A's vs. ROYALS

The A's lead the season series, 4-2...won two of three in Kansas City and are 2-1 in Oakland...need one more win to clinch their third consecutive season series win...are 16-7 (.696) against the Royals since the start of the 2009 season...have won eight of the 11 games in Oakland over that stretch...all-time, the A's are 295-241 against the Royals...that breaks down to 162-106 in Oakland and 133-135 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have an 18-21 record on Labor Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...this is the second meeting with Kansas City with the A's winning the previous contest 7-6 in 2002...it was win #19 in the 20-game winning streak

Andrew Bailey has converted all 11 of his save opportunities since the All-Star Break and is a perfect 34 for 34 in saves after the break in his career.

Hideki Matsui tied an Oakland record with three doubles yesterday (25th time)...he is batting .343 (62 for 181) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for fifth in the American League.

Cliff Pennington has career highs in home runs (7) and RBI (53)...is batting .335 (53 for 158) since the All-Star Break, which ranks ninth in the American League.

Jemile Weeks leads AL rookies in triples (8), ranks second in stolen bases (21), third in hits (94), fourth in doubles (19) and fifth in extra base hits (27) despite spending the first two months of the season in the minors.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1951 Ferris Fain goes 5 for 5 in second game of the а doubleheader against Catfish Washington...in 1973 Hunter improves his record to 18-3 as the A's defeat the California Angels 11-6...it is Hunter's club Angels record 13th consecutive win...he finishes the season 21-5, an .808 winning percentage

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Seattle to open the homestand and extend their winning streak to four games...that matches the second longest winning streak this year...the season high is six straight from June 15 to 21...trail Texas by 15½ games in the American League West and the tragic number for elimination in the West is seven...are 20½ games behind Boston in the Wild Card and the tragic number for elimination in the Wild Card is three...were in a tie for first place in the AL West at the conclusion of play May 17 with a 22-20 record...however, have gone 42-56 (.423) since then...have spent 43 of the last 44 days in third place in the West...for the season, have spent one day tied for first, three days in second, eight days tied for second, 77 days in third, five days tied for third and 61 days in fourth...have a 26-21 (.553) record on the weekend (13-12 on Saturday, 13-9 on Sunday) compared to 38-55 (.409) during the week...made a managerial change June 9, replacing Bob Geren with new interim manager Bob Melvin.

