OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics have won four straight after losing five in a row...are 25-23 since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 before the break...have a 26-21 record on the weekend (13-12 on Saturday, 13-9 on Sunday) compared to 38-55 during the week...are 27-27 during the day compared to 37-49 at night...are 3-0 on this six game homestand against Seattle (3-0) and Kansas City (three games).
- Trevor Cahill** earned his 10th win of the season, becoming just the second pitcher in Oakland history (Tim Hudson, 1999-2001) and sixth in franchise history (Jim Nash, 1966-68; Lefty Grove, 1925-27; Chief Bender, 1903-05 and Eddie Plank, 1901-1903) to win at least 10 games in each of the first three seasons of his career...snapped his four-game losing streak, which was one short of his career high of five (May 15-June 14, 2011).
- Brandon Allen** (2 for 4) hit two doubles today...of his 23 hits with the A's, 12 are for extra bases (seven doubles, two triples, three home runs).
- Hideki Matsui** (3 for 5) hit a career-high-tying three doubles (third time, last: May 14, 2005 at Oakland), which ties the Oakland record for most doubles in a game (25th time, last: Mark Ellis, Aug. 11, 2010 at Seattle)...is batting .343 (62 for 181) since the All-Star Break after hitting .209 before the break.
- Jemile Weeks** (0 for 5) had his career-high 11-game hitting streak snapped...batted .370 (17 for 46) during the streak...has gone homerless in each of his 77 games, which ties Rickey Henderson and Claudell Washington for the second longest career-opening homerless streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since Mike Bordick set the record with a 132-game streak before hitting his first home run May 10, 1992.
- The Athletics raised \$63,200 today on A's Breast Cancer Awareness Day, presented by Big O Tires...over the past 13 years, this event has raised more than \$1.2 million for breast cancer education and research.

SEATTLE NOTES

- The Seattle Mariners have lost four in a row and five of the last six games...are now 15-33 since the All-Star Break after going 43-48 before the break...are 24-44 on the road compared to 34-37 at home...are 0-3 on this six game road trip through Oakland (0-3) and Los Angeles (three games).
- Blake Beavan** is 0-3 with a 6.44 ERA (21 er in 29.1 ip) over his past five starts...is now 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (7 er in 11.2 ip) in his two career starts against Oakland.
- Dustin Ackley** (2 for 4) is on a career-high eight-game hitting streak (12 for 29, .414).
- Kyle Seager** (2 for 4) is batting .373 (22 for 59) over his last 16 games...is batting .328 (22 for 67) on the road compared to .213 (10 for 47) at home.
- Ichiro Suzuki** (2 for 5) has reached base safely in 17 of his past 18 games and is batting .338 (27 for 80) over that span...is a .364 (152 for 418) career hitter in Oakland, the highest career average by any hitter.
- Casper Wells** (0 for 0) left the game with a contusion on his left elbow after being hit by a pitch in the second inning...X-rays were negative.
