50 MULTI-HIT GAMES Ichiro has recorded 50 multi-hit games for the 11th consecutive season (52 in 2011)...dating back to the 1940's, is one of only 5 players with at least 11 seasons with 50+ multi-hit games (P. Rose - 15, S. Musial - 14, T. Gwynn - 13, D. Jeter - 13), and one of just 3 to do so in consecutive seasons (S. Musial - 14, T. Gwynn - 12).

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 2-team, 6-game road trip with the third of three games against the Athletics (0-2)...will also travel to Los Angeles (3 G)...were (2-5) on the recently concluded 2-team, 7-game homestand against the Chicago White Sox (0-3) and Los Angeles Angels (2-2)...today's game will be televised ROOT SPORTS and broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...have lost 3 in a row and 4 of last 5 games...have won 8 of 21, 13 of 31 and 15 of last 35 games...recorded club-record 17-game losing streak July 6-26...season-high 6G winning streak (May 18-23)...are 34-37 in games played at Safeco Field, 24-43 on the road...went 43-48 (.473) prior to the All-Star break, but 15-32 (.319) in 47 games since the ASG.

- Close Games -- 72 of 138 G have been decided by 2 or fewer runs (22-24 in 1-run, 10-16 in 2-run).
- The Mariners have used 128 different batting lineups in 138 games (106 different defensive lineups).
- Stingy on the Mound held opponents to 2 or less runs 48 times (38-10 in those G).
- **Jason Vargas** 3 shutouts are 3rd in AL Derek Holland & James Shields 4...T3rd most in single-season club history behind Randy Johnson (4, 1994) and Dave Fleming (4, 1992).
- Franklin Gutierrez is batting .280 (28x100) over his last 26 G to raise season avg from .194 to .221.
- Ichiro has made 10 starts at DH this season (.341/14x41)...36 career starts at DH: .361/56x155.
- Dustin Ackley has recorded at least one hit in 51 of 67 G, and reached base safely in 56 of 67 G
- Franklin Gutierrez has not made error in CF in 283 G, 275 GS (781 errorless chances), AL record.

MARINERS VS. ATHLETICS...today is the 16th (9-6) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2011...Mariners are 4-4 in three trips to Oakland and 5-2 at Safeco...the Mariners went 6-13 against the A's last season, including 4-6 at home...Seattle is 52-39 vs. Oakland since 2007... Mariners trail the all-time series 216-289, including a 92-162 mark in Oakland.

CLIMBING THE (CA)HILL...the active players on the Mariners roster are batting .320 (32x100) with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home run and 9 RBI against Trevor Cahill...Dustin Ackley is batting .667 (4x6) with 2B, 3B, HR, 4 RBI; Miguel Olivo batting .444 (4x9), Ichiro batting .429 (9x21).

DROPPING THE HAMMER...rookie Tom Wilhelmsen has recorded 5 straight scoreless outings totaling 8.2 innings, allowing just 3 hits while striking out 13 (13.5 K/9.0 IP)...in his first 11 appearances this season had a 6.28 ERA (10 ER, 14.1 IP) while allowing 18 hits and 12 walks.

PILING UP HITS...Seattle rookies have collected 252 hits this season and rank second in the Majors in rookie hits?...Seattle trails only the Minnesota Twins who have 268 rookie hits...since the All-Star break, Dustin Ackley (52) and Mike Carp (51) rank 4th and 5th respectively in the Majors in hits by a rookie.

TOO GOOD NOT TO SWING...Mike Carp is leading the Majors (min. 25 AB) in batting average on the first pitch, batting .571 (16x28) with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run and 11 RBI, slugging .821... Dustin Ackley is batting .450 (9x20), Miguel Olivo .333 (22x66), Ichiro .329 (24x73), Brendan Ryan .328 (19x58) when putting the ball in play on the first pitch.

DUSTING OFF THE COBWEBS...right-hander Shawn Kelley & left-hander Cesar Jimenez both appeared in Friday's game...for Kelley, it was his first MLB appearance since June 15, 2010 following Tommy John surgery...Jimenez had not appeared in a game since Sept. 28, 2008.

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH?...Mike Carp put together an award worthy month of August ranking near the top of various offensive categories amongst rookies...25 RBI (1st), 8 2B (T1st), 6 HR (2nd), 14 extra-base hits (T2nd), 61 total bases (2nd) .898 OPS (4th), .545 slugging (4th), .313 batting average (5th), .353 on-base % (T6th)...check your local ballots.

NEW NAME, SAME RESULT...Ichiro is a career .363 (150x413) hitter at O.co Coliseum, the highest lifetime batting average at the Oakland stadium by any hitter...followed by Derek Jeter (.348/94x270), Brian Harper (.345/39x113), Chili Davis (.342/63x184) & U.L. Washington (.339/38x112).