STRIKEOUTS: A's pitchers struck out nine batters yesterday, their fifth consecutive game with nine or more strikeouts...that matches the longest streak in Oakland history (Oct. 1, 1999-April 4, 2000)...now have 1018 strikeouts for the season, which ranks third in the American League...this is 11th consecutive season and 12th time in franchise history A's pitchers have fanned at least 1000...are on pace to break the franchise record of 1124 set in 2009.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have a 2.51 ERA (21 er in 75.1 ip) and 78 strikeouts over the last eight games but are just 4-4 over that span...have a 3.65 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (111), have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.373) and are tied for the lead in pickoffs (19) but have issued the third most walks (466).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in each of the last four games (2 er in 28.0 ip, 0.64 ERA) and are 4-0 over that span...this is the first time this year A's starters have picked up the win in four consecutive games...starters are now 8-5 with a 3.44 ERA (39 er in 102.0 ip) over the last 16 games after going 12-17 with a 5.52 ERA over the previous 36 contests...have a 3.71 ERA (352 er in 855.0 ip) for the season, which is third lowest in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's have the third lowest batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.371) in the American League, the third fewest home runs (94), the fourth fewest runs (563) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.314)...are on pace to hit 109 home runs...hit 109 home runs last year, which was the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1979 (108)...have not finished with an on-base percentage under .318 since 1982 (.309)...have been shutout 14 times, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors...it is the most by an A's team since 1991 (14)...have been shutout more than 14 times just twice in Oakland history (19 in 1978, 17 in 1979).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 109 errors, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (116)...it is the most by an A's team since the 2001 club had 125...18 of the errors have been committed by pitchers, which is tied with the Cubs and Reds for the most in the majors...they are the most by an A's pitching staff since the 1999 club also had 18...the last time A's pitchers had more errors was in 1997 when they had 19...the errors have led to 74 unearned runs, which are the most in the majors.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 25-23 (.521) since the All-Star Break after going 39-53 (.424) before the break...are batting .271 (452 for 1665) since the break after hitting .233 before the break...the pitching staff has a 4.66 ERA (222 er in 428.1 ip) since the break after posting a 3.13 ERA before the break...were leading the American League in ERA at the break but have the fourth highest post-break ERA in the AL...the offense ranks second in the AL in doubles (114) and triples (13) since the break (114), third in walks (173) and fourth in runs (248)...are hitting .312 (138 for 443) with runners in scoring position since the break...A's starting pitchers are 20-19 with a 4.77 ERA (151 er in 284.2 ip) since the break after going 31-35 with a 3.17 ERA before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-0 on this six-game homestand against Seattle (3-0) and Kansas City (three games)...went 4-6 on the last homestand and are 38-30 (.559) at home...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York (2-1), Boston (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and are 26-46 (.361) on the road, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fifth consecutive season...are batting .254 (564 for 2224) at home and .240 (604 for 2516) on the road...have a 3.04 ERA (210 er in 621.0 ip) at home compared to 4.25 (299 er in 632.2 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest in the majors.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 3-0 in this stretch that runs from Sept. 2 to 22 where they are scheduled to play 16 of 19 games in Oakland...the only exception is a three-game series at Texas this weekend...just completed a 29-game stretch that ran from Aug. 1 to Sept. 1 where they played 19 of 29 games on the road...were 12-17 over that span.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 17-24 (.415) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (San Diego, 18-28 .391)...the 24 one-run losses match the most by an A's team over the last 24 years...have not lost more since 1987 when they went 20-27...are 8-11 (.421) in extra inning games, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games and losses...the 11 losses are the most by an A's team since 1996 (9-11)...combined for just seven extra inning wins over the previous two seasons and are 15-28 (.349) in extra inning games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 10-19 in games decided in the last at bat...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for second most in the AL.

PLAYERS USED: Friday night, Michael Taylor and Andrew Carignan became the 46th and 47th players to appear in a game for the A's...the A's used 49 players last year and have not used fewer than 49 in a season since 2006 (40)...Carignan is the 26th pitcher the A's have used this year, which ties the Oakland record set in 1997 and matched in 2009...the franchise record is 27 set by the 1915 Philadelphia A's and matched by the 1955 Kansas City A's...Taylor became the A's fourth right fielder (DeJesus, Jackson, Sweeney), which is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history (also 1980).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...the A's are 5-6 (.455) in his starting assignment this year...his teams are 96-60 (.615) in his starting assignments in his career, including 63-37 (.630) with the A's...has tossed six or more innings in six of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer seven times...is 42-0 in 58 career starts with run support of four or more.

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out 42 batters in August, which ranked fifth in the American League...it was the most by an Athletic in

once month since he also struck out 42 in June, 2008...it was third most in August in Oakland history (Blue, 55 in 1971; Stewart, 44 in 1987)...has 64 strikeouts since the All-Star Break, which is tied for fifth in the AL...has 72 strikeouts in 63.1 innings for the season, an average of 10.23 per nine innings...that is second best in the AL among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched (Morrow, TOR 10.41).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .276 (40 for 145) with the bases empty and .177 (17 for 96) with runners on...eight of the 12 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots....has allowed a .193 (23 for 119) average against left-handed hitters and .279 (34 for 122) against right-handers...has surrendered eight of his 12 home runs to righties for a .508 slugging percentage...lefties are slugging .378.

HOME AND AWAY: is 2-0 with a 3.30 ERA (11 er in 30.0 ip) and .171 (18 for 105) opponents batting average in five starts at home and 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA (21 er in 33.1 ip) and .287 (39 for 136) opponents average in six starts on the road...is now 21-10 with a 3.01 ERA (111 er in 332.1 ip) in 56 career appearances in the Coliseum and 38-26 with a 4.09 ERA (262 er in 576.2) in 110 career appearances in all other parks.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA (24 er in 38.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or fewer and 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA (8 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts on six days rest or more.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list July 1 after going 0-0 with a 3.52 ERA in two starts on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento (7.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr)...did not appear in a game this spring and was placed on the 15-day DL March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right shoulder...it was his 10th career stint on the DL, his seventh as an Athletic...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 18 when the A's acquired David Purcey from Toronto.

