.2 ip) in five starts in Seattle and 0-2 with a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland...is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (21.2 ip, 28 h, 11 r, 10 er, 8 bb, 17 so) in four starts this year...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day April 1 in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he walked Cust with the bases loaded in the third inning...left with a 2-1 lead but pitched just 4.2 innings...then picked up the win in the A's 9-1 victory at Seattle April 23...allowed a run in the second on a Wilson RBI single but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-2, 10-inning loss in Oakland July 5...allowed an unearned run in the second inning when Ackley singled, stole second, went to third on a Suzuki error and scored on a Peguero sacrifice fly...also allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the seventh and left trailing 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the eighth and ninth innings to get him off the hook...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Seattle August 1...allowed a career-high tying 12 hits in just 4.0 innings...yielded five runs in the second inning and a RBI single to Oliva in the fourth...was relieved by Norberto after surrendering a leadoff single to Smoak in the fifth and he allowed Smoak to score on a wild pitch.

WITH THE A'S: Is 40-21 with a 3.54 ERA (238 er in 605.0 ip) in 108 games, 100 starts, in an A's uniform...his .656 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...began his career with the A's in 2003 and was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008...went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in 2½ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 batting average with 35 home runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