ROOKIE RBI RECORD ... Mike Carp finished August with 25 RBI, tying the rookie club record for RBI in a month with Danny Tartabull (July 1986)...set the August rookie RBI record (previous: 20, Carlos Guillen, 2000) and was just the 8th time in club history a rookie has recorded at least 20 RBI in a month...Carp recorded at least one hit in 24 of 27 games in August (.313/35x112, 15 R, 8 2B, 6 HR, 25 RBI), including a majority of his 20-game hitting streak (July 30-Aug. 21).

LEFTY SLUGGER... Mike Carp is batting .349 (15x43) with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs and 15 RBI against LHP this season...with records going back to 1974, Carp's .721 slugging percentage is 8th-highest by a left-handed batter against left-handed pitching (min. 40 PA)...his 1.125 OPS (.721 SLG/.404 OBP) ranks 9th...Ken Griffey Jr. recorded a .741 SLG vs. LHP in 1996 (186 PA).

.300 ROOKIES...Dustin Ackley (.294) and Mike Carp (.290) both have a chance to hit .300 this season...if the rookie duo both hit .300, they would become just the 8th pair of rookie teammates since 1950 to hit at least .300 (min. 200 AB), and the first pair in MLB since Atlanta's Wilson Betemit & Jeff Francoeur in 2005...first in AL since Boston's Fred Lynn & Jim Rice in 1975...just 7 total American League rookies have hit at least .300 since 2000...Ichiro (2001) & Phil Bradley (1984) are the only Mariners rookies in club history to hit .300 in a season.

YOUNG, BUT SWINGING IT ... the Mariners currently have 5 rookie position players on the roster Ackley, Carp, Robinson, Seager and Wells -- and the 5 have combined for the following line: 202 games, .276 average (199x721), 85 runs, 41 doubles, 7 triples, 22 home runs and 95 RBI.

PURSUIT OF 200...Ichiro has 158 hits and needs 42 more hits over the last 24 games to reach the milestone and set the all-time record for 200-hit seasons in a career (currently tied with Pete Rose)...Ichiro's record for hits in September is 44 in 28 games in 2004 (had 41 in 27 G in '10).

DID YOU KNOW?...that **Ichiro** will reach another profession milestone with 7 more total bases?.. Ichiro has 4,993 total bases in his career (1,889 in Japan & 3,104 in the U.S)...Ichiro would be the 20th player to accumulate at least 5,000 total bases in his professional career...former Mariners who have accumulated 5,000 total bases in their career are Ken Griffey Jr. (5,271) and Alex Rodriguez (5,198).

- Making his 11th Major League start/appearance today, his 2nd against the A's.
- Owns a career minor league record of 38-25 with a 3.73 ERA (226 ER, 546.0 IP) in 93 G/93 GS.
- Acquired w/ 1B Justin Smoak, RH Josh Lueke & INF Matt Lawson for Cliff Lee & Mark Lowe July 9, 2010.
- Drafted by Rangers in 1st round, 17th overall, in 2007 MLB June Draft.
- Pro debut 2008 with Clinton: 10-6, 2.37, in 23 GS. 2010 Texas League Pitcher of the Year...Texas League Post-Season All-Star...AA Frisco: 10-5, 2.78 ERA (34 ER,110.0 IP) in 17 GS.
- Graduated from Irving (TX) HS in 2007...finished senior season 9-2, 0.19 ERA (2 ER, 73.0 IP) & 139 K's incl. 18-K perfect G vs. Irving MacArthur HS 3/6/07.
- Selected Baseball America's 2006 Youth Player of the Year and appeared in 2006 Aflac All-American High School Baseball Showcase.

LAST TIME OUT...ND in Mariners 5-3 win on Aug. 28 vs. LAA...allowed all 3 runs in the 4th inning, includuing 1 2-run Trumbo HR...did not allow a walk or a record a strikeout, just the 4th time since the start of the 2006 season a Mariners starter has worked at least 1.0 IP and not allowed either (only 3 GS in MLB this season w/7.0+ IP, 0 BB, 0 K; Beavan, Lohse 6/22 & Fister 8/29)...earned his 8 quality start in 10 games this season.

FIRST 6 STARTS...recorded a quality start in each of his first 6 Major League starts...is the first pitcher in club history to open a ML career with 6 consecutive quality starts...Michael Pineda had 5 earlier this season, and Bob Stoddard held the previous record with 3 consecutive QS in 1981...is the longest streak of quality starts to start a career since Jered Weaver had a string of 9 straight with the Angels in 2006.

NOT SINCE FELIX...Beavan allowed 1 run on 8 hits in 8.0 inning on August 6 at LAA, becoming the first Mariners rookie starter to throw at least 8.0 innings and allow 1 or fewer runs since Felix Hernandez had a pair of such starts during his rookie season in 2005 (8/9/05 vs. MIN & 8/15/05 vs. KC).

MLB DEBUT...made his Major League debut July 3 vs. San Diego (7.0,3,1,1,2,4)...retired the side in order in the 1st including his first MLB strikeout to end the inning (Chase Headley)...allowed only run on RBI double by Will Venable in the 3rd inning.