SINCE 2003: Has 930 strikeouts in 909.0 innings since making his Major League debut in 2003...his average of 9.21 strikeouts per nine innings is second best among all pitchers with 900 or more innings pitched since 2003 (Lincecum, 9.95)...has a .225 (751 for 3343) opponents batting average over that span, which is third best using the 900 innings pitched minimum (Johan Santana, .221; Lincecum, .222).

WITH THE A'S: Is 40-21 with a 3.54 ERA (238 er in 605.0 ip) in 108 games, 100 starts, in an A's uniform...his .656 winning percentage is third best in Oakland history...began his career with the A's in 2003 and was traded to the Chicago Cubs July 8, 2008...went 19-15 with a 4.00 ERA in 58 games, 56 starts, in $2\frac{1}{2}$ seasons with the Cubs (2008-09) and Rangers (2010)...signed with the A's as a free agent December 21, 2010.

2011 START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Arizona *July 1* in Oakland...it was his first start since September 29, 2010 against Seattle and his first win since August 23, 2010 against Minnesota...it was his first start as an Athletic since July 6, 2008 and his first victory in an Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at

Oakland uniform since June 26, 2008 against Philadelphia...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Texas *July* **7**...allowed runs in four of his five innings and Holland shutout the A's on four hits...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in the second game of the doubleheader against Los Angeles *July* **16** in Oakland...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Wells in the sixth inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at New York *July* **23**...allowed a RBI single to Martin in the second inning and a solo home run to Swisher in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 10-8 loss to Tampa Bay *July* **28** in Oakland...did not allow a hit until Zobrist singled to lead off the fifth...left after six innings with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed seven runs in the seventh inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Seattle *August* **2**...allowed a two-run double to Carp in the first inning and a two-out, two-run home run to Wells in the sixth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win at Toronto *August* **9**...surrendered a lead off home run to Encarnacion in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Texas *August* **14** in Oakland...did not allow a home run, snapping a careerlong streak of eight consecutive games with a home run allowed dating back to his final outing of 2010...combined with Bailey and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Toronto *August* **19** in Oakland...tossed seven innings and allowed both of the hits...struck out a career-high tying **11**...had a no decision in the A's 22-9 loss at New York *August* **25**...left with a 7-6 lead but pitched just 4.1 innings...the Yankees then scored 16 runs off the A's bullpen over the final three innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 16-inning loss at Cleveland last Wednesday...it was his 100th career start as an Athletic and he is the 21st pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...allowed a sacrifice fly to Fukudome in the first but the A's tied the game with a run in the second...allowed a leadoff home run to Hannahan in the bottom of the second but Oakland scored single runs in the third and fourth...allowed another solo home run to Hannahan in the sixth, tying the game at 3-3.

HARDEN vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA (35.2 ip, 34 h, 12 r, 11 er, 13 bb, 29 so, 2 hr) in six career starts...is 0-0 with a 4.38 ERA (6 er in 12.1 ip) in two starts in Kansas City, 2-0 with a 1.47 ERA (3 er in 18.1 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 0-0 with a 3.60 ERA (2 er in 5.0 ip) in one start in Texas...last faced the Royals May 25, 2010 at Kansas City, a no decision in a 8-7 Rangers win...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the third on a Kendall sacrifice fly and an error...the Rangers built a 6-2 lead but he allowed a RBI double to Butler in the fifth and a two-run triple to Bloomquist in the sixth to make the score 6-5...O'Day allowed the tying run to score for the blown save.