ONE OF THE YOUNGSTERS...made his Major League debut July 3 vs. SD; becoming the 7th Mariner to make his debut this season (RH Michael Pineda, RH Tom Wilhelmsen, RH Josh Lueke, OF Carlos Peguero, OF Mike Wilson, 2B Dustin Ackley)...since then an 8th, 3B Kyle Seager, 9th, OF Trayvon Robinson, and 10th LH Anthony Vasquez have debuted.

HE'LL REMEMBER HIS FIRST ... became the first pitcher in club history to win his debut as a starter while throwing at least 7.0 innings and allowing 1 or fewer run in a Major League debut...he is the first Mariner (and one of only 8 overall) to toss at least 7.0 innings in a debut since Jim Converse on May 22, 1993 vs. Kansas City.

GET YA NEXT TIME...opponents are batting .306 (26x85) with 4 doubles, 4 home runs and 8 RBI in the first time through the lineup...after he faced each batter once, he lowers his opponent average to .267 (46x172) with 16 doubles, 6 home runs and 20 RBI in ensuing times around the lineup.

SPLITS...right-handers are batting .246 (29x118) with 7 doubles, 3 home runs and 6 walks against Beavan...left-handers are batting .309 (43x139) with 13 doubles, 7 home runs and 4 walks.

WITH THE RAINIERS ... made 16 starts for Rainiers, going 5-3 with a 4.45 ERA (46 ER, 93.0 IP)...struck out 64 & walked 20.

GS vs. LAA...recorded win in ML debut Aug. 23 (G#2) at CLE (5.1,9,6,5,2,2,2HR); became 10th pitcher in club history to start & win ML debut (last: Blake Beavan)...went 4-3, 3.21 ERA (19 ER, 53.1 IP) with 32 strikeouts in 8 games, all starts, with AAA Tacoma...began year with AA Jackson and was 5-7, 3.77 (42 ER, 100.1 IP) with 59 strikeouts in 16 games, all starts, including 1 CG...MiLB Career -- is 25-23, 3.28 ERA (140 ER, 384.0) with 267 strikeouts in 67 games, 58 GS...drafted by Mariners in 18th round of the 2009 MLB June Draft...2010: Led all Mariners farmhands with a 2.46 ERA, while finishing T2nd in wins (11) and 5th in strikeouts (125) combined between Clinton, High Desert and West Tenn...vs. LAA: lost in last GS vs. LAA, 13-6, allowing 7 ER in 4+ IP, including 2 runners he left scoring on bullpen (4+,7,8,7,3,1,HR-2).

BONUS NOTES

200 PUNCHOUTS...Felix Hernandez has recorded 204 strikeouts this season, giving him his 3rd consecutive 200-strikeout season (217 in '09, 232 in '10)...is the 3rd pitcher in club history with 200 K's in 3 consecutive season, joining Randy Johnson (5 straight, 1991-95) and Mark Langston (3 straight, 1986-88)...Johnson (7 seasons) and Langston (4 seasons) are the only pitchers in club history ahead of Felix for total 200-strikeout seasons...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the only other pitcher to have a trio of 200-K seasons at 25 or younger over the last 20 years is Kerry Wood (1998, 2001, 2002).

<u>DOUBLE-DIGIT STREAKS</u>...Ichiro has three double-digit hitting streaks this season (13 G – Aug. 17-30, 11 G – June 11-23, 10 G – Aug. 3-14)...now has recorded 40 single-season hitting streaks of at least 10 games in his career...dating back to 1918, records show that Ichiro has the 5th-most (tied) double-digit hitting streaks: 1. Ty Cobb (65), 2. Hank Aaron (44), 3. Al Simmons (42), 4. Stan Musial (41), T5. Ichiro (40), T5. Pete Rose (40)...research help from *Retrosheet.org*.

ROOKIE WINS...the Mariners have recorded 19 wins by rookie pitchers, leading the Major Leagues...the Mariners have recorded wins this season from RH Michael Pineda (9), RH Blake Beavan (3), LH Charlie Furbush (2), RH Tom Wilhelmsen (2), RH Josh Lueke (1), RH Chance Ruffin (1) and LH Anthony Vasquez (1)...it is the most by Mariners rookies since Freddy Garcia (17), John Halama (9) and Gil Meche (8) combined for 34 wins in 1999.

YOUNG GUN...Michael Pineda ranks 2nd in the American League averaging 9.23 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (163 K's, 159.0 IP)...that's the most by an AL rookie pitcher since Herb Score (CLE, 1955, 9.70)...rookie record for K/9.0 is held by Kerry Wood (12.58 in 1998)...last MLB rookie with higher K/9.0 was Rick Ankiel (9.98 in 2000)...the Mariners rookie record heading into this season was 8.16 K/9.0 IP by Mark Langston in 1984 (204 K's, 225.0 IP)... Pineda's 156 strikeouts currently rank 3rd in club rookie history behind Langston (204 in 1984) and Freddy Garcia (170 in 1999).