LHP Gio Gonzalez (12-11, 3.21 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 28th start of the season...has won each of his last three starts (2.18 ERA), which is one short of the longest winning streak of his career (twice, last: Aug. 24-Sept. 8, 2010)...is averaging 8.95 strikeouts per nine innings, which ranks fourth in the American League...the Athletics franchise record (since 1901) for strikeouts per nine innings in 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...is 4-5 with a 4.75 ERA in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 2.47 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is tied for sixth in the AL in losses since the break...combined with Breslow on a five-hit shutout in his last start, a 7-0 A's win at Cleveland last Thursday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 4 bb, 7 so)...is 3-2 with a 5.74 ERA in six career starts against Kansas City...is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (13.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 16 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year.



Bob Melvin was named interim manager of the A's for the remainder of the 2011 season June 9. He replaced Bob Geren, who compiled a 334-376 (.470) record in four-plus seasons as manager. Melvin has a record of 493-508 (.493) in seven previous seasons as a Major League manager with the Seattle Mariners (2003-04) and Arizona Diamondbacks (2005-09). He is the 29th manager in franchise history and the 17th in Oakland history.

In his previous managerial stint, he guided Arizona to a 337-340 (.498) record in four-plus seasons. He was named manager of the D-backs Nov. 5, 2004 and led the club to a 77-85 mark in his first season, a 26-game turnaround from a franchise-worst 51-111 mark in 2004. After a 76-86 finish in 2006, Melvin was named National League Manager of the Year by the BBWAA in 2007 after guiding Arizona to a league-best 90-72 record. He also earned NL Manager of the Year honors from *The Sporting News* and the Negro League Baseball Museum's C.I. Taylor Legacy Award. The Diamondbacks followed up their NL West title with a second place finish in 2008, finishing 82-80. Melvin became the winningest manager in Arizona history that season when he earned his 304th win Aug. 14, surpassing Bob Brenly. He was ejected from a game twice during the 2008 season and has 19 career ejections as a manager. Melvin was relieved of his duties as D-backs manager May 8, 2009 after a 12-17 start.

Prior to being named A's manager, Melvin had rejoined the Diamondbacks as a special baseball advisor to President & CEO Derrick Hall in May of 2011, assisting the baseball operations department and other business divisions of the organization. He was a professional scout for the New York Mets in 2010.

Melvin began his managerial career in 2003 and guided to the Mariners to a 93-69 record in his rookie campaign, shattering the team record for wins by a first-year Mariners manager set by Lou Piniella in 1993 (82-80). His 93 wins also tied for the 15th-most by any rookie manager in Major League history. The Mariners then fell to 63-99 in 2004 and he left Seattle with a 156-168 (.481) record in two seasons.

Melvin began his coaching career as Manager Phil Garner's bench coach from 1999-2000, first with the Brewers in 1999 and then in 2000 with the Tigers. While with the Brewers, he also managed the Maryvale team in the Arizona Fall League in 1999. He then served as Bob Brenly's bench coach with the D-backs from 2001-02 when the club won back-to-back NL West titles and the World Series in 2001. Prior to those bench coach roles, he spent three seasons with Milwaukee in various capacities, serving as a scout in 1996, roving instructor in 1997 and as assistant to General Manager Sal Bando in 1998.

A 10-year Major League veteran, Melvin's playing career included stops in Detroit (1985), San Francisco (1986-88), Baltimore (1989-91), Kansas City (1992), Boston (1993), New York-AL (1994) and Chicago-AL (1994). He posted a .233 hotme runs and 212 RBI while playing in 692 games.

The former catcher was drafted by Detroit as its first choice in the secondary phase of the 1981 January draft and hit .220 in 41 games in his rookie season of 1985. Melvin spent the next three seasons sharing the catching duties with Bob Brenly for the Giants and hit a career-high 11 home runs in 1987. After three seasons in Baltimore, he batted a career-high .314 in 32 games with Kansas City in 1992.

Melvin graduated from Menlo-Atherton High School in Menlo Park, Calif. in 1979 and later attended and played baseball at the University of California in Berkeley. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Lower Manhattan, NY. Their daughter, Alexi, is a recent graduate of the prestigious Lee Strasberg Theater & Film Institute in New York.
